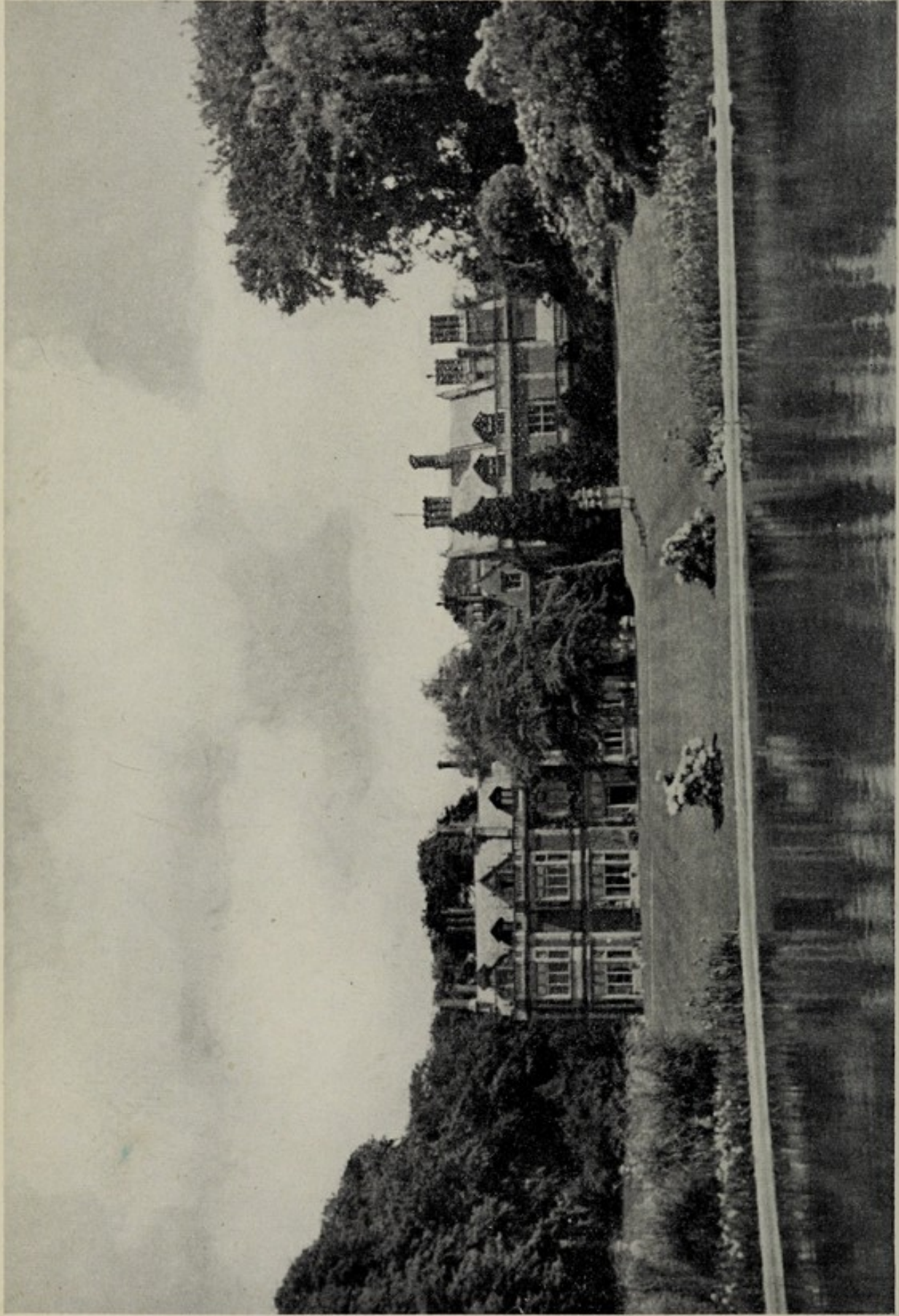
Surely there can be no fitter memorial of a departed relative or friend than the endowment of a Bed or Cot in a Hospital.

