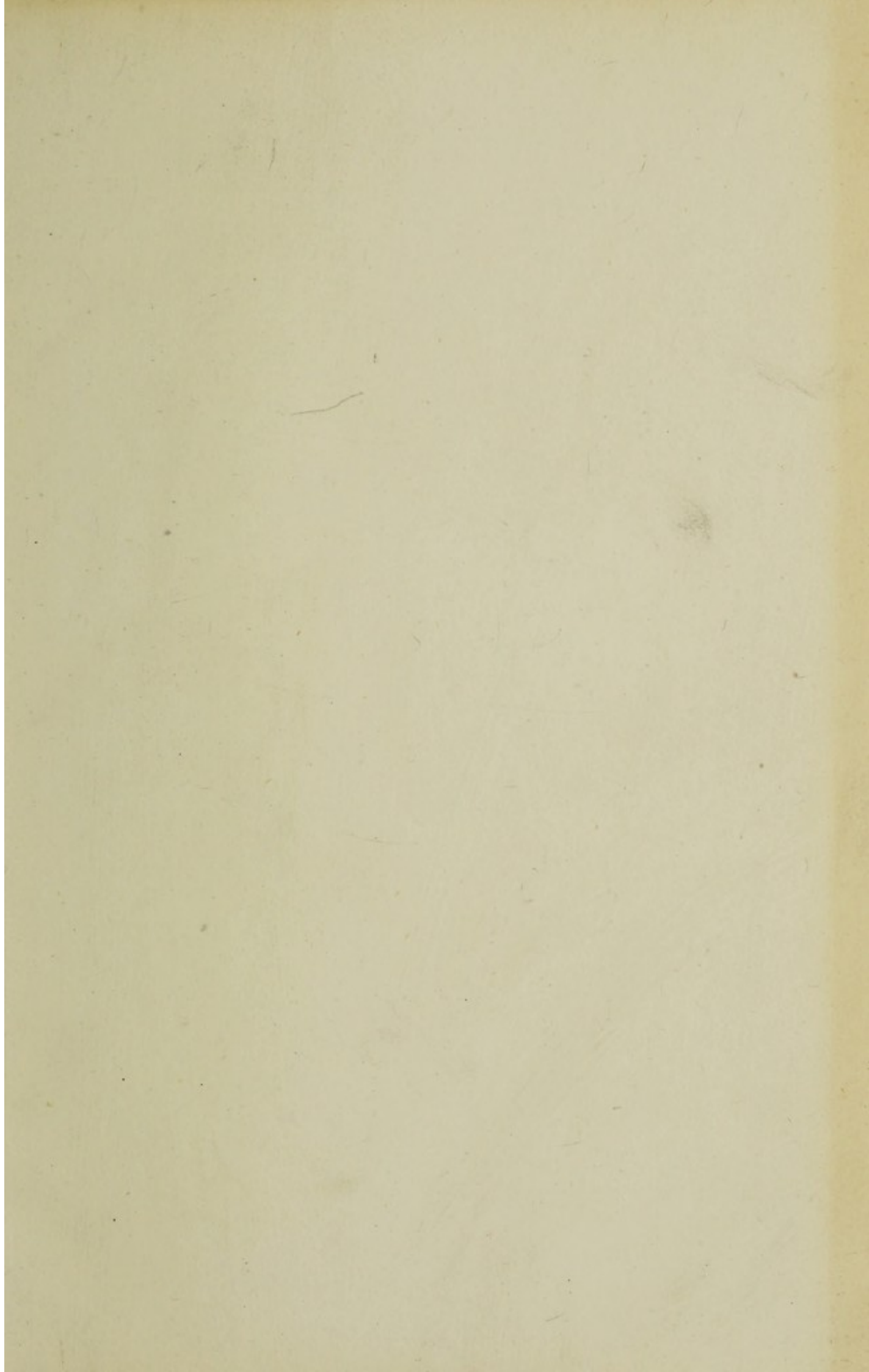

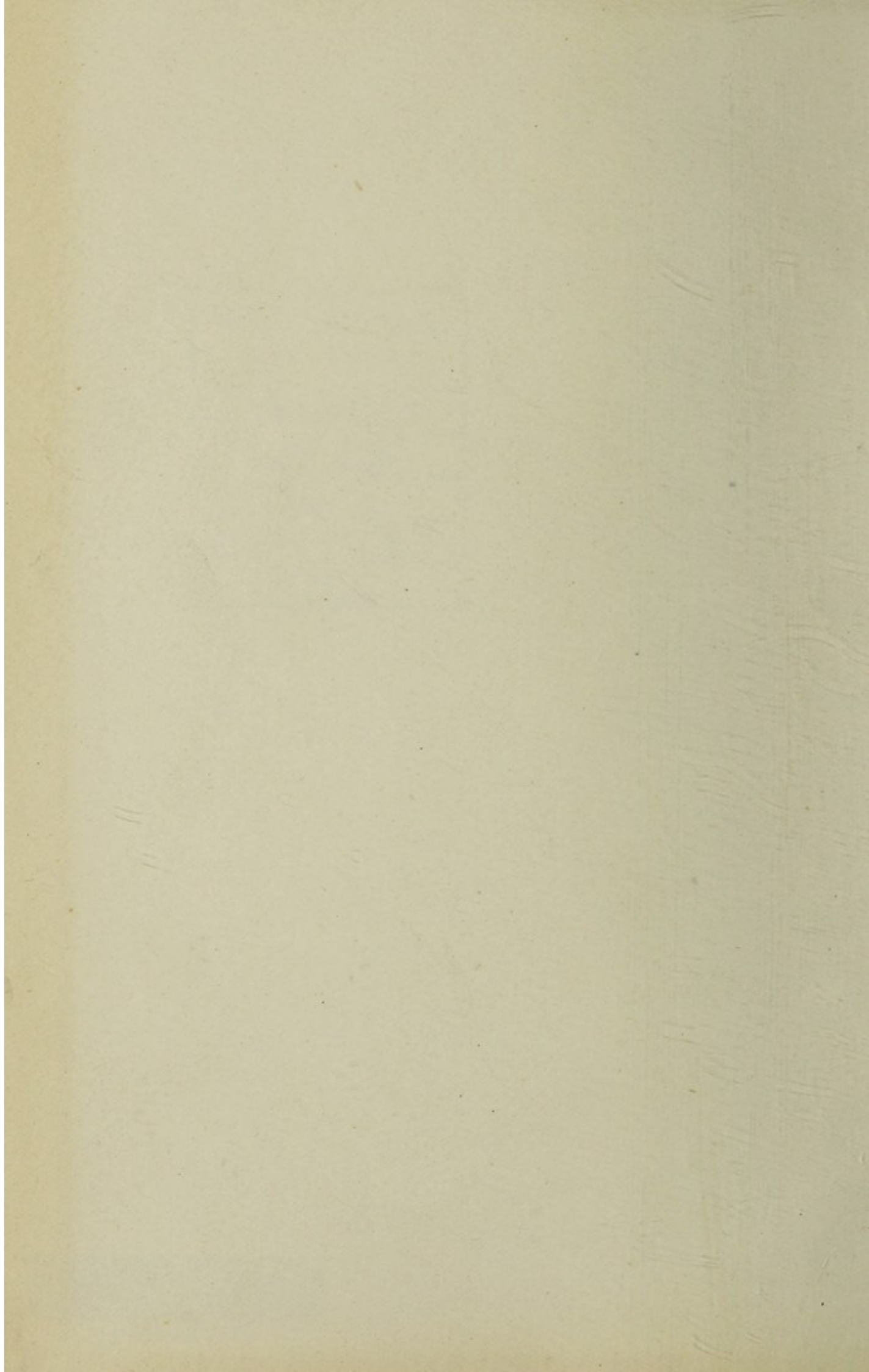

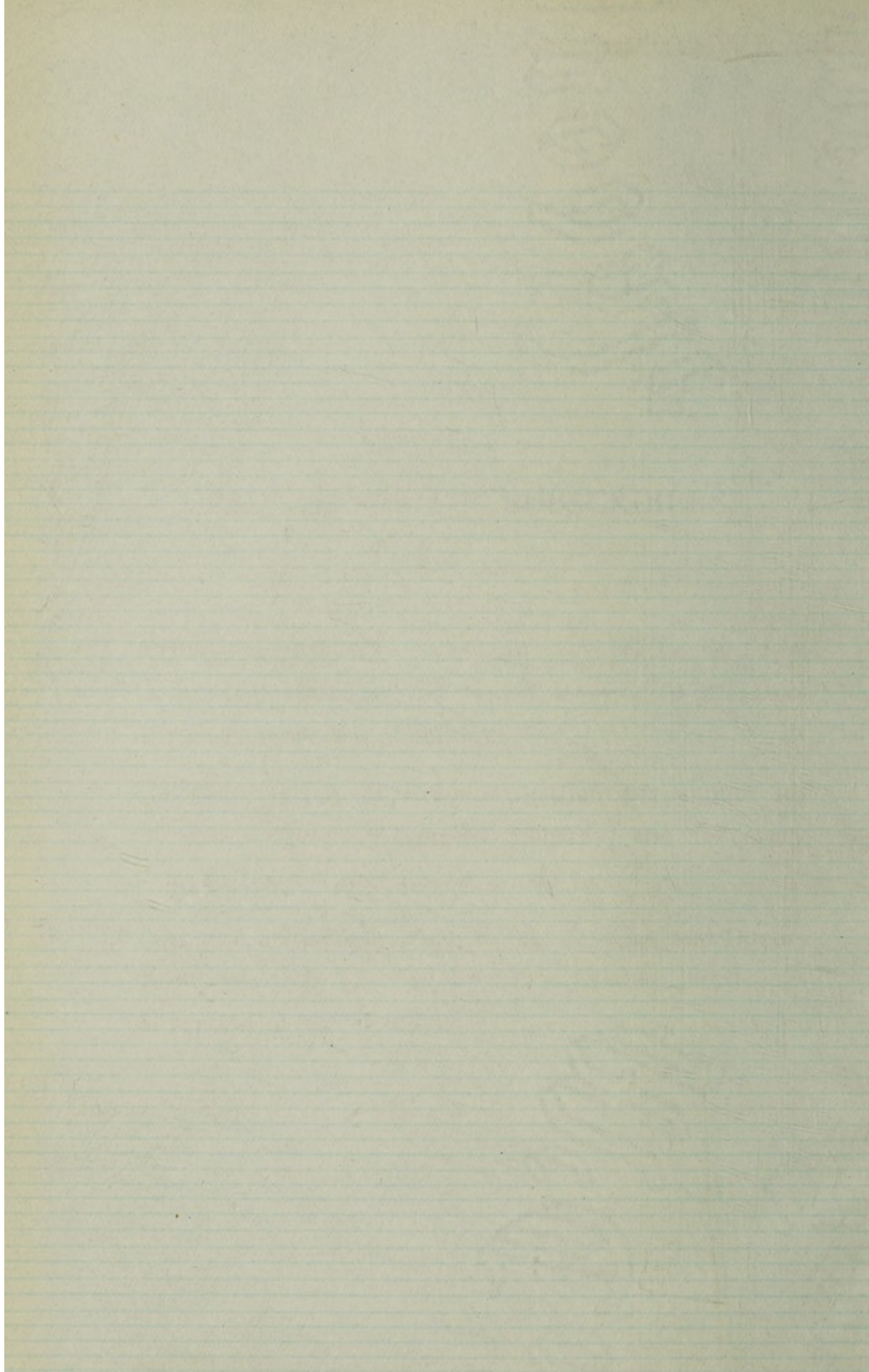

**T**he Board of Management have the honour to submit to the Governors and Subscribers their report for the year 1932, together with the accounts audited by Messrs. Price, Waterhouse & Co.

## EXTENSION OF THE HOSPITAL.

### Summary of Proposals.

The scheme approved by the Board of Management provides for :—

- (a) **New buildings for the Medical School.**
- (b) **New premises for the Pathological Institute.**
- (c) **Increased accommodation for Maternity Cases.**
- (d) **New Home for Nurses.**
- (e) **Pay Beds for patients of moderate means.**

### Progress of the Scheme.

#### (a) **Buildings.**

Work has been continued throughout the year on the buildings for the new Medical School and the new Pathological Institute, and there is every reason to believe that both buildings will be completed and available for occupation in the first half of 1933. This work has been carried out in close conjunction with the needs which the expansion of the Hospital and the eventual erection of the new Home for the Nursing Staff will inevitably entail.

