



A most fitting and beneficent Memorial to a departed relative or friend is an Endowed Bed in St. Mary's Hospital.



INSTALLATION OF WIRELESS.

Owing to the generosity of the Proprietors of the "Daily News" and subscribers to their "Wireless for Hospitals Fund," each patient in the Hospital has now available at

his bedside a headphone by which he can "listen in" when, and as, he pleases. The installation was formally handed over to the Hospital on behalf of the Advisory Council of the Wireless for Hospitals Fund by the Postmaster-General (Sir William Mitchell-Thomson, Bart., K.B.E., M.P.) on Monday, 30th November.

There can be no doubt that the Wireless Installation now provided will be a means of ameliorating the tedium and weariness of those who are laid aside for long periods on beds of pain and suffering in a large general hospital.

It had been estimated that the cost of maintenance of the apparatus, headphones, etc., would be some £50 a year. Mr. C. W. Drabble and Mr. F. C. Lindo very generously undertook to meet this expense by making an annual contribution of £25 each, so that neither the Wireless Installation nor its maintenance has become a charge in any way on the General Funds of the Hospital.

Annual subscriptions—perhaps the most vital source of the Hospital's income—again have increased, and show an excess of £332 over the previous year. This year's total is the highest which has been received under the heading of "Annual Subscriptions" since 1911, but even so, remains an almost absurdly low figure bearing in mind that the population of the Borough of Paddington alone is nearly 145,000.

In effect it means that considerably less than 1,000 inhabitants in the Borough of Paddington are prepared to undertake an annual subscription towards the large general Hospital situated in their midst. Donations (£11,392) are more than double those of the previous year, and constitute a record sum for a normal year in which no special appeal has been made. Generous and welcome additions have also been made to the Endowment Fund. A gift of £1,000 was received from Miss Florence P. Weston for the endowment of a bed in memory of her brother, the late Dr. Weston, an old St. Mary's man, who was highly esteemed by all who knew him.

To commemorate the anniversary of his 75th birthday, Mr. Bernhard Baron sent a donation of £1,000, which was utilized for the endowment of a Cot in memory of the munificent aid he has given to the voluntary hospitals throughout the country. The inscription on the endowment plate reads as follows :—

St. Mary's is fortunate in the loyalty and enthusiasm it arouses amongst its officers and servants. Only recently Dr. Bird, who was for over 30 years Medical Superintendent, left on his death practically the whole of his estate of some £10,000 to the Hospital, and this year an equally generous gift comes from Mr. Ottley, the Assistant Engineer, who on his death also bequeathed practically the whole of his estate to the Hospital, apart from some few personal gifts to his fellow-workers. At no time did Mr. Ottley receive more than £4 a week as an employee, and yet under his will the Hospital has received a legacy of £1,362. It is hardly possible to imagine that two more striking examples could be found of the devotion which the work of a large London General Hospital arouses. A memorial tablet has been erected in the main entrance hall of the Hospital with this inscription :—

A "Flag Day" in aid of the General Funds of the Hospital was once again organised, and held on 10th May. It proved a great success. The total receipts amounted to over £111, whilst the expenses were only £49, and a net sum of £662 was therefore paid over to the General Funds of the Hospital. Much of the success of "Flag Day," which began well because no small amount is due to the great services by the Nursing staff, the students of the Medical School, the Students of the three Hospitals, Nurses and Matrons, Department and a number of ladies associated with the work of the Hospital, who gave up some of their time and services. No outside help in any form was sought, and the expenses were well under £100 of the amount collected. The Board of Management would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the valuable assistance rendered by the local press, especially the "Paddington and Kensington Chronicle," in promoting

the children's Ward. Earlier in the year the Spartenians arranged a Committee with Mr. E. Cooke as Chairman, to hold a very successful evening Concert at the Kilburne Hall, the proceeds of which a donation of over £300 was received for the General Maintenance Fund of the Hospital.

He founded the Hospital and Dispensary in 1888, and the Hospital has since developed rapidly. A small building was first opened in 1888, and the Hospital now occupies a large building, the only one of its kind in the country. The Hospital has taken in the work of the former Dispensary, and the Hospital is now known as the Hospital for the Poor. The Hospital is situated in the heart of the city, and is easily accessible by road and rail. The Hospital is well equipped with all the latest medical appliances, and is a great centre for medical education and research. The Hospital is a great benefit to the poor and the sick, and is a great credit to the city of London.

