The President announced that the thanks extended to the Medical Staff, Ladies' Association, Pay Day Fund and various Committees and Organisations are embodied in the Annual Report of the Committee of Management.

The Chairman thanked the Rt. Hon. The Dowager Lady Cornwallis for her kindness in presiding at the Meeting.

REPORT.

The Committee of Management have much pleasure in presenting their Report for the year 1938.

Although the Committee exercise much thought with a view to economy, the Income and Expenditure Account for the year unfortunately shews a substantial deficit. The Income shews an increase but the Expenditure has risen by a much greater figure. Particulars of the main variations will be found under the headings of Income and Expenditure respectively.

The Hospital is now equipped with 135 Beds, 109 of which are always available for the treatment of ordinary patients, 16 are available for the reception of Maternity cases, and 10 are set aside in a separate wing for Private Paying patients.

Patients' Summary.

A full statistical table of the patients treated in the various departments will be found on page 39, but the following brief summary shews that the work of the Hospital still increases:—

Income.

The Ordinary Income with a total of £23,622 13s. 0d., shews an increase of £1,296 4s. 7d. over that of the previous year. The main item of the increase is to be found under the heading of Patients' Payments, and this can be attributed to the fees received in respect of Maternity patients over a full year as compared with the amount received for three months as shewn in the 1937 Accounts.

The amount received from the Pay Day Fund again shews a gratifying increase and this is referred to in a later paragraph.

There is, unfortunately, a decrease in both Subscriptions and Donations. The former can be accounted for by the death, or removal from the district, of many old friends of the Hospital. New subscribers have not, as yet, been found to fully repair the deficiency. The income from donations is always of a fluctuating nature and the decrease this year is due to a special gift in 1937 which was not renewed during the year under review.

Expenditure.

The Expenditure for the year shows an increase of £2,564 0s. 6d. over that of 1937, the figures being £25,813 15s. 0d. and £23,249 14s. 6d. respectively.

In view of the growth of the Hospital and the continued rise in commodities generally, an increase in Expenditure was anticipated. Apart from rising prices several other causes can be given for this increased expenditure, among them being a full year's cost of the working of the New Maternity Unit, as against three months in the previous year, increase in the salaries of the Nursing Staff and the engagement of extra nurses to allow for the reduction of the working hours—a paragraph dealing with this point will be found later in the Report.

Endowment.

The Committee record their gratitude to the Executors of the late William Newnham, Esq., of Loose, for the sum of £2,000 for the endowment of a Cot. The dedication of the Cot was carried out by the Chaplain of the Hospital, in March, in the presence of the Executors, Messrs. George Cassingham and F. Miskin, and members of the Hospital Committee.

Dedication of a Bed.

In the last Report it was recorded that Mrs. Walter Fremlin had given a donation of £1,000 to name a Bed in memory of her husband, the late Walter Fremlin, Esq. The bed was dedicated in July by the Chaplain of the Hospital, in the presence of Mrs. Fremlin, her friends, and members of the Committee and Staff of the Hospital.

Honorary Medical Staff.

The Committee extend their warmest thanks to the Honorary Medical Staff for their loyal and devoted services during the year. It is due to the skill and self-sacrifice of the Medical Staff that the Hospital upholds its reputation throughout the district.

Ladies' Association.

The opening of the New Maternity Unit, and the growth of the Hospital generally, continues to put a strain on the resources of the Association, but the increased demands have been met and your Committee would again express their deep sense of gratitude to the Committee, Members and Workers of the Association for their unselfish efforts in the cause of the Hospital.

The cash value of the goods supplied during the year amounted to £544 5s. 11d., and the total valuation since the inception of the Association in October, 1919, has now reached the figure of £8,319 15s. 10d.

The Working Party, under the direction of Mrs. E. A. Foord, have again met weekly for the repair and remodelling of worn linen, and the Committee desire to convey to them sincere thanks for this valuable aid.

Pay Day Fund.