Careful and prolonged consideration has been given to the possibilities of economical arrangements being made for the heating of the Hospital and the whole of the new buildings, both those in course of erection and those in contemplation. A thorough survey of the existing boiler plant proved that without complete reorganisation the present plant would not be capable of providing the necessary heating services for the new Medical School, the new Pathological Institute and later the new Nurses' Home. In the circumstances it was decided to instal a central heating plant with oil-fired boilers, thus avoiding separate scattered installations, each employing separate labour. Plans were prepared to this end, the estimated cost of the work being £19,000, of which sum the Hospital is faced with an immediate expenditure of £12,550, the balance being borne out of the funds of the Pathological Institute and Medical School. The arrangements were duly submitted to and approved by King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, who generously made a grant of £1,000 to the Hospital as a contribution towards the cost of this part of the work. It is of interest to note that the Board is advised that the annual cost of heating the Hospital and the whole of the new buildings under these arrangements will be no greater than that previously necessary for heating the Hospital alone with the old boiler plant.

In accordance with the original proposals, provision has been made for an extension of the maternity accommodation in the Hospital. A unit of 14 maternity beds for married women resident in the Borough will be provided as from 1st April, 1933, under an agreement with the Paddington Borough Council, who have undertaken to pay to the Hospital an annual grant for the maintenance of these beds. In addition, there will be 15 beds for general maternity cases, thus making a total of 29 maternity beds, and forming a unit of reasonable size which should be adequate to meet, for the time being, the growing demands for increased institutional maternity accommodation.

The Board is glad to be in a position to report the steady progress made with the extension scheme, which has

already incurred an expenditure of some £10,000 during the last two years.

The extremely great outstanding need is the provision of adequate accommodation for the Nursing Staff. The increase in the number of beds in the Hospital has necessitated almost to the last point the difficulty with regard to accommodation for the Nursing Staff. The present arrangements, whereby a large proportion of the nurses are housed in private hostels in the neighbourhood, are proving in practice extremely expensive and inconvenient. It is the constant desire of the Board of Management that work may be commenced without delay on at least a portion of the Nurses' Home. Plans are under consideration for the provision of accommodation for some 100 nurses, which it is hoped will not only effect a saving on the current rental now being paid, but will also afford greater opportunities for the corporate life of the Nursing Staff.

(b) Extension Appeal Fund.

The following summary shows the Donations and promises for the rebuilding of the Nurses' Home, the provision of Pay-Beds and the general expansion of the Hospital, received up to 31st December, 1932:

Amongst the gifts has been a magnificent donation of £1,000 from the Executors under the will of the late Mr. Alfred L. Rothchild, who, during his lifetime, was such a devoted friend of the Hospital. The sum of £500 was also applied to the purchase of the "Crown Hall" at the Grosvenor House Hotel on the 13th December. The "Crown

Careful and prolonged consideration has been given to the possibilities of economical arrangements being made for the heating of the Hospital and the extent of the new buildings both in order of construction and in the completion. A thorough survey of the existing plant and the proposed new buildings has been made and it is considered that the present plant would not be capable of providing the necessary heating services for the new Medical School, the new Pathological Institute and later the new Nurses' Home. In the circumstances it was decided to install a central heating system with oil-fired boilers, this involving separate boilers for each building, each employing separate labour. Plans were prepared to this end, the estimated cost of the work being £12,000 of which sum the Hospital is faced with an immediate expenditure of £1,000, the balance being made out of the funds of the Pathological Institute and Medical School. The arrangements were duly submitted to and approved by King Edward's Hospital Board for London, who generously made a grant of £1,000 to the Hospital as a contribution towards the cost of this part of the work. It is of interest to note that the Board is advised that the annual cost of heating the Hospital and the whole of the new buildings under these arrangements will be no greater than that previously necessary for heating the Hospital alone with the old boiler plant.

In accordance with the original proposals provision has been made for an extension of the maternity accommodation in the Hospital. A unit of 14 maternity beds for general women resident in the Hospital will be provided in 1934. In April 1933, under an agreement with the Paddington Research Council, who have undertaken to pay to the Hospital an annual grant for the maintenance of these beds, it is intended that there will be 15 beds for general maternity cases, and a further 23 maternity beds and forming a unit of considerable size which should be adequate to meet the demand for general maternity cases, the unit being the necessary demand for increased general maternity accommodation.

The Board is glad to be in a position to report the steady progress made with the extension scheme which has

already incurred an expenditure of some £250,000 during the last two years.

The remaining great outstanding need is the provision of adequate accommodation for the Nursing Staff. The increase in the number of beds in the Hospital has accentuated almost to breaking point the difficulties with regard to accommodation for the Nursing Staff. The present arrangements, whereby a large proportion of the nurses are housed in private hostels in the neighbourhood, are proving in practice extremely expensive and uneconomical. It is the earnest desire of the Board of Management that work may be commenced without delay on at least a section of the Nurses' Home. Plans are under consideration for the provision of accommodation for some 100 nurses, which it is hoped will not only effect a saving on the outside rentals now being paid, but will also afford greater opportunities for the corporate life of the Nursing Staff.

The sum of £750 was also received as the proceeds of the "Golf Ball" held at the Grosvenor House Hotel on the 15th December. The "Golf

"Ball" appears now to be firmly established as an annual event, and under the able chairmanship of Mr. G. D. Hannay, assisted by a Committee of prominent golfers, has proved a remarkable success. The Board of Management heartily congratulate the Chairman, the Committee and Mrs. Elphick and Miss Diana Fishwick, who acted as Honorary Secretaries, and Mr. Guy Harben as Honorary Treasurer, on the result of their efforts. Thanks are also due to Mr. J. H. Taylor for so kindly conducting the auction, and also to those golf professionals and firms throughout the country who so generously send gifts each year for prizes. The auction realised a sum of £240. Owing to the excellent work of certain members of the Nursing Staff a scheme for the distribution of prizes during the evening produced a sum of over £160. Generous tribute must also be paid to the Committee of the Ladies' Association who this year contributed a further sum of £500 ear-marked for the furnishing of the new Nurses' Home, thus bringing their total gifts to the Fund for this purpose up to £4,340.