A "Flag Day" in aid of the General Funds of the Hospital was once again organised, and held on 13th May. It proved a great success. The total receipts amounted to over £1,111, whilst the expenses were only £49, and a net sum of £1,062 was therefore paid over to the General Funds of the Hospital. Much of the success of "Flag Day," which it is hoped will become an annual event, is due to the great help given by the Nursing Staff, the Students of the Medical School, the Students of the Electro-Therapeutic, Physical Exercises and Massage Departments, and a number of ladies closely associated with the work of the Hospital, who gave so freely of their time and services. No outside help in organisation was sought, and the expenses were well under 5 per cent. of the amount collected. The Board of Management would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the valuable assistance rendered by the local press, especially the "Paddington and Bayswater Chronicle," in promoting

the needs of the Hospital, and particularly for the publicity they so kindly gave in connection with "Flag Day."

The Weekly Contribution Fund still affords substantial help, although, of course, its scope is very seriously limited by the continued extension of Central and Local Schemes. A sum of over £903 was collected last year by Voluntary Honorary Collectors, who made a tour each week of the particular streets allocated to them in the area in which they reside. No praise can be too high for these voluntary workers (a large number of them former patients of the Hospital) who so cheerfully undertake this task on behalf of an institution ministering to the needs of the sick and suffering of their neighbourhood.

The Board of Management record their indebtedness to the Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London for a grant of £6,000 towards the general maintenance expenses of the Hospital; to the Committee of the Hospital Sunday Fund for a grant of £2,250, and to the Committee of the Hospital Saturday Fund for a grant of £990.

The total sum received from patients who were in a position to make some contribution towards the cost of their maintenance in Hospital, together with the grants from certain Approved Societies, amounted to approximately £11,000, which is somewhat higher than the previous year. There are, however, as the following table shows, a great number of patients whose circumstances do not permit them to make any contribution, and the Hospital is always open to receive them without any distinction whatsoever:—

The number of patients attending with vouchers of the Hospital Saving Association has increased rapidly. The total amount received this year from the Association was £1,363 as compared with £516 in 1924 and £43 in 1923, but on the other hand there has been a very considerable diminution in the grant per patient from the time when the scheme was originally put into operation. It would appear a fair criticism to make that an undue proportion of the income of the Hospital is allocated to extra-hospital benefits, and these benefits have apparently been provided by diminishing the contribution rates to Hospitals. It is too early to judge what effect these Central Associations will have upon the extremely pleasant and intimate relations which the Hospital has had in the past with large employers of labour in the neighbourhood.

Acknowledgment must be made here of the generous support received from the London Midland and Scottish Railway Hospital Fund, who during the year made grants amounting to £957 in respect of services rendered to their members.

Attention must be made of the debt due by the Hospital to the Local Committee of the Winter Distress Legge for the help which has been given to enable work of an urgent character to be

the needs of the Hospital, and particularly for the patients they so kindly gave in connection with "Flag Day."

The Weekly Contribution Fund still affords substantial help, although of course, its scope is very seriously limited by the continued extension of Central and Local Schemes. A sum of over £500 was collected last year by Voluntary Honorary Collectors, who made a tour each week of the patients' cases allocated to them in the area in which they reside. No price can be too high for these voluntary workers (a large number of them former patients of the Hospital) who so cheerfully undertake this task on behalf of an institution ministering to the needs of the sick and suffering of their neighbourhood.

The Board of Management record their indebtedness to the Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London for a grant of £6,000 towards the general maintenance expenses of the Hospital; to the Committee of the Hospital Sunday Fund for a grant of £2,250, and to the Committee of the Hospital Saturday Fund for a grant of £950.

The total sum received from patients who were in a position to make some contribution towards the cost of their maintenance in Hospital, together with the grants from certain Approved Societies, amounted to approximately £11,000 which is somewhat higher than the previous year. There are, however, as the following table shows, a great number of patients whose circumstances do not permit them to make any contribution, and the Hospital is always open to receive them without any distinction whatsoever.

The number of patients attending with vouchers of the Hospital Saving Association has increased rapidly. The total amount received this year from the Association was £1,303 as compared with £516 in 1924 and £43 in 1923, but on the other hand there has been a very considerable diminution in the grant per patient from the time when the scheme was originally put into operation. It would appear a fair criticism to make that an undue proportion of the income of the Association is allocated to extra hospital benefits, and these benefits have apparently been provided by diminishing the capitation rates to Hospitals. It is too early to judge what effect these Central Associations will have upon the extremely pleasant and intimate relations which the Hospital has had in the past with large employers of labour in the neighbourhood.