It is very gratifying that an increase is again shewn in the amount received from the Fund and your Committee would extend their sincere appreciation to the Contributors of the Fund for the continued financial assistance.

Although a large number of contributors have not needed the services of the Hospital during the year, they have the pleasant knowledge of having helped their fellow men in time of sickness and suffering. The best thanks of the Committee are extended to the Committee of the Fund, and to the collectors whose unselfish efforts are a great factor in the continued success of the Fund.

St. John Ambulance Brigade.

The transference of patients both to and from the Hospital is always a source of anxiety to your Committee who greatly appreciate the work undertaken in this respect by the members of the Brigade.

District Nurses.

The calls for the services of these Nurses has been maintained and the following figures showing the number of visits made during the year testify to their usefulness to members of the public needing the assistance of a trained Nurse in their own homes :—

Resignation.

The Committee record with sincere regret the resignation of F. T. Travers, Esq., F.R.C.S., from his post of Honorary Surgeon.

They recall that when appointed as Honorary Surgeon to the Hospital in 1901, Mr. Travers had already given five years' previous experience as House Surgeon to the Institution. Mr. Travers' association with the Hospital thus extends for over forty years and during that time the Hospital has seen many great changes and passed through various trials. The Committee wish to make permanent record of the debt which they acknowledge to Mr. Travers for the free and unceasing gift of his skill in Surgery, his zeal in action, and his wisdom in council throughout all the period of his service.

In his promotion from the active to the Consulting Staff the Committee take pleasure and comfort in the thought that Mr. Travers' association with the Hospital will still be maintained and that, as he is still continuing in private practice, they may still look to benefit from his ripe experience as occasion arises.

Refugees for Training.

The Committee were asked by the Co-ordinating Committee for Refugees Nursing Sub-Committee if the Hospital would cooperate and receive refugees to serve on the Nursing Staff. The Committee have agreed to receive two refugees for training only.

Hospital in time of Emergency.

The Hospital has been scheduled as a Clearing Station in time of national emergency and arrangements have been made to more than double the normal number of beds to receive casualties caused by enemy Air Raids.

In this connection action is being taken by the Committee to safeguard the patients and personnel of the Hospital by precautionary methods suggested by the Ministry of Health.

The Honorary Medical Staff of the West Kent General and Kent County Ophthalmic and Aural Hospitals have jointly drawn up a report for the efficient working of the two Hospitals in time of crisis and although to carry out the necessary precautions will mean considerable expense to the Institutions, it is felt that the Committee will have the unqualified approval of the inhabitants of the district in preparing for any Emergency.

Nursing Staff.

In the previous Report it was stated that the Committee had decided upon a ninety-six hours duty per fortnight for the Nursing Staff. In consequence of the shortage of Nurses it has not been possible to put the Scheme fully into effect, but a modified form is now in operation and is much appreciated by the Staff.

Future Developments.

The Committee have considered the alteration and enlargement of the Out-patient and Orthopædic Departments as mentioned in the previous Report. The Scheme proposed was found to be too expensive under present conditions and a scheme of very modest proportions, providing better out-patient accommodation is being considered.

Night Transport Scheme.

The service organised by the Hospitals Voluntary Night Transport Scheme Committee for the transport to and from the Hospital of relatives called to the bedside of a patient between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m., has proved to be of much assistance. The Committee extend their cordial thanks to the motorists who have kindly put themselves at the call of the Hospital.

General Thanks.

The Committee thanks the Staff of the County Laboratories for the assistance rendered during the absence of the Honorary Pathologist.

The Committee desire to acknowledge the loyal services rendered by the House Governor and Secretary (Mr. Edward J. Gregg, F.H.O.A.) and his Staff, by the Resident Medical Officers, by the Matron (Miss W. M. Furze, A.R.R.C.), the Nursing Staff, the Almoner, and by the Staffs of the various Departments.

The best thanks of the Committee are accorded the Hon. Librarian (Miss H. Cadman) and her helpers.

