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
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
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

The benefactions which confer the privilege of Endowment are as follows:—





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

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1924.

THE Board of Management have the honour to submit their Report for 1924, together with the Audited Accounts for the year.

WORK.

The statistics for the year, as set out below, show that the work of the Hospital has been carried on with undiminished activity. It has been possible by the partitioning of one ward, to add three additional maternity beds, thus bringing their total number to ten, and increasing the total number of beds available in the Hospital from 285 to 288. The addition thus made in the maternity accommodation of the Hospital is particularly welcome, for it is found in practice that the facilities which the Hospital is able to offer to married women in confinements of a difficult character are greatly appreciated.

Improvements and Alterations.

Important and vital alterations in the work of the X-Ray Department have been in progress during the year. The use of plates, with the consequent need for storage accommodation, has been discontinued and films have taken their place. The developing room has been enlarged and remodelled on modern lines. Some indication in the increase of the work of

the Department is shown by the following figures:-

The accommodation of the Department proved so inadequate that it was decided to erect over the Board Room an additional storey to accommodate the Radio-Therapeutic work of the Department. The approval of the King Edward's Hospital Fund for London was sought and obtained, and in addition the Fund made a grant of £500 in aid of the work. This extension is linked up with the Radiographic Department by means of a covered stairway, and when completed will provide three treatment rooms. The cost of the building, which has been carried out by Messrs. Higgs & Hill, is approximately £2,300.

Great advances have been made during the past few years in the treatment of deep-seated cancer, and although the somewhat extravagant claims made sometimes in this connection on behalf of X-Ray treatment cannot be entirely substantiated, there is no doubt that this new technique is a great advance on the old. In the past, cases applying for treatment at St. Mary's have had to be referred elsewhere, but with the opening of the new extension there will now be in existence at the Hospital a department which will be able to afford special treatment and facilities for one of the most terrible maladies of our time.

During the extension of the X-Ray Department a convenient opportunity afforded itself of improving the heating facilities in the New Wing, and by means of the installation of a new condenser which will be reserved for the X-Ray Department and the New Operating Theatre, it is hoped in the warmer months to effect a considerable economy in the consumption of fuel by reducing the distance between the existing boiler and the New Theatre.

Work on the new electric lifts has been proceeding during the last eight months of the year. The two old hydraulic

lifts have been removed and new modern electric lifts are now in use. They have effected a great improvement in the arrangements for the transport of patients within the Hospital. Work has also commenced on the installation of a new motor for the existing electric lift in the Clarence Wing, and when this has been finished the very necessary and urgent overhaul of the transport arrangements of the Hospital will have been completed. The expenditure on this work has been a very serious item for the Hospital's finances and will amount to not less than £3,000.

A further attempt was made during the annual cleaning in the summer to overtake the arrears of painting and decoration which had accumulated during the years of the War and the period immediately following. Two large wards and the whole of the rooms on one floor of the Nurses' Home were painted throughout, and the wards of the Hospital are beginning to assume their pre-war appearance.

For a considerable time the question of the storage accommodation for coal has been one of great difficulty. The normal consumption of coal in the Hospital every twenty-four hours during the winter months is six tons of steam coal and two tons of household coal. Until quite recently the coal storage accommodation available was for sixty tons only, and during any period of trade dispute affecting either the collieries or transport, the Hospital was immediately in difficulties and had to pay an extremely heavy price in order to ensure an adequate supply of coal. During the last railway strike the price of coal, even on the opening day of the strike, was more than doubled. The Board felt that such a position was intolerable, and plans and specifications were obtained for the construction of a coal cellar to hold 150 tons. Owing, however, to the cost, it was not possible to proceed with the work. November the Winter Distress League was approached on the matter, and the Committee of that League very generously undertook to supply the labour if the work was done during the winter. This offer, amounting in hard cash to over £500, made the scheme a practicable proposition. With this additional accommodation available it

will be possible to purchase coal during the summer at summer prices, thus effecting not only a considerable saving in expenditure, but also providing the Hospital with some safeguard for the supply of its coal during any industrial dispute.

During the year the Committee of the Institute of Pathology and Research placed at the disposal of the Board of Management a sum of £250 for the purchase of apparatus urgently required by the Hospital and Medical School for which no funds were available. By means of this welcome gift, it has been possible to purchase additional equipment including a Waller Light for the Operating Theatre.