The Appeal Committee desire also gratefully to acknowledge the gift of £100 from the Antrobus Trust.

A delightful Motor Treasure Hunt, organised by Mrs. Currie and Miss Colquhoun on the evening of the 28th June, resulted in a sum of £75 being received for the Fund for the building of the Nurses' Home. A Garden Fête was held, by kind permission of Sir Leicester Harmsworth, Bart., at Moray Lodge, Campden Hill, on the 29th and 30th June, when the arrangements were admirably carried out by Mrs. Elphick and Mrs. Oliver Marks.

The activities of the Appeal Committee have of necessity been seriously hampered, not only by the prevailing economic depression, but also by the urgent needs for funds to maintain the general income of the Hospital, which was faced with a heavy deficit. Bearing these facts in mind, it is satisfactory to note the progress which the Appeal Fund has made during the year.

This has inevitably led to some reduction in the total number of new out-patients seen. Provision has, however, been made to ensure that patients who desire a second opinion and who are unable to pay consultants' fees, may have ready access to the Out-patient Department, even though they may not be in possession of a doctor's letter. The Board's view in this matter is that there ought not to be any restriction whatever which might preclude any patient, who is unable to pay the necessary fee for a private consultation, from being able to come to the Hospital and secure an examination by a Senior Medical Officer. The reorganisation of the administrative arrangements for registration, &c., in the Out-patient Department, which was put into operation at the beginning of this year, has worked satisfactorily and added considerably to the comfort of the patients and the efficient working of the Department.

Dr. More Gosse and the Secretary gave evidence on behalf of the Hospital before the Committee appointed by King Edward's Hospital Fund for London to enquire into out-patient methods; a Sub-Committee of that Committee visited the Hospital and were much interested in the revised arrangements for the reception and registration of out-patients.

Arrangements have been made, under a scheme approved by the London County Council, for the establishment, as from the 1st April, 1933, of an all-day Venereal Diseases Clinic, in place of the part-time evening clinics previously held. The question of the establishment of such a clinic was one of considerable importance, not only from the point of view of adequate facilities being provided for the neighbourhood, but also from that of medical education. The Board is indebted to Dr. Wilson, the Dean of the Medical School, for bringing these negotiations to a successful conclusion. In order to provide suitable accommodation, extensive internal structural alterations, involving an expenditure of £3,750, were necessary, plans for which were prepared by Sir Edwin Cooper, A.R.A., F.R.I.B.A. Under the new scheme, the London County Council has undertaken to increase their annual grant for the maintenance of the Venereal Diseases Department from £2,000 to £3,100.

The prevailing economic conditions have adversely affected the amount of contributions received from patients, and there is a fall of nearly £1,500, as compared with the previous year. The Board of Management has at all times been most anxious to avoid financial hardship being imposed on any patient by reason of his stay in Hospital, and admission is entirely free to persons who after enquiry are found to be too poor to make any contribution.

Valuable help has been given by the Hospital Saving Association and the Hospital Saturday Fund. Anyone whose income is within certain limits can make small weekly payments to these Associations and in return receive free Hospital treatment when necessary. In that event the Association makes a grant to the Hospital which in many cases is much greater than the patients themselves would have been in a position to contribute. The growth of the Hospital Saving Association in London has been remarkable, and their grants to the Hospital have shown a steady and continuous increase from £2,267 in 1928, to £6,325 in 1932. It is clear that these grants are becoming an increasingly

important factor as a normal and dependable source of income to the Hospital.

### FINANCE.

#### Income.

The deficit on the Income and Expenditure Account is £7,540 which is the largest deficit the Hospital has experienced since 1928. The seriousness of these losses is aggravated because this is the third year in succession in which there has been insufficient income to meet the normal expenditure of the Hospital. The total of the deficit for these three years now amounts to £13,400. The outstanding feature has been the continuous and steady decline in the sums received from legacies, and the total of £3,325 under this heading for the current year compares with £3,135 in 1931, £10,650 in 1930 and £12,612 in 1929. Donations show some increase but annual subscriptions have fallen from £4,900 in 1931 to £4,718 in 1930 and £4,718 in 1929. The financial position of the Hospital is therefore one of most serious anxiety if not alarm, for it is clearly impossible for the Hospital to maintain even its existing services unless additional sources of revenue can be secured.

It will not be out of place again to remind subscribers that without any extra expense whatever to themselves they can increase substantially the amount of their subscriptions by completing a form of agreement to contribute for seven years or during life, whichever shall be the shorter period. Full particulars will gladly be furnished upon application to the Secretary of the Hospital.

It is gratifying to note that the £2,500 West Fund of the Hospital still continues to grow. Annual contributions from the Old Patients' Association have reached a total of £1,000, thus completing the endowment in addition to the sum now permanently endowed by the Association. Dr. W. F. Hunt generously undertook the gift of a room at a bed in Chamberlayne Ward in memory of his mother, who was for so many years the beloved nurse-in-charge of the ward.

Arrangements have been made, under a scheme approved by the London County Council, for the establishment, as from the 1st April 1927 of an all-day Venereal Diseases Clinic in place of the present evening clinic previously held. The question of the establishment of such a clinic has one of the most important aspects not only from the point of view of adequate facilities being provided for the neighbourhood, but also from that of medical attention. The Board is indebted to Dr. Wilson, the Dean of the Medical School, for making these arrangements to a successful conclusion. In order to provide suitable accommodation, extensive internal structural alterations, involving an expenditure of £25,000, were necessary, plans for which were prepared by Sir Edwin Cooper, A.R.C.S., F.R.C.S. Under the new scheme the London County Council has undertaken to increase their annual grant for the maintenance of the Venereal Diseases Department from £3,000 to £3,500.

The prevailing economic conditions have adversely affected the amount of contributions received from patients, and there is a fall of nearly 50 per cent. as compared with the previous year. The Board of Management has at all times endeavoured to avoid financial hardship being imposed on any patient by reason of his stay in Hospital, and admission is granted free to persons who after enquiry are found to be too poor to make any contribution.