The thanks of the Committee are accorded the personnel of the Voluntary Aid Detachment who have willingly given their services as relief nurses on several occasions during the year.

It is with grateful thanks that your Committee acknowledge the gift of 7,488 Eggs from the annual Egg Collection undertaken by the local branch of Toc H., organised by Mr. P. Elmore. The best thanks are tendered, not only to the members of Toc H., but to all those who so kindly supported the collection by giving eggs.

The Committee offer their sincere thanks to all subscribers, donors, the Clergymen and Ministers of Religion, the senders of gifts in kind, contributions to the Christmas Tree Fund, and all who helped the Hospital in any capacity. There has been a continuance of the organised supply of hampers of fruit and vegetables.

Gifts of garden produce, eggs, groceries, provisions, etc., are always acceptable and will be gratefully acknowledged.

Conclusion.

The House Governor and Secretary and the Matron will be pleased to welcome friends of the Hospital and take them for a tour of the whole Hospital so that a full insight can be obtained of the work being done for the community. It is hoped that friends of the Hospital will take advantage of this invitation.

Almoner's Department.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1938.

In looking back over the past year's work one is amazed at the varied problems that have presented themselves for solution daily, and it is only the result of co-operation between the Medical, Nursing and Almoner's Departments and the never-failing assistance given by Local Authorities and Voluntary Organisations that has effected, in so many cases, a satisfactory solution.

It is cheering that improved housing conditions and less unemployment have raised the standard of living so that people, on the whole, are better fed and clothed than they used to be, but the fact still remains that there are cases of patients attending the Out-patient Department who, until arrangements are made for them to receive better nutrition, are not likely to derive full benefit from the treatment prescribed for them. When these cases arise the patient is sent from the particular clinic attended to see the Almoner, home conditions and difficulties discussed and arrangements made for the provision of extra supplies of milk and food stuffs.

An example of this was a woman whose husband, for one reason or another, was in constant unemployment. She was found to be losing weight and rapidly deteriorating in health. Arrangements were made for extra milk to be supplied to the home and the children referred to the Child Welfare Clinic. A slow, but steady improvement in health was the result.

A considerable amount of time is spent in arranging for the convalescence of patients for periods of varying length and while several patients from the Out-patient Department are sent to Convalescent Homes, the majority are from the Wards. We are fortunate in having the Pay Day Fund which provides two weeks' free convalescence to contributors and their dependants, and a debt of gratitude is due to this Fund for relieving the Department of much work in making it financially possible to send patients away. Most of these patients are sent to the Beau Site Convalescent Home at Hastings, unless a Home of a special nature is

required. There are a great number of patients, however, who do not qualify for the Pay Day Fund's financial assistance, and for these it is often very necessary to provide not only part, but the whole cost of the patient's stay. This has been found in many ways—through the kindness of subscribers to Convalescent Homes, through the assistance of the firm where the patient is employed, through the help of the Clergy, and sometimes through the help of friends. The needs of the patients requiring convalescence are varied. There are some, who after their stay in Hospital, require a period of convalescence before being fit to resume work, others whose home conditions are such that the patient would be unable to receive the care and attention necessary after an illness or an operation, those whose requirements are simply a change of air, and those tired and over-worked mothers, who after a period of ill-health, require a complete absence of a few weeks from the cares and responsibilities of home. In the latter cases it is sometimes necessary to overcome the mother's difficulty in leaving her home and children, by making satisfactory arrangements for someone to carry on in her absence. Thanks are due to the various Homes for the work they do in trying to understand the different mentalities of those they receive and of assisting the Hospital by completing the work it has begun.

