





Report of the Executive Committee for 1939.

The Executive Committee have pleasure in submitting their one hundred and ninety fifth Annual Report and Statement of Accounts.

WORK OF THE YEAR.

In-Patients. The number of in-patients admitted during the year was 2,765 as compared with 2,741 during 1938. The average number of patients resident was 153.05, and the average stay of each was 20.24 days. The largest number of patients resident on any one day was 175.

Of the patients treated during the year 2,291 were discharged as cured or relieved, and 159 died. Forty-two patients died within twenty-four hours of admission.

The number of patients awaiting admission on the 31st December, 1939, was 72.

Worcester Royal Infirmary Contributory Scheme. It is with great pleasure that the Executive Committee report an increase of £407 19s. 11d. in the income from the Contributory Scheme, the totals being:—

In addition a sum of £2,424 2s. 6d. was received from other Contributory Schemes towards the cost of maintenance of their members in the Infirmary.

Payments to other Hospitals and Contributory Schemes amounted to £534 5s. 7d. as compared with £564 0s. 10d. for 1938.

It is the earnest hope of the Executive Committee that the yield from the Contributory Scheme may still further increase. They feel that there still must be many who are eligible for membership but have not joined, and an appeal is made to any such members of the public to join the Scheme. Particularly are details of the Scheme commended to the attention of newcomers to the districts served by the Infirmary.

As no doubt was to be expected there was a falling off in some items of income during the last four months of the year. Annual Subscriptions were £120 7s. 0d. lower, Congregational Collections and Hospital Sunday Collections fell by £25 6s. 5d., and a severe loss was that of nearly £1,000 0s. 0d., the amount normally received from the Gala, which had to be abandoned.

In view of these setbacks it is most encouraging to the members of the Executive Committee to note that in spite of the difficulties the Ordinary Income was slightly higher in 1939 than in 1938, and they hope that encouraged by their effort in 1939 the public in the area served by the Infirmary will see to it that in a time of particular need the Infirmary may have the support it requires.

Expenditure. The ordinary expenditure of the year totalled £30,606 18s. 11d. The increases are due to the fact that heavier stocks are now being carried, and particularly in the case of foodstuffs to increased prices. Generally however, the ordinary expenditure is lower than that for 1938. Included in the expenditure is a figure of £1,006 7s. 7d., which represents the cost of work carried out since the outbreak of war to improve the services of the Infirmary as indicated elsewhere in this report, and for its protection.

At the time of the last report it was stated that the Committee, feeling concerned with the growing cost of the Engineering Services to the Infirmary, had appointed a Committee to consider these services and their cost of running. The deliberations of the Committee had reached a stage when the advice of a Consulting Engineer was sought and a report awaited. Owing to the outbreak of war and the need for steps to be taken to improve temporarily the existing services, this matter is in abeyance.

In reviewing the work done and the finances of the Infirmary for the past twelve months, reference must be made to the outbreak of war and its effect on the work of the Infirmary. During the first few weeks of the war, the number of patients receiving treatment as In-patients was very low. Acting on the instructions of the Ministry of Health all patients fit to be moved were sent home or to other institutions on the 1st September, 1939, and on the same day decants from Birmingham were admitted. From that date admissions were restricted to urgent cases only, and the emergency beds supplied by the Ministry of Health were erected and prepared for use. When these restrictions were relaxed by the Ministry, the Executive Committee took the opportunity of using to the full the available beds and the additional staff employed with the result that more patients were admitted during 1939 than in 1938, and the Waiting List was reduced as a result of the years working from 95 to 72.

On the financial side the Ministry of Health made interim payments for the period 3rd September to 23rd December, based upon the number of beds available for casualties including service sick, evacuated children, etc. As will be seen in the accounts a sum of £4,470 0s. 0d. was paid by the Ministry during this period. It must be emphasised that these payments have been interim payments made to cover the expenses incurred in the maintenance of decanted patients and others chargeable to the Ministry, and towards the cost of the necessary steps in improving the services in the Infirmary consequent upon the increase in its bed complement to 298.

It has been the policy of the Executive Committee to improve the services of the Infirmary, and to this end they have during the last few months of the year given instructions for the carrying out of the following alterations:—

- The renewal of the kitchen equipment in order that the kitchen could cope with the meals for the additional patients and staff.
- 2. The provision of a new dining room for Nurses.
- 3. The installation of a new Lift for theatre work.
- The conversion of rooms and departments into Emergency Wards.
- 5. The improvement of the steam and domestic hot water supply by the introduction of a new boiler with a larger output for steaming purposes and alterations to the hot water system. In this latter respect the Executive Committee have continued their practice of having available alternative types of fuel, and accordingly have arranged for the new boiler to use solid fuel.

These and many other smaller alterations which either have been or are being carried out have the approval of the Ministry of Health, and in the cases of the larger items of expenditure will rank for grant from the Ministry.

Endowment Fund. There was no addition to the Endowment Fund for the year, and the fund still stands at £42,368 16s. 11d.

The Future. From time to time the Executive Committee have laid before the Governors their future plans for the extension of the services of the Infirmary. Of necessity no similar statement can be made in this Report. The Infirmary under war conditions now houses 298 beds and all the ancilliary services have been or will be expanded to meet the needs of the larger hospital. Whether it will be possible further to consider the extension of the Infirmary during the war it is impossible to say, but the Executive Committee can assure the Governors that mindful of their responsibilities to the normal civil sick, they will watch the position and carry out such alterations and improvements as may be necessary.

Obituary. The Executive Committee regret to report the deaths of two old friends of the Infirmary, Dr. G. W. Crowe, and Alderman Sir H. A. Leicester, both of whom had long associations with the Infirmary.

Dr. G. W. Crowe was appointed Assistant Physician in 1881, and Physician in 1884. He was an active member of the Honorary Staff until 1919 when he was appointed a Consulting Physician. He was also a Life Member of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee mourn the passing of a skilled Physician and wise administrator who had devoted the larger part of his life to the Infirmary.

Alderman Sir H. A. Leicester became a member of the Executive Committee in 1908, and remained an active member until his death in 1939. By his willingness to help, his kindly interest and his wise counsel he rendered valuable service to the Infirmary.

Honorary Medical Staff. During the year under review the Executive Committee appointed an additional member of the Honorary Medical Staff. It was considered advisable to open a Dermatological Department, and in July last Dr. A. M. G. Campbell was appointed to organise this department. Whilst difficulties have ensued to hinder the work of the Department the Executive Committee are pleased to report that it has proved to be a useful addition to the facilities of the Infirmary and hope that upon return to normal times it will be developed to the benefit of the patients who attend.

There were no other changes in the personnel of the Honorary Medical Staff to whom the sincere thanks of the members of the Executive Committee is extended for their valuable work during the past year.

Dr. H. S. O'Conor, the Assistant Surgeon, was called up for active service on the outbreak of war.

Iron Lung. The Executive Committee gratefully acknowledge the generous gift by Viscount Nuffield of an Iron Lung.
