relating to the

Recommendation of Patients.

XV.—Annual subscribers shall be entitled to one In-patient recommendation for every £3 3s. od. subscribed, and to one Out-patient recommendation for every 10/6 subscribed.

XVII.—Governors and Annual Subscribers shall be entitled to recommend at any time any additional number of patients on payment of a subscription in accordance with the above scale.


XVIII.—Clergymen and Ministers making congregational collections shall be entitled to recommend patients on the same basis as Annual Subscribers.

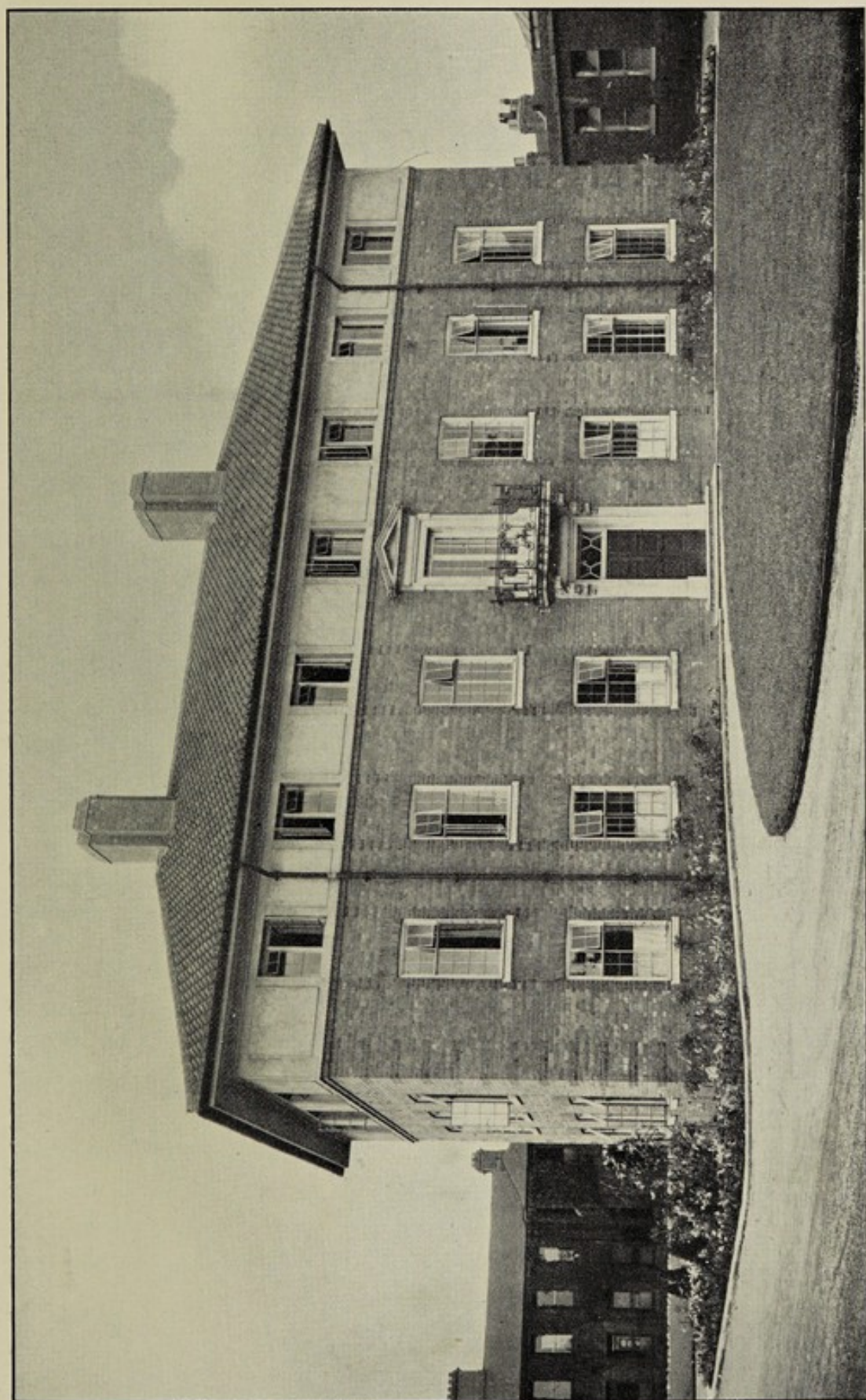

THE FIFTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT. OF THE GENERAL COMMITTEE OF THE STOCKTON & THORNABY HOSPITAL.

