ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1930.

THE Board of Management have the honour to submit to the Governors and Subscribers their Report for the year 1930, together with the Accounts audited by Messrs. Price, Waterhouse & Co.

OFFICE OF PRESIDENT.

The Board of Management deeply regret to record the death, on the 19th March, of the Rt. Hon. the Earl of Balfour, K.G., P.C., O.M., who since 1925 had held the office of President of the Hospital. Lord Balfour took a great interest in the work of the Scientific Departments, and was Chairman of the Committee of the Inoculation Department from its inception. Within a few months of his death he wrote a letter to "The Times," commending the work of the Pathological Institute, under the direction of Sir Almroth Wright, to the generous consideration of the public. St. Mary's Hospital may well be proud that its name should have been linked with that of such an illustrious statesman, and Lord Balfour's services to the cause of medical research will long be remembered with gratitude.

It is with the greatest pleasure that the Board of Management are able to report that later in the year H.R.H. the Duchess of York graciously consented to accept the office of President in succession to Lord Balfour. The keen interest taken by Her Royal Highness in the work of St. Mary's has been a most valuable encouragement to all concerned with the welfare and future of the Hospital and Medical School. Together with H.R.H. the Duke of York, Her Royal Highness attended the Ball organised by the Ladies' Association in aid of the Extension Appeal Fund, and on the 16th December paid a private and informal visit to St. Mary's, where an extended tour of the Wards and Scientific

Departments was made. On the occasion of her visit Her Royal Highness expressed her great appreciation of the work the Hospital was doing, and showed much interest in the schemes for development now in progress. Her Royal Highness hopes to pay another visit when the building work is further advanced.

EXTENSION OF THE HOSPITAL.

(1) Summary of Proposals.

In connection with the development of the "Island Site" of approximately one and three-quarter acres adjoining the Hospital, purchased in November, 1927, the Board of Management have decided to devote this valuable additional space, and that now occupied by the Inoculation Department, to meeting the following urgent needs of the Hospital and the public :—

- (a) New Buildings for the Medical School.**
- (b) New Premises for the Inoculation Department.**
- (c) New Home for Nurses.**
- (d) Increased Accommodation for Maternity Cases.**
- (e) Pay Beds for Patients of moderate means.**

Readers of the Annual Reports for recent years will not need to be reminded of the importance of these objects the last of which will relieve a new class of patient which is suffering severely under present economic conditions. A special committee, set up by King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, has drawn attention to the serious lack of pay bed accommodation in London and the action proposed by the Board of Management has met with the cordial approval of the King's Fund.

(2) Progress of the Building.

The portion of the site required for the re-building of the Medical School and Pathological Institute was finally cleared in the early part of the year. Tenders were invited

from the construction of the Hospital and the building
of the new Hospital Block, the sum of £100,000.

Building operations began in August, but unsupervised contractors have been connected with regard to the foundations, and in order to ensure the safety of the building, it has been necessary to strip away the piles some 15' depth of soil. Satisfactory progress is, however, being made under the supervision of the architect, Mr. J. W. Cooper, A.R.A., F.R.I.B.A., and it is hoped that both the Medical School and the Pathological Institute will be completed within twenty months from the date of the commencement of building operations.

By Extension Appeal Fund.

permits. Further additions may be proposed by
the Board of Governors, but until the same be approved

Estimates of the Building.

The cost of the building required for the extension of
the Hospital and the various Institutes will vary
from time to time, part of the year. Figures are arrived

from an approved list of builders, and the lowest tender, that of Messrs. Mowlem Bros. in the sum of £225,970, made up as follows, was accepted :—

Steady progress is, however, being made under the supervision of the architect, Sir Edwin Cooper, A.R.A., F.R.I.B.A., and it is hoped that both the Medical School and the Pathological Institute will be completed within twenty months from the date of the commencement of building operations.

(3) Extension Appeal Fund.

The following statement shows the donations and promises which have been made up to and including 31st December, 1930, for the extension of the Hospital and the rebuilding of the Nurses' Home :—

The Board of Management is also under a special debt of gratitude to the Duchess of Portland, the Chairman of the Ladies' Association, and the Countess of Kenmare, for their great interest in the Ball and for all the work they undertook to ensure its success.

