



### INFORMATION FOR SUBSCRIBERS.

The Hospital was opened on April 4th, 1740, for the relief of the diseased poor in the County of York, and rebuilt in 1851.

Donors of £21 and upwards are Life Governors.

A collector, or principal organizer of a collection of thirty guineas or more in any one year, may be made by the Committee a Governor for life, and the same privilege may be extended to the principal organizer of any entertainment resulting in the sum of thirty guineas or more being handed over to the Treasurer in one sum.

All Legacies and Donations given expressly for the purpose of being invested are to be permanently invested accordingly.

Annual Subscriptions are due on the 1st January in each year.

No Governor, whose Annual Subscription is unpaid Three Months after notice of its being in arrear has been given to him by the Secretary, can exercise any privilege as a Governor.

The House Committee is elected at the Annual Court in March.

Six Gentlemen and six Ladies (being Subscribers) are appointed to visit and inspect the Hospital during each Quarter, and to report their observations to the Committee.

In-patients are admitted any week-day. They must attend not later than Twelve o'clock Noon, and must come provided with a Change of Linen, Soap, Flannel, and Towels, and a Pair of Slippers or Light Shoes, and must arrange for their personal linen to be properly washed.

Accidents and cases of great urgency are treated and, if necessary, admitted at all times. Before patients are sent from a distance for admission, it should first be ascertained from the Secretary that accommodation is available in the Hospital. Particulars of the nature of the patient's case should also be given.

No person able to pay for medical attendance can be treated as an In or Out-patient.

Patients suffering from Consumption (except in its earliest stages) or from any infectious or contagious disorder, or any disease deemed incurable, or who might more suitably be treated at the City Infirmary, are not considered proper persons for admission.

Persons in receipt of parochial relief, soldiers or members of soldiers' families, cannot be admitted except by special arrangement between the Public Assistance Committee or the Military Authorities, and the House Committee.

### VISITING RULES FOR THE CLERGY AND MINISTERS OF ALL DENOMINATIONS.

Clergymen and Ministers may visit members of their congregations who may be patients in the Hospital, subject to such regulations as the House Committee may from time to time put intoforce.

Patients desiring the services of their own Clergyman or Minister must make definite application to that effect to the Matron, House Physician or House Surgeon, stating the name of the person whose visits they desire. Such Clergyman or Minister will be allowed to attend the Patient any afternoon between the hours of 2 and 4 o'clock, or in the morning if desired to do so, special request being made to that effect to the Matron, House Physician or House Surgeon; but no Clergyman or Minister can be allowed in the Wards between the hours of 9 a.m. and 2 p.m., except in urgent cases, for which special arrangements will be made.



The average stay per patient has risen from 19.4 to 21.5, and the daily average number of In-patients has considerably increased from 166 to 178.

Ever since the beginning of October the demand on the accommodation has been very great. There have been days on which every available bed in the Hospital has been occupied. An increase in the number of beds is urgently needed.

A small Ward has now been opened where patients admitted after 8 p.m. for emergency operations are treated for the night until they are transferred to the appropriate Ward the next

morning. This prevents disturbance and confusion after the main Ward has been closed for the night.

from the country and surrounding districts, and this small Ward has been an invaluable help in such cases.

The number of patients attending the Out-patient Department continues to increase. 802 more cases received attention in 1935 than in the previous year. It is now possible to deal with a larger number of minor operations in the new building. In 1934 these numbered 1,527, in 1935, 1,860.

### THE FINANCIAL POSITION.

In presenting the statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet, the Committee, while gratefully acknowledging the increase of £1,500 in the contribution from the York County and District Hospital Contributory Scheme, draws attention to the decrease in other sources of income. The lower contribution from the Yorkshire Voluntary Hospitals Committee and the closing of the Workpeople's Hospital Fund are directly attributable to the activities of the Contributory Scheme, but the continued decrease in the Annual Subscriptions is as steady as it is deplorable, and can hardly be explained in this way.

If the items of expenditure charged to Replacement Reserve Account (£551) are included in the Annual Statement for 1935, the Expenditure will be found to have exceeded the Income by £415. As a result there is still a Bank overdraft of approximately £11,500 on the General Fund, on which Bank charges of over £400 have been paid. Without a considerable increase in the annual revenue of the Hospital, there is little chance of lowering this burden on the Hospital's finances.

