REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

For the Year ending December 31st, 1940.

The Cottage Hospital has had another year of great activity. Often in its course we have regretted the projected New Hospital had not been ready for these days of strain. The Committee have done and are doing all that is possible to make the working conditions better, but whilst more modern appliances help, the great need is space. Inside our limits a great work has been accomplished in the past year.

The Honorary Medical Staff and Matron, with the Nursing and Domestic Staff are to be congratulated on the quality and quantity of work done. As will be seen from the report of the Medical Staff, 637 cases were treated during the year, 594 of which were operative cases, 158 being of a major character.

The Income and Expenditure Account is most interesting, and thanks to the generosity of our helpers, the deficit on the year is only £75 11s. 9d.—this in view of an expenditure of £4,396 7s. 0d. The latter figure includes certain items of Capital Expenditure, but in an old building like the Cottage Hospital we have to expect this sort of Capital Expenditure every year.

The Committee are grateful to all whose gifts helped to maintain the work in 1940. They are indebted once more to the U.H.S.P. for the donation of £350—raised by a series of gallant efforts, as no Parade was possible. Mrs. Myles Kennedy, of Stone Cross, again secured us a grant of £50 from the League of Mercy. Indeed the list of donations and subscriptions is an indication of the esteem the Hospital is held in Ulverston and the wide district served. The Linen League continues to serve us well and its help is one much appreciated by the Management Committee. Employees contributions continue to grow and the voluntary support of many who live in the area, but work at Barrow, is a great help.

The Committee thank the Honorary Medical Staff, Dr. Fawcitt the Radiologist, Matron and her Staff, the Honorary Architect (Mr. S. Grundy), The Hon. Auditors (Messrs. R. F. Miller & Co.) for their highly efficient services, given so unstintedly.

The Annual Meeting is called for Thursday, July 3rd, 1941, in the Council Chamber, Queen Street (by kind permission of the Ulverston Urban District Council) when a good attendance of subscribers and friends is requested.

YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1940.

627 Cases have been admitted during the year. There were 10 cases remaining in the Hospital on the 31st December, 1939, so that 637 cases have been actually treated during the year. Of these, it is interesting to note that no less than 594 were operative cases, and 92 cases of accident or extreme urgency. There were 20 cases remaining in Hospital on the 31st December, 1940. The Gross Expenditure for the year was £4396 7s. 0d. The average cost per Patient per week was £3 15s. 10d.

Report of Surgical Staff.

There were 637 cases treated during the year, 594 of which were operative cases 158 being of a major character. The number of deaths was 25, giving a mortality of 3.92 as compared with same number of deaths in the previous year, when the mortality was 4.19. Of the 25 deaths 7 occurred within 24 hours of admission.

The surgical Staff desires to place on record its appreciation of the very excellent work accomplished by the Matron and Nursing Staff.