NURSING.

The rapid advance which has been made during recent years in the knowledge of all medical and surgical conditions has, in its turn, reacted on the Nursing Staff, and has proved an important factor in so far that it has meant not only increased work for the Sisters and Nurses in the Wards, but also additional staff. Side by side with this increase in the practical work of nursing there has arisen the need for more theoretical knowledge if the clinical duties of a nurse are to be intelligently carried out, and this can only be done when the Nursing Staff has received sound instruction, both in practical and theoretical work.

During the year the first Preliminary State Examinations have been held, and the fact that every Nurse candidate from this Hospital was successful in satisfying the Examiners testifies to the careful instruction in both theoretical and practical work which is given to the individual Nurse. The value of the teaching of the Preliminary Training School, which was established early in 1923, has been so increasingly felt throughout the Wards that it was decided to extend the length of the course from five to seven weeks, in order to allow the Probationer to assimilate still further the knowledge gained before entering the Wards.

The spring months of 1924, owing to the influenza epidemic, proved a great strain to the Nursing Staff, but thanks to the spirit of loyalty and willing co-operation shown by all the Sisters and Probationer Nurses in training, the patients in the Wards were efficiently and carefully nursed, in spite of the great reduction in the Nursing Staff. It is in this spirit that the training of the Probationer is carried out from the time she enters the Preliminary Training School until she obtains both her General Nursing Certificate and her Midwifery Certificate at the end of her fourth year.

Gift of Radium.

The Board of Management report with much pleasure the receipt of a sum of £2,000 for the purchase of Radium, £1,000

as a donation from Miss V. E. Wills, and £1,000 from Mrs. E. M. Rowcroft.

In the past, owing to its cost, it has not been practicable to place facilities for Radium treatment at the disposal of a large number of patients. The Radium, which the munificent gift of Miss Wills and Mrs. Rowcroft has now made possible to purchase, will be the means of bringing relief to a type of case which is amongst the saddest with which the Hospital has to deal.

In addition, Mr. A. W. Page has very generously undertaken financial responsibility for the provision of a special safe for the storage of the Radium at the Hospital.

It would be appropriate at this time also to thank Dr. Beatton and Mr. Stevens, through whom the Hospital's great need in the matter was made known.

The most encouraging feature respecting the Hospital's income is the increase which has taken place in Annual Subscriptions, the total for the year being £3,977, as compared with £3,898 for 1923. The figure now recorded for Annual Subscriptions is the highest since 1914, and it is hoped that the decline which has been steadily taking place for so long in this vital source of the Hospital's Income has now been arrested, and that the total accruing under this heading may soon approximate to what was received in pre-war days.

Donations show a decline of nearly £3,300—that is, from £8,332 in 1923 to £5,051 for the present year.

Marie Control of the Control of the

A welcome increase has taken place in the amount received from Box Collections, which is mainly the result of the scheme for systematic Weekly House-to-House Collections in the neighbourhood of the Hospital. Over 150 voluntary collectors are now at work who have very kindly undertaken to make a collection in their particular streets from persons who have signified their willingness to make a weekly contribution towards the funds of the Hospital. By this means a class of contributor is reached to whom it would not be possible to appeal in the ordinary way. The total sum collected last year by these voluntary helpers was £955, which is a really magnificent result, bearing in mind that the great portion of this sum is received in penny or two penny weekly contributions, and that this is the first complete year in which the Scheme had been in operation.

Through the generosity of the Executors of the Will of the late Mr. William Brown Hextall, a sum of £1,000 was received for the endowment of a Bed in the Hospital. In addition, a sum of £500 was received through Hugh S. Quekett, Esq., the Honorary Secretary of the Stock Exchange Dramatic and Operatic Society as the result of the performances of Gipsy Love, which sum was used, at the request of the Society, for the endowment of a Cot bearing the following inscription:—

The Directors of the Prudential Assurance Company, Limited, have generously increased their Annual Subscription to £110 a year as a contribution towards the maintenance of two Beds and one Cot.