I have very great pleasure in submitting, on behalf of the General Committee, the 54th Annual Report for the year ended 30th June, 1930.

THE YEAR'S WORK.

The work accomplished during the period under review, with one exception, shows an increase on that of the previous year as will be seen from the following statistics, viz:—

It will be observed that the work in the Electrical and Massage Departments has increased by more than fifty per cent, and it has been found necessary, therefore, to augment the Staff in those Departments.

FINANCES.

The Statement of Accounts presented by the Honorary Treasurer shows the Ordinary Income for the year to be £18,676 4s. 7d., and the Extraordinary Income £1,770 0s. 0d. a total of £20,446 4s. 7d. The Ordinary Expenditure amounted to £13,797 17s. 4d., and the Extraordinary Expenditure to £1,963 8s. 9d., making a total of £15,761 6s. 1d.

It will be observed that a sum of £1,300 0s. 0d., appears in the Accounts for the alterations and additions to the Hot Water Installation, as foreshadowed in the last Annual Report. This work was completed some months ago, and is proving entirely satisfactory.

It is very pleasing to be able to report that, during the year, the Stockton War Memorial Fund invested a sum of money with the Charity Commissioners, the income from which is to be paid to the Hospital, and three beds have been named accordingly.

RESIGNATIONS AND APPOINTMENTS.

Your Committee regrets to report that it has received and accepted the resignation of Mr. C. R. Williams, one of the Honorary Auditors. Mr. Williams held this office for a number of years, and our best thanks are due to him for his services.

The question of the filling of the vacancy will come before you at the Annual General Meeting.

OBITUARY.

It is with the deepest regret that your Committee has to record the death of Lady Brown, a member of the Ladies' Committee, and of Mr. Matthias Robinson, a member of the General Committee, both of whom had the interests of the Hospital at heart, also of Dr. A. N. Ross, who, during the time he had been a member of the Honorary Staff, rendered excellent service to the Hospital by the unceasing care and attention which he bestowed upon its patients.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1929.

The above Act came into force on 1st April 1930, and it is very desirable, in view of the great powers for dealing with the Medical Services of the Country which have been conferred upon Local Authorities by this Act, that Voluntary Hospitals should work in co-operation with these Authorities, and, with this in mind, your Committee has elected the Chairman of the Honorary Staff (Dr. S. Lyle) and myself to represent the Hospital on the Committees formed by the Voluntary Hospitals to confer with the Local Authorities.

PENSIONS.

The question of the provision of Pensions for Nurses and Hospital Officers has received a great deal of attention during recent years, it being felt that something should be done to ensure a certain amount of security on retirement to those engaged in this splendid service. A scheme for such, on a contributory basis, was formulated and brought into operation in 1928, and has been adopted by 250 Hospitals in the United Kingdom. I have much pleasure in stating that your Committee decided to become members of this scheme as and from 1st January, 1930.

EXTENSIONS AND ALTERATIONS.

Reference has already been made to the large increase in the work of the Massage and Electrical Departments, and, in consequence thereof, your Committee has decided to extend the Orthopaedic Department by the addition of a further two rooms, one for Massage and Electrical Treatment and the other for Curative Muscular Exercise.

The bedroom accommodation for the Nursing Staff is too limited, and it has also been decided to provide further rooms by the addition of another floor over the old Wing known as the "Marshall Fowler Wing."

It is anticipated that this work will be commenced at an early date, and it will be observed that an estimated sum has been ear-marked in the Accounts to meet this expenditure.

LINEN GUILD.

Our sincere thanks are again due to the members of the Linen Guild, who, by their untiring energy and zeal, have again rendered yeomen service to the Hospital. As a result of their last appeal they handed over 1,471 articles, and collected the sum of £376 6s. 11d., out of which they have provided the whole of the bedding, linen, curtains and a baby's cot required by the Hospital during the year.

