

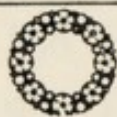

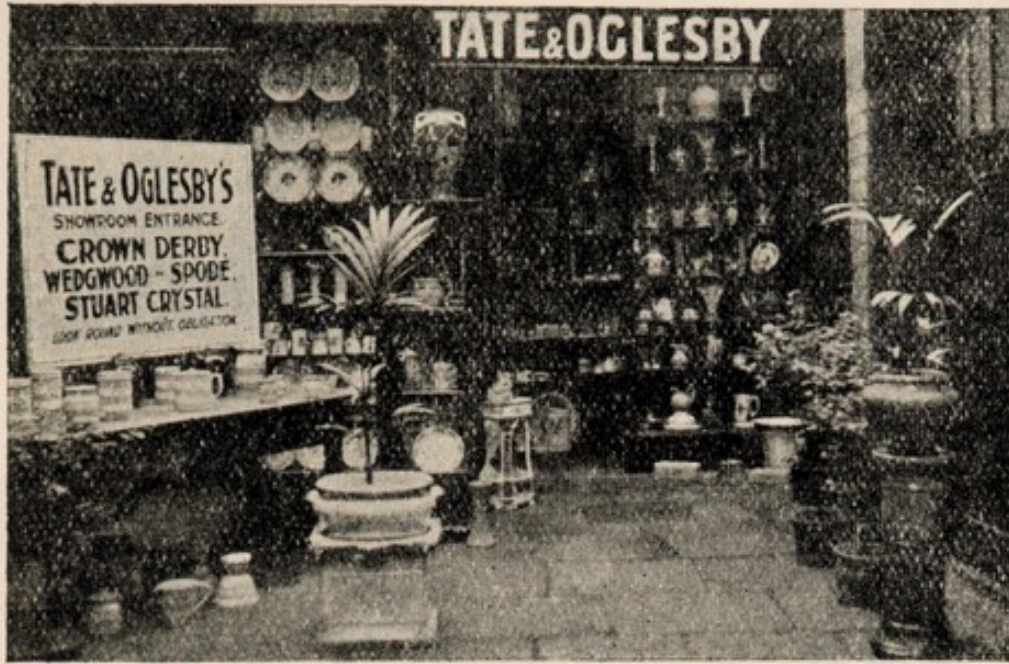

Objects . . .



TO provide for the reception, maintenance, and medical treatment as In-Patients, and the medical treatment as Out-Patients, of the sick children of the necessitous poor (children whose parents are able to pay to be excluded from the benefits of the Institution, except in consideration of such payment as may be deemed appropriate); to promote the advancement of medical science with reference to the diseases of children; to diffuse amongst all classes of the community, and chiefly amongst the poor, a better acquaintance with the management of infants and children during illness, and to assist in the education and training of women in the special duties of children's nurses.

EXTRACT FROM BYE-LAWS.

Donors or Collectors of FIFTY POUNDS or upwards in one year shall be LIFE VICE-PRESIDENTS ; of TWENTY POUNDS or upwards, but under FIFTY POUNDS, shall be LIFE MEMBERS ; and Subscribers of ONE GUINEA annually shall be MEMBERS of the Institution, according to its rules.

COTS.—Every person subscribing or collecting £25 or upwards per annum to the Institution, in addition to being a LIFE MEMBER, shall have the privilege of naming a Cot for the then current year of Subscription ; every person subscribing £300 or upwards to the Institution shall have the like privilege for life ; and every person subscribing £500 or upwards to the Institution shall have the like privilege in perpetuity.

Every Clergyman and Minister making collections on behalf of the Institution amounting to the sum of £25 or upwards in any one year, in addition to being a LIFE MEMBER, shall have the privilege of naming a Cot after his Church or Parish for 12 calendar months next after the payment of such amount, and for such period as the same sum continues to be paid.

Every person collecting sums for the benefit of the Institution amounting in all to £20 or upwards in one year, shall be a Life Member of the Institution, or sums amounting to not less than One Guinea, shall for twelve calendar months next after payment of the same, have the same privilege as Members.

