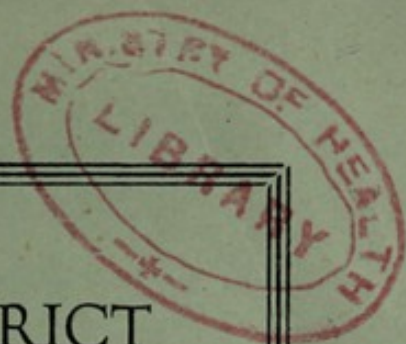
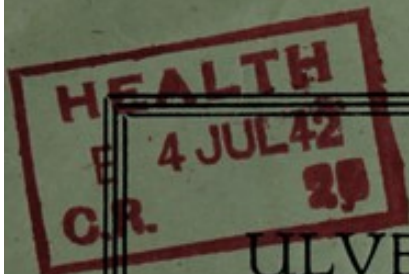

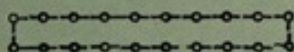

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE.

This has been a notable year in the long history of the Cottage Hospital. The number of cases treated, though not a record, shows a substantial increase on the previous year. Costs have been higher and our expenditure is the highest we have had to meet. The income, too, reached a new high level, but was not quite sufficient to balance the expenditure. In addition to our usual activities there has been a very large increase in the number of out-patients treated, 577 cases being received and about a thousand attendances made. The number of operations performed was 584 of which 202 were classed as "major." In addition 93 minor operations were performed on out-patients. In all 1276 cases were treated of whom 699 were in-patients whose stay in hospital amounted to 8463 days.

Income and expenditure were both over £5,000. It is very gratifying to find the generous public has recognised the good work of the hospital by increased support. Messrs. Vickers-Armstrong Ltd., have subscribed £100, Dalton Urban District Council made a grant of £20 in addition to their usual subscription of £15 : 15 : 0, Messrs. Kennedy Bros. Ltd., sent £15 in addition to their annual subscription of £20.

Once more we are indebted to the League of Mercy for £50 and we thank Mrs. Myles Kennedy for her kind interest. The Hound Trail Committee, through Mr. J. P. Jackson, sent £40. The Old Scholars' Dramatic Society, per Miss Brown, £25 and the Townswomens' Guild, per Mrs. Marker, £10 : 10 : 0. In addition the U.H.S.P. made a grant of £300, part of which was allocated to pay for Ward Trolleys and a Bed Pan Washer. These were gifts in memory of Mr. A. E. Jackson, their Secretary for so many years and whose death was a great loss. Messrs. Armstrong-Siddeley Ltd., through their Hospital and Benevolent Fund made grants of £105 to pay for a new Anaesthetising Apparatus. These gifts were all suitably inscribed.

Another item of interest is the growth of Employees' Contributions, Messrs. Armstrong-Siddeley Ltd., £284, and Messrs. Vickers-Armstrong Ltd., £194, being the largest. The scheme of weekly payments is now extended to the general public and a further increase is expected as the benefits of the scheme become known.

In further attempts to increase the efficiency of the Hospital services a new Refrigerator and new Ward Screens have been purchased in addition to the other gifts mentioned above.

In these days of war, increased expenditure is inevitable and wages and War Damage Insurances are only two of the many items affected. The cost per patient per day has risen to 12/1 from 10/10 last year, and we can only see further increases in the near future.

Altogether the year's work has been very strenuous and exacting. Many difficulties have faced us and new problems continually arise, but the work goes on and, judged by results, goes on most successfully. Our thanks for this are given most sincerely to the Honorary Medical Staff, Dr. Fawcitt, our Radiologist, Matron and her Nursing and Domestic Staff, our Honorary Auditor, R. F. Miller & Co., and our excellent Secretary, Mr. R. Graham. We are grateful to those ladies who have given occasional assistance, to the Girl Guides for their help, to the W.V.S. for their timely gifts and the Linen League whose contributions are more than ever valuable. And there are a host of friends whose kindly interest and help is acknowledged in this report or is given anonymously and we thank them.

The Annual Meeting will be held in the Council Chamber, Queen Street, on Monday, July 13th, 1942, at 8 o'clock, and all subscribers and friends are invited to attend.

YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1941.

679 Cases have been admitted during the year. There were 20 cases remaining in the Hospital on the 31st December, 1940, so that 699 cases have been actually treated during the year. Of these, it is interesting to note that no less than 584 were operative cases, and 112 cases of accident or extreme urgency. There were 14 cases remaining in Hospital on the 31st December, 1941. The Gross Expenditure for the year was £5110 18s. 9d. The average cost per Patient per week was £4 4s. 7d.

Report of Surgical Staff.

There were 699 cases treated during the year, 584 of which were operative cases 202 being of a major character. The number of deaths was 30, giving a mortality of 4.29 as compared with 25 deaths in the previous year, when the mortality was 3.92. Of the 30 deaths 8 occurred within 24 hours of admission. There were also 577 out-patients, of which 93 were minor operations.

The surgical Staff desires to place on record its appreciation of the very excellent work accomplished by the Matron and Nursing Staff.

The Secretary will be grateful for copies of Old Annual Reports of the Hospital issued previous to 1921.