Grants have been given by the Hospital Saving Association and the Hospital Saturday Fund. Anyone who is unable to obtain relief, can make small weekly payments to these Associations and in return receive free Hospital treatment when necessary. In that event the Association makes a grant to the Hospital which is many times as much as if the patients themselves would have been in a position to contribute. The growth of the Hospital Saving Association in London has been remarkable, and their grants to the Hospital have shown a steady and continuous increase from £2,000 in 1925, to £6,000 in 1932. It is clear that these grants are becoming an increasingly

important factor as a normal and dependable source of income to the Hospital.

## FINANCE.

### Income.

The deficit on the Income and Expenditure Account is £7,346 which is the largest deficit the Hospital has experienced since 1926. The seriousness of these figures is aggravated because this is the third year in succession in which there has been insufficient income to meet the normal expenditure of the Hospital. The total of the deficit for these three years now amounts to £13,185. The outstanding feature has been the continuous and steady decline in the sums received from legacies and the total of £5,526 under this heading for the current year compares with £9,135 in 1931, £10,630 in 1930 and £16,612 in 1929. Donations show some increase, but Annual Subscriptions have fallen from £4,980 in 1931 to £4,748 after having reached a total of £5,022 in 1930. The financial position is therefore one for most serious anxiety if not alarm, for it is clearly impossible for the Hospital to maintain even its existing services unless additional sources of revenue can be secured.

It will not be out of place again to remind subscribers that without any extra expense whatever to themselves they can increase substantially the amount of their subscriptions by completing a form of agreement to contribute for seven years or during life, whichever shall be the shorter period. Full particulars will gladly be forwarded upon application to the Secretary of the Hospital.

It is gratifying to note that the Endowment Fund of the Hospital still continues to grow. Annual Subscriptions from the Old Patients' Association have reached a total of £2,000, thus completing the endowment in addition to the two cots previously endowed by the Association. Dr. W. T. Hunt generously undertook the life endowment of a bed in Thistlethwayte Ward in memory of his late wife who was for so many years the beloved Sister in Charge of the Ward,

The Public Trustee has forwarded a sum of £700 on account of the endowment of a bed under the terms of the will of the late Mr. Reuben Smith. The Directors of the United Dairies, Ltd., have also been so good as to undertake the annual endowment of a bed, thus adding to the growing list of firms in the neighbourhood served by the Hospital who give such valuable help in this manner to the work of the Institution.

It is a matter of deep regret that scattered accommodation and lack of adequate recreation facilities hinders the full development of the corporate life of the Nursing Staff, but it is hoped that the erection of a section of the new Nurses' Home will remove at least some of the existing difficulties. Notwithstanding these difficulties clear evidence is given of the sound spirit of co-operation and enterprise existing amongst the Nursing Staff by the readiness with which volunteers have been obtained to assist in the various functions which have taken place during the year. Teams entered for the Inter-Hospital competitions and Nurses from the Hospital assisted in the Pageant showing the history of nursing organised by the College of Nursing in June, 1932, the Medical Pageant during the Medical Congress, and also in the numerous events organised on behalf of the Hospital, notably in connection with Flag Day and the Golf Ball.

The General Committee have endeavoured to give as wide publicity as possible to the objects of the Memorial Fund. An appeal made to the boys' public schools by General Sir Hubert Gough and the Earl of Munster produced a sum of £132. In addition, later in the year a Wonderland League, with Mrs. Hargreaves (the original "Alice") as Patron and Mrs. Cecil Harmsworth, Chief Cheshire Cat, was established whereby children upon receipt of a minimum subscription of 1s. were able to secure membership. Over 8,000 members have already been enrolled. A special centenary edition of "Alice in Wonderland," with a view to assisting the Fund, was produced by Messrs. MacMillan & Co., to which Mr. Hugh Walpole kindly contributed a preface. Useful publicity was also given to the appeal by Messrs. Bumpus during the Lewis Carroll Centenary Exhibition held at their premises in June. The Lewis Carroll Memorial Fund Committee are most grateful for the gift of £300 received from the British Broadcasting Corporation, Children's Hospital Wireless Fund, and to the *Daily Mirror* Children's League for their donation of £500.

Certain centres have been organised in the provinces, and the Committee are indebted to Mrs. Shawyer, who has done such excellent work in Oxford for the Fund.

Throughout all the activities of the Committee generous help has been given by Professor B. J. Collingwood, who is a nephew of Lewis Carroll.

Many activities of the Appeal, notably a canvass of all the girls' schools throughout the country, are still being organised, but approximately the position of the Fund at the end of December was that there was a sum of £3,000 in hand after payment of all outstanding expenses. It is the hope of the Lewis Carroll Memorial Fund Committee to establish and endow a Children's Ward specially dedicated to the memory of Lewis Carroll, in which lovers of "Alice" throughout the world will have for all time a special interest. A suggested design for the Ward is enclosed in this Report. The Board of Management feel that it is an especial privilege that the

Memorial to one beloved throughout the world as a friend of children should have taken a form so closely associated with the work of the Hospital.

### MEDICAL SCHOOL

The entry of full-course students during the Academic Year 1931-32 again showed an increase over the previous year being 59 as compared with 52 of the year 1930-31.

During the year 1931-32 the number of full-course students working in the Medical School and Hospital was 284 and 77 others attended for part courses during the same period.

During 1932, 30 students obtained the Degrees of M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., in the Conjoint Exam. At the London University eight students obtained the Degree of M.D. and gaining the University Medal, one obtained the Degree of M.S. and five others obtained the Degree of M.B. B.S. with Honours.

At Oxford one obtained the Degree of D.M. and one that of M.M., B.Ch.

Dr. W. Horst Brown was elected to the Radcliffe Traveling Fellowship of that University, and Mr. J. W. Lambell to the Radcliffe Scholarship in Therapeutics.

At Cambridge three obtained the Degree of M.D. (Ch.)

The hope expressed a year ago that the rebuilding of the Medical School would be completed by the end of this year has not been fulfilled, and work is still being carried on in the old buildings. It is hoped, however, that it may be possible to finish the work in time for the beginning of the next year.

