

# REPORT for the Year 1933.

The Board of Management have pleasure in submitting to the Donors and Subscribers the 40th Annual Report, Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet for the year ending 31st December, 1933, and in doing so, desire to express their great appreciation of the valuable assistance they have received during the year.

The year has been one of steady progress, and the work accomplished is shown in the Medical Report, details of which are given on pages 13—19.

The Income for the year is £14,358 18s. 5d. and the Expenditure £14,474 4s. 0d. showing a deficit of £115 5s. 7d.

It is very gratifying to be able to reflect, notwithstanding the reduction in subscriptions, which though serious, may in some cases prove only to be temporary, that the financial position has been fairly maintained.

#### MOTOR ACCIDENTS.

A Clause has now been inserted in the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933, in substitution for Section 36 (2) of the Road Traffic Act of 1930, as follows:—

- (1) An increase in the maximum amount recoverable from £25 to £50 in respect of the cost of treatment.
- (2) A maximum payment of £5 in respect of Out-Patients treatment.
- (3) The removal of certain difficulties under the Road Traffic Act of 1930, connected with ex-gratia payments and payments by contributory schemes.

These changes are very welcome, and will materially assist Hospitals in meeting the heavy costs they are put to in regard to these cases, but a great deal is still required before Hospitals receive their full due.

The motor accident cases dealt with during the year total one hundred and fifty-eight, who occupied beds for 3,196 days or an average of 8.76 per day. The total cost was £1,278 8s. 0d. towards which only £417 5s. 0d. was received, leaving a sum of £861 3s. 0d. to be found out of General Funds of the Hospital.

During the year the Board of Management, in order to increase the subscriptions, invited the Subscribers to sign a form of covenant for a period of seven years, thus enabling the Hospital to increase its permanent Income to the extent of the Income Tax on the gross amount of such subscription. This we recover from the Revenue Authorities while the actual cost to the individual is not increased. With this Report is included a Form of Covenant, and Subscribers who have not yet taken advantage of this opportunity are invited to do so, and any further particulars may be obtained from the Secretary.

To the Donors and Subscribers, the Board of Management tender their grateful thanks for their continued support, and although the total amount is less than the previous year, it has been of vital importance in carrying on the work of the Hospital.

The Board are strongly of opinion that a town of the population of Blackpool ought reasonably to yield a larger income in Annual Subscriptions, in support of its chief charitable Institution. A special appeal is therefore made to the Subscribers to assist by inducing their friends to become Annual Subscribers, and in doing so would render to the Hospital a valuable and timely service, which the Board would greatly appreciate. Each subscription of one guinea entitles the subscriber to one vote at the Annual Meeting.

The Ladies' efforts during the year have again been very successful, and are to be heartily complimented upon the results achieved as shown in the following table, and the Board of Management thank them for their loyal services on behalf of the Hospital.

The contributions from Workpeople again show an increase on the previous year of £191 16s. 3d., which must be considered very satisfactory, especially when one remembers the times of depression that we are passing through. It is hoped that all employers will give their employees every facility for taking advantage of this method of contribution.

Householders' Boxes have not been so successful as one is entitled to expect. The decline has been gradual and it is to be hoped that greater efforts will be made to regain its former position by the increased attention of "The Hotel and Apartments Association," and the Board appeal with every confidence to the members of that Association to obtain for the Hospital as large a sum as possible from their visitors who benefit so largely from its services. A glance at the list of the Towns from which patients are received fully justifies the undoubted claim the Hospital has upon their support.

Payments by, or on behalf of patients, show a slight decrease on the previous year, being £2,590 2s. 3d. for 1932 and £2,345 13s. 3d. for 1933. The Board of Management feel there are many hardships to contend with, and while they are quite willing to grant free treatment to those unable to make a payment, they feel that those in receipt of wages should willingly contribute towards their maintenance, and they appeal to the public to help them as much as possible in this matter. The maintenance cost of the Hospital is increasing, the population is growing, there is a steady increase in the number of patients treated, these are the important factors in the increased cost of maintenance.

The Board of Management report the receipt of legacies from the Exors. of the late Mrs. J. R. Huddlestone of £1,000, and from the Exors. of the late M. A. Blamires of £100.

Mrs. Sarah Mary Richardson, widow of the late Dr. William B. Richardson, who for many years was Honorary Surgeon to the Hospital, died on 19th July, 1933, and by her will left the residue of her estate to the Hospital to be used by the said Hospital for the Endowment or towards the Endowment of a Surgical Ward in memory of her late husband, Dr. William Brown Richardson. The Exor., Mr. J. B. Calkeld, states that he hopes in the near future to hand over securities value about £8,000—and on the death of an annuitant further securities value £2,000.