The Committee urges the need for stable sources of income and hopes that, with the better trade conditions in the country, the number of Annual Subscribers and of Employers who contribute will again increase. It also invites those friends of the Hospital, who are able to do so, to arrange whist drives and similar entertainments—a valuable source of income, which has, unfortunately, fallen heavily of late.

On the Expenditure side of the Accounts, it is to be noted that with the increase in the average daily number of patients and the opening of the various extensions, there is the inevitable rise in the maintenance costs.

In addition to the Ordinary Expenditure, the following items of Extraordinary Expenditure have had to be met—

(a) Bed Pan Washers installed in each Ward. This apparatus was very costly, but saves the Nursing Staff much time in their daily routine work.

- (b) Sick Room for Nurses and Domestics, providing 4 beds, also a bath-room and W.C. The urgent need for this had been felt for years.
- (c) Ash Pit and Rubbish Bin Shed—originally situated in close proximity to the Hospital, now erected, for hygienic reasons, at a spot well removed from the main buildings.
- (d) Foul Washer in the Laundry for dealing with soiled linen from certain types of cases. This piece of machinery makes it unnecessary for the linen to be handled by the laundress.
- (e) Fruit and Vegetable Store constructed in a room in close proximity to the Kitchen, and fitted with cages and racks for storing vegetables, etc.
- (f) Perambulator Shelter for the use of patients attending the new Out-patients' Department. There is accommodation for 20 perambulators.

### NEW MASSAGE, ELECTRICAL, AND SUNLIGHT DEPARTMENTS.

These Departments were originally housed in part of the Wooden Hut, but were moved into the ground floor of the Watt Wing in March last. The premises, which had served as an Outpatient Department for 50 years, have been suitably altered to meet the requirements of an up-to-date Massage and Electrical unit, and now provide adequate accommodation for a busy section of the Hospital's work.

### NEW DISPENSARY AND ALMONERS' DEPARTMENT.

The new Dispensary has now been in use for over a year, and the work has much increased. The good arrangement of the new Department has added greatly to its efficiency.

The work of the Almoners has also increased. The arrangement for Convalescent Homes and after-care, provision of Surgical appliances, etc., is much appreciated by many patients.

It should be realized that the Almoners' work is not merely to collect money, but is greatly concerned with the after-care of the patients and their families.

### NIGHT NURSES' FLOOR.

For a long time sleeping accommodation for the Nursing Staff was unavoidably cramped, in many cases 2 or more Nurses having to sleep in one room. The increase of staff necessitated by the extensions in 1934 made conditions worse. The Trustees made a grant of £5,000 to erect a floor over the Watt Wing. This provided bedrooms for the whole of the Night Nurses, who are now able to sleep in the day-time away from noise.

The new floor contains 19 bedrooms, each with built-in wardrobe and drawers, wash-hand basin and hot rail, a large sittingroom, 3 bath-rooms, linen cupboards, luggage store-rooms, and telephone box.

The Hospital Supporters' Club and the Linen Guild provided arm lairs and mattresses and bed linen for these rooms. Other donations were gratefully received.

### REST ROOM.

The attic room, used as a class-room for the Nurses, was turned into a rest room for patients' friends coming from a distance. This entailed moving the class-room into a portion of the old wooden massage hut for the time being. On several occasions the State Examinations of the General Council of Nursing have been held in this room.

### THE HOSPITAL EGG COLLECTION.

Mrs. Hugh Stobart organized another very successful Egg collection last year, the total number collected being 51,125. The Committee extends its grateful thanks for this valuable contribution. (See page 81.)

### ETHEL CROMBIE LINEN GUILD.

The Annual Meeting of the Guild was held in the John Petty Chapel, Monkgate, in December last.

A crowded gathering was presided over by Lady Thomson, and an address was given by Mrs. Woollcombe, wife of the Bishop of Whitby. The Hon. Secretary, Mrs. H. A. Watson, was able to announce that the Guild's finances were in a most satisfactory state, and that the amount of bedding and linen supplied to the Hospital was well up to the average.

To the above ladies, to Miss Rose, and all the Officers and Members, the Committee extends its warmest thanks for the great assistance which the Guild continues to give to the management of the Hospital.

### YORK COUNTY AND DISTRICT HOSPITAL CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

The Scheme has further increased the scope of its work during the past year. A total of £16,500 has been handed over to the York County Hospital for 1935. This is an increase of £1,500 over 1934 as shown in the following table:—

### YORK COUNTY HOSPITAL SUPPORTERS' CLUB.

The Committee gratefully records the receipt of donations amounting to £562 9s. 6d. in respect of various collections, entertainments, etc., organized by the Supporters' Club; also he proceeds of the York Rugby League Football Club match for the Hospital Cup (York v. Bramley) amounting to £153 7s. 6d.