In Athletics the members of the College have done well in the last during the past year. The College Football Team again retained the title for the Inter-Hospital Cup.

The Council Committee have endeavoured to give as wide publicity as possible to the objects of the Memorial Fund. An appeal made to the boys public schools by means of the *Boys' Own Paper* and the *East of England* produced a large amount of interest. In addition later in the year a *Wonderland* magazine with Mrs. Magruder the original Alice as heroine and Mrs. Cecil Hargreaves, Chief Cashier, was published whereby children upon receipt of a minimum subscription of 1s. were able to secure membership. Over 1000 members have already been enrolled. A special *Wonderland* number of "Alice in Wonderland," with a view to raising the fund, was produced by Messrs. Mackintosh Co., in which Mr. Hugh Wilson kindly contributed a preface. Special publicity was also given to the appeal by Messrs. Hooper during the Lewis Carroll Centenary Exhibition held at their premises in June. The Lewis Carroll Memorial Fund Committee are most grateful for the gift of £100 received from the British Broadcasting Corporation, Children's Hospital Weymouth Fund, and to the *Daily Mirror*, Children's League for their donation of £50.

Certain duties have been assumed by the provinces, and the Committee are indebted to Mrs. Shawyer, who has done such excellent work in Oxford for the Fund.

Throughout all the activities of the Committee generous help has been given by Professor B. J. Collingwood, who is a nephew of Lewis Carroll.

Many activities of the Appeal, notably a canvass of all the public schools throughout the country, are still being organised, but approximately the position of the Fund at the end of December was that there was a sum of £1086 in hand after payment of all outstanding expenses. It is the hope of the Lewis Carroll Memorial Fund Committee to establish and endow a "Lewis Carroll's Ward" specially dedicated to the memory of Lewis Carroll, in which lovers of "Alice" throughout the world will have for all time a special interest. A suggested scheme for the Ward is enclosed in this Report. The Board of Management feel that it is an especial privilege that the

Memorial to one beloved throughout the world as a friend of children should have taken a form so closely associated with the work of the Hospital.

### MEDICAL SCHOOL.

The entry of full-course students during the Academic Year 1931-32 again showed an increase over the previous year, being 59, as compared with 55 in the year 1930-31.

During the year 1931-32 the number of full-course students working in the Medical School and Hospital was 254 and 77 others attended for part courses during the same period.

During 1932, 30 students obtained the Diplomas of M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., at the Conjoint Board. At the London University eight students obtained the Degree of M.D. (one gaining the University Medal), one obtained the Degree of M.S., and five others obtained the Degrees of M.B., B.S. (one with Honours).

At Oxford one obtained the Degree of D.M., and one that of B.M., B.Ch.

Dr. W. Hurst Brown was elected to the Radcliffe Traveling Fellowship of that University, and Mr. J. W. Litchfield to the Radcliffe Scholarship in Pharmacology.

At Cambridge three obtained the Degrees of M.B., B.Ch.

The hope expressed a year ago that the rebuilding of the Medical School would be completed by the end of 1932 has not been fulfilled, and work is still being carried on in the old buildings. It is hoped, however, that it may be possible to make the move in time for the Summer Session.

In Athletics the members of the School have been well to the front during the past year. The Rugby Football Team again reached the Final for the Inter-Hospital Cup.

The Sailing Club are joint holders with St. Bartholomew's Hospital of the Inter-Hospital Sailing Cup, the Rifle Club gained the Challenge Cup of the United Hospitals Rifle Club, and members of the Athletic Club brought back from the Inter-Hospital Sports Meeting the Challenge Cups for the 440 yards Hurdles, and for the Mile, as well as the Princess Marie Louise Challenge Cup for the best individual performance.

### INOCULATION DEPARTMENT.

The Out-Patient Section of this Department continues to grow and the attendances during 1932 were 12,654 as compared with 11,903 in 1931 and 9,880 in 1930—an increase of about 28 per cent. in two years. When the Department was first instituted, in 1906, chronic tuberculosis, furunculosis and acne represented by far the largest proportion of the diseases treated, but vaccine therapy has extended far beyond these limits and now embraces practically all bacterial disease. The clinics are attended largely by patients suffering from rheumatism, arthritis, recurrent colds, bronchitis, asthma, hay fever and intestinal toxæmia.

It is hoped that in the early part of 1933 the new accommodation for Out-Patients will be available and thus end the difficulties under which the Department has had to work for a number of years. The new laboratories are also approaching completion and at an early date the Inoculation Department will vacate the accommodation which it has occupied in the Clarence Wing of the Hospital since 1907. In this connection, it is of interest to note that the laboratories where, in the past, important work has been carried out with regard to puerperal sepsis will now become maternity wards.

Owing to lack of funds it has not been possible to complete the interior of the whole of the new Pathological Institute. The main Lecture Theatre and a portion of two of the upper floors will, for the present, remain uncompleted. The Lecture Theatre is the largest in the new buildings

and is the only one suitable for the meeting of a large society such as the Biochemical and Pathological Societies. A sum of £1,250 is required for the work, and it is hoped that some generous benefactor will come forward so that the new Lecture Theatre may be available for use in the near future.

Active research work on the many problems connected with bacteriology and vaccine therapy continues to be carried out by Sir Almroth Wright and his colleagues as is evidenced by the various contributions made to the scientific literature on the subject. The new Pathological Institute will remove the grave difficulty of inadequate laboratory accommodation which has so much hampered the work of the Department in the past.

#### HONORARY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL STAFF.

When the Department was first instituted, in 1908, chronic tuberculosis, bronchitis and emphysema were by far the largest proportion of the diseases treated, but vaccine therapy has extended far beyond these limits and now embraces practically all bacterial diseases. The viruses are attended largely by patients suffering from rheumatism, arthritis, recurrent colds, influenza, measles, hay fever and infectious toxicities.