- R. B. Mather, J.P., died 27/7/33, both of whom were Trustees of the Hospital and late members of the Board of Management.
- Mrs. J. R. Huddlestone, O.B.E., died 13/8/33, rendered very valuable services for many years as a member of the Ladies' General Committee.

The Board of Management at their meeting held on the 14th June, 1933, elected Percy Willis, J.P., to fill the vacancy caused by the death of J. W. Mitchell, J.P.

The Donors and Subscribers at the Annual Meeting, 15th June, 1933, re-elected A. H. Turner, also Drs. W. J. McL. Baird and Major English, nominated by the Hon. Medical Board and Drs. H. T. Barton and Joseph McAuley, nominated by the Medical Practitioners of the Borough, members of the Board of Management.

The Board regret to record the resignation of the Rev. R. F. Moss on the 20th December, 1933, and desire to place on record an appreciation of the valuable services he rendered during the eleven years he was a member of the Board.

Although not coming within the purview of this Report the vacancies on the Board of Management caused by the death of J. R. Fielding, J.P., and the resignation of the Rev. R. F. Moss, have been duly filled by the election of Joseph Fielding, Builder, etc., "Derrymeade," Bispham Road, Blackpool, and the Rev. J. H. Barr, Clerk in Holy Orders, Vicarage, Park Road, Blackpool.

The following members retire at the next Annual Meeting of Donors and Subscribers, namely:—Messrs. G. Mitchell, T. P. Fletcher, W. H. Fox, T. Stopford and P. Willis, all of whom are eligible for re-election.

The collection of eggs last year totalled 30,000 for which the Board of Management thank all who assisted in achieving such a splendid result, and especially the Teachers and Scholars in the Schools of the Borough.

The presentation of Medals to the most successful Nurses of the year was performed by His Worship the Mayor, Ald. T Fenton, J.P., the winners being:—

rst—The "William Hammond Hodgson" Memorial Gold Medal—Nurse Kelleher.

2nd—The "J. R. Fielding" Silver Medal—Nurse Singleton.
3rd—The "Freda Kelsall" Bronze Medal—Nurse Green.

The special prize for the best all-round Nurse of the year was won by Nurse Green.

The erection of our new Hospital is proceeding most satisfactorily and we trust our subscribers will take an early opportunity, if they have not already done so, of viewing its progress, the Hon. Secretary will be pleased at any convenient time to make arrangements for them to do so.

We have now reached a stage in the building which is full of interest and affords a liberal education for those interested in Hospital architecture. Our only regret is that we are unable to proceed with the full scheme which includes the Out-patients' Department, Medical Block and the Nurses' Home. The difficulty is, that though such a Hospital is one of, if not the most essential social services of the Town, we cannot by merely obtaining the sanction of the Ministry of Health at once proceed to borrow the money at a low rate of interest and erect the buildings forthwith as in the case of Public Baths or a Public Park. We have to depend entirely upon Public benefactions. True we are borrowing money from the Corporation in order to fulfil this great want, but we have to give security, pay interest and eventually repay the money.

The portions of the Hospital we are now proceeding with consist of the greater part of the Administration Block, four Surgical Wards, four Operating Theatres, Maternity Ward, Children's Ward, sixteen Private Wards, together with the Casualty Ward, Boiler House and Mortuary.

The remainder of our activities will perforce for the present have to be continued in Whitegate Drive until our generous helpers have come to our further assistance, this will mean that until we are able to erect the remainder of the Adminstration Block, though the patients will be extraordinarily provided for, there will be certain restrictions in the accommodation for the Executive that will have to be accepted for the time being.

The buildings are now so far advanced as to give some idea of the character they will eventually assume and we are happy to say that there has so far been nothing but praise for the restrained but none the less attractive nature of the buildings. Everything has been so treated as to give the maximum of comfort combined with the requirements that the latest scientific experience can afford.

When completed these buildings will require furnishing. This expenditue is not included in the present contracts which total £120,000 and to cover this outlay it has been decided to hold a Bazaar in the autumn of 1935.

After the wonderful success that attended our last effort in 1925 we cannot be termed unduly sanguine if we express the conviction that we shall have no difficulty in covering the necessary expenditure entailed to provide the Laundry which, at the express request of our Ladies' Committee we have decided to erect, the payment of the Architects' fees and the furnishing of the Hospital. In addition to the Bazaar the Board have under consideration other methods of raising money which schemes will be made public through the Press in due course.