Once again the Committee of Sportsmen, with Mr. Moss Deyong and Mr. Lew Potter, as Chairman and Deputy Chairman respectively, organised their Annual Boxing Tournament at the National Sporting Club on behalf of their Endowment Scheme of £10,000 for the Hospital. A sum of over £5,000 has already been received from these tournaments during the last three years. For the active and generous interest of this Committee of Sportsmen in St. Mary's Hospital, the Board of Management cannot adequately express their thanks. The Board feel that this generous tribute is one paid by those who have a full knowledge of the work the Hospital is doing, and sincerely hope that the Committee may see their way to repeat each year what has been hitherto one of the most successful series of Boxing Tournaments ever held on behalf of a London Hospital.

The actual proceeds amounted to a little over £1,000. The whole of the organisation in connection with the Day was carried out by the Office Staff, so that the administrative costs were reduced to a minimum. Valuable help in making the effort so successful was given by the Nursing Staff, the students of the Medical School, and also the Students of the Physical Exercises and Massage Department.

Expenditure.

The cost of maintenance of the Hospital for the year was £55,455, as compared with £54,289 for 1923—i.e., an increase of £1,166. £500 of this increase is due to the additional cost of the Nursing Services.

The cost per Out-Patient per attendance has fallen from 1s. 11·8d. in 1923 to 1s. 10·6d., whilst the cost per In-Patient per week has risen from £3 7s. 6d. in 1923 to £3 10s. 6d. in 1924.

The increase in the cost of Surgery and Dispensary is accounted for by the fact that the Hospital was still using, in 1922 and 1923, a considerable amount of dressings, etc., which had been kindly given by the British Red Cross Society out of their surplus War Stock.

The Board of Management are glad to be able once again to report that St. Mary's still maintains an honourable position amongst the General Hospitals of London in the matter of economical administration. Whilst the average cost of an occupied bed in Hospitals of its class was £180.8, the cost in St. Mary's was shown to be £160.2, or £20.6 below the average.

WAR MEMORIAL.

A tablet, privately subscribed for by friends of the Hospital, has been placed in the Cambridge Place Entrance Hall, and contains the names of forty-five former Students and Members of St. Mary's Hospital who gave their lives for their Country in the Great War.

CHANGES IN THE BOARD AND HONORARY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL STAFF.

The Annual Election of the Board of Management took place, as usual, at the Quarterly Board of Governors in June. The following Ordinary Members, retiring by rotation, being eligible, were re-elected:—

Dr. Graham Little, on his election as Member of Parliament for the University of London, found it necessary to resign from the Board owing to the pressure of his Parliamentary duties, and Sir Almroth E. Wright, K.B.E., C.B., M.D., was elected to fill this vacancy.

Mr. A. R. Prideaux and Lieut.-Col. H. E. Verey, D.S.O., were re-elected Chairman and Deputy Chairman respectively, and at the first meeting of the House and Finance Committee, after the Quarterly Board in June, Lieut.-Col. H. E. Verey, D.S.O., was re-elected Chairman of that Committee.

The resignation of Mr. C. W. Christie-Miller, a former Deputy Chairman and Treasurer of the Hospital, from the Board of Management as one of its Ordinary Members, has been received with much regret.

In the earlier part of the year Mr. H. B. Bompas, Chairman of the Paddington Board of Guardians, was elected to fill one of the vacancies among the Ordinary Members of the Board of Management.

Staff Changes.

The Board of Management were deeply grieved during the year to learn of the death of Sir Malcolm Morris, K.C.V.O.,

F.R.C.S., Consulting Dermatological Surgeon to the Hospital, and at their meeting in February passed a resolution of deep sympathy with Lady Morris in her great bereavement. Sir Malcolm Morris had been intimately connected with the work of the Hospital for a great number of years, and in recognition of his services on his retirement from the active staff of the Hospital, was elected a Vice-President, which gave him a permanent seat on the Board of Management.

The Hospital has also suffered a grievous loss in the resignation of Mr. W. H. Clayton-Greene, C.B.E., F.R.C.S., Surgeon to In-Patients. Mr. Clayton-Greene has retired at the zenith of his powers to the Channel Islands for reasons of health, and it would be difficult to over-estimate his loss to the Hospital and Medical School. For over twenty years his teaching powers and his surgical skill have been amongst the greatest assets to St. Mary's. In recognition of his services to the Hospital and Medical School, he has been elected a Consulting Surgeon to the Hospital.