Amongst several cases requiring more than mere convalescence was that of a girl, without parents and living in lodgings. Not only was it necessary to make arrangements for a period of convalescence, free of all charge to herself, and her free conveyance to the Home, but to provide her with a complete outfit of clothes. Another case was a youth, unusually shy, who, until his admission to Hospital, had never been away from home. His kind and well-meaning parents had, unfortunately, nearly always given in to him and when convalescent home treatment was prescribed as essential for him, at first refused to let him go because he had expressed a desire to go straight home after his discharge from the Hospital. Both his parents were interviewed, the problem revealed and discussed and finally cleared up and the necessary consent received. A suitable Home was selected for him where he could receive special attention and steps taken to ensure employment for him on his return. When he was fully discharged from the Hospital he was a very different youth indeed.

Quite a large proportion of the work of the Department arises from the large number of surgical appliances required by

patients, chiefly those attending the Orthopædic Department. Many of these patients are subscribers to the Maidstone and District Surgical Aid Society and one might wish that many more would avail themselves of the opportunities afforded of receiving substantial grants towards the cost of their appliances by becoming subscribers. Patients to whom surgical appliances are supplied may be divided roughly into three sections—those in which the whole of the cost is met by Public Authorities, those in which the cost is met by grants from Approved Societies, Benevolent Funds, etc., and those who are members of no Society from which they can claim assistance and are unable to meet the whole, or any of the cost, themselves. Much time is spent on the third section; collecting Letters from the Royal Surgical Aid Society, making application to Benevolent Funds for compassionate grants and tapping all available sources for financial assistance. The sympathetic response made, in nearly all cases, to such appeals is most encouraging.

One interesting case was that of a patient requiring an artificial limb. He was in receipt of health insurance only and his wife, who had a young baby, had been finding it very difficult to keep the home going. His football club quickly rallied to his assistance and raised the sum required for the limb and when the question of extra nourishment for the family was investigated, it was found that the local milkman had been providing milk, free of charge, for a considerable time.

But providing payment for the cost of appliances often presents a difficult problem, calling for careful and patient enquiry and numerous applications to Benevolent Funds and Organisations. Such a case was a child requiring walking calipers and night shoes and whose parents were quite unable to contribute towards the cost. First one, and then another, body was tried, not always with success, and it was surprising the varied sources from which payment finally came to make up the total amount required.

One piece of work which falls to the Department is the provision of conveyance or fares for patients attending the Out-patient Department, particularly the Massage Department, in order that they may come in regularly to receive full benefit from their prescribed treatment. In the first case, thanks are due to the Kent Council of Social Service which has, in most cases, supplied the necessary transport. Fares have also frequently

to be found for those who are referred to special hospitals in London and elsewhere and these are provided after thorough investigation to prove that the case genuinely requires financial assistance.

It is regrettable that, during the past year, there has been an increase in the number of road accidents cases treated at the Hospital and admitted to the Wards. The number admitted was 164 and although over £600 has been recovered from Insurance Companies and other sources towards the cost incurred and there are a great many cases still awaiting settlement of their claim, a considerable proportion of the cost has to be met by the Hospital. The number of cases to whom emergency treatment was rendered was 74 and it is gratifying to note that the emergency treatment fee, in accordance with the Road Traffic Act, was recovered in nearly all cases.

The small sum available for helping patients is frequently depleted and is replenished in such a way that its existence is a very precarious one indeed. It will be seen that an official Samaritan Fund is not only justified, but urgently required, so that the work of relieving patients from financial anxiety and of co-operating with the Medical Staff in recommendations made for patients may be possible.

In conclusion, I should like to express my sincere and grateful thanks to the Authorities, Societies, Clergy and Ministers and individual workers who have given so much ungrudging help on behalf of the patients during the year. In particular I would mention the Kent Council of Social Service without whose assistance and co-operation with the Almoner's Department it would have been difficult to have accomplished so much.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1938.