## MEDICAL REPORT

---

The Medical Board notes with pleasure that real progress has at last been made towards the erection of the new and up-to-date Hospital on a site overlooking Stanley Park, and hopes that by the time of the next Annual Report it will be almost ready for the admission of patients.

During the past year the wards at times have been overcrowded, especially the Female Ward. On several occasions there have been nearly 50 patients in this ward. It will be noticed from the following figures that all the departments of the Hospital have been kept busy during the year.

There were 2,571 admissions to the wards during the year, and a total of 3,617 patients were treated in the Out-patients' department, a considerable increase on the previous year. The average attendance in this department was 6.09 per patient.

The average daily number of beds occupied was 106.98.

The average stay in Hospital was 15.17 days.

The nursing work accomplished during the year, i.e., patients treated for one day, was 39,045.

The number of operations performed during the year was 1,826.

X-RAY DEPARTMENT.—3,312 cases were treated in this department and the attendances and treatments were 5,384, including 1,440 sunlight treatments. 170 general anæsthetics for foreign bodies and manipulations were given.

Massage Department.—416 patients were treated, the attendances being 6,047. The average number of visits per patient was 14.53.

CLINICAL PATHOLOGY.—Bio-Chemical tests were performed in this department during the year which have been of great value and assistance to the Medical and Surgical cases in diagnosis and treatment. Medical beds have been allocated for observation and treatment of Medical cases under the supervision of the Honorary Clinical Pathologist and have proved of incalculable assistance to the Hospital.

EAR, NOSE AND THROAT DEPARTMENT.—431 patients were dealt with in this department during the year.

OPHTHALMIC DEPARTMENT.—In this department 126 patients were treated with 866 attendances.

CHANGES IN STAFF:—Dr. I. M. Dove, M.B., B.Ch., and Dr. J. P. Longworth, M.B., B.Ch., were appointed Hon. Anæsthetists to fill the vacancies caused by the resignations of Dr. Dorothy H. Taylor and Dr. R. Schofield.

The Resident House Surgeons who have done duty during the year are:—Dr. A. Young and Dr. M. Gaffney, and the Resident House Physicians, Dr. M. Gaffney and Dr. H. Shaffer.

The present Resident Officers are Dr. P. B. McCumiskey, House Surgeon, and Dr. D. M. Roberts, House Physician.

66 patients were moribund on admission and died within 48 hours.

The death rate was 5.64, with the inclusion of the above cases 8.19.

The use made of the Private Wards in the Hospital has again proved that there is a demand for this provision.



# RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ADMISSION OF PATIENTS TO THE X-RAY AND ELECTRO-THERAPEUTIC DEPARTMENTS.

- 1.—All patients requiring X-Ray treatment, etc., must be furnished with a recommendation signed by their Medical adviser, and
  - (a) be admitted to the Out-Patient Department before being admitted to the X-Ray, Light or Massage Departments;
  - (b) attend at the Registrar's Office to furnish the Registrar with full particulars of their case;
  - (c) pay the fee required, previous to receiving treatment;
  - (d) receive from the Registrar:
    - (1.) Admission Card giving authority for the patient's admission to the special Department;
    - (2.) Treatment form for the particular Department.
- 2.—The Radiologist, or his assistants, are forbidden to admit any patient for X-Ray examination or treatment without this authority, except in cases of emergency.
- 3.—A case of emergency is one considered so by a member of the Hon. Medical or Surgical Staff, the Radiologist, or by the House Surgeon or House Physician. Such cases may be admitted immediately by the Radiographer or assistants, but must report the name and address of such patient to the Registrar at the end of that X-Ray session.
- 4.—All patients (emergencies excepted) must be seen by an Hon. Physician, Hon. Surgeon, House Surgeon or House Physician (acting under the authority of the Hon. Physician or Hon. Surgeon), and enter on the Treatment Form the Medical History of the case, and his recommendation for special treatment. Where such entry is made by the House Surgeon or House Physician it should be initialled by an Hon. Physician or Hon. Surgeon.

5.—The reports of the Hon. Radiologist entered on the Treatment Form may be communicated to the patient's own Medical Practitioner, by the Radiologist, the Hon. Physician or Hon. Surgeon in charge of the patient, or by the House Surgeon or House Physician, acting under his direction.

All reports are strictly confidential and issued on the understanding that they are not used for any other purpose than the treatment of the patient. Special application should be made for reports for the information of Insurance Companies, or to substantiate legal claims.

6.—Patients who are in a position to pay full fees of the X-Ray, Light or Massage, must do so, and those who are unable to pay the recognised full fees must pay in accordance with their means.

