REPORT.

The Committee of Management have pleasure in submitting the 28th Annual Report for the year ending 30th of June, 1928.

It is most encouraging to your Committee to report an increasing interest and appreciation in the services the Hospital has been able to render during the past year, and the Committee take this opportunity to thank all those who have by their support financially, and in many other directions, assisted in maintaining the Hospital in its present state of efficiency.

Your Committee have had before them for some considerable time the question of extending and improving the equipment of the Operating Theatre, which is much needed, and after very anxious and careful consideration it has been decided to proceed with this. Ultra-Violet-Ray Lamps, which have become a necessary addition to all Hospitals, have also been added, and will be under the supervision of Miss Nicholson, who is fully qualified to give this treatment. The Committee fully realise the seriousness of this large expenditure amounting to approximately £2,000, but they feel they have the confidence of the supporters of the Hospital and the Town generally that this debt will be cleared at a very early date. A Special Appeal for this purpose will accompany this Report.

During the year there have been admitted to the Hospital 302 Patients, including 99 Children, and 47 Private Patients, against a total of 286 the year previous, including 80 Children and 45 Private Patients, (the greatest number yet recorded), which proves the Hospital continues to gain the confidence and the appreciation of the public it serves. The daily average of beds occupied is 14 against 18, the average length of residence of each patient being 21 days against 24, and the beds occupied this year 5089 days against 5804 days. After allowing for the amount received from Private Patients, and excluding Repairs to Buildings, X-Ray, Massage, and Sun-Ray expenses, the cost per bed has been £139 8s. 4d., against £121 13s. 4d. The cost per patient per day has been 7/8 against 6/8.

The Committee have again to report a welcome increase of £100 from the Employees' Fund, making their contribution £625 (a splendid achievement). To everyone who has subscribed, and to all those who have rendered their services in caring for this Fund, the Committee are very grateful.

The Committee acknowledges with grateful thanks the generous Subscription of £175 from The London Midland & Scottish Railway, and £100 from the Police Sports Committee. Also the Amateur Operatic Society for their third contribution of £200, making to date £525, towards the cost of the X-Ray Building. Grateful thanks to Miss Lois Perkins for the Instrument Case for use in the Operating Theatre, and also to the anonymous donor for the Glass Instrument Table for the Operating Theatre.

Thanks are also accorded to the various Clubs and Committees who have shown such practical interest by their generous Donations, which are recorded in the Accounts, and to all who in any other way have supported the Hospital during the year.

The Committee are again indebted to the Summer Fete Committee, and to the many willing helpers who worked so splendidly that the funds benefitted to the extent of £425, an increase of £100, (which is a record).

The Committee also welcome H. P. Vivian, Esq., Lord of the Manor, as a Life Governor.

The thanks of the Committee are again due to the Medical Staff, Hon. Dental Surgeons, Hon. Radiographer, Hon. Masseuse, Hon. Optician, Hon. Surveyor, Hon. Auditors, for their continued valuable services, to the Press for their publicity, and also to the Matron, and the Nursing Staff for the painstaking manner in which they have carried out their duties, which has brought forth much praise from many of the Patients, and to the following ladies, whose services as Collectors are highly appreciated.

REPORT OF X-RAY DEPARTMENT.

X-RAY DEPARTMENT,

1st July, 1928.

The Chairman and Members, Cottage Hospital Committee, Wellingborough.

Mr. CHAIRMAN AND GENTLEMEN,

I have pleasure in submitting to you my second Annual Report on the work of your X-Ray Department.

During the year from July 1st, 1927, to June 30th, 1928, 350 patients have attended the Department for X-Ray examination, and 1001 radiographs have been taken, an average of three radiographs per patient. Of this number 51 patients attended for examination of the alimentary tract by the barium meal process.

Of the 350 patients attending the Department, 262 presented "X-Ray Letters" and 88 were "Private" patients. The number of patients recommended by the Wellingborough doctors was as follows:—

Private patient fees amounted to £212 1s. 0d., and the expenses to £187 13s. 6d. The Department has therefore been able to carry through its work for the second year without expense to the General Funds of the Hospital.

During the year your Department had the honour of having its work accepted and hung at the Annual Exhibition of the Royal Photographic Society, London. The Exhibition of the Irish Salon of Photography, held in connection with the Dublin Civic Week. The 37th Annual Exhibition of the Birmingham Photograph Society, at which the Certificate of Merit in the Open Scientific and Applied Photography Class was gained.

I have now great pleasure in asking you to accept two pieces of apparatus which have been purchased at a cost of £180 out of the proceeds of the X-Ray Dances held during the Winter months. They are:—

- 1. A Watson "Mark IX." X-Ray Stand complete with Coolidge Tube. Cost £130.
- 2. A Wheatstone Stereoscope and Plate Changer, by Watson. Cost £50.

Both are invaluable aids in the work of the Department and have increased its usefulness and efficiency.

In conclusion I wish to take this opportunity of expressing my appreciation of the hearty support given to the Department by everyone and particularly of the work done by Miss Curtis, Mrs. W. E. Hall and Mrs. Sewter, in organising the efforts to raise funds for the purchase of the additional apparatus.