A Flag Day in aid of the Extension Appeal Fund was held on Wednesday, 28th May, when a sum of £1,110 was collected. The organisation was undertaken by the office staff, with the result that the expenses were kept very low. The success of the day was due to the ever-ready help given by the students of the Medical School, the Nursing Staff, the Massage Department, employees of Bradleys, Ltd., Wm. Whiteley, Ltd., the staff of the Great Western Railway, and many other friends of the Hospital. It is of interest to record that a sum of £6,650 has been received from these efforts since their inauguration in 1924, and in spite of the increasing number of "Flag Days" held by various organisations in London, the total collected on "St. Mary's Day" shows no sign of diminution, but rather a tendency to increase.

It will be seen from the above record that the Appeal Fund has made certain progress. The need for the rebuilding of the Nurses' Home is one which cannot be too strongly emphasised. The present arrangements, whereby the Nursing Staff are accommodated in various houses in the neighbourhood of the Hospital, are both financially extravagant and administratively unsound. The Board of Management will be prepared to commence building part of the Home as soon as the sum of £100,000 has been received, and it is the earnest hope of everyone who has the welfare of St. Mary's at heart that this sum may be received during the current year, in spite of the difficulties any appeal for funds in these days must inevitably meet.

In connection with the statistics relating to the average number of beds occupied, it should be noted that, out of the total of 356 beds available on the 31st December, only 343 were available for the first nine months of the year, owing to the closure of " Mitchell Bird " Ward.

The number of in-patients treated is the largest recorded for any year since the foundation of the Hospital. Over 730 persons now receive treatment daily at the Hospital, either as in-patients or out-patients, in the various departments.

NURSING STAFF.

The nursing of the Hospital has been maintained at the usual standard of efficiency, and the health of the Staff has been good. During the year 70 applicants have been interviewed, of whom 44 were selected for entry into the Preliminary Training School, the limited accommodation available rendering further acceptances impossible. The opening of " Mitchell Bird " Ward, and the transfer of the Domestic Staff formerly lodged there, has made it necessary to secure further sleeping accommodation for the Nursing Staff outside the Hospital. Sixty Nurses are now in residence in private houses and hostels in the neighbourhood.

The resignation of Miss Milner, who had been Sister in charge of " Allcroft " Ward for over 30 years, was accepted with deep regret. A pension was awarded to her by the Board of Management in recognition of her long and faithful service. On her retirement Miss Milner received a cheque, representing a present from Members of the Board and Staff of the Hospital, and a gift was also made to her by past and present nurses.

No difficulty has been experienced in securing suitable employment for nurses who have completed their training and qualified. Many are now working overseas, in India,

the Malay States, South Africa, the West Indies, and the United States of America. They have secured appointments in the Army or Naval Medical Services, or senior posts in other Institutions.

The Nurses' League has been increasing in activity during the past year. A dance given by the Nursing Staff was organized at the Hotel Royal York on the occasion of the Hall of Fame induction. The Sports Section has participated in the annual Hospital Competition.

On January 1, 1938, the Hospital became a member of the Canadian Hospital Association.

FINANCE

GENERAL

The financial result of the year's working is disappointing, the Hospital having received nothing by grant. This result is due to the absence of new subscribers and Hospital is on its present financial basis, accumulated to \$10,911, which is the lowest sum received since this hospital was founded, in 1912. The Hospital is now in arrears in its 1938 accounts to the amount of the current balance, which is \$1,000.00.

It is the opinion here of the Board of Directors that a different method of Subscriptions should be adopted. It is also decided to a method of advance fees by which Annual subscribers can sign a form of agreement to subscribe for three years or less, whichever shall be the shorter period. In such cases, the Hospital is to be in claim a 1/3 part of the fee. The subscriber is to pay annually, and in addition, to make instalments of 1/3 of his total fee. Each instalment will carry him one year's subscription to the Hospital.

the Malay States, South Africa, the West Indies, and the United States of America ; others have secured appointments in the Army or Naval Nursing Services, or senior posts in other Institutions.

The Nurses' League has shown increasing activity during the year. A purse of £50 collected by the Nursing Staff was presented to H.R.H. the Duchess of York on the occasion of the Ball on the 3rd December. The Sports Section has participated in the final Inter-Hospital Competitions, in spite of the difficulties of obtaining suitable recreation accommodation near the Hospital. A very successful re-union was held in the Out-Patient Department in May, which proves that past members of the Nursing Staff are happy to respond to the call for co-operation and continued interest from their old Training School.

FINANCE.

Income.