The Committee presents the 19th Annual Report. 1938 was a busy year—as indeed all years are—and it was an expensive year, largely owing to circumstances of an unusual nature. When war clouds were gathering darkly over Europe and it seemed as if at any moment the storm must break, England found herself obliged to make precautionary arrangements, and the West Kent

Hospital, among others, received notice that it would be required to act as a Clearing Station in case of National Emergency, and the authorities immediately took steps to arrange for this and to double their number of beds should such an emergency arise. This meant that very many more sheets, pillowcases, blankets, rugs, quilts, towels, etc., etc., were required in stock than is normally the case, and the need being urgent the various articles had to be purchased ready for use and placed at Matron's disposal. The sum spent in this way was about £50. When the crisis passed those extra articles went into general store so that probably we shall be spending less in 1939 than we might have had to do. In spite of the rather heavy outlay during that week in September, the Balance Sheet shows that expenses altogether for the year were down by £44 18s. 10d., in comparison with 1937, and collections and subscriptions have increased almost £29. "Bun Pennies" brought in £10 2s. 3d.—which is very satisfactory. As a result, the total excess of expenditure over income was £90 9s. 0d., as against £151 9s. 7d., in 1937.

The following Vice-Presidents have resigned:—Miss Parks (Allington), Miss Hilda Cadman (Boxley), Mrs. Bacon (Otham), Lady Douglas-Jones (Linton), the Marchioness of Ormonde (Hunton), and Mrs. Sillars (East Sutton). We also regret to record the death of Mrs. Pitt, Vice-President in Charing since 1919. It has been decided not to replace her, as Charing people make use of Ashford and Canterbury Hospitals and accordingly Charing is withdrawn from our list of Districts. Lady Ormonde was also one of the original Vice-Presidents appointed when the Ladies' Association was formed. We are pleased to know that we shall still have her interest and help as she is remaining a member of the Executive Committee. Nor is Miss Cadman leaving us entirely, for as Hon. Librarian to the Hospital she has asked to continue her attendance at the Quarterly Meetings of our General Committee. Allington remains vacant, but Mrs. Arthur Lushington has been appointed Vice-President for Boxley, Mrs. Crowther in Otham, Mrs. Hubert Allfrey in Linton, Mrs. Lithgow in Leeds, Mrs. Moore in East Farleigh, and Mrs. Bennett in East Sutton.

Parcels of needlework and knitting have been sent to West Farleigh, Wrotham, Barming, Boughton Monchelsea, Loose, Hollingbourne, Yalding, Boxley, Mangravet, East Peckham, Frittenden, Hucking, Harrietsham, Ulcombe, Langley, Mereworth, Teston, Smarden, Willington and Hunton. Individual workers have been

found among members of the Committee and the Mending Party, and also in Bearsted, Boxley, Addington, Maidstone—Bridge and Stone Street, Hollingbourne, Loose, Godden Green and Lenham. There have been gifts of infant vests from Hon. Mrs. Hannen, Miss Sweet and Miss Anne Hirst; operation stockings and baby woollies from Wrotham; 26 dressing towels and 12 cloths from "The Willing Hands," of Hunton; operation stockings from Mrs. Woodall and Mrs. Evelyn Seymour; children's vests from Miss H. Cadman; children's operation socks from Hon. Mrs. Hannen and Miss Ede; infant jackets from Mrs. Lysons, Hon. Mrs. Hannen, Miss Sweet, Mrs. C. H. Balston and Mrs. Evans. Dettling members sent a gift of money (£4 9s. 0d.), with which some milk jugs and sugar basins in "Hotel Plate" were purchased for the Maternity Unit. The total number of garments and other articles supplied to Matron was 3,644, besides bales of materials and various rubber goods.

Materials for mortuary gowns, screen covers and blinds, damask for tablecloths, satin jean for lining infant cots, net for blinds, cretonne for armchair and sofa covers and cushions in the nurses' and maids' sittingrooms; also doctors' gowns and mackintosh sheeting and rubber air ring cushions. Mrs. Foord and the Mending Party (20 members), have surpassed all previous records and dealt with 2,159 casualties.

PATIENTS' STATISTICS.

PAY DAY FUND PATIENTS TREATED:—

IN-PATIENTS:—851, who spent 16,927 days in Hospital, as compared with 672 and 14,265 respectively in the previous year.