The Board of Management regret the resignation of Dr. E. H. Kettle, the Pathologist of the Hospital, but congratulate him upon his appointment as Professor of Pathology and Bacteriology to the Welsh National School of Medicine, Cardiff.

The vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Clayton-Greene has been filled by the election of Mr. Duncan C. L. Fitzwilliams, C.M.G., M.D., F.R.C.S., Senior Surgeon in charge of Out-Patients, to be a Surgeon of the Hospital; and the vacancy caused by the resignation of Dr. Kettle has been filled by the appointment of Dr. W. D. Newcomb as Director of the Department of General and Special Pathology to the Institute of Pathology and Medical Research, Morbid Anatomist to the Hospital, and Lecturer in General and Special Pathology to the Medical School. Mr.F.A.Williamson-Noble, F.R.C.S., was appointed on the special recommendation of the Medical Committee an Additional Member of the Staff, and was elected a Supernumerary Assistant Ophthalmic Surgeon.

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CHANGES IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF.

There has been an unusually large number of changes in the administrative staff during the year. Mr. F. G. Rouvray, the Assistant Secretary and Steward, who had rendered devoted and valuable service to the Hospital, obtained the post of Assistant Secretary to the Brompton Hospital. Mr. R. J. Hearne, the Chief Clerk, was appointed Secretary to Willesden General Hospital, whilst Mr. H. E. Ryan has been appointed Assistant to the Secretary of Manchester Royal Infirmary.

The Board of Management regret the loss of these Officers, but at the same time wish them every success in their promotions to which their work at St. Mary's had fully entitled them.

THE "PARKWOOD" CONVALESCENT HOME.

The Trustees of the Home have continued throughout the year to place fifteen beds at the disposal of the Hospital for women and children in need of convalescent treatment before returning to their homes.

One hundred and sixty-two patients of the Hospital (137 women and 25 children) were sent during 1924, and the grateful letters which are so frequently received from these patients bear eloquent testimony to the splendid work which is being done by this Institution.

These beds are placed at the disposal of the Hospital free of any charge either to the patients themselves or to the Hospital; and the Board of Management once again record their grateful thanks to the Trustees of the "Parkwood" Convalescent Home for the invaluable help they render in aiding to complete recovery so many patients of the Hospital.

Maternity Department.

During the year 611 patients applied for treatment. All of them were visited in their homes by the Municipal Health Visitor, and many of them were put in touch with the Local Welfare Centre, where they continued to attend after their confinement.

Maternity Letters for confinement at Home were only given in cases where the home conditions were reported as satisfactory.

Nineteen unmarried girls made application, and were referred to a Social Worker, who arranged for the confinement and for the care of the baby afterwards. Five went to suitable Homes, with which they are still in touch.

Convalescence was arranged for nine mothers and their babies; 23 necessitous cases were helped through other sources. Help, with cost of clothing, was given to five mothers, and arrangements for the care of other children during the mother's stay in Hospital were made for four.

In-Patients.

Much of the report of this work is contained in the Report of the Dresden Fund Trustees.

CONVALESCENT FUND.

The attention of friends of the Hospital is drawn to the fact that there exists a deficit of approximately £100 on the working of the Convalescent Fund of the Hospital for the past year.

The Fund was inaugurated for the relief of necessitous Out-Patients and for providing them with necessary nourishment, clothing and change of air. The Fund is, in fact, an aid to the completion of the work of the Hospital, and has provided invaluable help in restoring once again to health

and strength a large number of persons attending the Out-Patient Department.

The Secretary of the Hospital will be very glad to receive and acknowledge any subscriptions or donations sent to him and which are earmarked by the donors for the purposes of the Fund.

MEDICAL SCHOOL.

The entry of Full-Course Students during the Academic Year 1923-24 was 50. The total number of Full-Course Students working in the School and Hospital during the same period was 308, as compared with 314 in the previous Academic Year. A special feature of the year was the increased number of full-time research workers.

The important decision to discontinue the system of co-education was arrived at during the past year after prolonged consideration by the Board of Management and Medical School Committee.

The Primary F.R.C.S. Classes in Anatomy and Physiology have again been well attended, and, in addition, two advanced courses of lectures on Physiology have been given.