The financial result of the year's working is disappointing, expenditure having exceeded income by £1,490. This result is a clear indication of how dependent the Hospital is on Legacies. During 1929 Legacies amounted to £16,612, whilst this year, the total received from this source was £10,630, a decrease of approximately £6,000 which more than accounts for the deficit on the current Income and Expenditure Account.

It is the earnest hope of the Board of Management that additional Annual Subscribers may be obtained. Attention is again drawn to a method of subscriptions by which Annual Subscribers can sign a Deed of Covenant to subscribe for seven years or life, whichever shall be the shorter period. In such cases, the Hospital is able to claim a refund of the Income Tax paid on the subscriptions, and, in addition, donors may make a deduction in their Surtax returns. Full information will gladly be given on application to the Secretary of the Hospital.

Possibly the most satisfactory feature of the year is the steady increase which is still taking place in the amount received from Annual Subscribers; in 1920 the total was £3,943; in 1929, £4,733; and in this year, £5,022, representing an increase of £289 over the previous year. Donations amounted to £8,363, as compared with £8,269 in 1929. Included in this total is the amount allocated to the Hospital from the Sunday opening of Cinemas in the Metropolitan Area, from which source the Hospital was receiving a considerable sum each week.

Warm acknowledgment is made of the munificent gift of £500 a year which the Prudential Assurance Company have given for the endowment of a Maternity Ward in the Hospital. This striking gift from one of the most important of the great Life Assurance Companies will be a great encouragement to all who are giving attention to the question of the care of women in childbirth. It is especially encouraging to St. Mary's Hospital, which is planning a great extension of its Maternity Services. The re-construction scheme includes 30 additional beds which will provide Hospital accommodation for nearly 1,000 difficult cases each year. The high rate of maternal mortality which is giving so much concern to Health Authorities in this country has been the subject of special research at St. Mary's Hospital, and it is hoped that with the wider experience possible when the increased accommodation is available, still more may be done to deal with this evil.

The Hospital has been fortunate in securing the generous interest of employers and employees whose business premises are situated in the neighbourhood. It is felt that this appreciation is one of the most striking tributes to the efficiency of the work of the Institution. A number of beds have already been endowed by such business houses, and it is gratifying to record that during the year the Staff of Messrs. William Whiteley, Ltd., have undertaken the endowment of an additional bed in the Hospital.

The gift of £1000 from Miss B. C. Lowder for the endowment of a bed in the new wing of the General Hospital, London, M.S., is gratefully accepted. The sum of £1000 was given from the £5000 left under the Will of the testator. This has been utilized in connection with the new operating Theatre, so that the new theatre will be ~~new~~ apart from the X Ray room, the apparatus for which is committed to joint fund.

A most successful Tennis Tournament was held at the Devonshire Hotel on the 1st April, and organized by Mr. Austin, aided by a Committee of Gentlemen, amounting over £600. The sum of £300 was duly handed up to Mr. Austin and his colleagues for their help, and hope that the success of their effort will induce them to make the Tournament an annual event.

The Trustees of the Bendix Baron Charitable Trust have very generously allotted to the Hospital a sum of £600 which is gratefully acknowledged. The late Mr. Bendix Baron will always remain a son of the Hospital, and his name will always be held in the highest esteem as a worthy soul and true friend to the Hospital.

The Board of Management are deeply indebted to Mr. Austin and his colleagues for their help, and hope that the success of their effort will induce them to make the Tournament an annual event.

The Hospital Saving Association now provides a very valuable nucleus of support. Its growth has been rapid, and it appears to meet a real need of those workers who desire, whilst in health, to make what provision they can for the time when Hospital treatment may be needed. In 1929 £3,865 was received from the Hospital Saving Association, this in 1930 had amounted to £5,329. There is great cause for satisfaction in the continued success of this admirable organisation.

The St. Mary's Hospital Rubbish Collection Fund has carried on its activities throughout the year, and a sum of over £2,550 has been received since the inauguration of the Fund in 1927. It is felt that the Rubbish Collection Fund is securing a substantial income for the Hospital. The Fund has made a special appeal to the public in that it has been possible to put to good use a great number of things which in ordinary households would otherwise have been thrown into the dustbin.

The 10th Anniversary Meeting of the Hospital Saving Association was held on the 2nd of October, 1921, at the Hotel Royal, London, and the following is a summary of the proceedings. It is a pleasure to record that the Hospital Saving Association has now 1,000 members and that the amount of £1,000 was paid in by the 1,000th member who would otherwise have been thrown into the sea.