NURSING STAFF.

The Nurses in Training continue to achieve satisfactory results in their various Examinations, and, for this, we are indebted to the Matron and Sister Tutor, and to those members of the Hon. Staff who so kindly lectured to the Nurses during the year.

APPRECIATIONS.

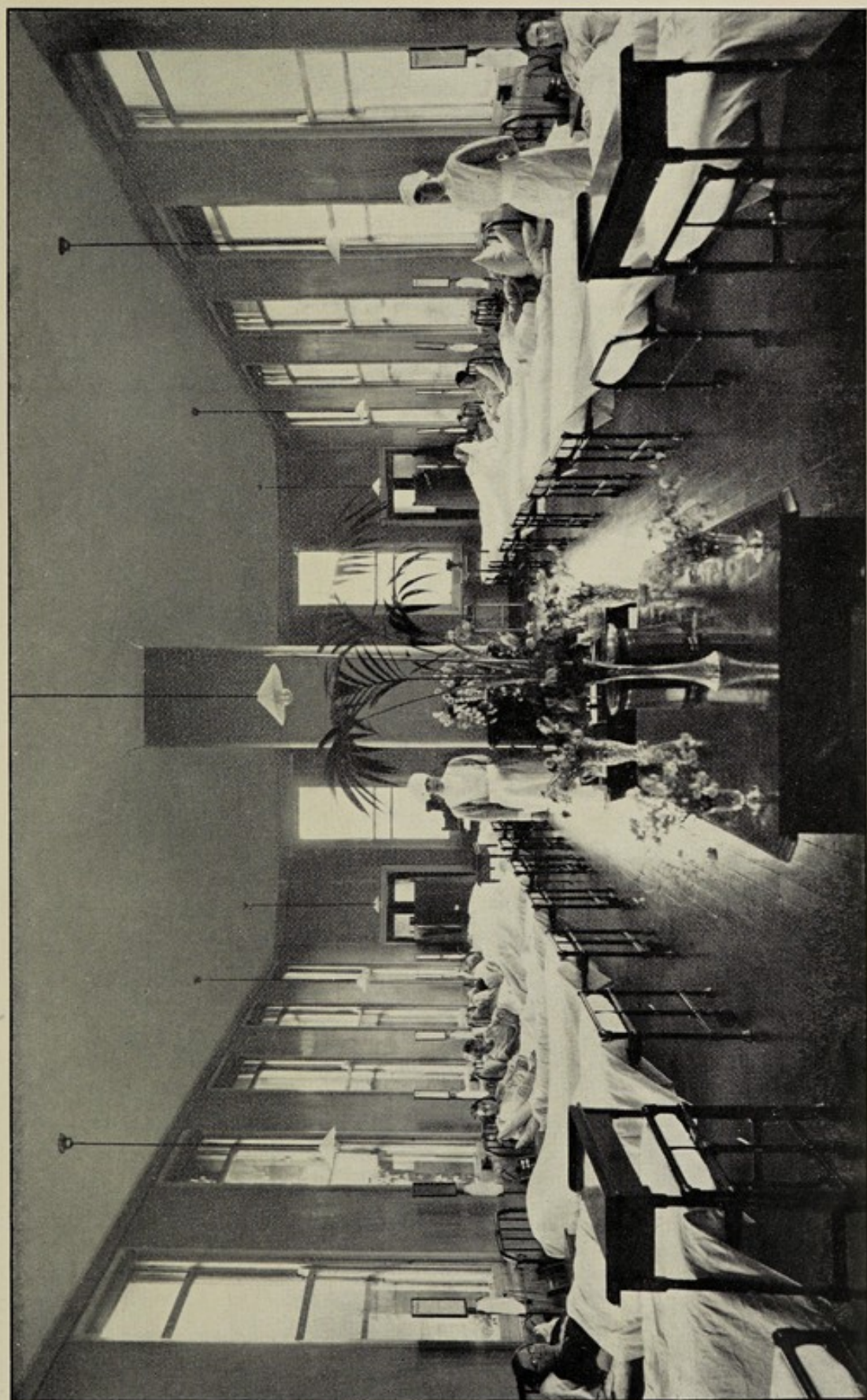

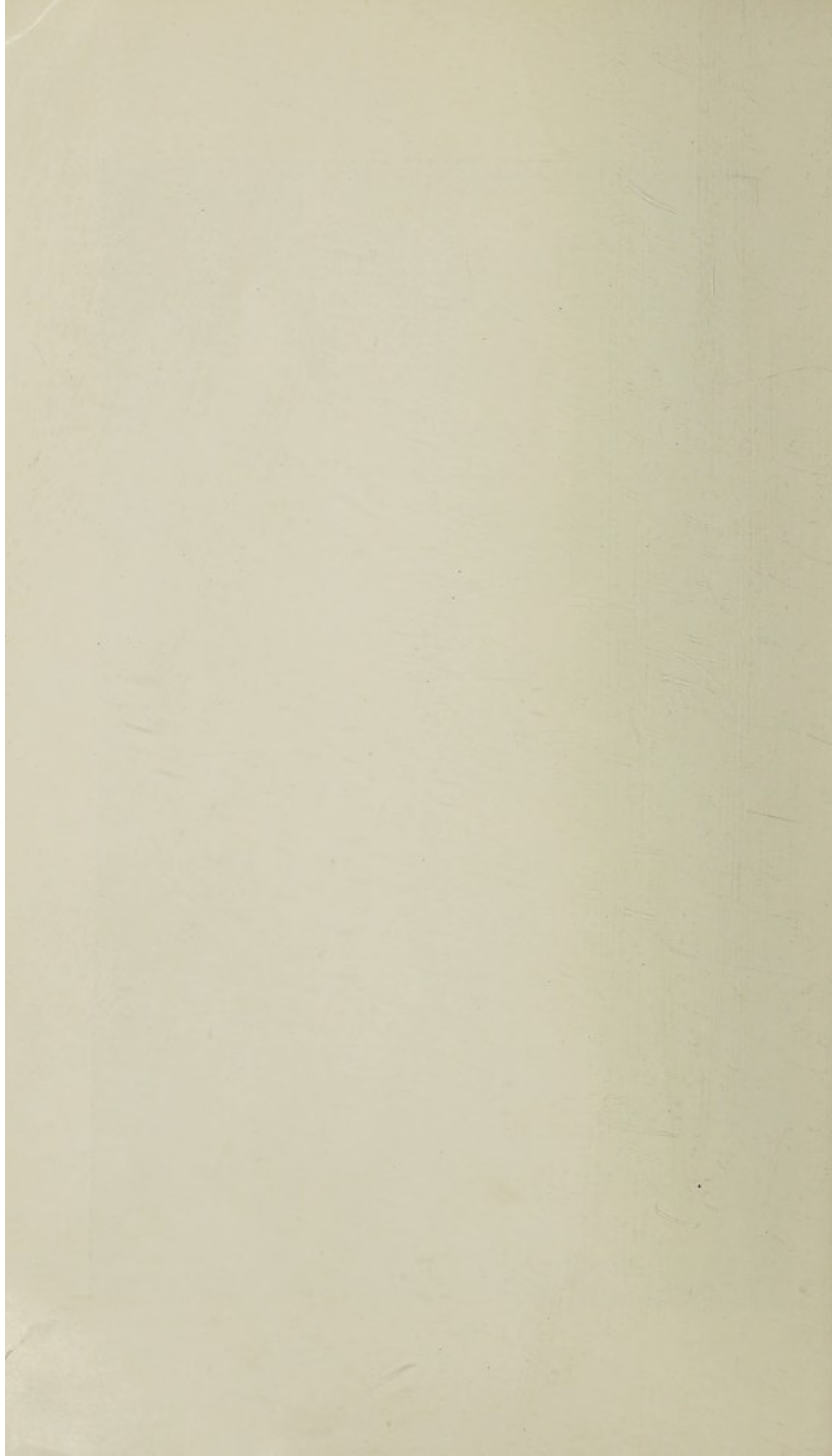