It is hoped that in the early part of 1933 the new accommodation for Out-Patients will be available and thus end the sub-optimal order which the Department has had to work for a number of years. The new laboratories are also approaching completion and at an early date the inoculation department will vacate the accommodation which it has occupied in the Cottage Wing of the Hospital since 1907. In this connection it is of interest to note that the laboratory work in the past important work has been carried out with regard to the year's season and now become materially more

Later in the year, Dr. Justina Wilson, F.R.C.P. (Edin.), D.M.R.E., was appointed to the office of

Medical Officer-in-charge of the Electro-Therapeutic Department. It is of interest to note that Dr. Justina Wilson is the first woman in the history of the Hospital to be appointed a member of the Honorary Medical Staff.

Owing to the operation of the age limit, Dr. J. H. Chaldecott, L.R.C.P., F.R.F.P.S., retired from the office of Anæsthetist, and was appointed a Consulting Anæsthetist to the Hospital. Dr. Chaldecott had given long and faithful service to the Hospital for a great number of years, and his retirement is much regretted. In order to fill the vacancy caused by his retirement, Dr. L. H. Morris, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., was appointed one of the Honorary Anæsthetists to the Hospital for a first period of five years as from 5th January, 1933.

#### **VICE-PRESIDENTS.**

The Hospital has suffered a greivous loss through the death during the year of Mr. Arthur Prideaux, Mr. Joseph Stower, and Mr. F. M. Dutton, all of whom held the office of Vice-President.

Mr. Prideaux became a member of the Board of Management in 1908, and from 1917 to 1928 was its chairman. Upon his resignation from that office he was elected a Vice-President of the Hospital and maintained his close and active interest in the work of the Institution practically up to the time of his death. Kindly and lovable in disposition, his loss will be deeply felt by all his colleagues on the Board of Management. During his tenure of office as Chairman in the War and the difficult times which followed, his wise counsel and sound advice were of great value, and preparations were made for the purchase of the site adjoining the Hospital for the great extension of the Institution which is now in progress. The Board of Management record with gratitude their appreciation of the legacy of about £13,000 which will eventually be received under the terms of his will for the Endowment Fund of the Hospital.

A little earlier in the year occurred the death of Mr. Joseph Storer, who, without fee of any kind whatsoever, acted through the valuations and negotiations for the purchase of the Island site and, upon his death, he bequeathed the sum of £2000 in aid of the General Funds of the Hospital.

Mr. F. M. Dutton was for a number of years a Vice-President and, under the terms of his will, the Hospital received a legacy of £250 per annum.

It is with great pleasure that the Board of Management report that Sir Percy Shephard and Mr. W. R. Moon have been unanimously elected to the office of Vice-President. The Hospital is deeply indebted to Sir Percy Shephard and Mr. Moon for the generous gifts which have been received from time to time from that portion of the staff of the late Sir William Shephard which was bequeathed to the Hospital as such London Hospitals as the Trustees may, in their absolute discretion, select.

### ALMONER'S DEPARTMENT.

During 1932 the work of the department has developed along increasingly interesting and useful lines, although the actual number of patients assisted is not greatly in excess of previous years.

#### In-Patients.

The number of in-patients specially assisted during the year was 666, and of these 405 were sent to convalescent and other institutions. An analysis of these cases is given below :—

Of the 91 patients sent to various Convalescent Homes, 38 were men suffering from severe gastric trouble, who were sent to the Merchant Taylors' Home at Pagnier, where a special diet suited to their condition was given. The majority of these cases benefited so much from this treatment that they were able to return to their employment almost immediately on their discharge from the Home.

Two hundred and thirty-six surgical instruments have been provided at a total cost of £100. Of this sum £100 was spent on providing artificial legs for seven patients. In only one instance was amputation necessitated by disease, the other amputations being due to the heavy toll taken by street accidents in the Metropolitan area. The cost of a good artificial limb is considerable, and contributions from Insurance Societies and Charitable Societies are small, with the result that the task of raising large sums for the provision of suitable artificial limbs is not easy. The results, however, more than justify the labour involved, for the provision of a suitable artificial limb makes all the difference between a person becoming a dependent cripple or remaining a self-supporting member of the community.

There is yet another and more complicated problem presented by some of the occupants of the accident beds in the Hospital. Persons suffering from severe mental and nervous strain show a tendency to become more subject to street and other accidents, and the task of fitting them for life again is not completed when the necessary surgical treatment has been effected. The shattered nerves of mental breakdown still remain. It is at this stage that the Almoner can be of real service in carrying out any recommendation made by the Physician for Mental Diseases. Quite often a long rest at a specially selected Convalescent Home will rebuild a life which would otherwise be in pieces.

#### Out Patients.

The records show that 1,694 cases were dealt with during the year. There has been a slight increase in the number of patients sent to Convalescent Homes, the average

Of the 91 patients sent to various Convalescent Homes, 38 were men suffering from severe gastric trouble, who were sent to the Merchant Taylors' Home at Bognor, where a special diet suited to their condition was given. The majority of these cases benefited so much from this treatment that they were able to return to their employment almost immediately on their discharge from the Home.

Two hundred and thirty-six surgical instruments have been provided at a total cost of £444. Of this sum £133 was spent on providing artificial legs for seven patients. In only one instance was amputation necessitated by disease, the other amputations being due to the heavy toll taken by street accidents in the Metropolitan area. The cost of a good artificial limb is considerable, and grants obtained from Insurance Societies and Contributory Schemes are small, with the result that the task of raising large sums for the provision of suitable artificial limbs is not easy. The results, however, more than justify the labour involved, for the provision of a suitable artificial limb makes all the difference between a person becoming a dependent cripple or remaining a self-supporting member of the community.

There is yet another and more complicated problem presented by some of the occupants of the accident beds in the Hospital. Persons suffering from severe mental and nervous strain show a tendency to become more subject to street and other accidents, and the task of fitting them for life again is not completed when the necessary surgical treatment has been afforded. The shattered nerves or mental breakdown still remain. It is at this stage that the Almoner can be of real service in carrying out any recommendation made by the Physician for Mental Diseases. Quite often a long rest at a specially selected Convalescent Home will rebuild a life which would otherwise go to pieces altogether.

#### **Out-Patients.**

The records show that 1,429 cases were dealt with during the year. There has been a slight increase in the number of patients sent to Convalescent Homes, the average

length of stay for children being between six and twelve weeks, and for adults three weeks.