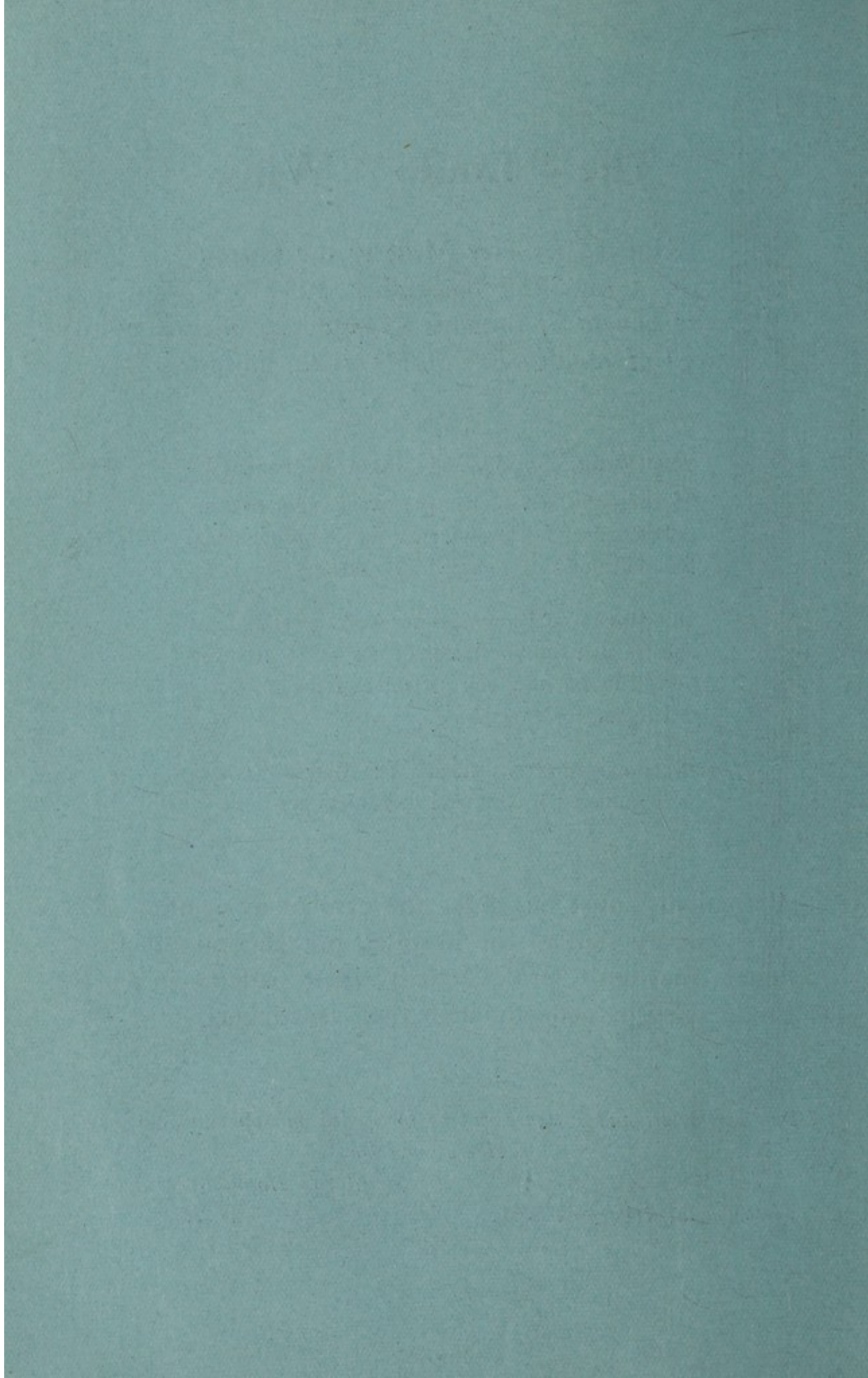

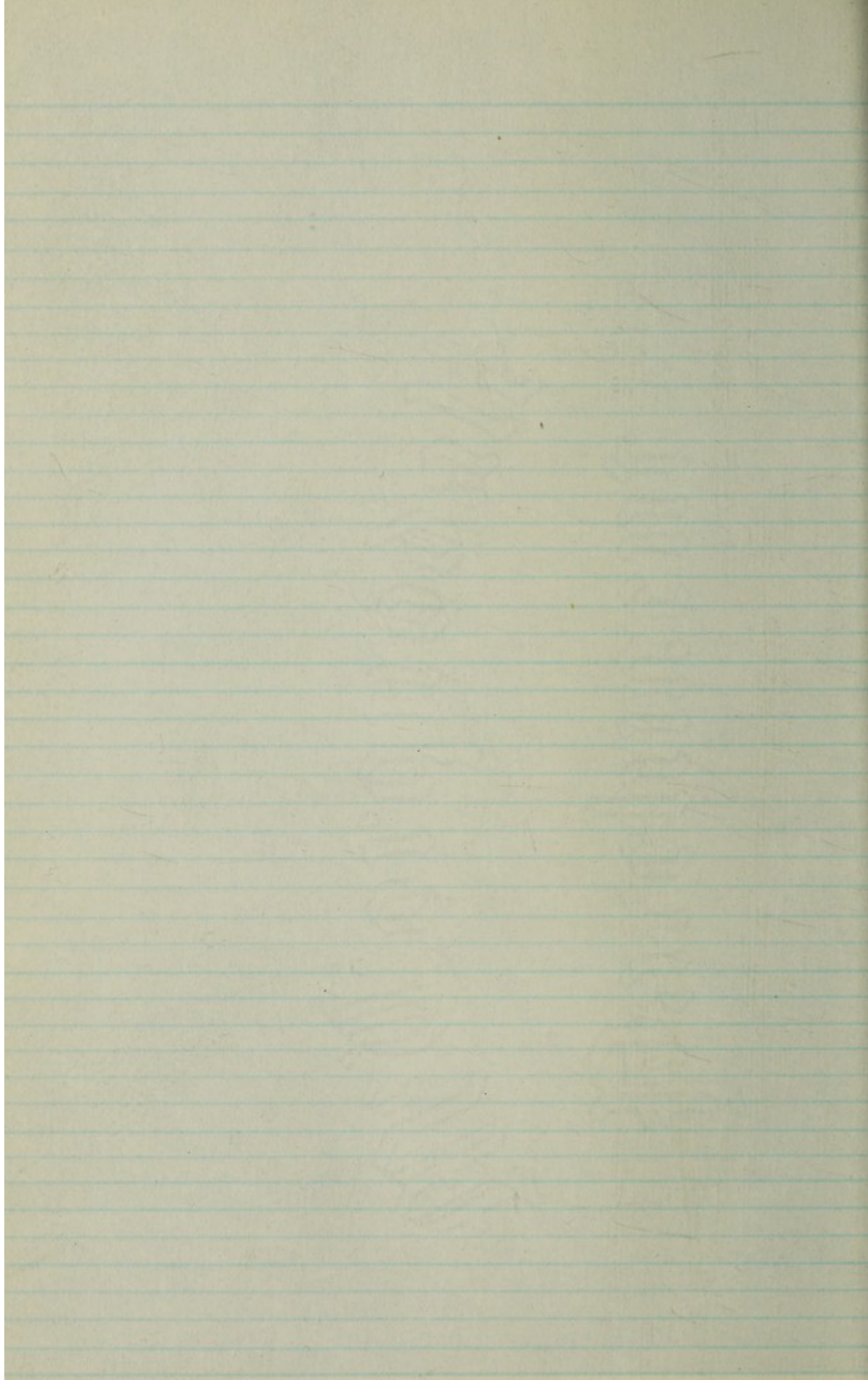

DEVELOPMENT OF THE HOSPITAL.

(a) Gift of Joyce Grove, Nettlebed, as a Convalescent Home.

The outstanding event of the year in the development of the Hospital has been the gift, through the good offices of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, and the personal generosity of members of the late Mrs. Robert Fleming's family, of Joyce Grove, Nettlebed, near Henley, with some thirty acres of garden, for use as a Convalescent Home for patients.

The house is some forty miles distant from London, but is readily accessible from the Hospital by road, and the journey can be made by car in 1½ hours. Joyce Grove is a large house of comparatively recent construction, consisting of seven reception rooms, 36 bedrooms and numerous out-houses. It would be difficult to find a site with more typical and extended views of rural England.

The Medical Committee reported that the house was, in every way, suitable for use as a Convalescent Home and would prove of the greatest value for patients. The possession of such a Home would facilitate the transfer of suitable cases, and in this way set free a number of beds which otherwise would not be available in the Hospital for the admission of acute cases.

The Board of Management concurred in this view, but were gravely concerned at the additional expenditure which would inevitably be entailed in the maintenance of Joyce Grove as a Convalescent Home, especially in the initial stages.

Upon representations being made, contributions amounting to £2,050 per annum for the maintenance of the House as a Convalescent Home were promised, including one of £1,000 per annum for seven years given with characteristic generosity by Lord Nuffield. The immediate financial anxieties being therefore removed the Board of Management was in a position gratefully to accept the offer of Joyce Grove, so generously made by members of the late Mrs. Robert Fleming's family, and is deeply indebted to Mr. Peter Fleming for all the time and trouble he has been so good as to give to the matter. It is hoped that the Hospital will enter into possession on the 1st January, 1940, and early in that year there will be available accommodation for some 30 to 40 patients in need of convalescent treatment.

There is no doubt that these facilities will confer great benefit on a large number of patients who receive treatment at St. Mary's Hospital, and that, in future, as development takes place, Joyce Grove will play an increasingly important part in the Hospital's work.

View from Bayou Grove, Westfield (Mass. History)

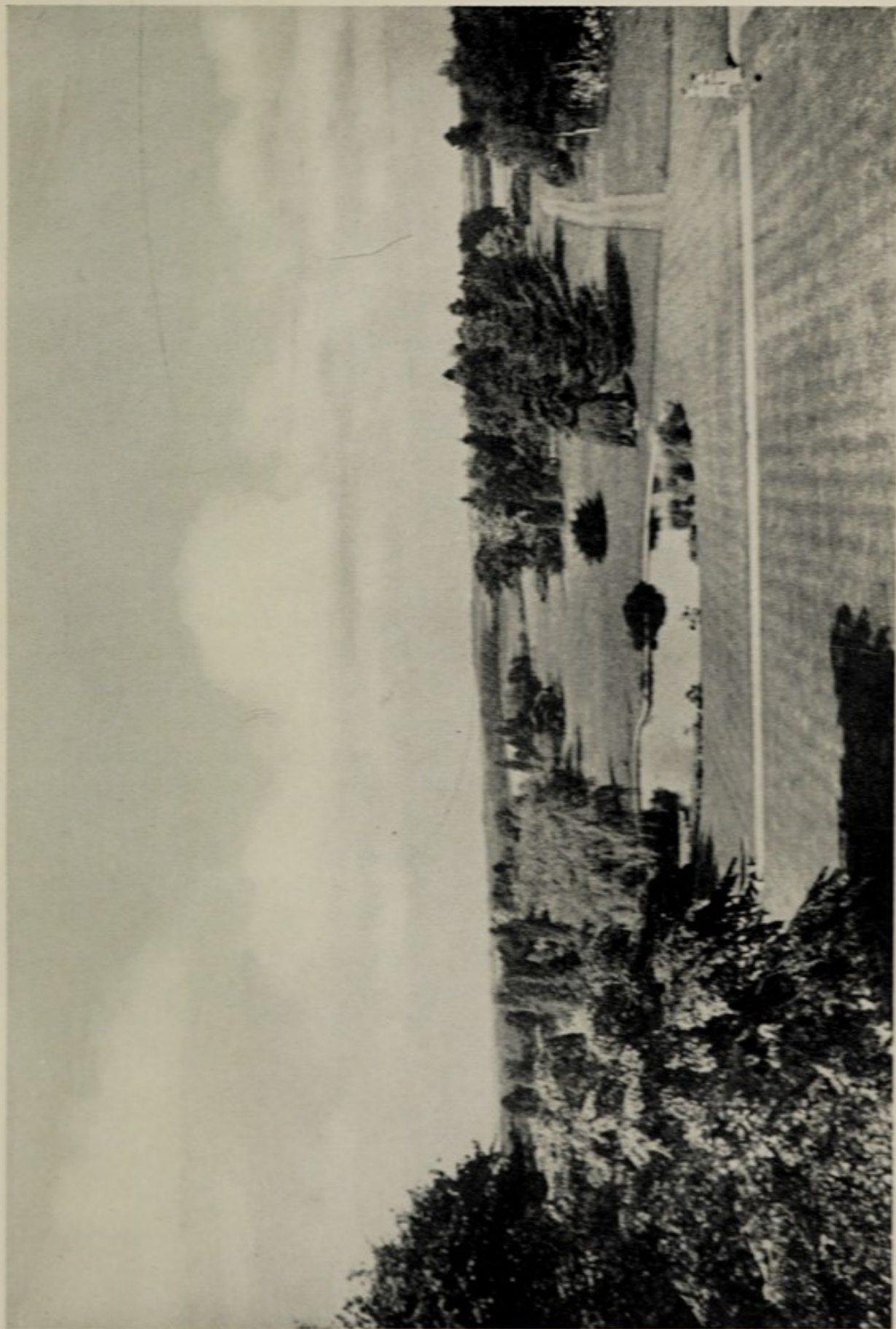

The possession of such a home would greatly increase the number of suitable cases which could be treated at the Hospital, and it was felt that the Board would be well advised to accept the offer of Joyce Grove as a Convalescent Home, especially in the present season.

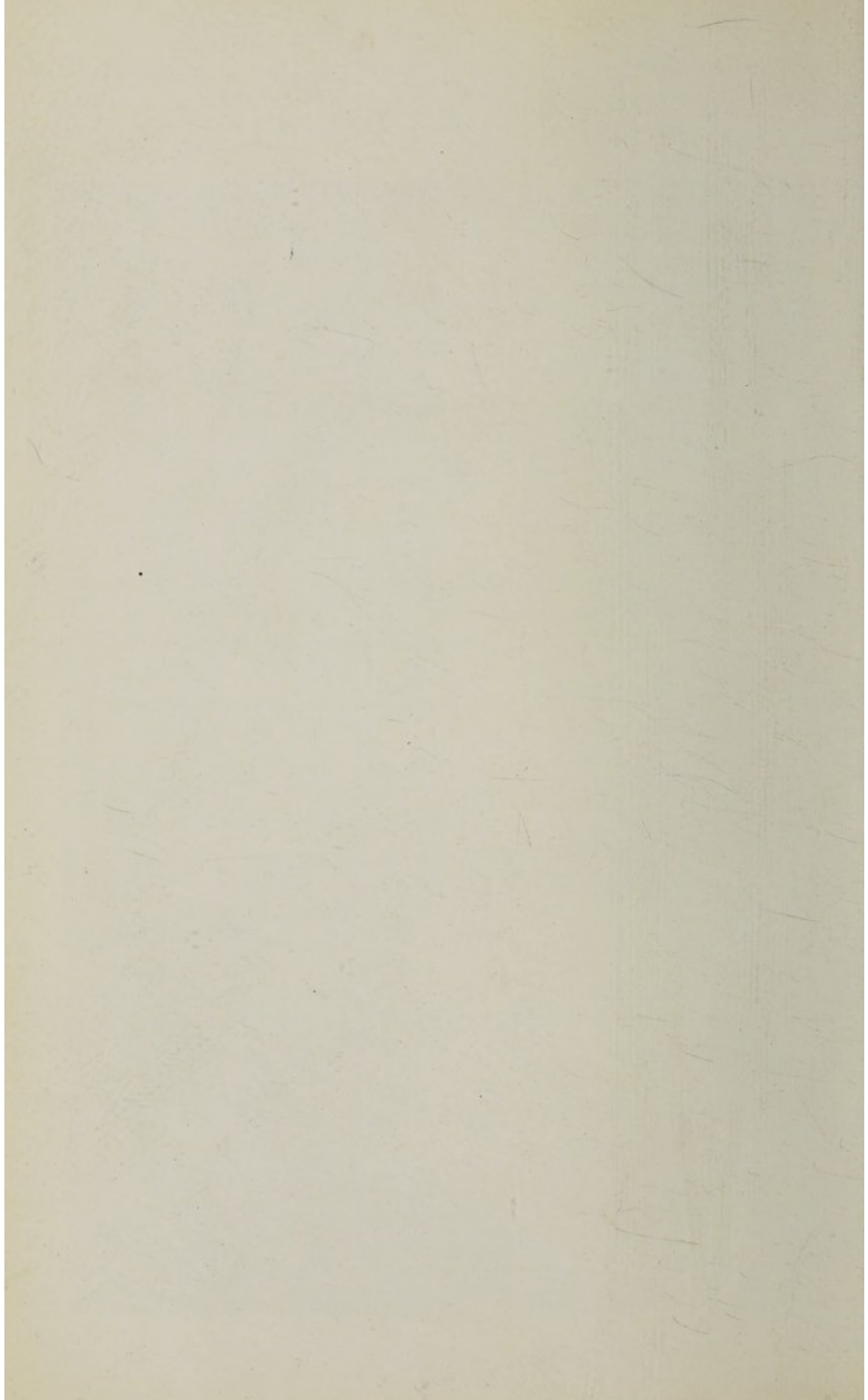
The Board of Management considered this offer, but were unable to agree on the financial arrangements which would have to be made in the matter. It was, however, agreed as a preliminary step, especially in the present season,