Any person who bequeaths not less than ONE HUNDRED POUNDS (duty free) to the Institution may by will nominate a LIFE VICE-PRESIDENT or two LIFE MEMBERS of the Institution. Any person bequeathing not less than FIFTY POUNDS (duty free) may by will nominate one LIFE MEMBER.

The Committee especially appeal to the Ladies of Hull and the Neighbourhood to assist them in their efforts by obtaining Donations and Subscriptions, and all Ladies desirous of doing so, will, upon application at the Institution, be supplied with Books for this purpose.





The 56th Annual Meeting was held at the Hospital on Friday, 14th June, 1929, for the year ended 31st December, 1928, this being the last Meeting under the function of the Trustees, the Institution having become Incorporated as from 1st January last.

At the request of the President (the Rt. Hon. T. R. Ferens, J.P.), Mr. William Burwell, J.P., presided, and amongst others present were Mr. E. Sheardown, J.P. (Hon. Secretary); Mr. G. F. Grant, J.P. (Hon. Treasurer); Mr. F. J. Palethorpe (Secretary); Mr. James Downs, J.P., Mr. E. J. Adderley, J.P., Mrs. Burwell, Mr. C. E. Exley, Mrs. H. Dean, Mrs. Walter Bell, Miss Stephenson, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Singleton, Mr. R. H. Bottamley, Mr. E. Walker, Mrs. Palethorpe, Mrs. Harris, Miss Dickinson, Mr. F. Moulson, Mrs. Brocklebank, Mrs. Featherstone, Miss Cattley, Miss M. Kennedy (Matron), Mrs. F. B. Moss-Blundell, Dr. F. C. Eve, Dr. D. S. Stewart, Mr. and Mrs. J. T. Collier, Miss Oxtoby, Miss Shaw, Miss Wheeldon, and others.

Letters of apology for unavoidable absence were received from Mr. W. Hugh Stephenson, J.P., Mr. J. F. H. Staples, Mr. H. P. Horsley, Mr. B. Cyril Barton, Col. G. H. Clarke, Alderman H. Dean, Mrs. Bailey, Mrs. Seed, Mrs. Lee Smith, Alderman T. S. Taylor, Major R. W. Gleadow, Capt. Tom Wells and Mr. H. W. Jackson.

Presenting the Annual Report, Mr. E. Sheardown said that the Bazaar held in November last had produced £1,090. During the year 407 children had been sent to the Hornsea Convalescent Home.

The outstanding feature in the medical report was the increase in the number of in-patients by 174 over the previous year. This was made possible by the provision of extra beds for aural and ophthalmic cases.

Nearly 200 more children were brought to the Institution as casualty patients, and it was pointed out that urgent accident cases could be, and were, attended to at any time of the day or night. The medical staff wished to make it clear that children suffering with infectious diseases had to be refused admission owing to the risk to the other little patients. The Hospital at all times had a "family" of about 100 children in the wards. The reports were unanimously adopted.

Mr. G. F. Grant, Hon. Treasurer, submitted the financial report and pointed out that the receipts amounted to £12,716, and the total expenditure to £10,462 12s. (inclusive of the Hornsea Convalescent Home). £1,000 had been carried to the Extension Fund for work done in connection with the extensions, and the balance of £1,357 would only keep them going for about a month at their present rate of expenditure. Mr. Grant paid tribute to the devotion of the nursing staff, and mentioned that the Hospital had at Hornsea one of the finest Convalescent Homes in the country, and they owed its inception to the generosity of Mr. Ferens who was with them that day.

The Board of Management was warmly thanked by Mr. C. E. Exley and Mrs. Burwell for the successful administration of the Hospital's affairs during the year.

Mr. E. J. Adderley paid tribute to the subscribers, lady collectors and the Working Men's Committee, the latter having contributed the handsome sum of £3,170. He also thanked the members of the Dorcas Society for their assistance. The result of the collectors' work he said, shows that the Institution was looked upon with the greatest possible confidence by the citizens of Hull. Dr. Eve added similar expressions of appreciation.

Mr. James Downs voiced the thanks of the Meeting to the Committee of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Fund. Their thanks to these excellent supporters was not merely lip service, for their contributions had been exceedingly valuable ones. Mr. F. Moulson supported.

