

#### Subscriptions.

THE admission of patients must depend on the sanction of the Medical Officers and the House Committee, and is subject to the accommodation of the Hospital. Infectious and incurable cases are not admitted.

Private patients admitted by special arrangements.

Application for the admission of patients not resident in Ilfracombe must be accompanied by a Medical Certificate of the case.

The Ex-Service Men having given to the Hospital £134 in War Loan, are entitled to benefit equivalent to the Interest of this sum.

A bed endowed by the late James Staples, Esq., is free to inhabitants of Combe Martin, under the usual rules of the Hospital.

By Clause 3 of the Charity Commissioners' Order, every donor of £21 and upwards at one time to the funds of the Hospital shall be a Life Governor of the Hospital.

#### Form of Bequest.

I give to the Tyrrell Cottage Hospital, Ilfracombe, for the General Purposes of that Institution the sum of................................ pounds free of duty, and the receipt of the Treasurer of the Hospital shall be a sufficient discharge for the same.

#### Annual Report.

Presented at the Annual General Meeting held on the 10th day of February, 1938.

THE GENERAL COMMITTEE have pleasure in presenting their eighth Annual Report, and the 67th in the history of the Hospital.

The number of patients treated during 1937 were: Inpatients, 489; X-ray Examinations, 353; Out-patients attendances, 3,279; new Out-patients, 589; Surgical Operations, 237; Accidents treated (including Out-patients), 331. These figures confirm the necessity for increased bed accommodation, also that of Private Wards, for which there is an increasing demand. Revenue is lost as a consequence. The staff sleeping quarters and kitchen premises leave much to be desired, and improvements are long overdue.

A sum of £1,642 10s. 1d. is in hand for improvements and extension. A further sum of £1,500 is, however, required before this work can be undertaken.

The assent of the Charity Commissioners is being sought for permission to use the £914 11s. 5d. received as Legacies in 1937.

The detailed statements in the Report reveal continued and sustained financial support, both for Extension and maintenance. In this connection the following deserve special mention: Mrs. E. Penn Curzon, C.B.E. (President of the Hospital), Mrs. D. Warrell Bowring (Adelaide College), Mrs. H. Bolton (Berrynarbor), Mrs. de Saunty Newby (Organizer, Alexandra Rose Day), Miss F. C. Fursdon, Mrs. W. B. Boone, Mr. R. M. Lenham, and to all whose names appear in this report. Thanks are also due to a host of friends and helpers whose name is legion.

Thanks are also recorded to the Ministers of all Denominatins, and their congregations, both for generous collections as well as gifts in kind from Harvest Thanksgiving Services.

The Hospital Saturday Fund (Chairman, S. W. Day, Esq.) increased their contribution this year, the sum of £232 16s. 4d. being handed over for current expenses. This reflects great credit on the newly-appointed Hon. Secretary, Mr. Eric Hutchings, and is mainly the result of his enthusiasm and hard work, backed up by a splendid Committee and many willing helpers whose work is gratefully recognised.

Unfortunately the Committee of the Devon Queen Victoria & King Edward Memorial Fund (President, H. W. Michelmore, Esq., Exeter) were unable to make a grant this year owing to other urgent calls on the Fund. The Committee desire, however, to place on record help from that Fund 1932 to 1936 inclusive, amounting to £104.

The Ilfracombe Hospital Carnival was perhaps the best yet staged, resulting in £430 being handed over for Extension purposes. It would be impossible here to name all those who helped to bring about this success. Mention must, however, be made of Mr. T. Mercer (the Chairman), Mr. W. R. Saxon (Secretary), Mr. J. L. Giddy (Hon. Treasurer), Mr. R. S. Falkner, Mr. W. C. Hutchings, Mrs. Boone, Mr. F. Gibbs, all organizers and the Chairmen of Sub-Committees. Miss Gammon also did excellent secretarial work.

