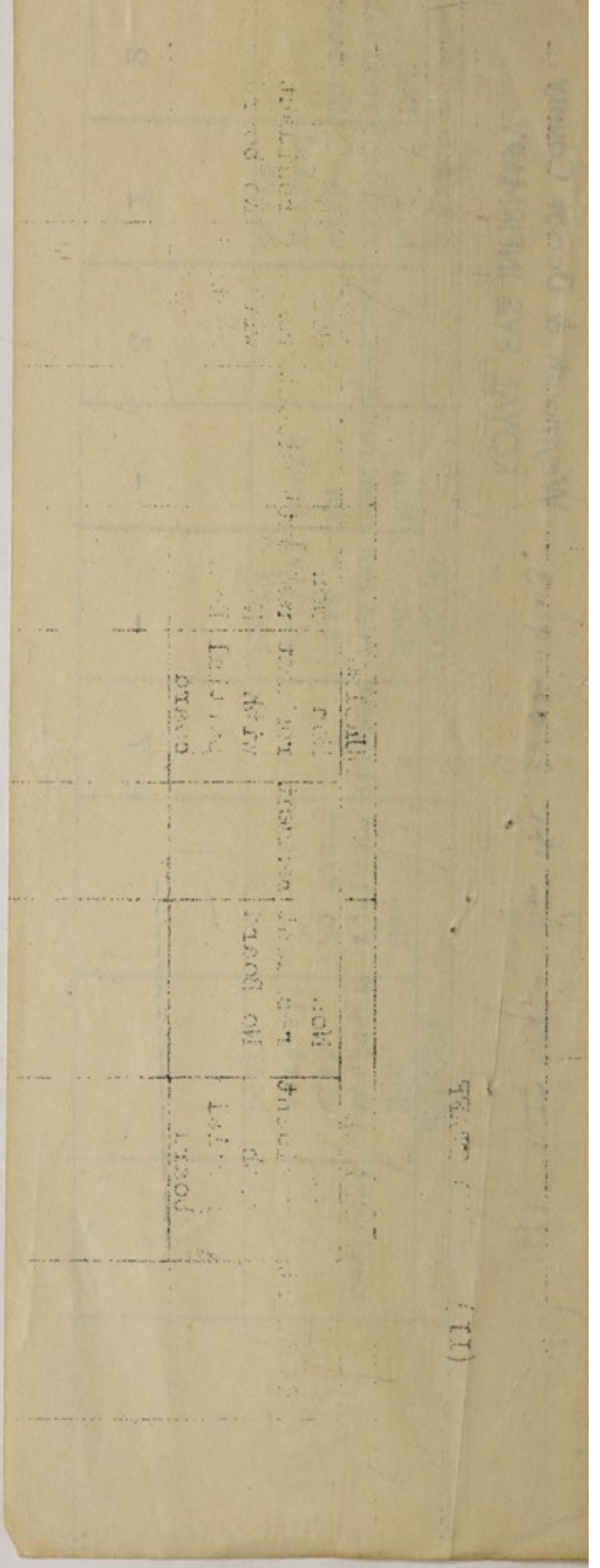

107th Annual Meeting.

Report of the Committee of Management to the Subscribers.

The Committee beg to submit the 107th Annual Report of the Weymouth and Dorset County Royal Eye Infirmary for the year ended 31st December, 1943, and have pleasure in recording a year of increased activity and service.

The grateful thanks of the Committee are extended to all generous supporters who have helped so loyally throughout the past year. Much gratitude is expressed to the Management and employees of Messrs. Vickers-Armstrongs, Ltd., for magnificent help—a survey of the Statement of Accounts will show yet a further increase in the Employees' contributions, and the Committee would tender their warm thanks and high appreciation. Grateful thanks, too, must be accorded to all Annual Subscribers, Friendly Societies, the Churches and Chapels, and all those who have given their kind support.

During the year the sum of £440 has been bequeathed to the Hospital by legacies from the Executors of the late Mrs. F. Wyllie, Mr. J. R. George, Mr. T. S. Churchill and Mrs. J. Mayo. These legacies, together with other accumulated funds, have been utilised in the purchase of £1,400 3 per cent. Savings Bonds. Notification has also been received from the Executors of the late Mr. W. W. Sampson to the effect that the hospital will benefit by a share of the annual income from his residuary estate after the death of the survivor of his widow and sister. The Committee are especially grateful for the assistance they have received in this way.

The sum of £116 2s. 6d. has been re-claimed from the Income Tax authorities, through subscribers who have signed an agreement for a period of seven years. The Committee would again call special attention to this arrangement and appeal to subscribers to take advantage of this scheme, and so have the satisfaction of increasing the annual income of the hospital by that amount which they now pay in Income Tax.

Owing to the extreme shortage, the sale of tinfoil has decreased considerably. We do, however, thank all those who have so kindly helped with the collection, and look forward to better times in the future.

Although many of the receipts show a welcome increase, the expenditure has increased correspondingly, due to the general rise in prices and the necessary increase in salaries. Extra correspondence on account of the requirements of the Emergency Hospital Scheme is largely responsible for the increased cost of postage.

The Committee again offer its warmest thanks to Miss Le Cocq and her fellow workers of the Ladies' Linen Guild.

Grateful thanks must be accorded to the Hon. Chaplain for his appreciated ministrations, and to all kind friends who have brought gifts for the benefit of the patients.

The Committee also desire to place on record an expression of their warmest thanks to the Honorary Medical Staff and to the untiring efforts of Mr. T. Colley, to whose loyal service the success of our work is largely due. They also tender their sincere appreciation of the work of the Matron, Sister, Secretary, and the whole of the Nursing and Domestic Staff for another year of devoted service.

How to help the Infirmary without expense.

SUBSCRIBERS to the Infirmary who are liable to pay Income Tax at the STANDARD rate can help the Infirmary without expense to themselves if they will sign an agreement to pay their subscriptions for a period of seven years or during their lifetime, whichever shall be the shorter. This will enable the Infirmary to recover from the authorities the Income Tax in respect of the annual subscription. For example—for every £1 1s. 0d. subscribed under this scheme the Hospital can recover (with Income Tax at 5/- in the £), the additional sum of 7/-. **Subscribers under this scheme who are Sur-Tax payers may deduct from their income returned for Sur-Tax purposes, the sum of £1 8s. 0d. for each £1 1s. 0d. they subscribe.**

This past year has again shown a marked increase in the number of patients admitted to the hospital for treatment. We have maintained a daily average of 15 patients, which I consider to be excellent for the number of beds at our disposal. During the year 67 Service patients received in-patient treatment and 27 patients were admitted to the private wards of the hospital. The operations performed in the Theatre were much the same in character and number as the previous year.

In spite of increasing transport difficulties there has been a large number of patients pass through the out-patients department; this increase has been general in all types of cases, and the total number of attendances was nearly 5,000.

In conclusion I wish to thank Dr. Tasker, Dr. Dorothy Howse, and Mr. Gathergood for their help during the past year, and I would express my appreciation to the Matron and her Staff for their loyal help and co-operation.