that arrangements being made, and a sum of £1,000 per annum for the maintenance of the House as a Convalescent Home were provided, including one of £1,000 per annum for seven years given with characteristic generosity by Lord Nuffield. The immediate financial difficulties being thereby removed, the Board of Management was in a position practically to accept the offer of Joyce Grove, so long as the offer was made by the late Mrs. Robert Fleming's family, and a check was issued to Mr. Peter Fleming for all the time and expenses which he has had to give to the matter. It is hoped that the Hospital will enter into possession of the House in January, 1940, and early in that year there will be available accommodation for some 30 to 40 patients in need of convalescent treatment.

There is no doubt that these facilities will confer great benefit on a large number of patients who require treatment at St. Mary's Hospital, and that, in future, as development takes place, Joyce Grove will play an increasingly important part in the Hospital's work.

(b) **The Lindo Wing for Patients of Moderate Means.**

The year has seen the inauguration of the Lindo Wing. It has already proved an outstanding success, and at the end of the year there was a list of patients awaiting admission. There can be no doubt that the Wing is meeting, in a marked degree, a long-felt need for Hospital services for patients of moderate means; that is to say, those who are unable to afford full nursing-home and professional fees and yet are unsuitable for treatment in the ordinary wards of the Hospital. This was the desire of the donor, and an increasing number of patients will be ever grateful to the late Mr. Frank C. Lindo, whose generosity and far-seeing policy enabled these facilities to be provided. The Wing, by reason of his most generous gifts, is free from debt and is a worthy monument to one of the greatest benefactors St. Mary's has had since its foundation.

Much of the success is due to those members of the Lindo Wing Committee, who have taken so great a personal interest in its organisation. The Board of Management is especially grateful to Dr. A. Hope Gosse for his constant and unremitting efforts to ensure the smooth running of the medical arrangements. High tribute has been paid on numerous occasions to the work of the Nursing Staff, and the greatest possible credit is due to Matron and the Sister in charge of the Wing (Miss E. M. Bloss).

The Wing contains 66 bedrooms. There are two operating theatres. A well-equipped diagnostic X-Ray Department, reserved for private patients, is situated on the ground floor of the building. In the basement is the Main Kitchen, fitted with the latest equipment, and there is a direct electrically-heated food lift service to the Ward Kitchen on each floor. The Wing is an integral part of the Hospital, and all the services which a modern general Hospital provides are available for patients admitted to the Wing.

The bedrooms are heated by radiators and, when necessary, by electric fires. They are equipped for wireless and, if the patient so desires, a G.P.O. telephone is available.

There is a switch panel at the bedside, which includes a switch for the signal lights to call the attention of the Nursing Staff. Every effort is being made to ensure that each bedroom is as sound-proof as possible, and there are no bells.

Out of the 66 beds, 56 are allocated for the use of patients of moderate means. The charge for these rooms is at the rate of seven guineas a week, and there is a considerably reduced scale for all professional fees, clinical, radiological, pathological, massage, &c. The remaining ten beds—"unrestricted" at 12 guineas a week—are for patients who can afford to pay professional fees on the ordinary scale. Accommodation is also available for maternity cases at ten guineas and 15 guineas a week.

All patients admitted to the Wing must be under the care of a member of the Honorary Medical Staff of the Hospital, who will be responsible for their treatment. Medical Practitioners may, if they desire, visit their patients professionally, and so collaborate in their treatment with the member of the Staff in charge.

FIFTH ARMY MEMORIAL FUND.

The Appeal in support of the Fifth Army Memorial Fund was launched on the 21st March, *i.e.*, on the 20th Anniversary of the German offensive, which proved so great a trial of the courage and endurance of all ranks of the Fifth Army under the command of General Sir Hubert Gough. It had been decided that the Memorial should take the form of the endowment of two wards at St. Mary's, together with the erection of a canopy and tablet at the entrance to the Hospital. The Board of Management, on their part, undertook to grant preferential admission to these wards to men who had served in the Fifth Army, their wives and their children in need of Hospital treatment.

Through the generosity of the Proprietors of the "Daily Telegraph and Morning Post" wide publicity was secured for the Appeal. Messages commending the proposals were

