





OBJECTS.



TO provide for the reception, maintenance, and medical treatment as In-Patients, and the medical treatment as Out-Patients, of the sick children of the necessitous poor (children whose parents are able to pay to be excluded from the benefits of the Institution, except in consideration of such payment as may be deemed appropriate); to promote the advancement of medical science with reference to the diseases of children; to diffuse amongst all classes of the community, and chiefly amongst the poor, a better acquaintance with the management of infants and children during illness, and to assist in the education and training of women in the special duties of children's nurses.

EXTRACT FROM BYE-LAWS.

Donors or Collectors of FIFTY POUNDS or upwards in one year shall be LIFE VICE-PRESIDENTS ; of TWENTY POUNDS or upwards, but under FIFTY POUNDS, shall be LIFE MEMBERS ; and Subscribers of ONE GUINEA annually shall be MEMBERS of the Institution, according to its rules.

Cots.—Every person subscribing or collecting £25 or upwards per annum to the Institution, in addition to being a LIFE MEMBER, shall have the privilege of naming a Cot for the then current year of Subscription ; every person subscribing £300 or upwards to the Institution shall have the like privilege for life ; and every person subscribing £500 or upwards to the Institution shall have the like privilege in perpetuity.

Every Clergyman and Minister making collections on behalf of the Institution amounting to the sum of £25 or upwards in any one year, in addition to being a LIFE MEMBER, shall have the privilege of naming a Cot after his Church or Parish for 12 calendar months next after the payment of such amount, and for such period as the same sum continues to be paid.

Every person collecting sums for the benefit of the Institution amounting in all to £20 or upwards in one year, shall be a Life Member of the Institution, or sums amounting to not less than One Guinea, shall for twelve calendar months next after payment of the same, have the same privilege as Members.

Any person who bequeaths not less than ONE HUNDRED POUNDS (duty free) to the Institution may by will nominate a LIFE VICE-PRESIDENT or two LIFE MEMBERS of the Institution. Any person bequeathing not less than FIFTY POUNDS (duty free) may by will nominate one LIFE MEMBER.

The Committee especially appeal to the Ladies of Hull and the Neighbourhood to assist them in their efforts by obtaining Donations and Subscriptions, and all Ladies desirous of doing so, will, upon application at the Institution, be supplied with Books for this purpose





ANNUAL MEETING.



The 55th Annual General Meeting was held at the Hospital on Thursday, 17th May, 1928.

Mr. W. Hugh Stephenson, J.P. (Chairman of the Board of Management) presided, and was supported by the President of the Institution (The Rt. Hon. T. R. Ferens, P.C.), the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress (Ald. and Mrs. H. Dean), the Sheriff and Sheriff's Lady (Mr. and Mrs. S. Webster), Miss Wentworth, Mr. E. Sheardown, J.P., Mr. G. F. Grant, J.P., Mr. W. Burwell, J.P., Mr. H. P. Horsley, Mr. C. E. Exley, Mr. Henry Stonehouse, J.P., Canon E. A. Berry, the Rev. J. D. Devereux, Mr. J. F. H. Staples, Mr. E. Johnson, Miss M. Kennedy, Mrs. Chas. Richardson, J.P., Miss A. E. Stephenson, Mrs. Walter Bell, Mrs. and Miss Cattley, Miss Levett, Mrs. T. E. Featherstone, Mr. F. J. Palethorpe, Mrs. Palethorpe, Mrs. B. S. Hainworth, Mr. C. E. A. Lyon, J.P., Mrs. F. B. Moss Blundell, Rev. Seldon Morgan, Ald. T. S. Taylor, J.P., Major R. W. Gleadow.

Mr. Sheardown presented the Annual Report, which stated that the year 1927 had been an important one in the history of the hospital—a year largely of improvements and additions on the surgical and medical sides of the institution. It would be seen from the figures given in the Report that the activities of the hospital were increasing rapidly, the accommodation was severely taxed, and the Hon. Medical Staff were asking for more and more room. It could not be too strongly emphasised that, notwithstanding figures appearing in the newspapers from time to time of the decrease in the birth rate in the country generally, the needs of the hospital were greater than ever, and that there was an increase in the numbers treated in almost all departments of the institution.