7.—Patients who are identified with the Workpeople's Contribution Scheme, will be treated under that arrangement.



# The Victoria Hospital, Blackpool.



Rules as to naming and endowing of beds and cots, adopted by the Board of Management, 5th June, 1913.



That, with a view to showing the appreciation of the support extended to the Hospital by various religious bodies, societies and individuals, not empowered to vote in respect of such support at meetings of donors and subscribers to the Hospital, the following rules be and are hereby adopted:—

- 1.—(a)—That any person or Society paying to the Board of Management for the Hospital, moneys received from collections in places of worship, or from sales of work, dramatic or other performances, concerts, or similar effort, the sum of £50 in any one year, shall in respect of such payment, be entitled to name a bed in the Hospital for the ensuing twelve months.
  - (b)—That any person or Society paying to the Board of Management for the Hospital, moneys received from collections in places of worship, or from sales of work, dramatic or other performances, concerts, or similar effort, the sum of £25 in any one year, shall, in respect of such payment, be entitled to name a cot in the Hospital for the ensuing twelve months.
  - (c)—That if a larger sum than £50 or £25, as the case may be, be contributed in any one year by any such person or society, as mentioned in the preceding rules, the amount in excess of the £50 or £25, as the case may be, shall be placed to the credit of such person or society for another year, thus:—

Contribution 1st year, £70 \ To entitle to name a bed for 2 years.

Contribution 1st year, £35 \ To entitle to name a cot for 2 years.

To entitle to name a cot for 2 years.

(d)—If the Board think fit they may agree that if and when any such person or society as aforesaid shall have paid sums of £50 or £25, as the case may be, for a period of twenty years, or if and when the aggregation of such payments shall have reached £1,000 or £500 respectively, such person or society shall be entitled thenceforward to name a bed or cot in the Hospital in perpetuity; provided that in the case of an aggregation as aforesaid there shall not be any cessation of, or any interruption in such payments which shall have the effect of there being less than £50 or £25, as the case may be, paid in any one year; and also provided that the Board shall have absolute power and discretion as to the position of any names, or method of naming of beds and cots under this rule.

#### Rules as to naming and endowing of beds and cots-(continued).

Or, as an alternative to the foregoing rule, that the Board may, if they think fit, agree to the following course being adopted:—

- 2.—That any person or society may annually pay into the endowment fund of the Hospital, not less than either £50 or £25, received from collections in places of worship, or from sales of work, dramatic or other performances, concerts, or similar efforts, such payments to accumulate until the sum of £1,000 or £500 respectively shall be reached, then such £1,000 shall endow a bed, and such £500 shall endow a cot in the Hospital in perpetuity; and that during the accumulation of the contributions such person or society shall be entitled to name a bed or cot in the Hospital, provided
  - (1.)—That the interest accruing from year to year on such contributions shall be applied to the annual maintenance fund of the Hospital.
  - (2.)—That no payment in any year shall be less than £50 or £25, as the case may be; but
  - (3.)—That if a larger sum than £50, or a larger sum than £25, as the case may be, be paid in any one year, the amount in excess of £50 or £25, shall be placed to the credit of the person or society for another year; and
  - (4.)—That in case there be any cessation of such payments or any interruption therein, which shall have the effect of there being less than £50 or £25, as the case may be, paid in any one year, the naming of a bed or cot by such person or society shall cease.

That if thought desirable the Board may agree to the following course being adopted:—

- 3.—In the case of any person or society contributing more than £50 or £25 towards the annual maintenance of a bed or cot in the Hospital, that any balance over and above the £50 or £25 may be paid into the endowment fund of the Hospital, towards the permanent endowment of a bed or cot, as the case may be, and that when the sum of £1,000 or £500 respectively shall have been reached by payments of such balances and interest thereon, the bed or cot, as the case may be, shall be endowed in perpetuity.
- 4.—The expression "person or society" in these rules shall include (a) any clergyman, minister, churchwardens, or governing body of a place of worship, contributing to the Hospital, moneys collected for the Hospital in such place of worship; and (b) the committee of management of any society or body of persons promoting, or any person solely promoting a bazaar, sale of work, dramatic or other performance, concert, or similar effort, or any contributions approved by the Board of Management, the whole or part of the proceeds whereof is duly announced to be for the Hospital.
- 5.—That the Board of Management shall have discretionary power, after consideration of each individual case as to the application thereto of any of the foregoing rules.

THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT hereby convene an ANNUAL MEETING of DONORS and SUBSCRIBERS to the funds of the Hospital, such Meeting to be held at the Town Hall, Blackpool, on Thursday, the 31st May, 1934, at 7-30 o'clock in the Evening.