Among the notable benefactions of the year was the sum of £6,250 received on account under the will of the late Dr. William Robert Ashurst. The financial position would have been indeed serious without this generous bequest.

Grateful mention must be made of the gift of Mr. Marsden, who for a great number of years has given most of the bacon and ham consumed in the Institution.

Help has also been afforded by the Winter Distress League, which placed at the disposal of the Hospital a number of unemployed workmen, thus making it possible for work of an urgent kind to be done which otherwise could not have been carried out for lack of funds. The Hospital provides the material, whilst the Winter Distress League undertakes financial responsibility for the payment of wages.

A serious loss of income from rents is resulting as the building operations progress in connection with the Extension Scheme. In 1929 rents from the property on the "Island Site" realised £3,866, but the demolition of houses necessary for the rebuilding of the Medical School and Pathological Institute has resulted in this sum being reduced to £2,493 for the year 1930, *i.e.*, a diminution in annual income of £1,373.

The amount received from patients' contributions is now a substantial portion of the Hospital's income. Every care is taken to ensure that no financial hardship is imposed on any patient by reason of his stay in Hospital. The following summary of contributions during the year 1930 may be of interest :—

16·49% were members of various Contributory Schemes.

16·12% contributed £1 1s. per week or over.

8·66% contributed between 10s. and 15s. per week.

7·70% contributed between 5s. and 7s. 6d. per week.

6·95% contributed 4s. per week or less.

6·62% contributed between 15s. and £1 1s. per week.

6·25% for whom Public Authorities made a contribution.

3·17% contributed between 7s. 6d. and 10s. per week.

Admission to the Hospital is entirely free to persons who are found to be too poor to make any contribution. But each person who is in a position to do so is required to pay according to his means—not for medical treatment, which is free—but towards the cost of food and other necessaries such as coal, light, washing, bedding, linen, &c.

The cost per in-patient per week was £3 10s. 9d., and the cost per out-patient per attendance was 2s. 2d. in 1930, as compared with £3 10s. 6d. and 2s. 1·5d. respectively in 1929. Constant and unremitting vigilance has been exercised throughout the year by the House and Finance Committee to ensure that expenditure may be reduced as far as compatible with efficiency. It is satisfactory to record that the position of St. Mary's in the matter of economy, as shown by the statistical returns of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, continues to be very satisfactory. The last published returns of the Fund show the average cost per occupied bed in the Teaching Hospitals of London to be £204·1, and that of St. Mary's to be £164·8.

Arrangements were made for the conversion of one of the patients' waiting-rooms into a Ward for five cots for the reception of L.C.C. school-children requiring operations for the removal of tonsils and adenoids. These operations had

previously been carried out in the Children's Department, and the children allowed to proceed home the same day. Under the new arrangement it is possible for each child to remain in Hospital for a few days, and ten such cases are treated weekly.

Provision had been made for the position during the first week of August, when the former ward was in full use, but owing to the opening of the new Building, the Board of Health found the increased nursing and hospital care required for patients were, therefore, available in the new building. The treatment of isolation of infections at present is not too important, as the recent outbreak of epidemic, especially among school people, rendered isolation unnecessary. In view of this recurrence, the Board of Health has decided to name the "Mitchell Field" Ward, after the name of the building, the necessary accommodations for the sick being provided by the Hospital and nurses in the isolated blocks of Mitchell Field. The Ward was not opened until September, and the increase of \$1,500 in the general expenditure will not be fully felt until next year when expenses are assessed. No other time is apportioned to the Hospital Department, and the present policy makes the reduction of the Hospital staff, which represents the largest expense item, the best method of saving money.

GENERAL REPORT

The number of students in the High School and Hospital for the year 1910-11 is given below, with the number of students in each class, the number of students in each grade, and the percentage of promotion. The figures for 1910-11 will again show an increase over those of 1909-10.

During the year 1910 the number of full course students in the High School and Hospital was 1,126, with 80 others admitted as part-time during the same period.

The following statement of the financial position of St. Mary's Hospital at the end of the year 1910 shows that the expenditure has increased by £1,000 over the year before. The House and Finance Committee suggests that expenditure may be reduced as far as compatible with efficiency. It is submitted also to note that the position of St. Mary's in the present economy as shown by the statistical returns of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London continues to be very satisfactory. The last named return of the Fund shows a sum of £1,000 per annum paid in as Training Money, which is to be divided and used at St. Mary's Hospital.