Seven hundred and fifty-five instruments have been provided for out-patients at a total cost of £925. Valuable assistance in connection with children's convalescence has been given by the Invalid Children's Aid Association, and generous grants have been made by various Charitable Societies.

In view of the increased accommodation which is to be provided for maternity cases at the Hospital, it may be useful to publish some statistics for 1932, and also to indicate some of the ways in which an Almoner may be of use in the organisation of the Maternity Department. Five hundred and forty-two maternity cases were dealt with in 1932. The Almoner, in interviewing and obtaining a thumb-nail social sketch from each new ante-natal patient, in making her aware of some of the excellent provisions which exist for the benefit of expectant mothers through Maternity and Child Welfare schemes, has ample scope to collect information as to home conditions, and, if these are unfavourable, to seek the advice and help of the medical staff with regard to plans for their amelioration. Adverse conditions may be constituted by dirt, disease or overcrowding. There may be also acute anxieties in personal relationships. These are particularly likely to occur when older relatives are living in the same house, producing daily difficult domestic situations. Very often the expectant mother needs only to discuss fully these matters, for difficulties shared frequently are difficulties halved. In other cases extensive plans have sometimes been made, as for example a whole family of young children may have to be accommodated in a Babies' Hostel or Homes or boarded out during such time as the mother is in Hospital.

The delicate wife of an unemployed man may need not only free milk but also extra nourishment prior to confinement. This also the Almoner must arrange. The problems of convalescence and rest, if ordered by the physician, have also to be solved and need much careful planning if the physician's instructions are to be carried out in an adequate manner.



length of stay for children being between six and twelve weeks, and for adults three weeks.

Some limited and fifty-five instruments have been provided for the patients at a total cost of 1935. Valuable assistance in connection with children's convalescence has been given by the Hospital Children's Aid Association and generous gifts have been made by various charitable bodies.

In view of the increased accommodation which is to be provided for maternity cases at the Hospital it may be useful to publish some statistics for 1932, and also to indicate some of the ways in which an Almoner may be of use to the Hospital staff. The Maternity Department has handled and delivered two hundred cases with a view to 1932. The Almoner in interviewing and obtaining a thorough medical history for each patient has found it necessary to make arrangements for nursing and medical treatment, and to make arrangements for the benefit of expectant mothers through Maternity and Child Welfare schemes, her principal scope to collect information as to home conditions, and if these are unfavourable to seek the advice and help of the medical staff with regard to plans for their improvement. Adverse conditions may be caused by financial difficulties or overcrowding. There may be also acute anxieties in personal relationships. These are particularly likely to occur when other relatives are living in the same home, producing daily difficult domestic situations. Very often the expectant mother needs only to discuss fully these matters for difficulties which frequently are discovered to have been solved. In other cases various plans have sometimes been made, as for example a whole family of young children may have to be accommodated in a Nurses' Hostel or Home or boarded out during such time as the mother is in Hospital.

The delicate life of an unemployed man has been touched upon here, but also the maintenance of a family and the Almoner's part in the Almoner's work. It has been seen how in such a case the Almoner may be of use to the Hospital staff in a variety of ways, and it is hoped that the Almoner's work will be carried out in an efficient manner.

### THE LADIES' ASSOCIATION.

During the year £409 10s. 7d. has been expended on 152 ward blankets, 450 linen sheets, 250 twill sheets, 800 linen pillow slips, 644 towels, 100 white counterpanes and 800 stone cloths for use in the Hospital, in addition to cash grants for £93 7s. 5d. for flannel and £16 13s. 8d. for wool for the making of garments for the patients.

“Pound Day” was held on 17th March, when Mrs. Oates and Mrs. Cope very kindly were in charge of the arrangements. Over £316 was received in cash, whilst the total of the groceries, &c., received amounted to nearly four tons, large and generous contributions being received from the children in schools in the neighbourhood of the Hospital.

In the year 1884 Mr. George Sturge, of Woodthorpe, Sydenham Hill Road, executed a Deed of Trust conveying to St. Mary's Hospital £926 \*Great Eastern Railway 5 per Cent. Preference Stock, representing one thousand pounds (£1,000), under the following conditions :—

“ In giving the sum of £1,000 for a Samaritan Fund for the above Hospital, Mr. Sturge gives it on the conditions that this Fund shall be kept entirely separate from the General Funds of the Hospital, and that the income shall be paid to, or applied for, such In-Patients as may be necessitous, and within three months from their discharge from the Hospital, and for the purpose of their having necessary nourishment, clothing, or change of air.”

“ Mr. Sturge hopes that this Fund may be made known and that others may be induced to subscribe to it.”

named in the will, or to their legal representatives.

## THE MATERNITY

Annual Subscribers of One Guinea, or Donors of Ten Guineas to the MATERNITY FUND, may recommend three Patients annually to the Maternity, and so on in proportion to the amount of the subscription.

## ATTENDANCE OF PATIENTS

Applications are treated as In-Patients, or Out-Patients at the discretion of the Medical and Surgical Staff, and as the nature of the case and the state of the Wards may permit.

Accidents and other cases deemed urgent by the Medical Staff are (as far as space permits) admitted without Letters.

Holders of Letters are not admitted as In-Patients unless they present their Letters at the Hospital at 1 o'clock on the day of admission.

Much inconvenience having resulted from the admission of the Medical Staff of Patients from a distance, without notice, it is requested that the case of Patients coming from places at some distance from the Hospital, and requiring communication with the Hospital, should be given notice to the Maternity Office before the Patient intends to apply for admission. Medical Certificates stating as fully as possible the nature of the case.

Visiting hours: Adults—Wednesday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and Public Holidays, from 2 to 4.

## THE MATERNITY.

Annual Subscribers of One Guinea, or *Donors* of Ten Guineas to the MATERNITY FUND, may recommend three Patients annually *to that department*; and so on in proportion to the amount of the subscription.

## ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Applicants are treated as In-Patients or Out-Patients at the discretion of the Medical and Surgical Staff, and as the accommodation available in the Wards may permit.

*Accidents* and other cases deemed urgent by the Medical Officers are (so far as space permits) admitted without Letters at all times.

Holders of Letters seeking admission as In-Patients must present their Letters at the Hospital at 1 o'clock (Sundays excepted).