At the conclusion of the Meeting, Mr. W. H. Singleton moved a cordial vote of thanks to the Chairman for presiding, and this was seconded by the President, who appealed for the continued interest of the younger supporters.

For the Year 1928.

At last we have become incorporated, which means that the Trustees cease to function and we can hold the property in our own right; but it has been a tedious and lengthy business, and we are very much indebted to our Solicitor, Mr. J. C. Babington, and the Incorporation Sub-Committee, who have shown untold patience and skill in bringing the negotiations to a successful conclusion.

New Departments and Extensions. Wards for the Ear, Nose, Throat and Eye Departments were opened by our President on July 16th, 1928. These wards were named after Mr. G. F. Grant, in acknowledgment of the valuable services rendered by our esteemed Hon. Treasurer for many years. The provision of this ward has been more than justified by the results. Mr. T. F. Lavelle, L.D.S., has been appointed Hon. Dental Surgeon. This is a new and apparently much-needed Department. A Sister Tutor has been appointed to give

Special Lectures and Instructions to the Nursing Staff so that the Institution may have the benefit of a Nursing Service thoroughly up-to-date, and to prepare the nurses for passing the examinations now necessary to qualify as a member of the nursing profession.

The amount contributed by this Committee during the past year has been the handsome sum of £3,150 and £20 for the Convalescent Home, Hornsea. It is hardly necessary that the Board should allude more than they have repeatedly done to the sacrifice of time and the unselfish and tireless efforts on the part of the various members of this Committee, which alone can secure such gratifying results of their labours. Our best thanks to all the members of this Committee. As a token of appreciation of Alderman Dean's long and valued services in connection with the Hospital and as Hon. Secretary of the Working Men's Committee, a framed photograph of the Alderman and ex-Lord Mayor, subscribed for by his colleagues on the House Committee, has been hung in the Board Room of the Institution.

Again we have to thank the "Monks of Carolling. Newland" for the sum of £32 10s. received through Mr. Harold Ellis, and £58 5s. from the "Hessle Waits" per Mr. C. W. Marshall.

There is again a long list, particulars of which are set out elsewhere in this Report. Messrs. **Special Contributions.** T. J. Smith and Nephew have, as in the past, made us handsome presents in the shape of Surgical Dressings.

Our President kindly presented a Piano for the nurses' sitting room.

Hornsea Convalescent Home. The number of children sent to the Home during the year has reached 407. The demand for accommodation has been so great that six extra beds have been provided, bringing the number of beds to 36. This number speaks for itself as to the excellent work being done by the Home, and its great utility in supplementing the treatment of children's diseases. We are grateful to the residents of Hornsea and the neighbourhood for their interest and generous support, and to the members of the Hull Rotary Club and other friends who very kindly lent their cars for the conveyance of children to and from the Convalescent Home. This has been a great joy to the patients. The building itself has been kept in perfect repair and condition within and without, and a visit to it and inspection of it by any friend of the Institution or of children generally could not fail to please.

Retirements. It is with the greatest possible regret that we record the resignation through ill-health, of Mr. W. H. Singleton as Chairman of the House Committee. We have every reason to regret his resignation for he had filled the post long enough to enable us to judge what an admirable Chairman he was.

Mr. H. P. Horsley has been elected to succeed him.

We have also to deplore the loss of one of our Honorary Secretaries—Mr. G. Lee Wanless, L.L.B., J.P., owing to removal from Hull; he was always ready to pull his weight in the boat and we shall miss his genial presence and wise counsel.

The Committee have elected Mr. H. P. Horsley in his place.

Obituary. It is with a sense of personal loss that we record the death of our kind friend, Major Bernard Barton, J.P., one of the oldest Members of the House Committee (1888) and at one time Vice-Chairman of the

Board. He will be remembered by what he did in connection with the Fancy Dress Ball for a great number of years, and for taking the part of "Father Christmas" to the great delight of the patients and the staff at the annual festivities at the Hospital. Major Barton also succeeded each year in persuading gentlemen on the "Pacific Club" and at the "Hull Exchange" to undertake the collection of the "New Year subscriptions," which resulted in substantial sums being contributed to the funds of the Hospital. The Committee decided to commemorate his deeds by establishing a Cot in perpetuity to his memory.