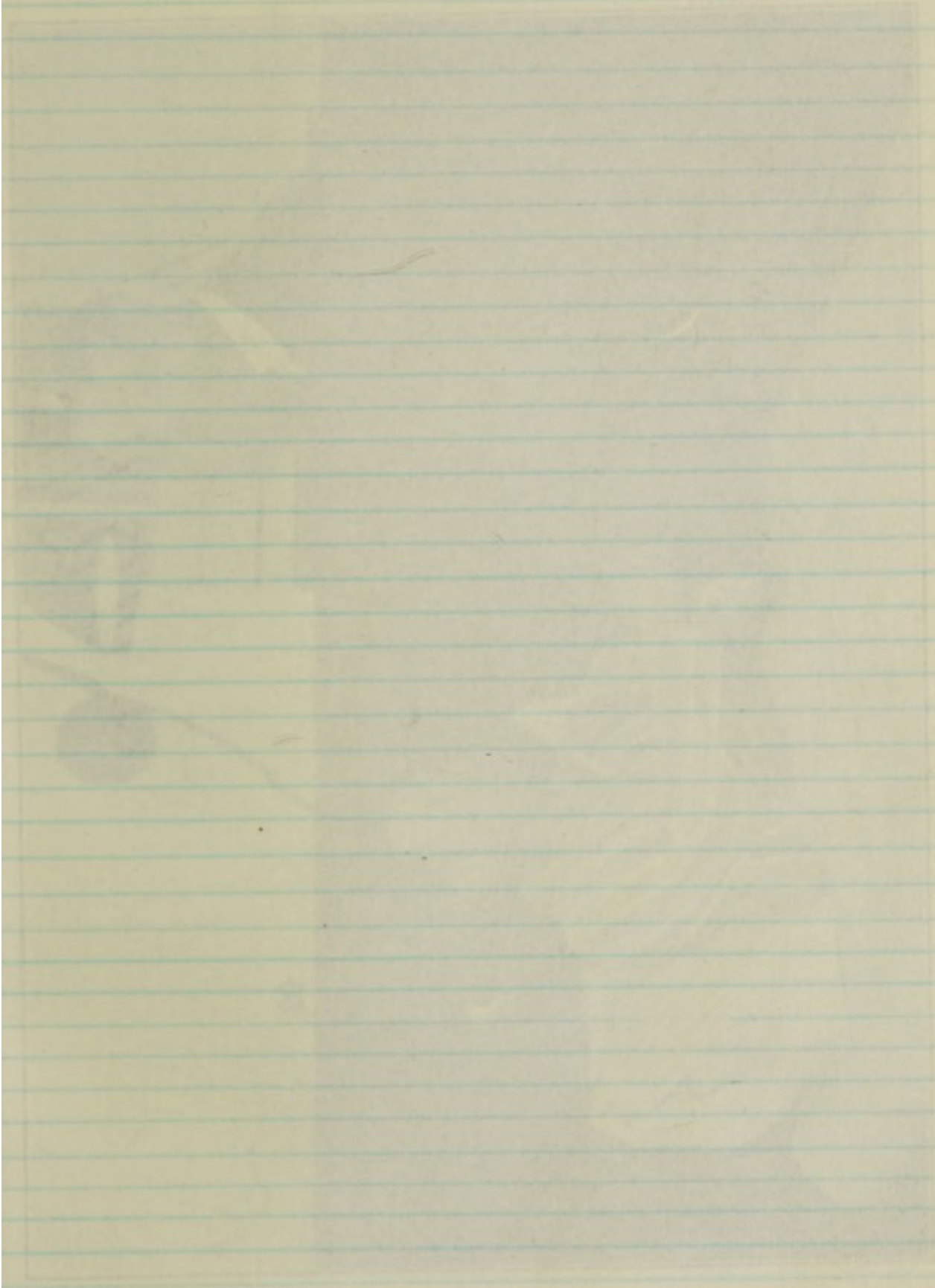


PLATE I

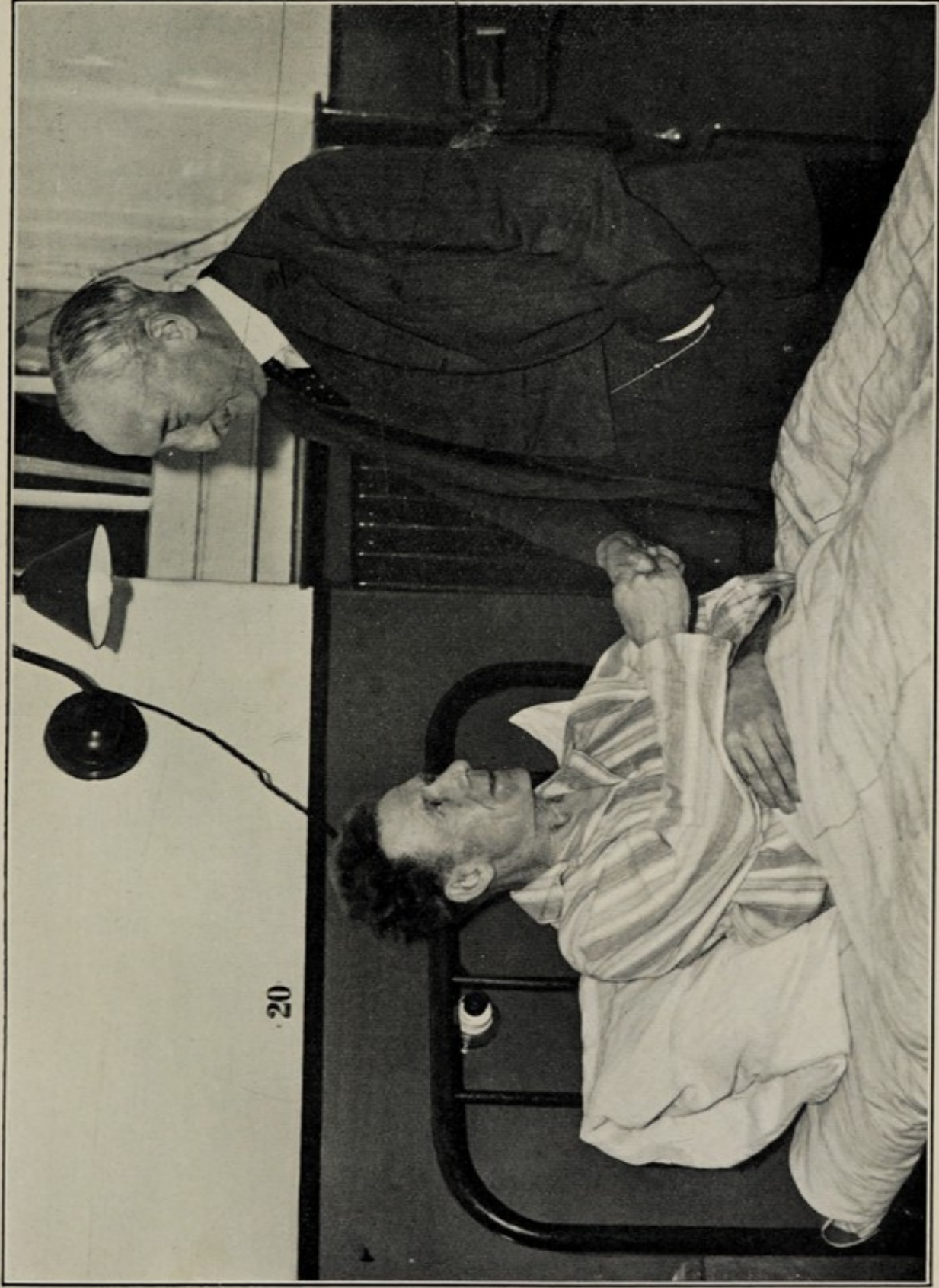

Accommodation is also available for temporary cases of ten guineas and 15 guineas a week.

All patients admitted to the Ward must be under the care of a member of the Honorary Medical Staff of the Hospital who will be responsible for their treatment. Medical Practitioners may, if they desire, visit their patients professionally, and so collaborate in their treatment with the member of the Staff in charge.

FIFTH ARMY MEMORIAL FUND.

The Appeal in support of the Fifth Army Memorial Fund was launched on the 21st March, 1919, on the 20th Anniversary of the German offensive which proved so great a trial of the courage and endurance of all ranks of the Fifth Army under the command of General Sir Herbert Kitchener. It had been decided that the Memorial should take the form of the endowment of two wards at St. Mary's, together with the erection of a canopy and tablet at the entrance to the Hospital. The Board of Management, on their part, undertook to grant preferential admission to these wards to men who had served in the Fifth Army, their wives and their children in need of hospital treatment.

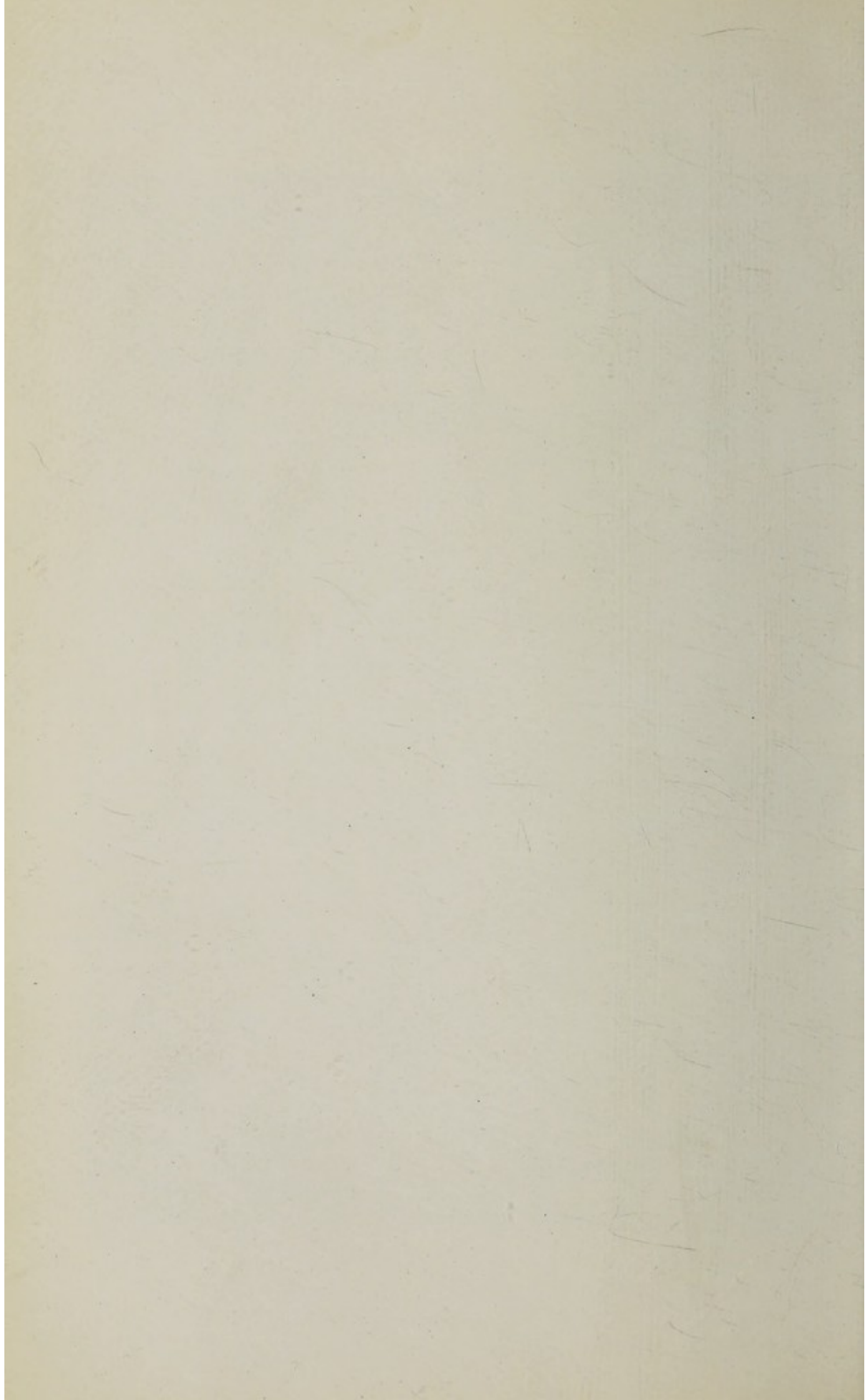
Through the generosity of the Proprietors of the "Daily Telegraph and Morning Post" wide publicity was secured for the Appeal. Managers commencing the project were

published from Her Majesty the Queen, the Rt. Hon. Winston Churchill, P.C., Lord Galway, the Rt. Hon. David Lloyd George, P.C., Lord Gowrie, Maréchal Pétain, the Rt. Hon. Sir John Simon, P.C., General the Rt. Hon. Jan C. Smuts, P.C., and others.

The response to the Appeal was immediate. Gifts were received from all parts of the world, including many from men who had served in the Fifth Army and numerous branches of the British Legion and Old Comrades' Associations. Many, too, were received in grateful memory of those who had fallen in the service of their country, and as a tribute to the various units which formed a part of the Fifth Army. Notable amongst such donations was a gift of £500 from Colonel A. Porritt, in memory of the 2/5th Battalion, East Lancashire Regiment, which he raised and commanded, and which as a unit of the 66th Division and Fifth Army did so well; also an anonymous gift of £500 for the endowment of a cot to "The memory of Arthur, 2nd Lieut., Oxford and Bucks Light Infantry, who fell at Villers au Flos, March 24th, 1918, aged nineteen—'All he had, he gave.'"

In spite of the difficult times which followed the inauguration of the Appeal, a sum of over £8,700 has already been received. It is earnestly hoped that this amount will be raised to £10,000 at an early date. The Memorial Fund Committee is deeply indebted to General Sir Hubert Gough for all the time and energy he has so ably devoted to the Appeal, and to Sir Henry Strakosch, Mr. Anthony de Rothschild, Mr. Guy Harben and Captain Williams for so kindly acting as Honorary Treasurers. The Committee also gratefully record their especial thanks to Lord Camrose, Brigadier the Hon. E. F. Lawson and the Staff of the "Daily Telegraph and Morning Post" for the great assistance which they gave in bringing the Appeal to the notice of the general public.