Acknowledgment must be made here of the generous support received from the London Midland and Scottish Railway Hospital Fund, who during the year made grants amounting to £257 in respect of services rendered to their members.

The total expenditure for the year amounted to £62,505, compared with £60,265 in 1924. This increase of £2,240 is accounted for in the large amount spent on annual cleaning and out-door repairs.

A further sum of £1,500 was spent on internal painting and repairs, which included the main corridors and central staircase. This work has thrown a very severe strain on the finances of the Hospital, but was of such an urgent character that it could not be longer delayed. Two new calorifiers were installed for the heating of the old building at a cost of £365. It will now be possible for the Hospital's Engineer to carry out the necessary annual cleaning of the pipes, whereas previously, with the old pattern calorifier, outside help had to be obtained at a cost of some £50 a year.

It is again with pleasure that the Board of Management are able to report that St. Mary's still maintains a highly satisfactory position amongst the General Hospitals of

London in the matter of economical administration. The statistical returns published by King Edward's Hospital Fund for London in August last show the average cost per month paid in the General Hospitals of London to be £111 18s., and in St. Mary's to be £103 18s., or £18 below the average.

RADIUM.

The Radium which was purchased with the sum of £2,000 so generously placed at the disposal of the Hospital by Mrs. E. M. Rowcroft and Miss V. E. Wills has since March, 1925, been used in connection with the treatment of some fifty-five patients.

It has been found in practically all cases that the patients' condition has improved and the physical pain considerably relieved as the result of the radium treatment.

The Board of Management would like to take this opportunity of recording their deep sense of gratitude to Mrs. Rowcroft and Miss Wills who have enabled the Hospital to give to patients this beneficial treatment.

MEDICAL SCHOOL.

The entry of full-course students during the academic year 1924-25 was 43.

The total number of half-course students working at the School and Hospital during the same period was 288. In addition to these 61 took part-time courses.

The competition for University Scholarships in 1925 was very keen, nine nominations having been received for the University Scholarships and twenty-one for the two Hospital Scholarships. Owing to the fact that the first three were selected for the University scholarships, only one nomination for each Hospital Scholarship was

carried out which could not have been done without the use of the necessary funds.

Labour was provided during the winter for the repainting of practically all the outside ironwork at a cost to the Hospital of only the materials used.

Expenditure.

The total expenditure for the year amounted to £16,500, compared with £10,200 in 1924. This increase of £6,240 is accounted for in the large amount spent on annual cleaning and out-door repairs.

It has been found in practically all cases that the patients' condition has benefited and the physical pain considerably relieved as the result of the Radium treatment.

The Board of Management would like to take this opportunity of recording their deep sense of gratitude to Mrs. Rowcroft and Miss Wills who have enabled the Hospital to give to patients this beneficial treatment.

MEDICAL SCHOOL.

The entry of full-course students during the academic year 1924-25 was 43.

The total number of full-course students working at the School and Hospital during the same period was 288. In addition to these 91 took part-time courses.

The competition for entrance Scholarships in 1925 was again very good, nine nominations having been received for the two University Scholarships and twenty-one for the two Public School Scholarships. Owing to the fact that the first four candidates selected for the University Scholarships were considered to be of equal merit, these Scholarships were divided.

The awards of these and of the Public School Scholarships have resulted in the acquisition of some students of outstanding merit.

At the beginning of October a short Post-Graduate Course was arranged for the third year in succession, and proved to be very popular. Intensive teaching upon modern methods was given for a period of three days, and was attended by 130 practitioners.

During 1925, 22 students obtained University Degrees. In the Royal Colleges of Physicians and Surgeons, 58 obtained the qualifying diplomas, and seven obtained the diploma of F.R.C.S.

THE "PARKWOOD" CONVALESCENT HOME, SWANLEY, KENT.

The Board of Management have pleasure in acknowledging the very great assistance received during the year from the authorities of the "Parkwood" Convalescent Home, Swanley, Kent, who once again generously placed at the disposal of the Hospital 15 beds free of all charge.

One hundred and sixty-five patients (130 women and 35 children) were sent to "Parkwood" from the Hospital,

and many expressions of their gratitude for the kindness and treatment accorded to them during their stay in this admirable institution were received.

To the great regret of all members of the Association, Lady Broadbent has found it necessary to resign from the post of Honorary Work Secretary, which she has so ably held for many years, but the Association has been fortunate in securing Mrs. Maynard Smith to take her place. In December, a very successful Bridge Party, arranged by Mrs. Easton and Mrs. Thurburn, was held by kind permission of Mrs. Douglas King at her house. The proceeds of the Bridge Party amounted to over £141.