As a final proof of his interest in the Hospital, Mr. Barton bequeathed the sum of £250 to the funds of the Institution. The Board are glad to announce that Mr. B. Cyril Barton has taken his father's place on the House Committee and as "Father Christmas," and thus carries on the tradition to the second generation.

The Board desire to acknowledge their indebtedness to the Matron, Miss Kennedy, for her very capable and economical management, and to the Sisters, Nursing, Clerical and Domestic Staffs; and last but not least to the Hon. Medical Staff for their work during the twelve months. Also to thank very heartily all those who by subscriptions, donations, collections or other valued and appreciated services have enabled the Institution to be maintained in so satisfactory a manner and its sphere of usefulness to have been so enlarged.

MEDICAL REPORT for 1928.

THE outstanding feature of the Medical Report for 1928 is that the number of in-patients (1,342) is greater than that of last year by 174. This is mainly due to the extra beds which have been devoted to the treatment of disease in the throat and in the organs of special sense.

Nearly two hundred more children were brought to the Institution as casualty patients. This is a marked increase; nevertheless, one cannot help thinking that the number would have been greater if the facilities offered by the Hospital for the treatment of urgent street or other accidents were recognised to the extent which they deserve. The Hon. Medical Staff wishes to emphasize the fact that urgent accidents can be, and are, attended to at any time of the day or night.

During the year the Medical Staff has often been distressed by patients seeking admission to the wards who are suffering from some form of infectious disease. Often the parents make no secret of the presence of infection, but some yield to the temptation to conceal the fact that their baby whoops at times, or has recently had a rash or sore throat. Seriously ill as many of these children are, the Medical Staff is bound to refuse admission to them, simply on account of the risk of infecting others.

The Hospital always has a family of something like one hundred in the wards, and is, to a great extent, in *loco parentis* to these children and would be neglecting an elementary duty did it expose them to any avoidable risk of infection.

The Medical Staff would be grateful if all friends of the Hospital would recognise the fact that the presence of disease which is dangerous to others is the one—and only—bar to the admission of any poor child who is ill.

In conclusion, the Hon. Medical Staff wishes to record thanks for, and appreciation of, much valuable help given by the Residents, Dr. Clarke and Dr. Slack, by the Matron and by the other members of the various complementary services during the period under review.