Typical of the help given to the Appeal has been the gift from Sir Philip Gibbs, who gave his fee for writing two special articles on the German offensive in March as a donation

to the Fund, and also the gift of the painting by Sir William Rothenstein of the portrait of General Sir Hubert Gough, which was sold on behalf of the Fund.

Galsworthy, Ltd.), whose employees worked throughout the day and night, this conversion was, to all intents and purposes, completed by the 28th September. The Board of Management gratefully acknowledge their indebtedness to Sir Edwin Cooper, who placed his services at the disposal of the Hospital. Thanks should also be given to the various Contractors who carried out the emergency work at the Hospital without profit.

The period was one of great strain for the various officers of the Hospital and the ready assistance given by the Medical Superintendent, the Steward and the Senior Pharmacist in connection with the re-organisation of the Hospital and the purchase of additional supplies proved of great help. Matron, with volunteers from the Ladies' Association and other ladies, undertook the preparation of dark blinds for the whole of the Hospital.

Like the world, the Hospital was thankful the Crisis passed, but those who had worked at bringing the organisation into being felt that, if St. Mary's had been required as a Casualty Clearing Station, it would have been perfectly ready to act in that capacity.

The general work of the Hospital in its main Departments is summarized in the above table, which also shows a comparison with the corresponding figures for the previous year. Included in this table is the number of attendances made by Out-Patients attending the Inoculation Department and also, for the first time for a complete year, the number of patients admitted to the Lindis Wing.

The decrease in the number of Out-Patient attendances is due mainly to the fact that a new clinic in the Special Clinic which has attracted a large number of frequent attendances has been opened by the Inoculation Department. It is a matter for regret that the Parliamentary Borough Council found itself unable to continue in full the excellent facilities which were available at the Hospital for maternity cases resident in the Borough. Under the revised Agreement, the number of such beds has been reduced from fourteen to six, with a corresponding reduction in the Annual grant for maintenance from £2,200 to £185.

Throughout the year a Sub-Committee of the Medical Committee, under the able chairmanship of Professor F. S. Langmead, has had under consideration the question of the future size of the Hospital and the possibility of the provision of suitable accommodation for the X-ray Department, Casualty Department, Pathological Department, Trauma Centre, Out-Patient Department and other ancillary services of the Hospital, which are at present, so inadequately housed. The Report and recommendations of the Sub-Committee will be awaited with much interest, for a number of Departments are now working under conditions which add very grave hardship to both patients and Medical Staff.

The acquisition of the site adjoining the Hospital through the generosity of Sir Edward Meyerstein in November, 1937, and the negotiations which are proceeding for the purchase of further adjacent land, give rise to the hope that, in the not too distant future, the most serious handicap which a number of Departments of the Hospital are suffering by lack of reasonable accommodation will eventually be removed.

The general work of the Hospital in its main Departments is summarised in the above table, which furnishes a comparison with the corresponding figures for the previous year. Included in this table is the number of attendances made by Out-Patients attending the Inoculation Department and also, for the first time for a complete year, the number of patients admitted to the Lindo Wing.

The decrease in the number of Out-Patient attendances is due mainly to the use of a new drug in the Special Clinic which has obviated the need for such frequent attendances being made by patients in that Department. It is a matter for regret that the Paddington Borough Council found itself unable to continue in full the excellent facilities which were available at the Hospital for maternity cases resident in the Borough. Under the revised Agreement, the number of such beds has been reduced from fourteen to six, with a corresponding reduction in the annual grant for maintenance from £2,299 to £985.

Throughout the year, a Sub-Committee of the Medical Committee, under the able chairmanship of Professor F. S. Langmead, has had under consideration the question of the future size of the Hospital and the possibility of the provision of suitable accommodation for the X-Ray Department, Casualty Department, Pathological Department, Fracture Clinic, Out-Patient Department and other ancillary services of the Hospital, which are, at present, so inadequately housed. The Report and recommendations of the Committee will be awaited with much interest, for a number of Departments are now working under conditions which cause very grave hardship to both patients and Medical Staff.

FINANCE.

Income.

The income for the year amounted to £111,012, as against £88,679 in 1937; included in this total is the sum of £20,165 received for the maintenance of patients in the Lindo Wing. Some indication of the great development of the Hospital in the post-war period is afforded by the fact that whereas the income in 1920 was £52,595, the income for the current year exceeds £100,000 for the first time in the history of the Hospital.

Legacies for the year amount to £14,041, as compared with £13,154 in 1937. This amount includes the sum of £10,000 received under the Will of the late Mr. J. H. Stephens, who was for a short time a member of the Board of Management. Two beds—one in a female ward and one in a male ward—have been named after the Donor to commemorate this most generous benefaction.

Even with the aid of this substantial legacy, and the contribution received from the Lindo Wing, the Hospital was not successful in balancing its accounts, for the year's working shows a deficit of £4,763. This, combined with the deficit of £2,746 in 1937, gives rise to a financial position of great anxiety. In these circumstances it is a matter of especial regret to the Board of Management that the amount of annual subscriptions should have shown a fall, however slight, from that of the preceding year. No support is more valuable than that derived from this source, which supplies an assured income so essential to the steady and planned development of the Hospital. Attention is drawn to the arrangement whereby, without any extra expense to themselves, annual subscribers may, with Income

Tax at 2s. 6d. in the £, increase by more than one-third the amount of their subscription to the Hospital, by completing the Form of Agreement to contribute for seven years or during life, whichever shall be the shorter period. Over £555 was recovered in this manner during the year. Full particulars of the Form of Agreement will be gladly supplied upon application to the House Governor.

It is a great pleasure to the Board of Management to record that a large number of old patients of the Hospital have become, through the Old Patients' Association, annual subscribers. Each member, in token of gratitude for treatment received at the Hospital, undertakes to make a subscription of, at least, 2s., and since the establishment of the Association in 1921 a sum of nearly £6,000 has been received in annual subscriptions.

Welcome additions have been made to the Endowment Fund during the year. An anonymous donation of £1,000 was given for the endowment of a bed in memory of the late Mr. C. W. Drabble, a former Vice-President and most generous friend of the Hospital. Under the terms of the Will of the late Sir Henry W. Lucy, a legacy of £2,500 has been received, together with the sum of £1,000 for the endowment of a bed in memory of his wife, Lady Nancy Lucy. The Staff of Sir William Lill have also indicated their kind intention of endowing a bed in the Hospital, and a sum of £200 has already been subscribed. It is difficult to think of anything more beneficial to the Hospital than the endowment of a bed or two, and the Board of Management are highly appreciative of these gifts, for they add for all time to the permanent income of the Hospital.

The annual events, which are now a feature of the Appeal side of the work of the Hospital, have again been held. The success of these events depends upon the whole-hearted co-operation of all friends and departments of the Hospital, and are much enjoyed by those who are so good as to give their support.

Each tribute is paid to the London Blood Transfusion Service for the ready and valuable help given by their members during the year in many serious cases. Thanks are also due to Mrs. Ernest Ward for the garments which she has so kindly sent for the children in Hospital.

Income.

The income for the year amounted to £111,015, as against £83,373 in 1937; included in this total is the sum of £20,755 received for the maintenance of patients in the Lindo Wing. Some indication of the rapid development of the Hospital in the post-war period is afforded by the fact that whereas the income in 1930 was £62,000, the income for the current year exceeds £100,000 for the first time in the history of the Hospital.

Legacies for the year amount to £14,041, as compared with £13,154 in 1937. This amount includes the sum of £10,000 received under the Will of the late Mr. J. H. Stephens, who was for a short time a member of the Board of Management. Two beds—one in a female ward and one in a male ward—have been named after the Doctor to commemorate this most generous bequest.

Even with the aid of this substantial legacy, and the contributions received from the Lindo Wing, the Hospital was not provided in balancing its accounts for the year's work with a surplus of £1,762. This, combined with the surplus of £1,245 in 1937, gives rise to a financial position of some concern. In these circumstances it is a matter of especial regret to the Board of Management that the amount of annual subscriptions should have shown a fall, however slight, since that of the preceding year. No support is more valuable than that derived from this source, which supplies an essential income so essential to the steady and planned development of the Hospital. Attention is drawn to the management whereby, without any extra expense to themselves, annual subscribers may, with income

