

An Annual Subscription of £1 1s. constitutes the Subscriber an Annual Governor, who is entitled to one Letter of recommendation for every Guinea of Annual Subscription.

Each In-Patient Letter is exchangeable, on application by the Subscriber to the Secretary, for four Out-Patient Letters.

A Donor of £1,000 endows, in perpetuity, a bed which will bear his name.

An Annual Subscriber of £30 endows a bed which bears his name during the continuance of his subscription.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

The Hospital is open for the admission and relief of patients from all parts of Walthamstow, Wanstead and Leyton, on the recommendation of Subscribers.

Accidents and cases of emergency are attended to at all hours of the day or night without any Letter of Recommendation.

Other applicants for admission are required to bring with them a Medical Certificate that they are not suffering from any infectious or incurable disease, and if they are unable to attend must also send a recommendation from their own doctor that the case is suitable in every way for admission.

If there is a vacancy, the patient is then at once admitted.

If the case is not considered a fit one for admission, the Subscriber can obtain a fresh Letter of Recommendation from the Secretary.

A letter is not available for more than three weeks' stay in the Hospital, after which time a new Letter must be obtained.

Out-Patients should obtain a Subscriber's Letter of Recommendation for Out-Patients, and attend at the Out-Patient Department in the morning. Out-Patients' Letters are available for three weeks' treatment.

The Hospital being established to relieve only those persons who are unable to pay for suitable Medical and Surgical Aid, Patients are required to give information as to their means and circumstances, with a view to prevent the abuse of the charity by persons who are able to pay.

VISITORS.

The Hospital may be inspected by Visitors on any week-day between the hours of 2 and 4 p.m., except on such days as any one of the Medical Officers shall, in the exercise of his discretion, forbid (by written notice left with the Matron) the entrance of Visitors to the Wards as likely to be injurious to Patients or any of them.

All Visitors to the Hospital are requested to enter their names in a book provided for that purpose.

HISTORIC NOTES.

The Hospital, in aid of which the reader's support is invited, was not founded in its present form, but has grown steadily since the day of its institution in proportion to the demands which were placed upon it.

It is common knowledge that the parishes of Walthamstow, Leyton (including Leytonstone) and Wanstead have been growing rapidly during the last forty-seven years, but it seems hardly credible that in the life-time of some of the older subscribers and friends of the Hospital, the combined population of these four districts has increased from under 10,000 to nearly 300,000 persons.

Until the year 1878, there was no recognised Hospital in the district, but in that year a Cottage Home for Sick Children was provided in North Road, Wood Street, by the late Mr. and Mrs. Edward S. Tudor. Two years later a Hospital Home for Children was built on a site in Salisbury Road, Walthamstow, where for fourteen years it attempted to minister to the needs of the district, although even at the end of this period it had only eight beds at its disposal. As may be expected the rapid growth of the neighbourhood rendered this accommodation quite inadequate, and created the necessity for the provision of a General Hospital, where cases of accident could be treated. Consequently steps were taken to effect this end, and in 1894, through the generosity of the late Mr. and Mrs. Henry J. Casey, who gave the house and

land, the Hospital moved to its present quarters in Orford Road, as a Children's and General Hospital, with nineteen beds available.

Even this increase was almost immediately found to be insufficient, with the result that, in 1895, a further effort was made, which bore fruit when Her Royal Highness the late Princess Mary, Duchess of Teck, opened, in 1897, an extension which enabled the number of beds to be increased to thirty-five. A further extension was undertaken in 1903, and opened, on the 4th of July in that year, by Her Royal Highness the late Duchess of Connaught, then Patroness of the Hospital. This enlargement included an excellently equipped Out-Patients' Department, an Operating Theatre (with Anæsthetic Room adjoining), a Casualty Room, a Mortuary, and increased the accommodation for patients to forty-five beds in the Wards.

Additional improvements were carried out in 1914. In that year the Observation Ward was enlarged, and a new Ward of one bed added, a room specially built for the new X-ray installation, Eye-testing and Pathological Laboratory; and the Laundry enlarged. During 1915 the new X-ray apparatus and additional equipment of the X-ray room and new Ward were completed.

In the course of the year 1917, by a careful rearrangement, four more beds were provided, making a total of 50 beds.

In 1919 additional ground was purchased from the Trustees of the Casey Estate, and given to the Hospital by Mr. J. C. Gillett.

Important alterations were commenced in May, 1925. The new buildings—of which Mr. J. Andrew Minty, F.R.I.B.A., is the Architect—include two wards, to be named the Leyton and Leytonstone War Memorial Ward and the Thomas Worton Memorial Ward, providing forty beds—eight of which will be reserved for paying patients—a new Nurses' Home, and additions to the Out-Patient and Casualty Departments, with other necessary work. These alterations are now nearing completion, and it is hoped will be opened in the course of the next few months.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL.