Arrangements were made for the payment of the above sum to St. Mary's Hospital by the sum of £1,000 calculated on the open rates for the month of March and carried forward from previous years.

Prolonged and careful consideration was given to the position arising out of the closure of " Mitchell Bird " Ward, formerly used as an Isolation Ward, but which, owing to the opening of the new Extension, had been utilised to house the increased Nursing and Domestic Staff required. No facilities were, therefore, available in the Hospital for the treatment or isolation of infectious or doubtful cases, and the frequent outbreak of epidemics, especially in the Children's Wards, rendered isolation accommodation imperative. As a consequence, the Board of Management decided to re-open " Mitchell Bird " Ward, and were forced to secure the necessary accommodation for the Nursing Staff in private hostels and houses in the neighbourhood. " Mitchell Bird " Ward was not opened until September, and the increase of £1,500 in the annual expenditure will not be fully felt until next year's accounts are presented. No other course appeared open to the Board of Management, and the present position makes the re-building of the new Nurses' Home, to which reference has already been made in this Report, an outstanding need of the Institution, and one of most urgent and pressing necessity.

MEDICAL SCHOOL.

The entry of full-course students during the Academic Year 1929-30 was 52, as compared with 49 in the previous year, and 44 in the Academic Year 1927-28. It is encouraging to find a steady increase in these numbers year by year, and the large entry of new students in October last (41), makes it probable that the figure for the Academic Year 1930-31 will again show an increase.

During the year 1929-30 the number of full-course students working in the Medical School and Hospital was 235, while 80 others attended for part-courses during the same period.

In athletics, the Rugby Football Club has again been able to play four teams throughout the season.

A very successful Athletic Sports Meeting was held jointly with Middlesex Medical School in the Summer.

The work of clearing the site of the new Medical School was begun in the Summer, and building operations are now in progress.

INOCULATION DEPARTMENT.

The Out-Patients' Section of this Department continues to grow, and the attendances during 1930 were 9,880, as compared with 9,631 in 1929. When the Department was first instituted in 1906, chronic tuberculosis, furunculosis and acne represented by far the largest proportion of the diseases treated, but vaccine therapy has extended far beyond these limits, and now embraces practically all bacterial disease. The clinics are attended largely by patients suffering from rheumatism, arthritis, recurrent colds, bronchitis, asthma, and intestinal toxæmia.

The accommodation for these Out-Patients remains inadequate, and is attended with much inconvenience and waste of time. The plans for the new building for the Institute of Pathology and Research, however, provide for a commodious Out-Patient Department which will greatly add to the patients' comfort, and will enable investigations to be carried out which are at present impossible. The total estimated cost of the building scheme and equipment of the Department is £95,000. Of this amount £40,000 has been contributed by the Earl of Iveagh; the Department has, owing to a very careful husbanding of its resources, been able to provide £20,000, and an additional sum of about £11,000 has been collected. Grateful acknowledgment is made of the further donation of £1,000 which has been given by Mr. Chester Beatty, and also of the gifts of £2,210 from Mrs. Gilbert Russell and £1,354 from Mr. Gilbert Russell, the two donations to be spread over a period of seven years.

CHANGES IN THE HONORARY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL STAFF.

The retirement of Sir John Broadbent, Bart., M.A., M.D., F.R.C.P., under the age limit, brings to a close the service on the active medical staff of one who rendered long and devoted service to the Hospital and Medical School. Sir John Broadbent was Dean of the Medical School during the first four years of the War, and so one could have had the School's interests more at heart. He served on the Board of Management for a great number of years, and was also a member of the House and Finance Committee where his advice and sound counsel were greatly valued. Upon his retirement the Board of Management passed a resolution recording their high opinion of all his services. Sir Henry's, and the other eminent appointments of Consulting Physicians—Dr. McDonald Miller, the Senior Consultant Physician, was placed by us in vacancy on the Medical Staff, and Dr. Thomas G. Abbott was appointed physician in charge of Out Patients.

In addition the Psycho-Physical Club has assumed a rôle to play for many throughout the year.

A very similar Athletic Society was established by the Middlesex Medical School in the same year.

The work of clearing the air of the red dust of London is the business of the Surveyor, and building operations are still in progress.

INOCULATION DEPARTMENT.

The last balance sheet of this Department, taken up to the end of December 1900 were £2,500, as compared with £1,000 in 1899. This Department was first instituted in 1900 about tuberculosis fifteen thousand and one thousand cases, by far the largest proportion of the disease treated, but vaccine therapy has extended far beyond these limits, and now includes practically all infectious disease. The disease is controlled entirely by specific antigenic treatment, and no other method of control is known at present.