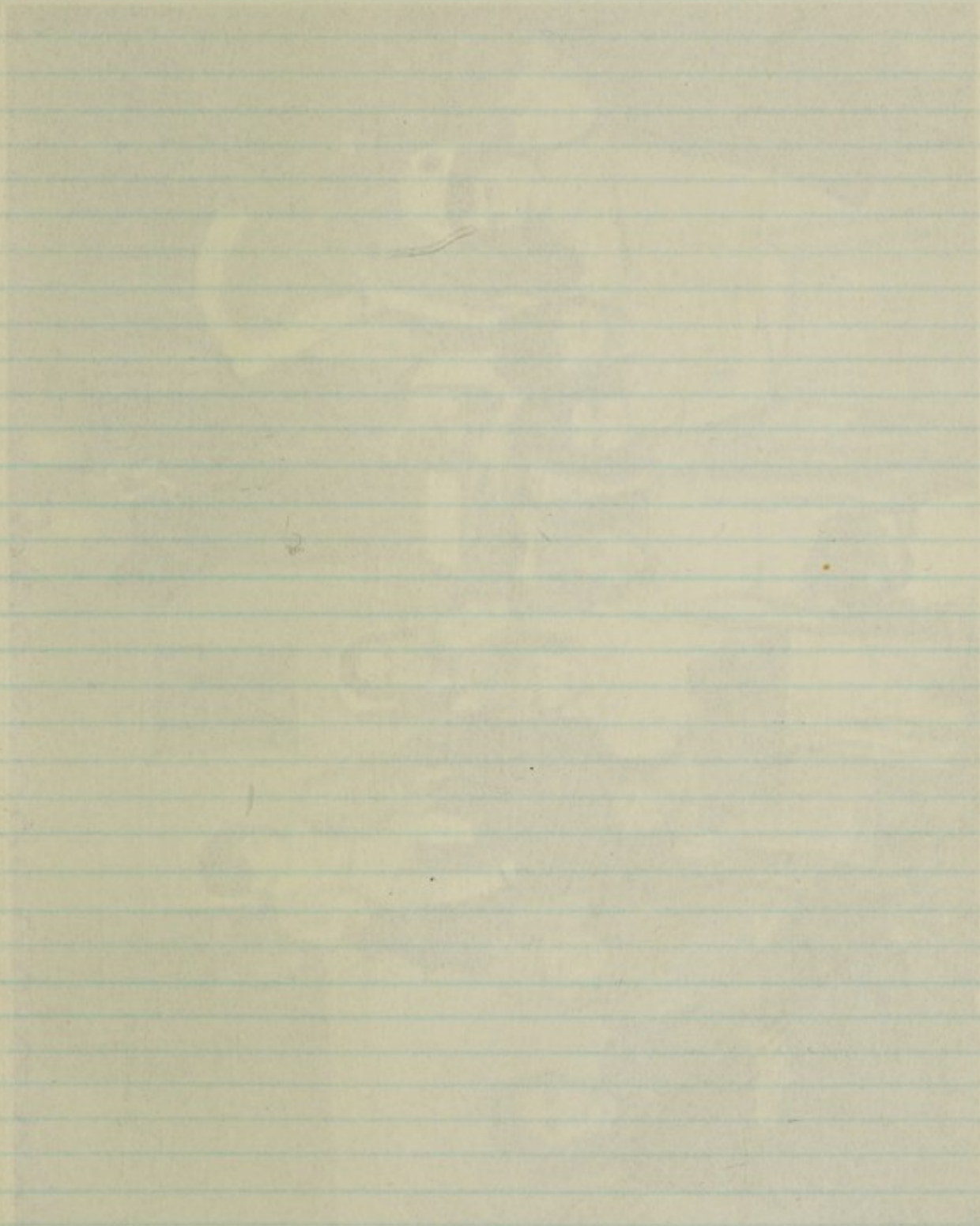

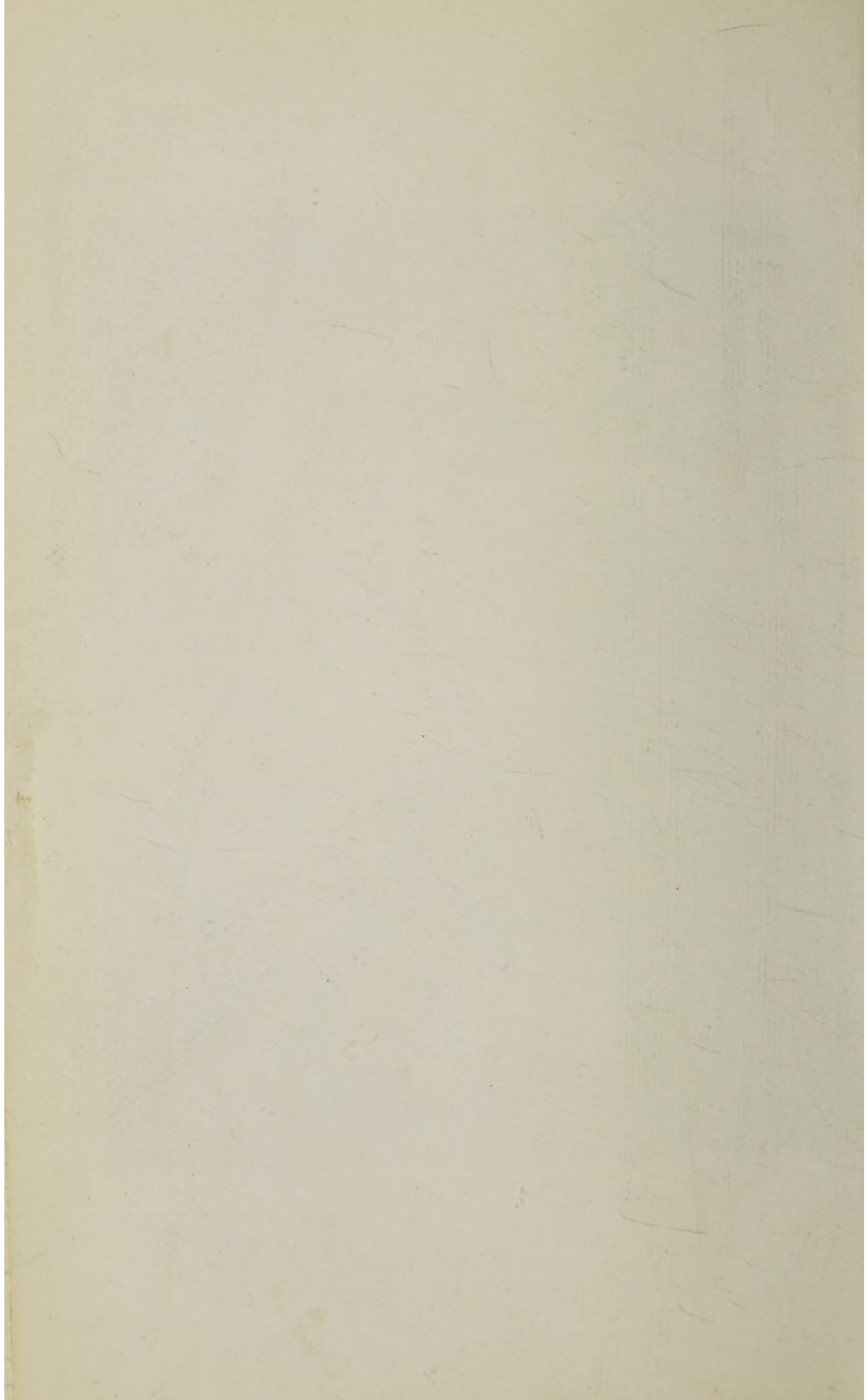

For the past 11 years Mr. Walter Payne has been so good as to place the Metropolitan Palace of Varieties at the disposal of the Hospital for a Matinée and, as a result, nearly £3,000 has been raised. Through the excellent arrangements made by Miss Leddington and Mr. A. W. Matthew practically every variety artist of note has, at some time or other, given their services at these matinées, and this year the programme was of exceptional merit.

No report of the benefactions to the Hospital would be complete without mention being made of the gift which Mr. J. D. Marsden has made for so many years of the greater part of the bacon and ham consumed in the Hospital. The Board of Management are deeply indebted to Sir Percy Shepherd, Mr. W. R. Moon and the Public Trustee, not only for the further generous grant of £3,000 made to the General Funds of the Hospital, but also for the donation of £1,500 made to the Extension Appeal Fund from the Estate of the late Mr. William Shepherd.

Hospital by joining the Hospital Saving Association and the various other contributory schemes which have been established. Last year, the grant from the Hospital Saving Association was £11,568, as compared with £10,219 in 1937, whilst the grant from the Hospital Saturday Fund was £1,837, against £1,722 in the previous year. One-third of the patients now admitted to the Hospital are members of a contributory scheme, either in London or in the Provinces. In this connection, the Board of Management would desire to take this opportunity to state that the Hospital is open at all times for the admission of patients who, after enquiry, are found to be unable, owing to financial circumstances, to make any contribution towards the cost of their maintenance during their stay in Hospital.

Expenditure for the year is, once again, the highest recorded in the history of the Hospital. For the first time for a complete year, the substantial increase in bed accommodation has been fully utilised and this fact is naturally reflected in the figures given above. The exceptional conditions which prevailed throughout the latter part of

the year have also had their effect. A sum of £450 was spent in the conversion of Lewis Loyd Ward into an emergency operation theatre. It is hoped that this amount will eventually be recovered from the Government, but an additional expenditure of some £500 was undertaken for the provision of dark blinds, emergency lighting, heating and cooking arrangements, which would appear to be irrecoverable, for the Ministry of Health has notified the Hospital that there will be no re-imburement of such expenditure. In addition, considerable loss from patients' contributions occurred through the partial evacuation of the Hospital and the delay which inevitably took place in the normal admission of patients.

The burden of interest on the Hospital's overdraft of nearly £63,000 is now beginning to be felt. During recent years, the funds standing to the credit of the various Extension Funds have balanced the overdraft on the General Maintenance Fund, thus avoiding interest charges, but as substantial payments have recently been made to the Contractors, the question of the interest charges and the overdraft itself becomes a matter of acute financial anxiety. The interest payable by the Hospital in the current year on this overdraft is £389 as compared with £78 in 1937, and in the coming year will certainly prove a much heavier burden. It is clear it will be almost impossible to carry on the normal working of the Hospital unless some reduction in the present overdraft is possible, for at times during the current year, the overdraft on the General Maintenance Fund amounted to nearly £70,000.

The problem of rising fuel costs has been a matter of concern. The tax on oil, imposed a few years ago, necessitated a change to coke, which at that time could be obtained for 31s. 6d. per ton; in 1937, this price was raised to 33s. per ton, and in 1938, the price quoted was 35s. 6d. per ton. In the circumstances, steps were taken for forced draught fans to be installed at a cost of £400, so that small coal might be used and the installation has already been successful in

The question of fuel and coal has been a matter of increasing concern since the outbreak of the war. A few years ago, excellent fuel was available at a price which could be obtained for 25s. 6d. per ton, but the price was raised to 30s. per ton, and in 1941 the price quoted was 55s. 6d. per ton. In the present year, the price for fuel for hospital use has to be regarded as being 70s. per ton, so that some £10,000 might be saved if the price of fuel were to be reduced to 50s. per ton. It is therefore a matter of some concern that the price of fuel has not been brought down to a level which would allow the Hospital to meet its requirements.

effecting a reduction in the cost of supplying steam to the many separate buildings of the Hospital.