The new system of awarding Scholarships by nomination has produced a much keener competition, both for the Public School and University Scholarships, and the result of the change appears to be very satisfactory. In particular, the University Scholarships have produced men who are likely to be a gain to the School, both in work and athletics.

During 1924 13 Students obtained the M.B., B.S. Degree of the London University, and one obtained the Degree of M.S. In the Royal Colleges of Physicians and Surgeons 43 obtained the qualifying Diplomas, while 4 obtained the Diploma of F.R.C.S., and one that of M.R.C.P.

THE CHAPLAIN'S REPORT.

The present Chaplain of St. Mary's has nearly completed his tenth year of service. The duties of the office do not vary greatly from year to year. The work is by no means easy, but it is made pleasant through the kindly cooperation of the members of the Hospital Staff and through the readiness of the Patients to welcome the ministrations of the Chaplain and his colleagues.

Some hours of each day are occupied in visiting the Wards, and prayers are said in some Wards every night. The Chapel services have been well attended, and the Communicants have been more numerous than in any previous year. The offerings contributed have sufficed to cover the expenses of the services, and have allowed the support of the Mission Hospital at Quetta to be continued.

The Board's thanks are due to the Lady Visitors for their regular attendance, and to the Singers, whose Sunday visits give so much pleasure to the Patients.

THE LADIES' ASSOCIATION.

The Board of Management desire once again to take this opportunity of placing on record their deep appreciation of the services rendered to the Hospital by the Ladies' Association. The value to the Hospital of their work consists not only of their generous gifts of linen, etc., but also in the increasing number of friends who have become interested in the work of the Hospital through the activities of the Association.

Her Royal Highness Princess Arthur of Connaught, President of the Association, who carried out her training as nurse at St. Mary's during the war, was present at the Annual General Meeting of the Association on 25th March, 1924, and afterwards graciously opened the Model Market and Sale of Flowers organised by Mrs. Kendal and Mrs. C. M. Wilson. The Association again became responsible for a depot in connection with the sale of flowers on "Alexandra Day," and a sum of £78 13s. 0d. was collected.

A successful Jumble Sale, arranged by Mrs. Wilfred Harris and Lady Broadbent, was held in the Out-Patient Department of the Hospital in November, with the satisfactory result that a sum of £161 8s. 7d. was handed over to the funds of the Association.

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Since March, 1924, £565 has been voted to the Hospital by the Association for the purchase of blankets, flannel, linen, sheets, etc.

The resignation of Mrs. Easton, who has been for so many years the Honorary Secretary of the Association, was accepted with much regret. She has been succeeded by Miss R. M. M. Evans, of 24, Sussex Gardens, Hyde Park, W.

The Executive Committee appeal most earnestly to all ladies interested in the Hospital for increased support in their work either by joining the Association, enlisting new members, or by making garments and lending their houses for work parties. The object of the Association is to provide for the supply of garments, linen and blankets required for the use of In-Patients in the Hospital.

Honorary Vice-Presidents subscribe one guinea annually and Honorary Members 5s. Working Members subscribe 10s. 6d. annually, and are supplied with cut-out garments to make. Lady Broadbent (the Honorary Work Secretary) is at the Hospital every Thursday morning from 11 to 12 during the months of October to March, and will gladly give any information respecting the work of the Association.

GENERAL.

It is a matter for great regret that at a time when there is an urgent and pressing need for capital expenditure on a large scale the ordinary income of the Hospital should have fallen short of the normal expenditure by over £3,000.

The question of adequate accommodation for the Nursing Staff grows in urgency every year. It is vital to the work of a hospital that it should possess a body of nurses efficiently trained for their work, and bent on maintaining the high standard of unselfish devotion which has been the glory of English Nursing. Other things being equal, the entrant to the nursing profession will seek admission to a hospital where the facilities as regards accommodation are adequate, and, therefore, the importance of a new Nurses' Home cannot be exaggerated. In addition, should the financial conditions of the Hospital permit of the erection of such a Nurses' Home,

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the accommodation at present used as a dormitory for Nurses would provide an unrivalled opportunity for the establishment of Wards for private paying patients, the need for which is so strongly felt at the present time.

Proposals are also under consideration for re-modelling the Operating Theatre, situated in the old wing of the Hospital. Should these proposals be adopted by the Board of Management, a very heavy capital outlay will be necessary.