During the summer it had been decided to provide further beds at the Hornsea Convalescent Home, and more cases were sent down to the Home, with excellent results.

The Board had appointed Dr. T. Ritchie Rodger Hon. Surgeon to the new ear, nose and throat department, and Dr. D. Stenhouse Stewart, Hon. Ophthalmic Surgeon. An Honorary Dental Surgeon also had been appointed. In the out-patients' department an ultra violet ray outfit had been established, and important improvements in and additions to the equipment had been made.

Mr. G. F. Grant, J.P. (Hon. Treasurer), submitted the financial report, and pointing out that the subscriptions and donations for 1927 (£2,993) were down £150 on the previous year, said that with the increased responsibilities arising from incorporation and the fact that Hull was growing, they must do their utmost to obtain greatly increased subscriptions. The total expenditure of the institution was over £10,000 in 1927, but he prophesied that it would be £12,000 in another year when the extensions were completed.

The Chairman, moving the adoption of the Report and Balance Sheet, pointed out that the new ward of ten beds would cost £900 to £1,000 a year extra. They had one of the best equipped children's hospitals in the country, and they must make the income keep pace with developments. He alluded to the splendid efforts of the Working Men's Committee, and paid special tribute to the Lord Mayor's work in connection with that body for 35 years.

Mr. Horsley seconded and referred to the new Ward for special cases.

The Report and Balance Sheet were then approved.

Moving a vote of thanks to the Board of Management, the Honorary Officers, and Medical Staff, the Lord Mayor referred to recent newspaper criticism of the activities of unauthorised house-to-house collectors, and said that in the case of the Children's Hospital all the collectors wore badges and were supplied with an authority signed by the Secretary. He wished that people would be more careful in seeing that unauthorised persons did not get the money. None of the hospital collectors were paid for their services, the whole of the money collected going to the hospital, and their written authority to collect was renewed yearly.

Mr. Exley seconded, and said the Board of Management, the doctors, the nurses and the staff gave of their very best without hope of reward, in the knowledge they were doing a great and noble work.

The Sheriff moved—"That the President, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Secretaries, the Hon. Officers and the members of the Board of Management remain in their respective offices until the Certificate of Incorporation of the Institution be received and the new Board elected."

Mr. H. Stonehouse who seconded the resolution, paid the following warm tribute to the memory of the late Mr. Thomas Bailey, J.P., from whose estate the Institution had benefited to the extent of £11,000 :—This Hospital received many handsome gifts from him during his life-time, but not until the publication of his will was it known what a warm corner he had in his heart for this Institution. He derived much pleasure in amassing his wealth, but not from any miserly motive, for during his life-time nearly all Benevolent Institutions in the City and neighbourhood regularly shared in his liberality. Neither was his genius employed for any selfish end, for his tastes were not gratified by indulging in excessive luxuries. He liked giving, but all the same he preferred it should be spontaneous, and suppliants for his charity gained nothing by importunity. He gave without ostentation and had no thirst for praise, and to all kinds of flattery he turned a deaf ear, and when arranging the final distribution of his wealth he cast aside the old Mosaic margin of 10 per cent. and left nearly all his vast fortune for benefit of those who needed it most. His ultimate object in making money was that he might apply it to its noblest end. We ought to be profoundly thankful that an over-ruling Providence raises up and prospers men like Mr. Bailey and our dear friend the President, who take a delight in disposing of their substance for the amelioration of suffering poor.

On the proposition of the Rev. J. D. Devereux, seconded by Mr. J. F. H. Staples, the Subscribers, Donors, Lady Collectors and the Working Men's Committee were thanked ; and the Committees of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds were thanked on the motion of Mr. Wm. Burwell, J.P., seconded by Mr. Ed. Johnson.

At the conclusion of the Meeting, the President (the Rt. Hon. T. R. Ferens), moved a very cordial vote of thanks to the Chairman for presiding.