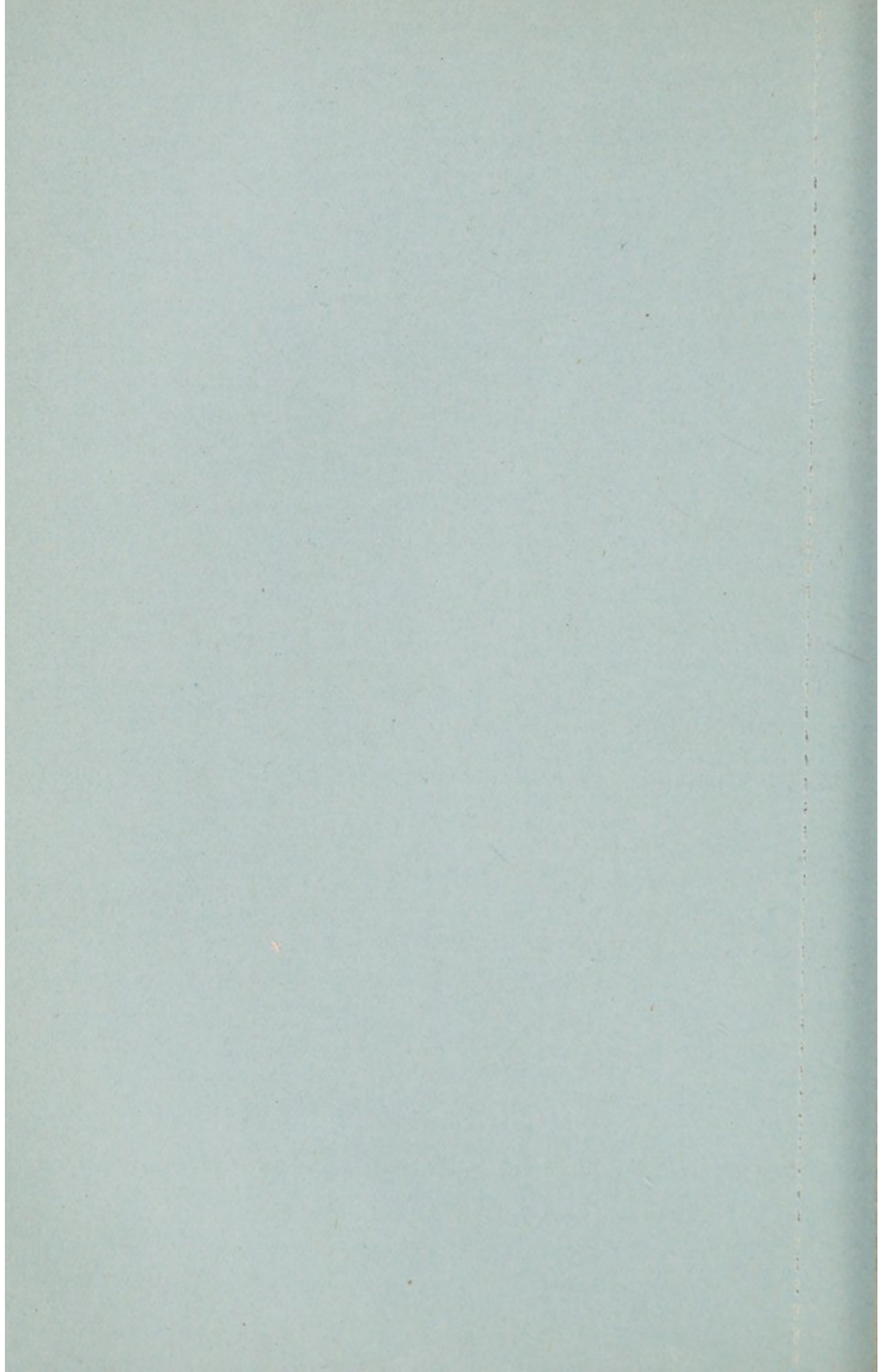

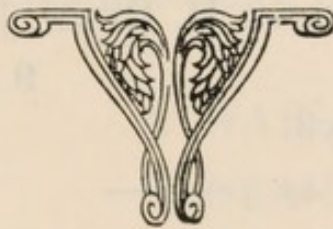

IN presenting the Thirty-Eighth Annual Report and Balance Sheet, the members of the Working Men's Committee have the pleasure of announcing the close of another successful year's work in the interests of the Hospital.

The receipts for the year amount to £3571 18s. 5d., including the balance brought forward from the previous year. The House-to-House Collections in Hull and surrounding districts amount to £574 19s. 2d. The Operatives' Donations amount to £1294 13s. 9d., and shew a satisfactory increase over the previous year.

The Flag Day collection was a most successful effort and realised £407 2s. Collections taken during Hull Fair brought in the sum of £98 2s. 7d., and £124 was paid over by the Hospital Saturday Committee. The special Christmas Effort realised £92 11s. 10d., and the sum of £65 13s. 9d. was received as the special effort organised at the Star and Garter Hotel, Hessle Road, Hull. Donations have been received from the City Football Club, the Hull Football Club, and the Kingston Rovers Club, and also from the Elementary Schools Football Association.

A Dance promoted by the Lady Mayoress (Mrs. H. Dean) towards the end of her year of office was held in the Guildhall, Hull, and resulted in the sum of £106 2s. being handed over to the funds of the Committee.

The Hull Bowling Association has handed over the sum of £15 15s. as a donation, and the Albert Club £20. Valuable assistance has also been received from many other sources.

A detailed statement of income and expenditure is published in the report. The Committee has paid over to the Board of Management the sum of £3150 for the General Account and £20 to the Hornsea Home Account.

The Committee tender their sincere thanks to all who have in any way rendered assistance during the year under review.