In addition, the Club provided a number of Easy Chairs for the new Nurses' Quarters and met the cost of the upkeep of the Wireless installation during the year.

The Club has, since its foundation in 1928, contributed nearly £7,000 to the funds of the Hospital.

### YORK WORKPEOPLE'S HOSPITAL FUND.

After 34 years of valuable service in the cause of their local Hospital, the members of the Workpeople's Fund decided, some time back, to bring the existence of their organization to a close.

The Committee wishes to extend to Mr. Parkin, the President, to Councillor A. Wilkinson, the Secretary, and to all who have associated themselves with the efforts of the Fund, its most grateful thanks for the valuable assistance which has been rendered to the Hospital by the Fund over so many years.

The organizers of any efforts, the proceeds of which were formerly paid into the Workpeople's Hospital Fund, are now asked to forward any contributions direct to the Secretary of the Hospital.

### LORD DANESFORT'S DEATH

The Committee records its deep sense of loss at the death of Lord Danesfort, a very old friend of the Hospital.

### PATIENTS' LIBRARY.

The library service has been much appreciated by the patients during the past year. A glance at the shelves shows that the books available are being constantly brought up-to-date.

For this kindly assistance in providing for the patients' comfort, the thanks of the Committee are due to Mrs. Stobart and her helpers—Mrs. Bryan Fairfax, Mrs. Fletcher, Miss Jeffcoat, Mrs. Ivo Thomson, and Miss Thompson.

### OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT CANTEEN.

The Committee tenders its thanks to the Hon. Mrs. Fairfax and Mrs. Lawson-Smith for instituting an Out-patient Canteen, which has been much appreciated

### THE HOSPITAL STAFF.

The opportunity is again taken of expressing to the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staffs the appreciation and thanks of the Committee for the devotion and skill with which they have served the Hospital during the past year.

# RECOVERY BY THE HOSPITAL OF INCOME TAX ON ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTIONS.

Subscribers to a Hospital who give a written agreement that they will pay their subscriptions for a period of seven years or during their lifetime, whichever shall be shorter, will enable that Hospital to recover the Income Tax paid by the subscriber; and, further, the subscriber, if a surtax payer, may deduct the gross amount of his annual subscription from the amount of income which he returns as assessable for surtax.

With income tax at 4s. 6d. in the £1 the following example is given in respect of an annual subscription of £1 (the figures applicable to bigger subscriptions are in proportion):—

### a. INCOME TAX.

For every £1 of annual subscriptions the Hospital will recover 5s. 10d. and the subscriber who now gives £1 annually will have the satisfaction of knowing that this £1 is worth £1 5s. 10d. to the Hospital, without any additional expense to the subscriber and without any trouble, as the Hospital will recover the amount from the income tax authorities.

### b. SURTAX.

In making his surtax return the subscriber of £1 can deduct £1 5s. 10d. (larger amounts in proportion) from the income which he returns for surtax purposes.

It is hoped that the surtax payer will give the Hospital the saving which he will thus make on his payment for surtax, as the Hospital cannot reclaim it in the same way as income tax.

In view of the large additional income which may accrue to the Hospital in this way without any trouble or expense to present subscribers, it is hoped that all subscribers will sign the agreement, which will be supplied by the Secretary of the Hospital on application.

Compared with the advantage to the Hospital the disadvantage to subscribers is almost negligible; there are probably very few who do not intend to continue their subscriptions for the next seven years, if they live so long, and the agreement imposes no obligations on their executors.

It will not be necessary for subscribers who have given a bankers' order to alter that order in any way.

### LIST OF ANNUAL SUBSCRIBERS.

Subschers marked thus \* have signed an agreement to pay their subscriptions for seven years or their lifetime, whichever is the shorter. This will enable the Hospital to recover the Income Tax paid by subscribers on the amount of their subscriptions. With Income Tax at 4/6 in the £ a subscription of £1 becomes worth £1 5s. 10d. It is hoped that all subscribers will sign this agreement, copies of which can be obtained from the Secretary.

### Those marked † are also Life Governors.

All Annual Subscriptions shall be paid annually in advance, and shall be considered due from the first day of January preceding the date of Subscription.



## MATRON'S REPORT, 1935.

There have been many changes for the better during 1935, and the Nursing, Massage, and Domestic Staffs have greatly benefited.