Through the kindness of Mr. R. M. Greenwood an improved system of lighting has been installed in Allcroft, Victoria, Manvers and Thistlethwayte Wards. It has been much appreciated by patients and it is hoped that, in the near future, all Wards will be similarly lighted.

A typical example of increased expenditure is that under the heading "Drugs and Dressings." The whole trend of modern prescribing is towards specialities costing many times more than the old standard remedies. A notable case is that of "M & B" 693, which is now extensively used in the Special Clinic, costing £6 per thousand tablets, as compared with the old tablet (Sulphonamide) at 13s. 4d. per thousand.

The House and Finance Committee, in conjunction with the Board of Management, has exercised a constant and unremitting vigilance to ensure that expenditure be reduced to a minimum, compatible with efficiency. It is pleasing to report that, once again, the position of St. Mary's in the matter of general economy and administration, as shown by the statistical returns of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, continues to be very satisfactory.

THE NURSING STAFF.

There has been a welcome increase in the number of applicants for training. Fifty-six probationers have entered the Preliminary Training School during the year. An effort has been made to "bridge the gap" between that difficult period when a girl leaves school and her acceptance for training as a Nurse, and a scheme whereby candidates are accepted as pre-probationers at 18 years of age for non-nursing duties in the Lindo Wing has proved popular and, in practice, has worked well.

Important modifications which have taken place in the prescribed course of training for midwives are now in force, and as the period of training has been extended to 12 months, some alterations have become necessary in the Hospital's

conditions for the award of Midwifery Scholarships to members of the Nursing Staff. The agreement with the East End Maternity Hospital has been terminated and arrangements have been made for Nurses to receive their midwifery training at Queen Charlotte's Hospital.

Adair Lodge, Aldeburgh, which under the terms of the Will of the late Mr. F. C. Lindo was endowed and bequeathed early in the year to the Hospital as a Convalescent Home for the use of the Nursing Staff, has proved a veritable godsend. Many Sisters and Nurses have greatly benefited and thoroughly enjoyed the excellent facilities which Adair Lodge, with its beautiful gardens and delightful surroundings, afford to those in need of convalescence and rest. Miss Kerridge, the Sister in charge, by her constant care and helpfulness, has contributed in no small measure to these amenities. Many nurses who go there are able to drive and cycle, and the gift of a second-hand car or cycles would be greatly appreciated.

For a number of years attempts have been made to secure a tennis court in the neighbourhood of the Hospital for the use of the Nursing Staff. Through the kindness of the Vicar (Rev. H. C. MEDICAL SCHOOL.

The entry of full-course students for the Academic Year, 1937-38, was again restricted to 66. The number of full-course students who attended during the same Academic Year was 435, while 42 attended for short courses.

In the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge and London 22 men obtained B.A. Degrees and obtaining an Honorary B.Sc. Degree and two others gaining Honours in Pathology at the Final M.B. B.S. Examinations. Of Higher Degrees two obtained the M.D. London and the Ph.D. London, and one the M.D. Cambridge. During the year 34 students obtained First Diplomas and 14 obtained Higher Diplomas.

In athletics the year has again been a successful one, the Rugby and Association Football Cups and the Cricket Cup have been retained, together with several Sporting Club Cups, and the Inter-Hospital Hockey and Golf Cups have been added.

The Medical Society has been specially active during recent years. A Pyliferium has been erected, through the kind permission of His Lordship of Brough, at Pyrlford for the collection of grass and other plants for the preparation of extracts used in the treatment of hay fever.

INOCULATION DEPARTMENT.

During 1938 the attendances in the Out-Patient Department numbered 21,330. The increasing demand for vaccine treatment in recent years is indicated when it is noted that the number of out-patient attendances in 1921 was 5,579.

This increase is, in the main, due to the development of the Asthma and Hay Fever Clinics. Patients are sent to this department by Medical Practitioners all over the country to be "desensitised" to grass pollen, horse, cat, dog, fish, milk and other animal and vegetable products. A Pollenarium has been erected, through the kind permission of the Earl of Iveagh, at Pyrford for the collection of grass and other pollens for the preparation of extracts used in the treatment of hay fever.

In addition, other clinics provide treatment for practically all bacterial diseases, *e.g.*, acne, furunculosis, chronic tuberculosis, rheumatism, arthritis, recurrent colds, bronchitis,

intestinal toxæmia. There has been recently a very great increase in the number of patients treated for furunculosis (boils) and other staphylococcal infections.

A Whooping-cough Clinic has been established for the prevention and treatment of this disease. Research is being carried out, and an increasing number of children are attending for bacteriological diagnosis and inoculation.

Another clinic, which was inaugurated at the suggestion of the London County Council, provides for the treatment of diphtheria carriers; whilst a further clinic exists for the immunisation of children against diphtheria. Experience in many parts of the world has shown that by the injection of diphtheria toxoid, children can be immunised and that the immunity is a lasting one. In certain communities, notably in Canada, where this method of immunisation has been extensively carried out, diphtheria has almost disappeared, and a similar state of things would exist in London if it were possible to immunise all susceptible children. The difficulty arises, not in the process of immunisation, which is very simple, but in persuading parents to bring their children to an immunisation clinic. If it were possible to immunise 90 per cent. of young children against diphtheria, the disease, which at the moment brings sorrow to so many homes, would become negligible.

A substantial grant is made from the funds of the Inoculation Department to the Pathological Institute for the encouragement of research in all branches of Pathology, and for a series of lectures each year by distinguished medical scientists, both from home and abroad.

Research on the many problems connected with bacteriology and vaccine therapy is being continuously carried out by Sir Almroth Wright and his colleagues, as is evidenced by the various contributions made to scientific literature on the subject.

The third floor of the new building has been completed with the aid of a very generous legacy received under the

Will of the late Dr. H. E. Dewey. Provision on this floor is made for the laboratory for the preparation of vaccines for which Dr. Meyer was in a position, and it is probable that these vaccines are now prepared under conditions better than exist elsewhere in the world.

The remaining unexpended portion of the fund has been now been completed. Part of the amount now has been allocated to the Meyerstein Dental Research Laboratory and part prepared for future use as a bacteriological museum.

On the fourth floor laboratories have been fitted out for the study of virus diseases, e.g., influenza, smallpox, measles, etc. Their equipment includes a perfectly air conditioned chamber for the production of filtering membranes for distribution throughout the world to laboratories working on virus diseases. Active work is proceeding with the preparation of virus vaccines for the protection of patients against certain infectious diseases, more especially influenza. The department already prepares vaccines against the influenza bacillus and other bacterial and rickettsial diseases, but when it is possible to produce these vaccines by an efficient vaccine against the primary virus infection, a great advance will have been made.

These viruses are extremely small bodies which cannot be seen satisfactorily with the ordinary high power microscope, and, for their study, special optical equipment is necessary. The further sum of approximately \$400 is required to complete this equipment.

MEYERSTEIN DENTAL RESEARCH LABORATORY.

Research work has been carried out continuously by Dr. Wilfred Fish, Mr. Robert Ross and their assistants throughout the year in the Dental Research Laboratory, provided through the generosity of Edward Meyerstein.

The details of an investigation into the reaction of bone to the experimental substitution of septic infection was reported by Dr. Fish to the American Dental Association at their Annual Congress at St. Louis last year.

intentional forerunners. There has been, recently a very great increase in the number of patients treated for bronchitis, asthma and other respiratory infections.

A Whooping cough Clinic has been established for the prevention and treatment of this disease. Research is being carried out, and an increasing number of children are attending for bacteriological diagnosis and inoculation.

Another clinic, which was inaugurated at the suggestion of the London County Council, provides for the treatment of diphtheria carriers, while a further clinic exists for the administration of diphtheria antitoxin. Experience in some parts of the world has shown that by the injection of diphtheria antitoxin, the disease can be prevented and that the immunity is a long-lasting one. In certain communities, notably in Canada, where the method of inoculation has been extensively carried out, diphtheria has almost disappeared and a similar state of things would exist in London if it were possible to inoculate all susceptible children. The difficulty does not lie in the process of inoculation, which is very simple, but in persuading parents to bring their children to an immunization clinic. If it were possible to immunize 50 per cent. of young children against diphtheria, the disease, which at the moment brings sorrow to so many homes, would become negligible.

A substantial grant is made from the funds of the Lister Institute to the Pathological Institute for the investigation of research in all branches of Pathology and the progress of this work is supervised by distinguished medical scientists both from home and abroad.

It is upon the various problems connected with respiratory system that therapy is being continuously carried out by Dr. Wright and his colleagues, and it is evidenced by the various contributions made to scientific literature on this subject.

The third wing of the new building has been completed with the aid of a very generous legacy received under the

Will of the late Mr. H. E. David. Provision on this floor is made for the laboratories for the preparation of vaccines for which St. Mary's is so well known, and it is probable that these vaccines are now prepared under conditions better than exist elsewhere in the world.

The remaining unoccupied portions of the building have now been completed. Part of the ground floor has been allocated to the Meyerstein Dental Research Laboratory and part prepared for future use as a bacteriological museum.

On the fourth floor laboratories have been fitted out for the study of virus disease, *e.g.*, influenza, smallpox, measles, &c. Their equipment includes a perfectly air-conditioned chamber for the production of filtering membranes for distribution throughout the world to laboratories working on virus diseases. Active work is proceeding with the preparation of virus vaccines for the protection of patients against certain infectious diseases, more especially influenza. The department already prepares vaccines against the influenza bacillus and other bacterial complications of influenza, but when it is possible to supplement these vaccines by an efficient vaccine against the primary virus infection, a great advance will have been made.

These viruses are extremely small bodies which cannot be seen satisfactorily with the ordinary high-power microscope and, for their study, special optical equipment is necessary. The further sum of approximately £400 is required to complete this equipment.

ALMONER'S DEPARTMENT.

General.