The Council present the Forty-ninth Annual Report, covering the period from 1st January to 31st December, 1926.

ANNUAL MEETING.

The last Annual General Meeting was held on the 23rd March, 1926, when Colonel Sir T. Courtenay Warner, Bart., C.B., J.P., the President of the Hospital, occupied the Chair, and, in proposing the adoption of the Report for 1925, again urged the necessity of proceeding with the enlargement of the Hospital. He also asked the Meeting to express their sympathy with his old friend, Mr. Bird, the Secretary of the Hospital, who was too ill to attend.

The six members of the Council who retired in rotation, viz., Mr. W. Bulgin, Mr. W. P. Forbes, J.P., Rev. C. B. Howard Knight, M.A., M.C., Mr. William McCall, Capt. D. M. Smith, J.P., and Councillor A. J. Allanson, were re-elected.

Mr. GILBERT HOUGHTON was re-elected Treasurer, pro tem., on the understanding that he retired from the position as soon as some other gentleman was elected.

Votes of Thanks were passed to the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff, the other members of the Honorary Staff, the Ladies' Committee, the visiting Clergy, the Nursing Staff, and the Auditors—Messrs. Eben. Clarke & Son, Chartered Accountants—who were re-elected Auditors for the ensuing year.

ADDITION TO COUNCIL.

Since the last General Meeting the following gentleman has been appointed to fill a vacancy in the Council: Councillor H. W. Dongray.

TREASURER.

On Monday, 16th August, Mr. W. H. MAYELL, Manager, Barclays Bank, 618, Lea Bridge Road, Leyton, E.10, took on the duties of Treasurer to the Hospital.

VICE-PRESIDENTS.

Since the last General Meeting the following gentlemen have been elected Vice-Presidents: W. P. Forbes, Esq., J.P., William Mallinson, Esq., J.P., William McCall, Esq. J. Ashbridge, Esq., and the Rev. Canon H. D. Lampen.

RESIDENT HOUSE SURGEONS.

On the resignation of Mr. D. S. MORGAN JONES, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., and Mr. PHILIP BAYER, M.B., B.CH., the Council appointed Mr. J. Ivor Williams, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., and Mr. Donald Frost, M.B., B.S., M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., as Resident House Surgeons.

SECRETARY.

Owing to illness, Mr. BIRD retired from the post of Secretary to the Hospital on 21st June, 1926. On 19th July, 1926, Capt. E. E. CANDLER was appointed Secretary.

HONORARY STAFF.

Since the last Annual General Meeting, H. ROWE JEREMY, Esq., F.R.C.S., has resigned his position of Honorary Surgeon for the Eye Department.

SAMARITAN FUND.

This useful fund continues to receive the support of the Ladies' Committee.

LINEN LEAGUE.

The Walthamstow, Wanstead and Leytonstone Branches have carried on their very useful work. The Leyton Branch also started for the first time. The Council are most grateful to the many ladies who so kindly gave their services for the benefit of the Hospital.

POUND DAYS.

Gifts amounting to 5,805'7 lbs. weight of useful household stores were received in December, in addition to £18 6s. od. in cash.

CHRISTMAS.

The usual Christmas Tree Party was given for the children; over one hundred present and past patients attended, besides other friends. A capital programme was arranged and was much appreciated. All toys, decorations and expenses were contributed by various friends.

THANKS.

The Council desire most heartily to thank the Medical and Surgical Staff, Anæsthetists, Dentist, Pathologist, Consulting Electrical Engineer and Radiographer, the visiting Clergy, and the Matron, Sisters and Nurses, for their valuable work during the year.

COT OR BED.

£,1,000 will endow a cot or bed in perpetuity, and £,30 will name a cot or bed for a year. One bed—the Victoria Bed in the Hibbert Ward—was endowed by subscription, to commemorate Queen Victoria's reign of sixty years, and six beds have been endowed in memory of the late Mr. and Mrs. H. J. Casey. During the past year, Cots and Beds were provided for as follows: - "The J. C. and E. M. Compton" Cot, by the family of the late Mr. J. C. COMPTON; "The Fairholme" Cot, by Mr. and Mrs. GILBERT HOUGHTON; "The Walthamstow School Children's" Cot, "The County High School for Girls'" Cot, a Bed in the Connaught Ward by Mr. ALFRED E. COOPER, a Bed in the Boy's Ward by the League of Three, and a Bed by the Shernhall Approved Society. The Ancient Order of Druids, Tinfoil Fund, have endowed the "King George V." Lodge Bed, and this Lodge has also endowed a second Bed; The Leyton, Leytonstone and District Scottish Association have endowed a Bed in the Men's Ward.