New Depart- During the summer it was decided to provide further beds at the Hornsea Convalescent **ments and Extensions.** More cases were sent down to the Home with excellent results.

On the advice of the Hon. Medical Staff, the Board decided to appoint two Honorary Specialists for the treatment of the diseases of the ear, nose and throat, and also the eye. It appointed Dr. T. Ritchie Rodger Hon. Surgeon to the new ear, nose and throat department, and Dr. D. Stenhouse Stewart Hon. Ophthalmic Surgeon. This, of course, necessitated additional accommodation, and arrangements were made for extra beds and equipment.

The Board has under consideration the appointment of an Honorary Dental Surgeon.

On the recommendation of the Hon. Medical Staff, the Ultra Violet Ray outfit has been established in the Out-Patients' Department, and important improvements in, and additions to, the equipment have been made.

Carolling "Ye Monks of Newland" again carolled at Christmas with good effect and contributed £34. (*per* Mr. Harold Ellis).

"Hessle Waits" once again were very good friends, and carolled forth to the tune of £57 5s. (*per* Mr. C. W. Marshall).

Hymers College Carol Concert Party (*per* Mr. W. V. Cavill, M.A.) kindly contributed £9.

Staff. Owing to the resignation of Miss Lovekin, it was necessary to appoint a new Matron. In April the Committee selected Miss M. Kennedy, who took up her duties on 31st May. Since her appointment the work of the Hospital has continued in a very smooth and efficient manner.

In June Miss D. Render, Masseuse, resigned her position, and Miss L. Howard was appointed.

Dr. Dorothy Collishaw, House Surgeon, resigned on 31st December, and Dr. Lillie S. Dickson was appointed to that position. Dr. Ethel Morris, House Physician, resigned on the same date, and Dr. Ethel G. Potts was appointed in her place.

There is another long list, particulars of which **Special Contributions** are set out elsewhere in this Report, showing how great is the interest taken in the work of the Hospital by all classes.

One day a gentleman walked into the Hospital and begged to be allowed to give a donation to the funds of the Institution. No name was given ; he remains anonymous and is unknown to the Hospital Staff. He left behind £55 in Bank of England Notes, for which we express our most sincere thanks.

The Licensed Trades again made the large donation of £75 to our funds.

The Directors of Messrs. T. J. Smith & Nephew, Ltd., kindly continued their usual practice and forwarded to the Hospital large presents in the shape of surgical dressings.

The Directors of the L.N.E. Railway Co., recognised in a very practical way the services of the Hospital Nursing Staff in the Withernsea Express Disaster. They expressed their gratitude by a donation to the funds of the Hospital and a further sum for the purchase of a suitable article of furniture for the Nurses' Home.

Corn, Seed and Oil and Coal Trades. Messrs. Bernard Barker, Jack Wright and E. A. Rodger kindly undertook the collection of the New Year subscriptions at the Pacific Club and Hull Exchange from members and friends of these trades.

Hospital Saturday and Sunday Funds. Again these collections are very satisfactory, for which we are greatly indebted to our Civic Heads. There was an increase in the Hospital Sunday Fund, £1,300 being allocated to the Institution. The Hospital Saturday Fund contributed £100. Our thanks are once more tendered to these Committees.

Mrs. Arthur Wilson, who was so well known to us all. Both she and her husband, our late President, had identified themselves with the work of the Hospital from its earliest days. We feel her loss deeply, and desire to express our sympathy with Captain Stanley Wilson, J.P., and all the other members of her family. The “Arthur Wilson” Ward in the Hospital will bear witness for all time to the unstinted generosity of our late President and his wife.

Working Men's Committee. Congratulations to Alderman H. Dean, J.P., who has been associated for so many years with this Committee, on his selection as Chief Magistrate of the City.

Again we desire to draw attention to the efforts of this Committee, which handed over £3,150 to the

Hospital, and £20 to the Hornsea Convalescent Home. This is a splendid result, having regard to the present difficulties in industry. Our thanks to all members of this Committee.