The temporary hostel at 30 Monkgate was closed in October, when the Night Staff with Sister moved into their new rooms.

I would like to take this opportunity of thanking the following friends who helped so generously in the furnishing of the Sitting and Bedrooms—Mrs. Arthur Watson, Mrs. Charles Farrer, Sir Lycett Green, The Pocklington Hospital Supporters, the York County Hospital Supporters' Club, the Ethel Crombie Linen Guild, and an anonymous donor.

The Maids have also had many alterations made to their cubicles, which have been so re-assembled that all have windows.

A new Nurses' Sick Room unit was completed in the autumn. A further bathroom was added to the Betty Hastings' Home, and the Chapel has also been renovated, the new Kneelers being given by Lady Thomson and worked by Mrs. Hugh Stobart.

The old class-room for probationers is now a rest room for Patients' Friends, furnished entirely by the Linen Guild. The Nurses have moved into the Massage Hut, which is used for all lectures and demonstrations as well as for the State examinations.

Sister Foster, who was appointed Tutor and Home Sister in March, has been given a bed-sitting room in the Betty Hastings' Home. She has prepared successfully for the State examinations in 1935—

7 Senior.

10 fully trained probationers for the Hospital certificate examination.

The gold medallist was Nurse Kitchen.

Nurse Wren and Nurse Holdway got the Books. For the Cookery examination Nurse Metcalfe and Nurse Massey obtained equal marks. The Lady Deramore kindly judged the trays. The practical instruction was given by Miss Lees.

Sister Walker left to go to Leicester for House-keeping experience, and Sister Chambers was appointed Night Sister in her place. Sister Crow left to take up work as Matron in a

Babies' Clinic in London, and Sister Jones returned as Sister, Ward 7. Staff Nurse F. Brown was appointed to the X-Ray Department in June. Sister Mackenzie was given leave of absence to obtain house-keeping experience in London, and Nurse Evelyn Hope was in charge of the Theatre in her absence.

During 1935 there were 122 applicants for training. 17 entered. 5 left as unsuited to Nursing, and 1 through ill-health. On December 31st there were on duty in the Hospital—

Buckton and Mr. Arthur Hurst for the daily papers and "Punch," sent for the Nurses; Miss Barlow and the V.A.D. members from Acomb, who assist at Mr. Craig's clinic; Miss Kenny and the V.A.D. members from Messrs. Rowntrees, who help in the Out-patient Department; Miss Coates and Miss Hoar, who help in the Sunlight Clinic bi-weekly; Miss Renolds' Rangers, who mind the babies of visitors on visiting days; Mrs. Stobart and helpers, who issue pooks to the patients every week; Miss L. Payne-Gallwey and Mrs. Melrose, who visit patients whose friends are too far away to come often to see them; Mr. Hughes for again giving his enjoyable dance for the staff; Dr. du Bois Ferguson for all his care and thought for the Sick Nurses; the Theatre Royal for tickets for the staff weekly, and many others who send flowers, magazines, cakes, jam, eggs, and game for use in the wards.





## ALMONER'S REPORT, 1935.

Since 1932, the first year of the Department's activities, there has been an increasing demand upon the social service branch of the work. Help was given to 165 cases in 1932, and to 540 cases in 1935. This latter figure included 233 patients, for whom appliances were obtained, and 125 patients, who were helped to get convalescent treatment at various seaside and other homes. Thanks are due to the many voluntary and statutory bodies, also to the employers and private individuals, who have given such valuable aid to the patients referred to them.

Besides the cases mentioned above the Department has given help during the year in the payment of patients' fares, in visits to the homes of discharged patients, in the provision of extra nourishment, and in the supply of clothing to necessitous patients, to mention only a few of the manifold activities of this branch of the work.

The administrative side of the work included the interviewing of both in- and out-patients. The proportion paying into the York County and District Hospital Contributory Scheme rose from approximately 30% in 1932 to 56% in 1935.

Chocolates, Tobacco, Cigarettes, Cheese, Bath Salts, etc., to name but a few commodities, are wrapped in "Silver" Paper, and almost every person in the country throws away a piece every day; perhaps this is only natural as each separate piece has little or no value, but "Silver" Paper has a very definite value when it is collected in bulk and scientifically treated.

We have made arrangements with a firm which handles this material to purchase our collection, and we earnestly appeal to the community to cultivate the idea that "Silver" Paper is a perquisite of the York County Hospital.