Since March, 1925, £780 has been voted to the Hospital by the Association for the purchase of linen, etc., this being an increase of £215 on the previous year.

The Board of Management desire to take this opportunity of placing on record their deep appreciation of the services rendered to the Hospital by the Ladies' Association.

The Executive Committee appeal most earnestly to all ladies interested in the Hospital for increased support in their work either by joining the Association, enlisting new members,

Negotiations were entered into for the purchase of an adjoining site, but owing to the great difference in price between the valuation made on behalf of the Hospital and that asked by the vendors, the Committee which had the matter under consideration was unable to recommend the Board of Management to purchase. In this connection the very best thanks of the Board are due to Mr. Joseph Stower, who throughout the negotiations placed himself at the disposal of the Hospital and made no charge for his professional services.

The founders of St. Mary's Hospital had estimated in 1890 that the number of beds necessary for the provision of Hospital facilities for the then existing neighbourhood was 200. In spite of the enormous increase in the population of

Mrs. Maynard Smith (the Honorary Work Secretary) is at the Hospital every Thursday morning from 11 to 12 during the months of October to March. Miss R. M. M. Evans, Hon. Secretary, 24, Sussex Gardens, Hyde Park, will gladly give any information respecting the work of the Association.

GENERAL.

Throughout the year the Board of Management has continuously had under serious consideration the inadequate existing accommodation of the Hospital, which has been reflected in the number of cases of accident and sudden emergency refused admission owing to the fact that there were no beds available.

Negotiations were entered into for the purchase of an adjoining site, but owing to the great difference in price between the valuation made on behalf of the Hospital and that asked by the vendors, the Committee which had the matter under consideration was unable to recommend the Board of Management to purchase. In this connection the very best thanks of the Board are due to Mr. Joseph Stower, who throughout the negotiations placed himself at the disposal of the Hospital and made no charge for his professional services.

The founders of St. Mary's Hospital had estimated in 1845 that the number of beds necessary for the provision of Hospital facilities for the then existing neighbourhood was 380. In spite of the enormous increase in the population of

the north-west districts of the Metropolitan area, St. Mary's is endeavouring to provide Hospital facilities for all cases of accident and the treatment of the sick poor with only 288 beds at its disposal. In addition, the difficulty of the proper housing of the Nursing Staff increases and the Hospital's inability to provide for each nurse a separate bedroom is ultimately bound to affect the recruiting of the Nursing Staff, upon which, perhaps more than any other factor, the real efficiency of the Hospital depends.

The Electro-Therapeutic Department and Ultra-Violet Ray (*i.e.*, Sunlight Treatment) Department for children is accommodated in two rooms in the basement, and is working under extremely difficult circumstances. Further, the need for beds for private paying patients is so well known that it is scarcely necessary to emphasise the point. Had the Hospital the additional accommodation, beds would be immediately allocated for this purpose. They cannot, of course, be taken out of those which have been provided for the normal patients of the Hospital.

The four vital factors enumerated above affecting the future of St. Mary's Hospital could be dealt with if some substantial sum were available for the purchase of the adjoining site. The Nursing Staff are at present housed in the Hospital. If possession could be obtained of the additional site a new Nurses' Home could be built which would immediately set free accommodation for some additional 100 beds. It is impossible for a great teaching hospital to stand still. Laboratories for investigation are of necessity encroaching always on bed accommodation. The limit has now been reached, and with it the pressing urgency of additional space.

The Board of Management feel that it would be deplorable if now, after so much labour and generosity on the part of its benefactors in the past, and after reaching its present high level of efficiency, St. Mary's were allowed to enter upon a period of retrogression simply by reason of the lack of adequate accommodation.

Much inconvenience having occurred in consequence of the arrival of Patients from a distance, without notice, it is requested that in the case of Patients coming from places so remote as to preclude easy and cheap communication with the Hospital, notice be given to the Secretary three days before the Patient intends to apply for admission, enclosing a Medical Certificate stating as fully as possible the nature of the case.

VISITING DAYS. Adults : Wednesdays and Saturdays, from 4 to 5 ; and Sundays and Public Holidays, from 3 to 4. Children under 15 : Wednesdays, 4 to 5, Sundays, 3 to 4. Except for urgent reasons visitors cannot be admitted at other times. Children are NOT allowed to visit the Children's Ward. 
