REPORT.

In presenting the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ending 30th of June, 1927, the Committee of Management desire to express their gratitude for the support so generously accorded to the Hospital.

The year has been a strenuous one for all concerned in the management for the welfare of the Hospital. The increasing demands upon the resources emphasizes the great importance of its maintenance in the highest state of efficiency, and the need of increased financial efforts, in order to meet the increasing expenditure.

It is very encouraging to your Committee, the Matron and Staff, to have received so many letters of thanks and appreciation from Patients. Especially do we thank all those who have so generously contributed to the Funds after their discharge, and hope this practical recognition will become more general during the coming year.

During the year 286 patients have been admitted to the Hospital, including 80 children and 45 private patients, against 268 including 81 children and 43 private patients last year. The daily average of beds occupied is 18, against 17 $\frac{1}{3}$ rd, the average length of residence of each patient being 24 days against 24 $\frac{1}{2}$, and the beds occupied this year 6570 days against 6360. After allowing for the amount received from private patients and excluding repairs to buildings, X-Ray and Massage expenses, the cost per bed has been £121 13s. 4d. against £123 3s. 9d. The cost per patient per day was 6/8 against 6/9.

The Committee desire to place on record their great appreciation of the increased support of the Employees Fund, who contributed the splendid sum of £525, an increase of £25 upon last year's record. To everyone who has subscribed to this Fund, the Committee tender their thanks, and especially to all those who are responsible for the work and care of this Fund.

The Committee regret there are yet some Factories who fall far short in their contributions for the benefits they receive, and hope this will be remedied by greater efforts on the part of those who are responsible for the Collections in these Factories.

The Committee are no less grateful to "The L.M.S. Railway Hospital Fund," for their splendid subscription of £170 ; "The County Police Sports Committee" of £100 ; the second contribution of £175 from the "Wellingborough Amateur Operatic Society," to whom we owe so much for the responsibility of the cost of the X-Ray building ; "The Hatton Lodge of Freemasons" who were responsible for the cost of £52 10s. 0d. for the new operating table (so much needed), and to all supporters who so generously subscribe towards the maintenance of the Institution of which we are justly proud.

The Committee also record with regret the death of the late Miss H. E. Sharman, Elsdon Lodge, and the late Mr. Samuel Mash Adams, of Bassett House. Their deep interest in the welfare of the Hospital has made it the richer by £90 and £250 respectively.

To the Widow of the late Dr. Watson, who has so generously contributed the sum of £1,000 to the memory of her dear Husband to endow a Bed, the Committee offer their profound gratitude, and will ever remember his self-sacrifice for the suffering, his labour amongst us and in our Hospital, and whose memory will remain ever dear to us.

Your Committee also have to record with deep regret, the death of Mr. A. P. Hinds, who did so much for the welfare of the Hospital, serving on the Finance Committee for a number of years, and offer their sincere sympathy to the Widow.

The Summer Fete, held July, 1926, realised £325, and the Committee's thanks are again due to John Pendered, Esq., for the use of his grounds, and to all those who gave their services with such a splendid result.

Your Committee have to record with deep regret the removal, by death, and other causes, of several old Subscribers, and hope these will be replaced by new Subscribers, and increased Subscriptions from others.

The thanks of your Committee are again due to the Medical Staff, Hon. Dentists, Hon. Masseuse, Hon. Optician, Hon. Radiographer, Hon. Surveyor and the Hon. Auditors, for their continued valuable services and to the following ladies, whose services as Collectors are highly appreciated:—

REPORT OF X-RAY DEPARTMENT.

X-RAY DEPARTMENT,

1ST JULY, 1927.

The Chairman and Members,

Cottage Hospital Committee, Wellingborough.

MR. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I have great pleasure in submitting to you my first Annual Report on the work of your X-Ray Department.

During the year from July 1st, 1926 to June 30th, 1927, 329 patients have attended the Department for X-Ray examination and 1056 radiographs have been taken, an average of three radiographs per patient. Of this number 33 patients attended for examination of the alimentary tract by the barium meal process in the course of which 423 radiographs were taken, an average of 13 radiographs per patient for this particular purpose. If the number of this class of patient is deducted from the total number of patients the average number of radiographs for the 296 patients attending for all other reasons is reduced to two per patient.

Of the 329 patients attending the Department 249 presented "X-Ray Letters" and 80 were "Private" patients. The number of patients recommended by the Wellingborough doctors was as follows:—

Private patient fees amounted to £225 19s. 6d., while the total expenditure of the Department was £210 15s. 9d., there being a credit balance of £15 10s. 9d. These figures prove, from a financial point of view, that you were justified in establishing the Department and at the same time, from a more important aspect, it has rendered invaluable assistance to many.

The Department is not only appreciated by the inhabitants of Wellingborough, but it is rapidly becoming known throughout the district as will be seen from the following list of places from which private patients have come :—