OUT-PATIENT ATTENDANCES:—3,151. DENTAL CASES, 1,320, a total of 4,471, as compared with 4,372 for the year 1937.

NEW CASUALTIES AND EMERGENCIES:—5,359, as compared with 6,925 for the year 1937.

The cost to the West Kent General Hospital for the maintenance and treatment of these Patients was £9,864 0s. 10½d.

TOTAL NUMBER OF PATIENTS TREATED DURING 1938:—

IN-PATIENTS:—2,121, as compared with 1,901 for 1937. An increase of 220.

NEW OUT-PATIENTS AND CASUALTIES:—14,219, as compared with 13,850 for 1937. An increase of 369.

REPORT, 1938.

The year 1938 witnessed yet another record set up by contributing firms and members of the Pay Day Fund, and both your Committee and the Committee of Management of the Hospital desire to thank all who have helped the Fund. The Committee are ever mindful of the fact that the ultimate success of the Fund rests with the keenness of the representatives, and they feel, therefore, that the result of these efforts of representatives for the year under review is one of which all members can justifiably be proud.

INCOME.

The sum of £9,818 4s. 2d. was subscribed for the year, and once again it has to be said that this sum is the highest ever realised by the Fund since its inception in 1915. This amount is an increase of £231 17s. 11d. over the amount subscribed in 1937.

In the last report it was stated that it was hoped that £10,000 would be realised during 1938, but although this total did not quite materialise, the result must be considered very satisfactory, and your Committee feel sure that the time is not far distant when this hoped-for sum will at last be realised.

The number of subscribing firms has been slightly increased, and all firms who have contributions outstanding are circularised annually, reminding them of the closing date for receiving payments.

The number of members who contributed individually through Capt. R. W. Daykin still continues to increase, thereby contributing to the total subscribed.

EXPENDITURE.

The grants to other Institutions have again increased, and of necessity mean heavier expenditure than for the year 1937. The sum of £242 19s. 5d. has been distributed to other Institutions for treatment of members or dependants of members of the Fund. All questions of grants for members' maintenance charges who are patients in other Hospitals receive very careful consideration. In several cases grants have rightly been refused as the cases did not come under Rule 19 of the Fund, but where cases of real hardship have been met, or cases that could not be accepted by the West Kent General Hospital for some reason, a compassionate grant has been made.

HOSPITAL ACTIVITIES and FINANCE.

The Committee of Management of the Hospital have to face, unfortunately, a debit balance of £2,191 2s. 0d., or a full year's work with the increased Bed Accommodation, which now is 135 beds.

The Income of the Hospital increased by £1,296 4s. 7d., but the Expenditure, due to various reasons, also shewed a larger increase. To meet the ordinary running costs of the Hospital a sum of £26,000 has to be raised annually.

Reference was made in the last report to the hope for a new Casualty and Out-patients' Department with combined Clinics. A survey has been made, and the Honorary Medical Staff submitted a report on the subject, but as the cost of this ideal scheme was thought to be too prohibitive, a more modest scheme has been suggested, and the Committee, although faced with last year's debit balance, feel that the improvement to the Out-patients' Department must be pushed forward.

The working hours of the Nurses have been reduced, but due to the general shortage of Nurses, it has not been found possible to fully reduce their working hours to 96 hours per fortnight. In common with other Hospitals, the wages of the Nursing Staff have been revised.

Since the "Crisis" in September, 1938, an A.R.P. Scheme has caused the Hospital a great deal of thought. The precautions will probably involve the Hospital in great expenditure, but it is felt that the Hospital will receive every praise in its attitude to this all-important question. It is only proper that some protection should be given to those unfortunate people who would not, should the occasion arise, be in a position to protect themselves.

THE FUTURE.

Representatives will gather from this Report that the Hospital still needs and appreciates their support and help, and every little service, however small, to still further aid the work of the Hospital will always be welcome.

The House Governor and Secretary will, if notified previously, be pleased to welcome all friends of the Hospital, and to take them for a tour of the Institution.