The Council are most grateful for this valuable support.

FINANCE.

BUILDINGS.

All necessary repairs have been carried out.

APPEAL FOR MAINTENANCE.

The Council are pleased to report that contrary to expectations, there has been no deficiency in the year's workings.

When the new wards are ready, it is estimated that a further sum of approximately £4,000 per annum will be required for maintenance; in view of this, the Council earnestly plead for new Subscribers. Subscriptions should be the backbone of the Income.

The Council view with pleasure the scheme that has been organized in the Borough of Leyton, and desire to express their sincere thanks to the Officers and Collectors of each Ward who are working so assiduously.

NEW BUILDING FUND.

This Fund was started in May, 1924, with the object of raising the sum of £30,000 for the purpose of the enlargement of the Hospital. Unfortunately, owing to cost of labour and material and other unforeseen circumstances, this sum has been increased to over £40,000, of which £34,000 (including promises) has already been collected.

Expenses in connection with the Appeal since May, 1924, when it started, amount to £1,717; Architect's fees paid on account are £1,300; Contractor, on account, £23,500. This leaves us with approximately £7,400 in hand to pay off the remainder of the Contract (Contract was £32,990 without

extras), i.e., £9,500. The new X-Ray Department will cost £1,350, and it is estimated that the furnishing of the New Nurses' Home and New Ward Block will cost £5,000. There is also £300 due to the Architect on completion of the Buildings.

Taking these four amounts, £2,100 Contractor, £1,350 for new X-Ray Room, £5,000 for furnishing, and £300 for Architect, it will be seen that we require at least £8,750 before the new extension can be opened free from debt. The Appeal Committee implore one and all to make a final effort to achieve this end.

Building operations were commenced in May, 1925, and the following progress has been made:—

The Out-Patient and Casualty Block, together with the New Quarters for two Resident House Surgeons, is practically completed.

New Nurses' Home practically completed.

The New Ward Block, the Foundation Stone of which was laid by Sir WILLIAM PRYKE, on 11th March, 1926, during his term of office as Lord Mayor of London, is nearing completion. This Block contains the Leyton War Memorial Ward and the Thomas Worton Ward.

The whole buildings are expected to be completed by June, 1927, but cannot be opened free from debt until the remaining £8,750 is collected.

In this connection, it is hoped to hold a Big Hospital Week in Walthamstow, Wanstead and Leyton, either in May or June, to endeavour to wipe out this debt by one great effort. The Appeal Committee urge the help of the general public to ensure the success of this week.

The Walthamstow Hospital Fête Committee have, since 1915, raised over £4,500, and are still giving their invaluable support, for which the Appeal Committee are most grateful.

It may be satisfactory to know, in view of the recent correspondence in *The Times* on the subject of Private Wards for

Paying Patients, that there will be at least eight such wards in the New Ward Block, which will supply a long-felt want in this district.

The St. James Street and Wood Street (now known as the West Walthamstow and East Walthamstow) Committees have done excellent work during the past year on behalf of the Building Fund, and the Appeal Committee wish to express deep gratitude for their invaluable help. Amounts collected by these two Committees since their formation are as follows: West, £184 13s. 9d.; East, £727 5s. od.

A large three-day Fête was organised by Major F. G. S. BAKER, O.B.E., and held on the Forest School Playing Grounds, on 1st, 2nd and 3rd July. The magnificent sum of $\pounds_{2,223}$ 5s. 3d. was raised by this effort. \pounds_{500} was allocated to the Maintenance Fund and $\pounds_{1,723}$ 5s. 3d. to the Building Fund. Major Baker desires to thank all the kind ladies and gentlemen who worked so hard for three days and made the Fête such a gigantic success.

On 10th February, 1925, the sum of £524 was received from Edward Kemp, Esq., sole Trustee and Executor of the late Mrs. A. E. Mason. This amount was shown in donations in last year's Report in error, and should have been shown as a Legacy.

The thanks of the Appeal Committee are again due to the King Edward Fund for London for a further grant of £750 to the Building Fund, and to others far too numerous to mention.

The Appeal Committee wish to thank all those who have so kindly helped in various ways, either by giving donations, selling brick tickets, or running entertainments, and hope that all will make a further united effort to assist in collecting the balance required, so that the buildings when completed may be opened free of debt.

PRESS.

The thanks of the Council are due to The Walthamstow, Leyton and Chingford Guardian, The Express and Independent, and the Stratford Express for their help in giving publicity to the needs of the Hospital.
