

Twenty-Ninth Annual Report.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st DECEMBER, 1927.

The Committee have pleasure in presenting the Annual Report together with audited Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1927.

The number of In-patients treated to a conclusion during

the year was 306, as follows:-

Of these cases 46 were medical and 260 surgical. There were 224 operations. In addition, 343 cases were dealt with requiring no stay in the Hospital.

It will be observed from the above summary that there has been a substantial increase in the number of patients admitted to the Hospital during the past year, and the number of operations performed is also in excess of the previous year.

The accounts for the year have been compiled in accordance with the revised uniform system of the King Edward's Hospital Fund, consequently no provision has been made for depreciation. On the other hand for the first time the work provided by the Ladies' Linen League and the gifts in kind on Pound Day have been brought into account as represent-

ing a sum of £130.

On reference to the expenditure on renewals and repairs to Buildings and Plant attention should be drawn to the item of £208 15s. 6d. which includes the cost of a new Lobby and entrance to the Committee Room also the erection of a partition separating the Main Hall from the Committee Room and Kitchen. This work was carried out during the year with a view to prevent any unnecessary noise disturbing the patients.

The Committee welcome this opportunity of expressing their thanks to the district as a whole for the generous response which has been made to the appeal at the last General Meeting to provide increased revenue to meet additional expenditure in connection with the Nurses' Superannuation Fund and the administration of the new wards, etc., and the Committee desire to appeal for a still further increase of this generous support during the coming year.

During the past year the Committee have given very careful consideration to the proposed scheme for the extension of the General Wards, and it has now been decided to carry out works of extension which will provide an additional eight beds in the general wards (4 for women and 4 for men), four extra rooms in the Nurses' Home, provision of external fire staircases for the main building and Nurses' Home and other incidental works. The estimated cost of the new work including necessary furniture is approximately £5,000.

Arrangements are being made which will enable the work to be commenced on 16th July next and to be completed on September 15th. Detailed plans of the suggested improvements have been submitted to the King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, and the Distribution Committee of that Fund have expressed their approval and intimated their intention to contribute a special donation of £150 towards the cost of the work. In addition to which the Fund have further intimated their intention to contribute a sum of £250 from the Wells Legacies distribution. The Committee desire to express their grateful thanks to the King Edward's Hospital Fund for their generous financial assistance.

In their endeavour to raise the balance of the funds required the Committee trust that they may look forward with confidence to the continuance of the sympathetic and generous support of the many friends who have always so readily responded to the needs of the Hospital.

The Committee are very glad to be able to report that the outstanding balance of the fund required in connection with the installation of the new X-Ray Apparatus has now been subscribed and it is hoped that the efficiency of this apparatus may prove to be of considerable benefit to those patients requiring treatment.

The Hospital has been visited during the year by representatives of the Distribution Committee of the Kng Edward's Hospital Fund (H. A. T. Fairbank, Esq., F.R.C.S., and Lt. Col. E. L. H. Beddington). As a result of their visit and report upon the work of the Hospital a grant of £75 has been received towards the maintenance fund, for which the Committee wish to tender their thanks.

The Federated Superannuation Scheme for Hospital Nurses etc., has now been organized and operates as from the 1st January, 1928, and the whole of the nursing staff have decided

to become contributory members.

The special thanks of the Committee are due to Mr. W. C. Reid for the assistance which he so kindly rendered in securing a grant of £150 from the Stock Exchange Dramatic and Operatic Society, and in accordance with the desire expressed by the Society a sum of £75 has been expended in the purchase of special instruments required for use in the operating theatre, (included in item 11 (3) Instruments and Appliances on page 15) and the balance of £75 has been devoted to the X-Ray Fund.

During the year Dr. F. A. Martin Flegg tendered his resignation as a member of the hon. Medical Staff which the Committee received with regret and they desire to acknowledge their appreciation of the services which he has for many years rendered in connection with the work of the Hospital, and they are pleased that he has consented to continue his association with the Hospital in the capacity of Hon.

Ophthalmic Surgeon.

The Committee continue to give sympathetic consideration to all cases where after investigation it is found that the patients are only able to pay reduced fees, and in fact a considerable number of necessitous cases have been treated during the year without any payment whatever.

The Committee further desire to recognise the very valuable services which were rendered by Mrs. F. Miller and all those

many friends who so kindly assisted in organizing the Alexandra Rose Day Collection in this area. The financial result achieved upon this occasion was undoubtedly due to the untiring and very able manner in which the collection was organized, as a result of which a donation of £350 has been received.

The thanks of the Committee are again due to the many religous bodies, associations, clubs, etc., who have assisted the work of the Hospital by their generous financial support during the past year. They also tender their grateful thanks to the many subscribers who have contributed through the penny-per-week collection.
