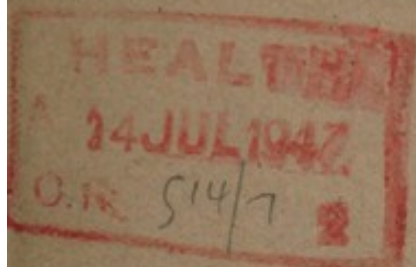

ANNUAL REPORT

For the year ended 31st December, 1946

THE Annual Meeting of the Hospital, for the year ending 31st December, 1945, was held on the 25th June, 1946, when our President, Mr. J. V. Rank, presided and was supported by the Lord Mayor (Councillor H. Harrison) and the Lady Mayoress, together with the Sheriff (Councillor H. W. Jackson) and the Sheriff's Lady.

The Chairman of the Board, Mr. W. E. Hare, presented the Annual Report of the Board for the year 1945, which had been circulated amongst the members.

The Honorary Treasurer (Mr. W. Hugh Stephenson, J.P.) submitted the Income and Expenditure Accounts and the Balance Sheet, which were adopted.

The Board of Management was re-elected.

The Balance Sheet and Accounts 1946 show, notwithstanding the amount received from the Special Appeal of £6,200, that there is a loss of £7,349 5 11 on the year's working.

This being the first complete year of working the Hospital under peace-time conditions, in order to bring the Hospital up to a high state of efficiency a great deal of reorganisation has been necessary.

Under this heading the Board have given instructions for the alterations to the Out-patient's Department, which, though not yet complete, will add greatly to the facilities very much needed in this department.

In February Miss L. V. Stanford was appointed Matron and on the 1st June commenced her duties, and it is pleasing to record that with her wide experience she is fully maintaining the efficiency and high tone of the Hospital. We look forward to many years of her wise guidance as Matron of the Hospital.

Alderman F. Holmes, Hon. Commandant of the Civil Defence Cyclists Messenger Corps, on their behalf, presented six large Electric Clocks to the Hospital. This gift is very much appreciated as it synchronizes the time throughout the wards.

Our Branch at Brantingham, so kindly placed at our disposal by Mr. and Mrs. Arnold Reckitt in 1941, was finally closed in February. Their generous action in accepting our children in their delightful home will always be remembered by the Board. We therefore take this opportunity of expressing our grateful thanks again.

During the year the Dorcas Society promised us £300 towards the upkeep of the linen of the Hospital. This gift will be very much appreciated, as the present cost of linen and blankets is almost prohibitive.

In June, 1946, Dr. Ritchie Rodger felt that he had to resign his work at this Hospital after many years of loyal service, and he was appointed by the Board as Honorary Consulting Surgeon in appreciation of his valued assistance. We are sure that should the occasion arise we shall continue to have the benefit of his wide experience.

For some time the Board had had under consideration the re-equipping of the X-ray Department with an up-to-date apparatus and an order for one of the very latest design has now been placed.

During the year the Hospital suffered a severe loss in the death of Mrs. Mary Jackson. She was for many years a member of the Working Men's Committee and did some very useful and splendid work. She was a representative of this Committee on the Board and House Committee, and her kindly advice at the weekly meeting of the House Committee, at which, until shortly before her last illness, she was a regular attender, will be greatly missed.

Mr. W. H. Singleton, who had been many years Chairman of our Hornsea Branch Committee, under doctor's advice, resigned his Chairmanship, also his membership of the House Committee. We do wish him a return to better health now that he has retired. His good work in connection with our Hornsea Home will long be remembered, particularly his attention to the many details in connection with the arrangements for the re-opening of the Home after its de-requisition. The Board would like to place on record their appreciation and thanks to Mr. Singleton for his many years of useful service on behalf of the Hospital.

We are glad to report that we have appointed as Almoner Miss Rosemary Joyce Morris, who will take up her duties early in the New Year.

The Hull Voluntary Hospitals Scheme provided the magnificent sum of £6,769 8s. and we wish to express our appreciation and thanks to the Council and the Organising Secretary (Mr. W. G. Nevin) for this contribution which greatly helps us in our work for the year.

We are pleased that Alderman H. Dean, J.P., Secretary of the Working Men's Committee, who had been seriously ill, is now happily restored to health and is carrying on this great work again. The Board wish to express their thanks for the handsome donation of £1,000 to our funds and congratulate the Committee on the result of their efforts.

The Hospital Sunday Fund Appeal made by the Lord Mayor (Councillor H. M. Harrison) resulting in the sum of £1,745 being allocated to this Hospital, an increase on the previous year, and we are greatly indebted to this Fund for this magnificent gift.

As usual business men of the city helped us with the collections on the Pacific and the Exchange, with the result that the Coal Trade (Mr. G. Bell) collected £112 10s. 6d., the Grain Trade (Mr. J. G. Redfern) collected £84 14s. 6d., and the Seed and Oil Trade (Mr. K. Waterhouse) collected £84 10s. 6d. We are much indebted to these gentlemen for undertaking these collections.

The Sheriff of Hull (Mr. W. R. Austen Hudson) who is also a member of the Board of Management, kindly continued the time-honoured custom of maintaining the Sheriff's Cot during his year of office.