The following materials can be handled in addition to "Silver" Paper:—Foils, Tin, Lead, Aluminium, either bright, dull or decorated. Brass, Copper and Lead waste pieces, Lead Paper used in Tea Chests, Capsules from Wine and Spirit Bottles, etc. Tubes which have contained Toothpaste, Shaving Soap, Mounting Paste, Seccotine, Cold Cream, etc.

## TWELFTH ANNUAL REPORT

(FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 5TH, 1935).

The Committee of the "Ethel Crombie" I nen Guild have pleasure in presenting their 12th Annual Report.

They regret to record the loss, by death, during the year of two good friends of the Guild—Mrs. Fairweather, who was District Secretary for Pocklington Deanery, died in the Spring, and will be much missed. Owing to her efforts, collectors had been secured for nearly all the villages in the area, which is a large and scattered one. They also regret the death of Miss Rotherham. She was the Collector in the village of Holtby and a member of the General Committee.

The Hon. Mrs. Egerton has accepted the post of District Secretary for Pocklington, and the Committee are also glad to report that the work in Helmsley District, which had lapsed for 2 years, has been re-commenced under the direction of Lady Marjorie Beckett, assisted by Mrs. Claud Palmer.

Two new members of the Committee have been appointed during the year—Mrs. C. W. Thompson and Mrs. Clark, who is the representative of the Catholic Women's League.

The village of Kepwick has contributed for the first time. The knitting cards are an innovation since last year, and it is hoped will be popular with our knitters. They have been carefully prepared, and are in every case, patterns approved by the Matron. Mrs. Claude Thompson, who has drawn them up, emphasises the fact that it is essential to follow the instructions in every particular if good results are to be ensured. They can be procured from Mrs. H. A. Watson or the District Secretaries.

1935 has been a busy year at the Hospital, and it is gratifying that the Linen Guild still retains its reputation of providing all that has been required of it.

The new Night Nurses' Block has been completed this year and the new Massage Department. The Guild has supplied to the former, mattresses, quilts, curtains, chair covers in the sitting-room, etc., and to the latter, special mattresses covered with American cloth and all other needs.

Another event this year at the Hospital was the opening of a Rest Room for the use of relations and friends who are fetched (often during the night) to patients who are seriously ill. This room has proved an inestimable boon and has been in use nearly every night, and the Guild equipped it with easy chairs, rugs, sofa blankets and pillows to try and make it as comfortable as possible.

Lord and Lady Deramore once again opened their beautiful gardens to the public in aid of Guild funds, and as the day was very fine a substantial sum was realised. The Committee would like to take this opportunity of emphasising the fact that there is no extravagance in the Linen Department. Owing to tensions and improvements during the last few years, there is a good deal more linen in circulation—there are now four theatres to be supplied, where two years ago there was only one. Every week 10,000 pieces go through the Laundry.

The total number of articles sent in this year is 3,661. This is a slight increase on last year's figures and is additionally satisfactory, as the Committee are of opinion that the standard of the work has again improved.

The thanks of the Committee were also expressed to the Trustees of the "John Petty" Chapel for their kindness in allowing them the use of this Chapel and Schoolroom for the meeting and show of work, and they acknowledge gratefully the great help given by the Hospital Staff with the tea and those who assisted as stewards at the meeting.

As in other years the cost of the tea has been defrayed by private subscriptions and does not encroach on Guild Funds.

Messrs. James Bowman have again carted goods for us free of charge.

## OBJECTS.

## The Guild exists: -

- To supply one of the most pressing needs of the York County Hospital—the provision of new linen for the beds and garments for the patients.
- 2. To save the General Fund the expenditure necessary for this purpose.
- To give those who are anxious to assist in this good work an opportunity for helping the County Hospital in a practical and practicable manner.

#### RULES.

- 1. The Guild consists of a President and Vice-President, District Secretaries and Members, and is managed by a Committee of Ladies, who elect their Chairman, Treasurer and Honorary Secretary. Two Members of the Committee retire by rotation annually to be eligible for re-election at the end of two years. (This rule does not apply to District Secretaries who are also Members of Committee, or any holding office thereon.)
- Each District Secretary is responsible for collection of subscriptions and work from the Members in her District.
- 3. Each Member to subscribe not less than 1s. annually, and to provide one or more articles of linen or clothing.
- 4. The articles must be made from patterns which will be supplied by Miss Steele at the Hospital.
- 5. Finished articles and subscriptions must be sent to the District Secretaries by the end of the first week in November of each year.