The most serious step the Hospital has taken **Incorporation.** in recent years must be noted. Early in the year the Board recommended that the necessary steps should be taken to convert the Institution into an Incorporated Company. In May a Special General Meeting of the Members of the Institution was held, at which it was unanimously decided that this important change should be made. There can be no doubt as to the wisdom of this action, having regard to the present size of the Hospital and the importance of the Institution in the life of the City. At the moment of writing, the matter is in the hands of the Honorary Solicitors to the Institution, Messrs. Thompson, Cook & Babington, and before H.M. Board of Trade Department. The Board desires to express appreciation of the work and care devoted to the question by Mr. J. C. Babington and the Incorporation Sub-Committee, which has gone into the whole matter with great thoroughness.

MEDICAL REPORT for 1927.

THE Honorary Medical Staff has pleasure in presenting the medical report for 1927.

The total number of patients treated during the period under review is almost as great as it was in the record year of 1926 ; but the figures show an interesting variation, for, whilst the number of in-patients has slightly decreased, this loss is almost balanced by an increase in the number of out-patients.

The new theatre and adjacent rooms in the out-patient building have allowed of many children being operated upon, and kept in the recovery room till they recovered, who, under a less up-to-date arrangement, would have had to be sent to the wards. This saves the children distress, and the Hospital expense, but, of course decreases the number of in-patients.

Infectious disease, fortunately mild in type, has obstructed the work of the Hospital to a greater extent than usual ; at one time near the end of the year, so many of the staff were rendered temporarily unfit for duty that some difficulty was experienced in keeping the work going. That this difficulty was overcome is due to the fact that the House Physician and many of the Nurses undertook the duties of their sick colleagues as well as their own.

The House Surgeon (Dr. Collishaw) and the House Physician (Dr. Morris) have both left the Hospital. The regret with which the Hon. Staff parted with two hard working and skilful young colleagues was heightened by the fact that, owing to unforeseen circumstances, they both resigned at the same time, thus making the duties of their successors more arduous.

The Honorary Medical Staff wishes to record its grateful thanks to the Residents, to the Matron and her Nurses, and to the members of the other auxiliary services for dexterous and willing help given during the year.

IN presenting the Thirty-Seventh Annual Report and Balance Sheet, we have pleasure in stating that the work of the past year has been well maintained, although unemployment and depression in trade were still in our midst.

The income for the year, including the balance brought forward is £3,629 0s. 7d. The House-to-House Collection in Hull was £188 18s. 7d., and in the surrounding districts the sum of £482 19s. 8d. was collected, making a total from this source of £671 18s. 3d. Operatives' donations amounted to £1,189 14s. 3d., which is somewhat less than last year, but with a return of increased employment we are hoping to remedy this decrease in the near future.

The Hospital Saturday Committee paid over to this Hospital the sum of £100. The Flag Day Collection was again a success and realised £324 11s. 6d. Collections were again taken on behalf of the Committee during the holding of Hull Fair, and resulted in the sum of £124 15s. 4d. being raised. The special effort organised at Christmas was the means of adding £155 5s. to the funds of the Committee. The patrons of the Star and Garter Hotel, Hessle Road, Hull, have continued their keen interest in the work of the Hospital, and have raised the handsome sum of £74 10s. as their donation for the year. The usual donation of £20 has been received from the Albert Club.

The City Football Cup Competition was most successful, and as the result the sum of £95 was received by the Committee.

The income of the Committee has also been augmented by donations from the Hull City Football Club and the Kingston Rovers Club.

A friend of the Hospital who wished to remain anonymous donated the sum of £25, and another friend the sum of £5.

A Whist Drive at Sutton realised the sum of £17. A Dance at Skidby £5 10s. 7d., and a Concert by Miss E. Trott, £8 7s. 5d. The Recreation Clubs have also in several cases contributed very generously to our funds.

A detailed statement of income and expenditure is set out in the financial statements.

At the annual meeting of the Committee it was decided to pay to the Board of Management the sum of £3,150 for the General Account, and £20 to the Hornsea Home Account.

The hearty thanks of the Committee are tendered to all those who have so loyally supported the work of the Hospital during the past year.