During the war years, owing to the black-out and other difficulties, we were unable to organise the Annual Juvenile Fancy Dress Ball. Under the Presidency of Mrs. A. Wilson Filmer the popular event was resuscitated on 8th January, 1946, and held in the Reception Room of the Guildhall by kind permission of the Lord Mayor (Councillor H. M. Harrison). The Ball proved a great success, both socially and financially, £290 1s. 2d. being handed over to the funds of the Hospital. For this result our thanks are due to the Honorary Secretaries of the Ball Committee—Mr. B. C. Barton and Mr. J. N. Young, and the members of the Ladies Ball Committee.

MEDICAL REPORT FOR 1946

The Honorary Medical Staff has pleasure in presenting the Annual Medical Report with details which show that the year has been a busy one in every part of the Hospital.

This is especially marked in the out-patients, whose attendances exceeded 31,000: more than 3,000 of these received treatment with artificial sunlight—possibly an index of the small amount of natural sunshine available during the so-called summer months.

Owing to the rapid growth in the number of children seeking the help of the Hospital and to the introduction of new fields of endeavour, each of which calls for increased accommodation, the Hospital itself has been under treatment for a considerable part of the period under review, partly for the removal of old scars and blemishes left by the war, but mainly in valiant attempts to so stretch the pint pot as to make it capable of holding a quart.

This has hampered the work from time to time as medical attention to patients does not mix well with the operations carried out by builders. Everyone realises that this drawback could not be avoided and all are glad to think that if the Hospital expires as a voluntary institution in the near future it will do so with a bright, cheerful face and in an up-to-date condition.

In conclusion the members of the Honorary Medical Staff wish to record their appreciation of, and thanks for, much valuable help given during the year by their resident colleagues, by Matron and by the small army of other ladies amongst whom they work.

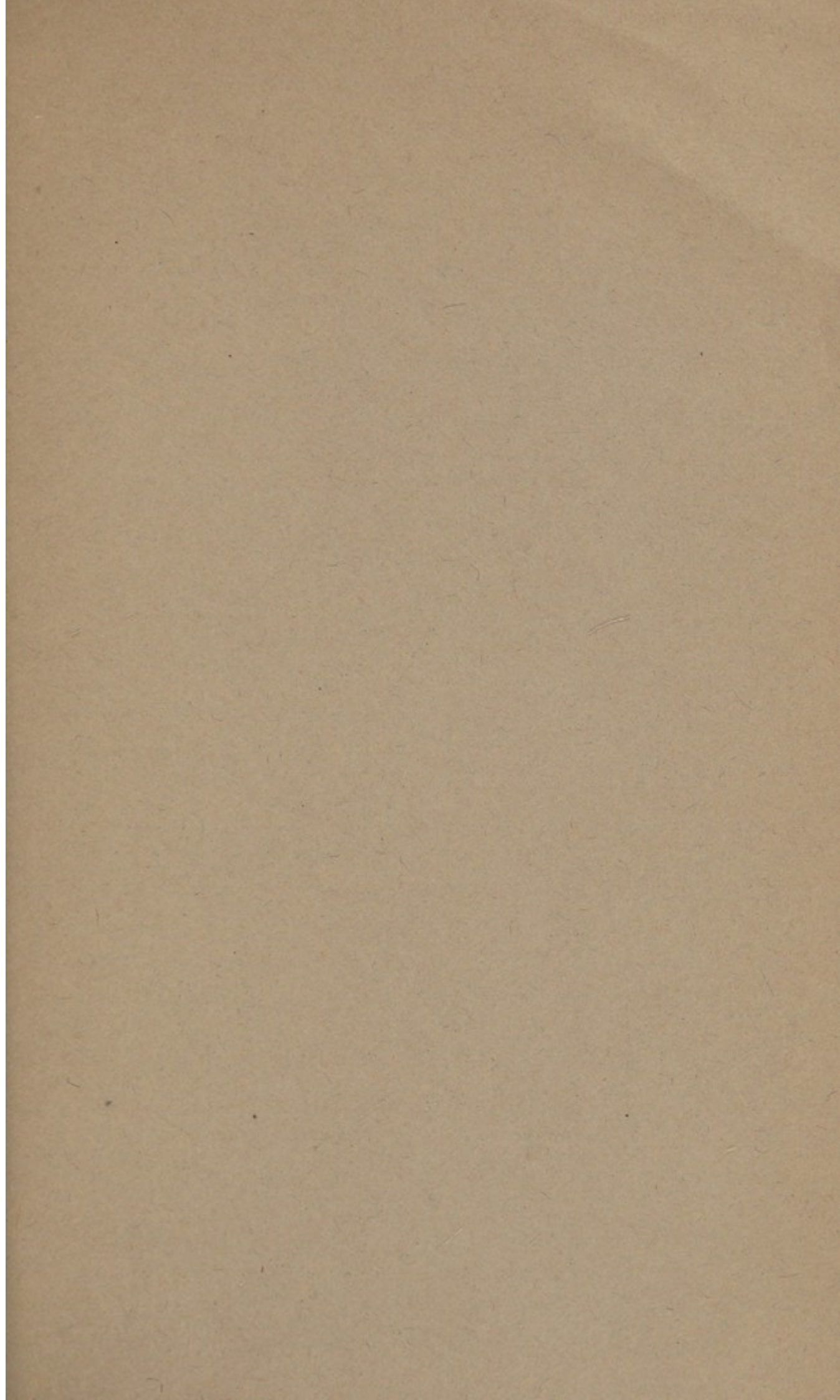
