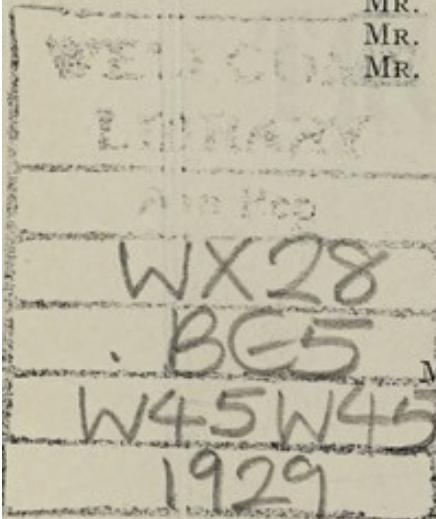

REPORT.

The Committee of Management have pleasure in submitting to Subscribers the 29th Annual Report and Statement of Account for the year ending the 30th June, 1929.

During the past year the work of the Hospital has met with the utmost appreciation and it is very gratifying to your Committee to have received so many expressions of gratitude and thanks from patients who have been under the care of the Matron and Staff.

The Committee are also grateful to all those patients who have shown their appreciation by contributing to the Funds of the Hospital.

During the year there have been admitted to the Hospital 213 patients, which number includes 72 Children and 36 Private Patients, against a total of 302 the year previous, which figure included 99 Children and 47 Private Patients, the lower numbers this year being due to the fact that the Children's Ward was closed whilst new heating apparatus was being installed and the Operating Theatre was closed for some time to enable the extensive alterations to be carried out. The daily average of beds occupied was 13 against 14, the average length of residence of each patient being 26 days against 21, and the beds occupied this year 4651 days against 5089 days. These figures do not include Private Patients.

After allowing for the amount received from Private Patients and excluding Repairs to Buildings, Waiting Room and Heating Apparatus, X-Ray, Massage and Sun Ray expenses, the cost per bed has been £152 1s. 8d. against £139 8s. 4d. The cost per patient per day has been 8/4 against 7/8.

The enlargement and reconstruction of the Operating Theatre has been completed and is much appreciated by the Medical Staff and the visiting surgeons.

The Special Appeal for this expenditure has not fulfilled the hopes of your Committee and they will welcome further donations to clear the remaining Debt of about £600.

A List of Donations already received accompanies this Report.

The Committee desire to place on record their appreciation of the support of the Town Employees' Fund, whose contribution of £625 equals the record established last year.

The Committee would welcome a more general support of the Shop Assistants and those outside Factory occupations who could help by becoming Subscribers to the Town Employees' Fund.

REPORT OF X-RAY DEPARTMENT.

X-RAY DEPARTMENT,

1ST JULY, 1929.

*The Chairman and Members,

MR. CHAIRMAN, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

I have pleasure in submitting to you my third Annual Report on the work of your X-Ray Department.

During the year ending June 30th, 1929, 318 patients have attended for X-Ray Examination and 847 radiographs have been taken, an average of 2.66 radiographs per patient.

Of the 318 patients attending the Department 258 presented "X-Ray Letters" and 60 were "Private" patients. The number of patients recommended by the doctors residing in Wellingborough numbered 282.

The receipts amounted to £162 4s. 0d., and the expenses to £125 12s. 6d. The Department has therefore been able to carry through its work as in previous years without expense to the General Funds of the Hospital.

The Department has presented to the Hospital a Shadowless Lamp for use in the Operating Theatre and has also provided itself with an Auto-Focussing Enlarging Apparatus. The cost of these, viz., £53 has been borne by funds raised from efforts organised by Miss Curtis.