Thanks are also recorded to those Ladies and Gentlemen who organized various entertainments, sports, etc.,by which considerable monies were raised, viz.: Mrs. W. B. Boone (Ladies' Section Golf Club, competition); The Ilfracombe Amateur and Dramatic Society (Hon. Secretary, Mr. E. N. Bearcroft); Flitch Trial (Mr. G. Thomas, Mr. Frank Woodward, Mr. Cecil Morley); The "After Dinner" Company (Mr. G. Thomas and Mr. Cecil Morley, the Entertainments Manager, Ilfracombe U.D.C.); Swimming Gala (Mr. Eric Hutchings); Rowe Charity Cup Competition (Mr. H. G. Ridge); Miss Fair, West Down, various entertainments; Miss Monica Giddy (paper chase, Ladies' Cricket Match, etc.); Ilfracombe Urban District Council, per Mr. H. G. Brede (use of Rest Room for exhibition of Replica of Crown Jewels and Regalia, lent by "The Daily Sketch" newspaper; The Bachelors' Club, various functions (Mr. Harry Chapman, Chairman); Miss G. Elms for continued Christmas effort; and many others.

Two beautiful stainless stands, complete with bowls, for use in the Theatre have been presented by the Ilfracombe Rotary Club, and the British Red Cross (D. 64), Commandant, Miss Dean.

The Hospital is now affiliated with The Daily Mirror, also Daily Sketch Coupon Scheme. Many friends are sending in Coupons monthly; more friends, and coupons, needed.

Ordinary Subscriptions amount to £292 17s., an increase of £62 12s. 6d. over last year. Mainly due to: (1) The generosity of F. C. Pilley, Esq., of Lee, and Mrs. H. B. Gray, who contributed £42 in memory of the late F. G. Pilley, Esq., who had intended himself making this gift; (2) The continued Subscription (Annual) of £14 5s. 8d. by R. M. Rowe, Esq., C.A.; (3) A special donation from the Woolacombe Ex-Service Men's Club (per Mr. J. T. Bradley and Mr. S. Redmore).

The Exeter & Western Counties Hospital Aid Society's payment for treatment to their members amounted to £600 17s, 6d. It is an encouraging sign that an increasing number of working men and women are joining the ordinary Benefit Scheme of this Society. The weekly contribution of 3d. only is a good investment. A new and extended Benefit Scheme for Honorary Members is now available for those whose incomes are above those allowed under the ordinary scheme. The benefits are generous. Mr. S. W. Watkins, the newly-appointed Group Secretary, whose address is "Berridale," Lamb Park, Station Road, Ilfracombe, will be pleased to give all particulars.

The abolition of the "Recommend" system has met with general approval, and it is felt that poor patients will be benefited. Hospital treatment, as hitherto, is available for them.

Turning to the Ordinary Expenditure and Receipt Account, it will be seen that with two exceptions—viz., a decrease in Church Collections of £9 8s., and the loss of a grant from the Queen Victoria & King Edward Memorial Fund (already referred to)—all other sources of income are up. The total increase being £161 0s. 7d.

On the expenditure side, strict economy with efficiency has been practised, resulting in a saving of £184 2s. 2d., as compared with last year. The net result being that last year's deficiency of £266 14s. 10d. has been reduced by £78 7s. 11d., and now stands at £188 6s. 11d.

Turning to the Extraordinary Account, Legacies received during the year amount to £914 11s. 5d.; Donations £70; Special Appeal and Bank Interest £28 17s. 4d.; Hospital Carnival contribution £430. Total £1,443 8s. 9d.

As none of this money was expended during the year, the above sum remains on deposit pending investment, together with the accumulated balance of last year, viz., £1,113 12s. 9d. Total, £2,557 1s. 6d., which it is hoped may all be available for future improvement and Extension.

The Hospital has been well maintained during the year, the reports of all monthly visitors being satisfactory. Extracts from letters from grateful patients will be found tabulated in the Report. New supplies of crested crockery for the patients have been purchased, also bed linen, including counterpanes bearing the imprint of the Hospital. All Insurances have been under review during the year, and increased cover arranged.

The Sankey Report dealing with the future of Voluntary Hospitals is being carefully considered, and the Hon. Secretary has attended meetings at Barnstaple, Torquay and Plymouth, of the South-West Regional Committee of the British Hospitals Association in connection with the matter.

The resignation from the Committee of the Rev. J. O'Byrne in September last, owing to his removal to Plymouth, was received with regret. The Rev. Matthew Morehan has been co-opted to fill the vacancy. The vacancy caused by the death of the late H. A. B. Evatt, Esq., has been filled by the co-option of Mr. T. Mercer.

Thanks are recorded to Mr. A. Norman for again auditing the accounts.

Further donations are urgently required for the completion of the work and may be sent to the Hon. Secretary or Treasurer.