At the present time the work remains unbroken, and the number of admissions and new patients daily is the same as during the 1900-1901 season, though however there should be a diminution in the Inoculation Department which will steadily add to the general health of the population.

The Inoculation Department is now under the charge of Dr. J. H. G. Smith, who has been appointed for the past two years.

Up to date 1900-1901 season, 1,000 cases have been treated, giving an average of 100 admissions per month. The number of cases treated by Dr. Smith and also of the patients treated by Dr. G. H. Smith, and Dr. G. H. Smith, from his admission to the Hospital, the number of cases treated in a period of three years.

The retirement of Sir John Broadbent, Bart., M.A., M.D., F.R.C.P., under the age limit, brings to a close the service on the active Medical Staff of one who rendered long and devoted service to the Hospital and Medical School. Sir John Broadbent was Dean of the Medical School during the difficult years of the War, and no one could have had the School's interests more at heart. He served on the Board of Management for a great number of years, and was also a member of the House and Finance Committee, where his advice and sound counsel were greatly valued. Upon his retirement, the Board of Management passed a resolution recording their deep appreciation of all his services to St. Mary's, and he was unanimously appointed to the office of Consulting Physician. Dr. Reginald Miller, the Senior Out-Patient Physician, was elected to fill the vacancy on the In-Patient Staff, and Dr. Thomas C. Hunt was appointed Physician in charge of Out-Patients.

The Board of Management desire to take this opportunity to congratulate Sir Ernest Graham-Little, Physician for Diseases of the Skin, on the Knighthood conferred upon him in the New Year's Honours List. Sir Ernest Graham-Little has proved himself one of the ablest defenders of the voluntary system, both on the platform and in the Press, and his colleagues, lay and medical, are delighted that some public recognition has now been made of his valuable and devoted work.

THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.

The Annual Election of the Board of Management took place, as usual, at the Quarterly Board of Governors in June. The following Ordinary Members, retiring by rotation, being eligible, were re-elected :—

At the first meeting of the Board, after the Annual Election, Colonel H. E. Verey, D.S.O., was appointed Chairman, and Mr. G. P. Harben, O.B.E., Deputy-Chairman. At the first meeting of the House and Finance Committee, Mr. R. M. Greenwood, C.B.E., was appointed Chairman of the Committee. The resignation of the Earl of Ossory, owing to his residence in Ireland and subsequent inability to attend the meetings of the Board of Management, was accepted with regret.

ALMONER'S DEPARTMENT.

The year 1930 has been memorable in that the duties formerly undertaken by the Poor Law Guardians have now been transferred to the Municipal Authorities. This change has had a direct effect on the Almoner's work. The immediate result has shown itself in connection with the Special Institutions previously administered by the Metropolitan Asylums Board, and now taken over by the London County Council. Children suffering from rheumatic hearts and chorea have been admitted quite frequently to L.C.C. Convalescent Homes within a week of application being made. On the other hand, much delay, probably due to the greatly increased number of applications, has been experienced in procuring vacancies at the White Oaks, Swanley, for children suffering from serious ophthalmic trouble. Close co-operation has been effected during 1930 between responsible officers of the Special Hospitals Division of the London County Council and the Almoner's Department of the Hospital.

In-Patients.

Six hundred and forty-eight In-patients have needed special help in various ways; this shows a slight decrease on the figures for 1929, but is accounted for by a fewer number of convalescent cases.

Two hundred and forty patients have been supplied with various types of instruments.

The following instance will show another kind of assistance given :—

X was three years old, illegitimate and unwanted. The mother having married wished to get rid of him. He was brought to Hospital in a deplorable state of neglect ; filthy and dribbling so badly that his chest was sore. The mother said that he was mentally deficient. The child was admitted to Hospital for observation and within twenty-four hours appeared a different little creature, bright, cheerful and stopping dribbling directly he was told to. Application was made to Dr. Barnardo's Homes, and, after much correspondence and personal interviewing, they were persuaded to take X for a probationary period of six months, providing the mother made a regular contribution for his maintenance.

Out-Patients.

The work in the Almoner's Department has proceeded steadily throughout the year. The total number of patients assisted was 1480, which shows a decrease of 60, as compared with last year, but the number sent for convalescence has increased, especially convalescence for children. The average length of stay for a child in a Convalescent Home is eight weeks, shorter periods having been found to be of little permanent gain.

