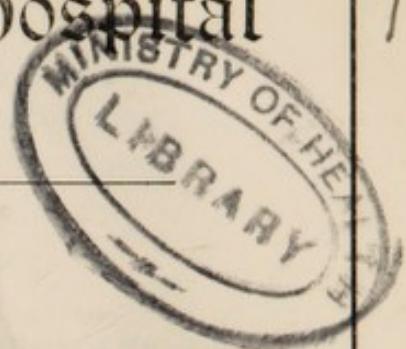

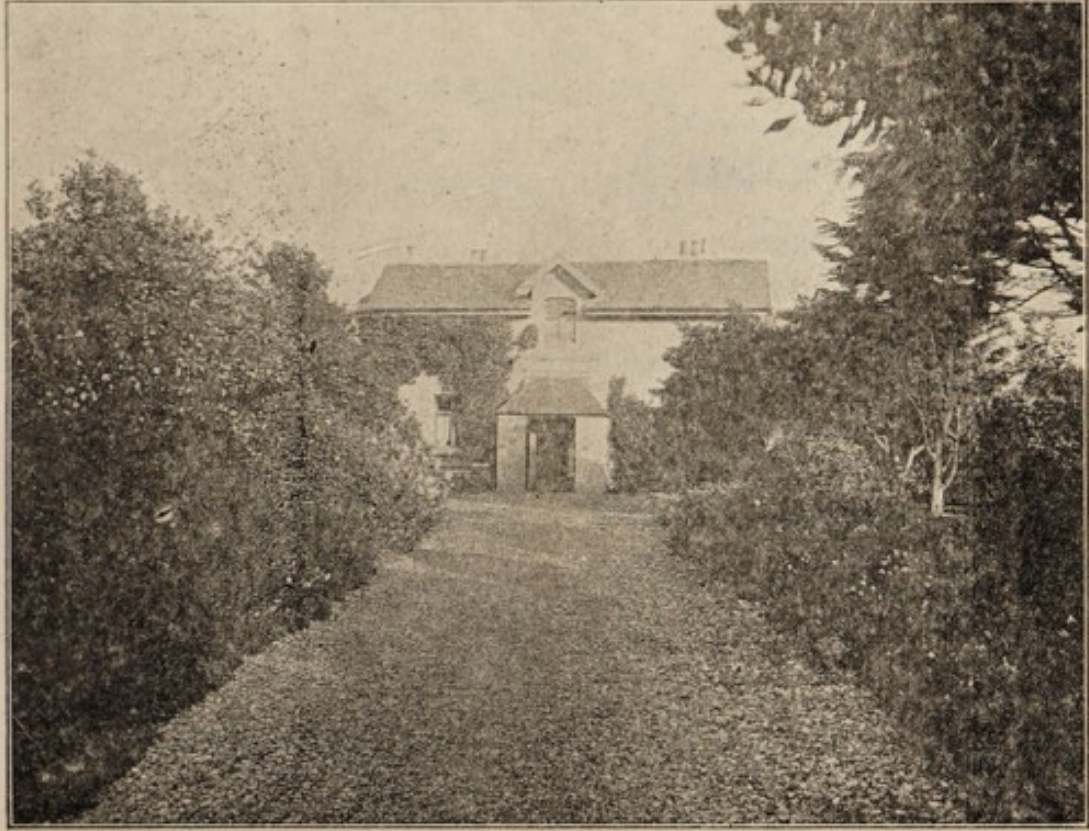

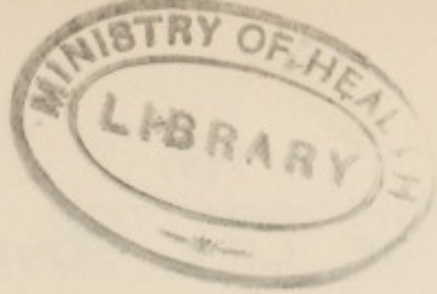

Report for the Year ended 1929.

The House Committee of the Tenby Cottage Hospital present herewith to their Subscribers and friends their 59th Annual Report.

From a perusal of the accounts it will be noted that, except in the Balance Sheet, only the actual Income and Expenditure for the year is shown. This method will, in future years, provide an easier comparison than was possible when the previous year's balance was entered.

"Renewals and Repairs" is a heavy item, due chiefly to the building of a new Larder (£35 10s.) and re-roofing the operating theatre (£63 12s.). The men's ward has also been re-decorated.

The increase under "Fuel and Lighting" is due to the new building and recently installed radiators.

Hospital Week once again proved a success, and the thanks of the House Committee are due to the ladies of the Linen Guild for so ably organising the Fair, and to all those who so willingly gave their help. £228 16s. 4d. has been transferred to the Building Fund, leaving a balance of only £191 2s. 9d. required to meet the total cost of the new wing. It is sincerely hoped that this sum will be collected in Hospital Week, 1930.

The best thanks of the Committee are due to the following:—

The Household Box Scheme Committee, whose work entails a lot of time and patience, for the sum of £300 10s. 3d. The number of Patients treated in the Hospital during the year under this Scheme is 69.

To all those who have sent gifts in kind. In all nearly 1,000 gifts have been received during the year, and have been acknowledged through the Press. The Committee once again wish to thank these generous donors.

The Misses Thompson for inaugurating the "Woofferton Grange Fund," for the upkeep of the Children's Ward. This Fund, subscribed to by past and present pupils, will in years to come prove a great asset to the Hospital.

The Voluntary Aid Detachments, and the members of the Red Cross Ambulance for the constant help they have so willingly given.

Mr. A. D. Watson, for kindly paying the wireless licence.

Mr. Carew, for looking after the wireless apparatus during the year without charge.

Miss Wood for once again mending all the linen during the past year.

Mr. and Mrs. Jensen, for so kindly providing vegetables free during the month of February.

The Hon. W. B. C. Lewis, for so kindly auditing the accounts, and Mr. R. Thomas for auditing the Hospital Week accounts, and Mr. F. T. Coles for auditing the Box Scheme accounts.

The House Committee greatly appreciate the generous support given throughout the year, and realize that this is due to the confidence the public place in the Medical and Nursing Staff, to whom their thanks are especially due.

They also wish to thank all Subscribers, Donors, Helpers, and proprietors of the Press for their generosity and help, without which the work could not be carried on.

Criticisms and suggestions are always welcome, and patients are asked to make their complaints direct to the House Committee. This, however, is seldom done ; patients preferring to air their grievances outside the Hospital thereby giving the House Committee no opportunity to enquire into and, if necessary, rectify the matter. It is most earnestly requested that any complaint, however trivial, may be made known to the Committee as soon as possible after its occurrence. This is asked in all fairness not only to the patients who have a grievance, but also to the House Committee and Staff of the Hospital.