The Board of Management make an earnest appeal to all those friends of the Hospital who have so generously supported its work and made possible the great achievements of the past to continue their support so that St. Mary's Hospital may still retain its position as one of the great Teaching Hospitals of the Metropolis.

"The voluntary hospitals system, which is peculiar to the English-speaking peoples, is part of the heritage of our generation, and it would be lamentable if by our apathy or folly it were suffered to fall into ruin."

THANKS TO THE MEDICAL STAFF.

The Board conclude their Report with the expression of their sincere thanks to the members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff for their constant attention and kindness to the patients, and for their valuable services to the Hospital throughout the year.

B. Form of bequest of money, etc.

I give and bequeath to the Treasurer or Treasurers for the time being of a Corporation called the President and Governors of St. Mary's Hospital, Paddington, the sum of*.....to be applied in and towards carrying on the charitable objects of that Institution. I direct that the said sum be paid free of Legacy Duty, and that the receipt of the Treasurer or Treasurers for the time being of the said Corporation shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors for the payment of the same; and I further direct that the Executors for the said sum and the Legacy Duty thereon respectively shall be paid exclusively out of such part of my personal estate as may be legally bequeathed for charitable purposes, and in priority to all other payments thereout.

The George Sturge Trust Fund.


In the year 1884 Mr. George Sturge, of Wloodsthorpe, Sydenbam Will Road, executed a Deed of Trust conveying to St. Mary's Hospital £926 *Great Eastern Railway 5 per Cent. Preference Stock, representing one thousand pounds (£1,000), under the following conditions:—

"In giving the sum of £1,000 for a Samaritan Fund for the above Hospital, Mr. Sturge gives it on the conditions that this Fund shall be kept entirely separate from the General Funds of the Hospital, and that the income shall be paid to, or applied for, such In-Patients as may be necessitous, and within three months from their discharge from the Hospital, and for the purpose of their having necessary nourishment, clothing, or change of air."

"Mr. Sturge bopes that this fund may be made known and that others may be induced to subscribe to it."

GOVERNMENT AND MANAGEMENT.

The mode of government is by a Board of Management, meeting fortnightly, and by Standing Committees appointed by the Board of Management.

The Board of Management consists of the President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurers (permanent Members), and twenty-eight Governors elected annually (Ordinary Members), of whom not more than five may be women. Of the Ordinary Members eight are Members of the Medical Staff or Lecturers in the Medical School (Medical Members).

Subscribers of greater sums are entitled to recommend Patients in proportion to the amount of their subscriptions. Letters are not issued unless expressly desired, as many Subscribers do not require them.

Governors have also the privilege of visiting the Hospital under regulations made by the Board of Management, provided that they previously ascertain from the Secretary that such visit will not interfere with the work of the Hospital.

Executors of any considerable benefactor by Will are eligible to be elected Honorary Life Governors.

THE MATERNITY.

Annual Subscribers of One Guinea, or *Donors* of Ten Guineas to the MATER-NITY FUND, may recommend three Patients annually to that department; and so on in proportion to the amount of the subscription.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Applicants are treated as In-Patients or Out-Patients at the discretion of the Medical and Surgical Staff, and as the accommodation available in the Wards may permit.

Accidents and other cases deemed urgent by the Medical Officers are (so far as space permits) admitted without Letters at all times.

Holders of Letters seeking admission as In-Patients must present their Letters at the Hospital at 1 o'clock (Sundays excepted).

Much inconvenience having occurred in consequence of the arrival of Patients from a distance, without notice, it is requested that in the case of Patients coming from places so remote as to preclude easy and cheap communication with the Hospital, notice be given to the Secretary three days before the Patient intends to apply for admission, enclosing a Medical Certificate stating as fully as possible the nature of the case.

VISITING DAYS. Adults: Wednesdays and Saturdays, from 4 to 5; and Sundays and Public Holidays, from 3 to 4. Children under 15: Wednesdays, 4 to 5, Sundays, 3 to 4. Except for urgent reasons visitors cannot be admitted at other times. Children are NOT allowed to visit the Children's Ward. Only parents or guardians of patients, or persons in loco parentis, are allowed as visitors to the Children's Ward.

Out-patients are attended DAILY (Sunday and Public Holiday excepted). They must present their letters at the Hospital at the following times:—