At this Meeting the Donors and Subscribers will elect five elective Members of the Board of Management, the following Members retiring by rotation and being eligible for re-election, viz.:— Mr. T. P. FLETCHER, Mr. W. H. FOX, Mr. T. STOPFORD, Mr. G. MITCHELL and Mr. P. WILLIS.

No person, unless recommended by the Board is eligible for election as an elective member unless he or some donor or subscriber has at least seven clear days before the meeting left with the Secretary of the Hospital a notice duly signed, signifying his candidature, or the intention of a Donor or Subscriber to propose him. An elective member of the Board must be a donor of not less than £10 10s. od. or an annual subscriber of not less than £1 1s. od. to the funds of the Hospital.

Notice of candidature or of proposition of candidate must be left with me on or before the 23rd May, 1934.

At this Meeting the following Special Resolution will be proposed:—

"That it is desirable to make an alteration in the number of the "Members of the Board of Management of the Victoria "Hospital, Blackpool, by providing that the number of "elective members of the Board be increased from fifteen to "twenty-one and this Meeting of donors and subscribers do "by this Special Resolution resolve that the number of elective "members of the Board of Management be increased from "fifteen to twenty-one accordingly and that the Mayor of "the Borough of Blackpool for the time being shall be an "ex-officio member of the Board in addition to the two existing "ex-officio members, namely the Honorary Treasurer and "the Honorary Secretary, making the total number of the Board twenty-four.

"That the six additional elective members of the Board of 
"Management referred to in this Special Resolution shall 
"consist of three representatives of the Corporation of 
"Blackpool and three persons duly qualified and nominated 
"as provided by the Hospital Trust Deed, one of whom shall 
"be a member of and elected by the Honorary Medical Staff 
"of the Hospital and the other two by the donors and 
"subscribers and nominations on forms to be obtained from 
"the Honorary Secretary shall be left with the Honorary 
"Secretary not less than seven clear days before the adjourned 
"Annual Meeting of which due notice shall be given.

"That the first term of office of each of the three additional " elective members representing the Corporation of Blackpool "shall be three years and the first term of office of each of "the other three additional elective members elected shall be "determined as follows:—The person elected by the highest "number of votes to hold office for three years; the person " elected by the next highest number of votes to hold office "for two years; and the person elected by the lowest number " of votes to hold office for one year : in case of any equality " of votes the Chairman to have a casting vote : "additional elective members to be eligible for re-election "if duly qualified under the Trust Deed; and that on the "expiration of his first term of office fixed by this Resolution, "each of the elective members, or his successor respectively "may be elected for the full term of three years specified by "the Trust Deed.

"That the election of the six additional elective members of the Board of Management referred to shall take place at an adjournment of this Annual Meeting of donors and subscribers to be held at a time to be decided at this Meeting but not earlier than seven days after.

"In the event of there not being any nominations under this "Special Resolution, or if the number of nominations shall be "less than six, the Board of Management may proceed to "exercise the powers vested in them by the Trust Deed to "fill any casual vacancies on the Board"

Every Donor or Subscriber as defined in the Trust Deed may vote personally or by proxy; the instrument appointing a proxy must be under the hand of the appointer, or if such appointer be a Corporation, under its Common Seal, and must be deposited with me not less than twenty-four hours before the time for holding the Meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote.

All necessary forms, including forms of authority to a person to represent an institution or society may be obtained from the undersigned.

#### TO OLD AND NEW SUBSCRIBERS

How to increase your subscription by 33½ per cent. without any extra cost.

By virtue of the Income Tax Act, 1918, and subsequent Finance Acts it is possible for a hospital to recover from the Inland Revenue Department the Income Tax that has been paid by subscribers in respect of their subscriptions. To enable a hospital to do this, however, it is necessary that each subscriber should enter into a Contract to pay to the hospital an annual subscription of definite amount during a period of not less than seven years.

A sur-tax payer actually profits by this scheme, as he is entitled to deduct the gross amount of his annual subscription from the total income shown in his next sur-tax return.

These agreements are usually so drawn as to be terminated by death, so that a subscriber's estate will not be liable to continue the subscription after he has died. If so desired, however, the agreement may be made for seven years certain binding the subscriber's estate.

#### A concrete case :—

A subscriber covenants to pay to the hospital out of his taxed income an annual subscription of say, £5 5s., during a period of seven years. The hospital can then claim from the Inland Revenue £1 15s. so long as Income Tax remains at 5s. in the £. The amount of subscription in the Annual Report would be £7. The subscriber is entitled to deduct £7 from his sur-tax return.