A Rheumatic Clinic was established in April of this year, to provide for the observation and treatment of rheumatic children. Former patients of the Rheumatic Clinic at Paddington Green Children's Hospital, upon reaching the age of 14 years, are transferred to the Rheumatic Clinic at St. Mary's, a short summary of the medical details being sent with each child. Upon receipt of this report, a home visit is paid, and full particulars taken of family history, home conditions, housing conditions and school environment. These details are combined and sent to the doctor for his information

and guidance. The social side of the Clinic includes the improvement of housing conditions through the local Medical Officer of Health, the provision of extra accommodation through the Tuberculosis Committees and other agencies and convalescence or rehabilitation treatment. In short, an attempt is made to correlate anti-tuberculosis which may force upon the patient to chemise to incense.

It is satisfactory to report that the various appointments instituted during the year for the reception of maternity patients are working smoothly. In the best interests were recruited somewhat indiscriminately without due regard to the qualifications possessed by the persons concerned. This has been remedied by the recent appointment of Dr. J. C. MacLennan, formerly the Director of the Ontario Department of Public Health, as the medical officer in charge of the Maternity Clinic at the Ante-Natal Clinic. The Committee wishes to thank Dr. MacLennan for his services and to assure him that his work will be appreciated and rewarded.

The number of cases that have been admitted to the Ante-Natal Clinic during the year shows that these admissions are completed with entire satisfaction by the Committee. The necessity for early supervision of all cases of pregnancy is obvious, and it is gratifying to find that expectant mothers now realize this. A committee was appointed to the maternal ward every morning to assist in the Ante-Natal Clinic as required. This committee has had a general meet on the 1st day of May, 1911, having made a full report to the Committee.

THE LABOUR AND DELIVERY.

It is very difficult to make the suggestion that His Grace the Duke of Portland would consent to accept the office of Chairman of the Association, rendered vacant by his resignation from all posts in the Committee of Kenmare. The interest taken by the Duke of Portland in all Hospital work is well known, and the Local Association hope that he will be equally interested in securing his

A summary of care was submitted by a childless couple for the consideration of treatment of their childless condition. The husband was 35 years old and the wife 32 years old. The social scope of the Clinic includes the improvement of housing conditions through the local Medical Officer of Health, the provision of extra nourishment through the Public Assistance Committees and other agencies and of convalescence or institutional treatment ; in short, an attempt is made to ameliorate any condition which may pre-dispose the patient to rheumatic diseases.

Maternity.

It is satisfactory to report that the new arrangements instituted during the year for the acceptance of maternity patients are working smoothly. In the past, patients were accepted somewhat indiscriminately, without due regard to the number of beds available, in any particular month. There was, therefore, no encouragement for patients to attend regularly the Ante-Natal Clinic throughout pregnancy, since by one or two visits, immediately prior to confinement the mother had an equal chance of admission with those who had probably attended for some months. Under the new arrangements, 28-30 patients are accepted for admission each month, this number having been fixed in consultation with the Medical Officers. Patients applying for admission when these numbers are completed are, after examination by the Obstetric Officer, referred elsewhere. The necessity for early supervision in all cases of pregnancy is obvious, and it is gratifying to record that expectant mothers now realise that, should they desire admission to the maternity ward, early and regular visits to the Ante-Natal Clinic are essential. The new arrangement has a beneficial effect on the Maternity Ward itself, having regularised the number of admissions.

THE LADIES' ASSOCIATION.

It is very gratifying to be able to announce that Her Grace the Duchess of Portland has kindly consented to accept the office of Chairman of the Association, rendered vacant by the resignation, through ill-health, of the Countess of Kenmare. The interest taken by the Duchess of Portland in all Hospital matters is well known, and the Ladies' Association feel that they have been especially fortunate in securing her services as their Chairman.

Mrs. and Miss Hollway, together with Mrs. Kenyon, very kindly again undertook the organisation of "Pound Day" on the 20th March, 1930. All former records for "Pound Days" were broken, and over £583 5s. 5d. was received in cash, and over four tons of goods in kind. Most grateful thanks are due to Mrs. and Miss Hollway and Mrs. Kenyon for this most successful result.

During the year, members of the Ladies' Association have supplied £740 and 380 miscellaneous articles to the Hospital, whilst in addition, a grant of £411 10s. 10d. was made to the Matron for the purchase of Linen. The Association also gave valuable help, as in previous years, on the occasion of the Hospital's "Flag Day," and took charge of a Depot on "Alexandra Day."