The resignation early in the year of Miss E. M. Wetherall (The Senior Almoner) was accepted with regret. On her retirement Miss Wetherall was presented with a testimonial in appreciation of her services to the Hospital and as a tribute to the regard and esteem in which she was held by all those who worked with her. Miss M. H. Williams was appointed Senior Almoner and Miss D. Shiell Senior Almoner in the Out-Patient Department.

The international Crisis in October had an inevitable repercussion on the In-Patient work, as it became necessary to discharge all patients who could conveniently return to their homes, and admissions ceased temporarily except for emergency cases. Even when the danger was past it was not possible to re-admit at the normal rate until conditions were re-adjusted and the loss of an even flow of patients caused the almoner's work to decline for two or three weeks. For the month of October, therefore, 30 less cases were dealt with than in 1937, but in spite of this the total number of cases dealt with during the year has increased to 1303 as against 1229 in 1937, an advance of 74 cases.

Casualty Department.

A marked increase has occurred in the number of patients referred from the Casualty Department. There have been 300 cases referred to the Almoner for assistance, which represents 145 more cases than in 1937; 88 of these required to be attended by a District Nurse, and 130 had to be referred to the Cleansing Stations. In the first half of the year, 42 patients suffering from Scabies were sent to the Almoner, and in the second half of the year, 88 patients. The majority of these were composed of (1) down and outs, (2) unemployed men or their families who have often barely sufficient money with which to buy food, let alone soap, (3) young men and women employed chiefly in cheap domestic labour where living-in conditions are frequently overcrowded and wretched. Of the remaining 82 Casualty cases the majority

consisted of various problems. There were also a fair number of persons taking their treatment or advice on domestic and social problems. Several visits of investigation were undertaken at the request of the Medical Officers in the County Department.

ALMONER'S DEPARTMENT.

General.

The resignation early in the year of Miss E. M. Wetherall (The Senior Almoner) was accepted with regret. On her retirement Miss Wetherall was presented with a testimonial in appreciation of her services to the Hospital and as a tribute to the regard and esteem in which she was held by all those who worked with her. Miss M. H. Williams was appointed Senior Almoner and Miss D. Stuell Senior Almoner in the Out Patient Department.

The international Crisis in October had an inevitable repercussion on the In-Patient work, as it became necessary to discharge all patients who could conveniently return to their homes, and admissions ceased temporarily except for emergency cases. Even when the danger was past it was not possible to re-start at the normal rate until conditions were re-established and the loss of an even flow of patients caused the Almoner's work to decline for two or three weeks. For the month of October, therefore, 50 less cases were dealt with than in 1957, but in spite of this the total number of cases dealt with during the year has increased to 1378, as against 1229 in 1957, an advance of 149 cases.

Casualty Department.

A marked increase has occurred in the number of patients referred from the Casualty Department. There have been 284 cases referred to the Almoner for assistance, which represents 140 more cases than in 1957. 88 of these required to be admitted to a District Nurse, and 139 had to be referred to the Casualty Division. In the first half of the year, 12 patients were referred to the Almoner, and in the second half of the year, 86 patients. The majority of these were (101) down and out, (21) unemployed men, and (162) who have often barely sufficient money with which to buy food, let alone wear (16) young men and women employed chiefly in cheap domestic labour where living conditions are frequently overcrowded and wretched. Of the remaining 85 Casualty cases the majority

consisted of maternity problems. There were also a fair number of persons needing extra nourishment or advice on domestic and work problems. Several visits of investigation were undertaken at the request of the Medical Officers in the Casualty Department.

Requests for convalescence and instruments from the Medical Staff are to the Almoner more or less routine recommendations presenting, as a rule, no very great obstacles. It is the unusual case requiring special arrangements which taxes her capabilities if success is to be attained.

Various cases of this type are as follows:—

Transport.

A serious brain case had to be conveyed to the other side of England. Arrangements were complicated by the fact that there was no through train to the patient's destination, and the cost of an ambulance the whole way was prohibitive. An escort therefore had to be found, and an ambulance provided at either end, heavy fares and fees had to be raised, but this was successfully accomplished.

Rehabilitation.—A boy of 17 who had hitherto done heavy labouring work was admitted with heart disease and on discharge a suitable occupation had to be found. After much negotiation the job of assistant to a spectacle frame maker was found, and a visitor reports periodically on the patient's condition and progress.

Financial Assistance.—This is the case of a school teacher who was an In-Patient for four months and who was in despair over the payment of rent, having an invalid mother dependent. Through one of the funds devoted to the teaching profession, a substantial sum of money was raised to meet the rent and rates.

Home Visit and Assistance.—In conversation with the relative of a tubercular patient the Almoner discovered that the patient's wife had five children under eleven, rent £1 and an income of £1 19s. 6d. The family lived in the Midlands. Full particulars were sent to the local Relieving Officer, who arranged for the wife to receive financial assistance.

OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT.

The Social problems which continually arise in the Out-Patient Department are much the same each year, and

Convalescence.—119 patients have been sent away for either long or short periods of convalescence. This is an increase of 24 on the number sent away last year, but the figure is still low compared to the number of Out-Patient attendances. In a great many cases the arrangements for convalescence are made direct with the various Homes, but in others, chiefly with the children and cases which need prolonged convalescence, they may be referred to the local Health Authorities or to the Invalid Children's Aid Association.

Maternity.—The total number of Maternity bookings was 595, an increase of 53 on last year. Of the total bookings 498 were for the ward and 97 for the district.

Under the new Midwives Act the arrangements for the District bookings are rather different, as the assessments are now made to the London County Council scale, and a special register is kept. The scheme appears to be working very satisfactorily.

THE SPECIAL CLINIC

The Antenatal Department in the Special Clinic was opened in 1934. The two-fold objective is the endeavour to avoid default and the prevention, so far as possible, of a recurrence of the trouble. Many girls become infected through lack of necessary care and by their help to obtain work and regain their self-respect is an necessary treatment for their disease. During the past five years nearly four thousand new women patients have been seen, presenting difficulties both emotional and physical.

Following up is now an established routine which patients accept as part of the doctor's supervision. Over two thousand visits have been paid in the five years, 600 in 1938.

Plans have been made in the five-year period for nearly six hundred maternity patients, attendance supervised and beds booked in appropriate institutions, while constructive help has been given to the whole number. Assistance given includes housing; removal of financial pressure; obtaining of beds and bedding; extra and extra nourishment; surgical instruments; clothes; convalescence; work and leisure occupations.

THE LADIES' ASSOCIATION

The Ladies' Association, under the Chairmanship of Lady Violet Benson, has continued its splendid and invaluable work. This has consisted not only of generous gifts, both in money and kind, but also of the help afforded to every event organised in aid of the Hospital and the increasing number of friends who have become interested in the work of the Hospital through the activities of the Association.

A sum of £400 was expended on the purchase of 300 counterpanes, 750 sheets and towels for ward women, whilst some £170 was spent on material for the making, by members of the Association, of various garments for patients. In addition, a further grant of £750 was allotted to the Fund for the improvement and re-equipment of the

Maternity.—The total number of Maternity bookings was 459, an increase of 23 on last year. Of the total bookings 208 were for the hospital and 251 for the district.

Under the new Maternity Act the arrangements for the District bookings are rather different, as the assessments are now made to the Local Authority Council scale, and a special register is kept. The scheme appears to be working very satisfactorily.

THE SPECIAL CLINIC.

The Almoner's Department in the Special Clinic was opened in 1934. The two-fold objective is the endeavour to avoid default and the prevention, so far as possible, of a recurrence of the trouble. Many girls become infected through force of economic stress, and for these, help to obtain work and regain their self-respect is as necessary as treatment for their disease. During the past five years nearly four thousand new women patients have been seen, presenting difficulties both emotional and economic.

Following up is now an established routine which patients accept as part of the doctor's supervision. Over two thousand visits have been paid in the five years, 563 in 1938.

Plans have been made in the five-year period for nearly six hundred maternity patients, attendance supervised and beds booked in appropriate institutions, while constructive help has been given to the single mothers. Assistance given includes housing; removal of financial pressure; obtaining of beds and bedding; dinners and extra nourishment; surgical instruments; clothes; convalescence; work and leisure occupations.

THE LADIES' ASSOCIATION.

The Ladies' Association, under the Chairmanship of Lady Violet Benson, has continued its splendid and invaluable work. This has consisted not only of generous gifts, both in money and kind, but also of the help afforded to every event organised in aid of the Hospital and the increasing number of friends who have become interested in the work of the Hospital through the activities of the Association.

A sum of £480 was expended on the purchase of 300 counterpanes, 750 sheets and tobralco for ward screens, whilst some £170 was spent on material for the making, by members of the Association, of various garments for patients. In addition, a further grant of £750 was allocated to the Fund for the improvement and re-equipment of the

Kitchens in the Hospital, whilst through the personal generosity of Lady Tweedmouth, Lady Revelstoke and members of the Association, a most welcome gift of four Electric Food Trolleys was made for use in the Wards.

The Annual Meeting was held in March, when Lady Violet Benson was in the Chair, and most interesting addresses were given by Lady Galway and the House Governor. The Honorary Treasurer was able to report that a sum of over £1,193 had been raised during the year.

On the same day, a very successful Pound Day was again held. With the assistance of Mrs. Oates (Chairman), Mrs. Barnes (Hon. Treasurer), Mrs. James (Hon. Goods Secretary), Miss Hollway (Hon. Schools Organiser), Mrs. Hayden, Miss Loveday, Miss Gordon and Lady Wilson, members of the Pound Day Committee, a sum of £287 was raised and 3½ tons of goods received.

“ In giving the sum of £1,000 for a Samaritan Fund for the above Hospital, Mr. Sturge gives it on the conditions that this Fund shall be kept entirely separate from the General Funds of the Hospital, and that the income shall be paid to, or applied for, such In-Patients as may be necessitous, and within three months from their discharge from the Hospital, and for the purpose of their having necessary nourishment, clothing, or change of air.”

“ Mr. Sturge hopes that this Fund may be made known and that others may be induced to subscribe to it.”