Grants amounting to £1,200 for the equipment and furniture of the new Nurses' Home, have been made by the Ladies' Association out of its own funds towards the Extension Appeal Fund.

The outstanding feature of the year's work has been the organisation of the Ball held at Grosvenor House on the 3rd December, at which T.R.H. the Duke and Duchess of York were present. In connection with the appeal, a "Purses for Nurses" Fund, organised by Mrs. Elphick, realised £1,700, and the total received from these two efforts for the Extension Fund amounted to £2,700, which sum has been earmarked for the building of the new Nurses' Home.

The Executive Committee of the Ladies' Association appeal very earnestly to all ladies interested in the Hospital to support them in their work by joining the Association, enlisting new members, making garments, or by lending their houses for work parties. The object of the Association is to provide the garments, linen and blankets required for the use of patients in the Hospital.

Honorary Vice-Presidents subscribe One Guinea annually, and Honorary Members 5s. Working Members subscribe 10s. 6d. annually, and are supplied with cut-out garments to make. Mrs. Maynard Smith (the Honorary Work Secretary) is at the Hospital every Wednesday morning from 11 to 12

for the month of October to March. Miss R. M. M. Evans, Secretary, Sanatorium, Silver Gardens, Hyde Park, will give a detailed report respecting the work of the institution.

THE CHAPLAIN'S REPORT,

The work of the Chaplain and his assistants continues as usual. The Chaplain's services should be of real value to the patients in the hospital, especially during the winter months, when the Chaplain makes his rounds. It is important that these visits should be frequent and frequent enough to insure the spiritual welfare of the patients.

Our best thanks are due to all who throughout the year have been responsible for decorating the Chapel over such beautiful flowers.

The resignation of Doctor A. W. Burton, who has been called to service, but visiting him to farewell, is much regretted. His work was always greatly appreciated and will be much missed. The Chaplain Dr. G. D. Brown however, has kindly helped, though he is very busy.



GOVERNMENT AND MANAGEMENT.

The mode of government is by a Board of Management, meeting Monthly, and by Standing Committees appointed by the Board of Management.

The Board of Management consists of the President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurers (permanent Members), and twenty-eight Governors elected annually (Ordinary Members), of whom not more than five may be women. Of the Ordinary Members eight are Members of the Medical Staff or Lecturers in the Medical School (Medical Members).

Governors have also the privilege of visiting the Hospital under regulations made by the Board of Management, provided that they previously ascertain from the Secretary that such visit will not interfere with the work of the Hospital.

Executors of any considerable benefactor by Will are eligible to be elected Honorary Life Governors.

THE REGULATIONS.

All patients admitted to the Hospital, or Discharged from the Hospital, must present their tickets or tickets admitted to this department, and so on in proportion to the amount of time available.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Applications are made as In-Patients or Out-Patients at the discretion of the Medical and Surgical Staff, and as the accommodation available in the Wards may permit.

Accidents and other cases deemed urgent by the Medical Officers are (as far as space permits) admitted without letters at all times.

Holders of Letters making application as In-Patients must present their Letters at the Hospital at 1 o'clock (midday) (excepted).

In the case of children under the age of 12 years, or in case of the removal of patients from a distance, without tickets, it is required that in the case of Patients coming from places so remote as to preclude early and close communication with the Hospital, notice be given to the Secretary three days before the Patient intends to apply for admission, enclosing a Medical Certificate stating as fully as possible the nature of the case.

Visiting Days.—Adolescents—Wednesdays and Saturdays, from 4 to 6 p.m., and Sundays and Public Holidays, from 1 to 4 p.m. Children under 12 years, 2 to 4. Except for urgent reasons patients cannot be admitted at other times. Children are permitted to visit the Children's Ward—either parents or guardians of patients, or persons in charge, accompanied or witnessed by the Children's Ward.

Out-patients are admitted Daily (Monday and Saturday excepted). They must present their letters at the Hospital at 1 o'clock (midday) (excepted).

The Trustees of the Dresden Fund, as a result, have been enabled to send 138 Patients to this Home for a period of 19 days or more, at no expense to the Fund, except the fares of the Patients. The Trustees gladly take this opportunity to record their grateful thanks to the authorities of the Hospital Convalescent Home for the great benefit which the use of these 13 beds has enabled the Trustees to confer on so many Patients of the Hospital.


