

HNNUAL REPORT.

THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT have the honour to submit to the Governors and Subscribers, their Annual Report for the year 1938, together with the Audited Accounts:—

THE CAY MATERNITY HOME, AND THE LORD AND LADY KENILWORTH ANTE-NATAL CLINIC AND LABOUR WARD UNIT.

The hope expressed in last year's Annual Report that it would be possible to commence the above new buildings last summer was happily realised. The decision to do so was taken by the Committee on the 16th March, 1938, when the Appeal Fund, in donations and promises under Covenant Deed, reached the total of £24,000, the sum at which it had been previously agreed to commence. It is desired to emphasize very strongly, however, that this sum was £4,000 short of the total estimates and although it was agreed that £2,000 of this balance should be found from the Hospital's General Funds in order to pay for that part of the Extension to the Nurses' Quarters not actually required for the nurses to be employed in the new Home, the fact remains that a sum of £4,000 has still to be found.

The foundation Stone of the new Buildings was laid with full Masonic Rites on Saturday, the 16th July, 1938, by The Right Worshipful Provincial Grand Master for Warwickshire, Colonel Sir William Wyley, V.D., D.L., assisted by Worshipful Brother J. S. Pritchett, M.A., B.C.L., P.G.D., Deputy Provincial Grand Master, Worshipful Brother Brigadier General Lord Henry Seymour, D.S.O., P.G.W., Assistant Provincial Grand Master and the Officers of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Warwickshire. The Ceremony took place in the presence of 700 invited guests, who were afterwards entertained to tea, and conducted over the Hospital.

The new Buildings are now nearing completion, and it is hoped that the Opening Ceremony, which is to be performed by the Patron and generous Benefactress to the Hospital, Mrs. Albert Cay, will take place in May or early June, 1939.

NEW NURSES' DINING ROOM, MAIDS' SITTING ROOM AND THE REMODELLING OF THE KITCHENS, ETC.

It was stated in last year's report that a tender for the above work had been accepted, and the work commenced.

The Committee are pleased to be able of report that this difficult problem, necessitating as it did the underpinning of the 100 years' old centre block to put in iron girders to make the alterations possible, has been successfully completed by the Contractors, Messrs. Lewis & Watters, under the direction of the Architects, Messrs. Armstrong and Gardner, F/A.R.I.B.A.


The new rooms were completed in August last, and everyone who has inspected them realises how essential they were to the well being of the Nursing and Domestic Staffs, and to the important question of food preparation for the Patients. The alterations to the Kitchen meant temporary arrangements for cooking, etc., for a period of nine months, and the Committee have recognised in a suitable manner the excellent services rendered under great difficulties by Miss Smith, lady cook, and her Assistant and Staff.

The cost of these alterations, owing to the difficulties experienced which could not be foreseen, exceeded the estimate of £5,000, by £500. This expense has been met by the sale of investments, realising £5,000, sanctioned at the last Annual Court of Governors and £500 from the £1,899 12s. standing in the Appeal Trustees Fund Account.

SPECIAL APPEAL-FOR £15,000.

In October, the Committee decided to appeal for £15,000, made up as follows:—

- (a) £3,000, being the balance required to complete the Cay Maternity Home and The Lord and Lady Kenilworth Ante-Natal Clinic and Labour Ward Unit, and to provide a sum to cover the loan charges on the amount to be borrowed until the subscriptions under the seven year agreements, amounting to £9,000, gradually fall due.
- (b) £5,500, being the cost of the provision of the New Nurses' Dining Room, Maids' Sitting Room and the Remodelling of the Kitchens. The cost has been met by selling investments, but it is hoped that the sum may be replaced, so that the resulting loss in income can be made good.
- (c) £2,000 is required to pay for that part of the additions to the Ledbrook Nurses' Home, earmarked for the extra Nursing Staff

the Committee desire to employ in order that arrangements can be made to reduce the Nurses' hours of duty to a 96-hour fortnight, recommended by the General Nursing Council for England and Wales, and approved by the Committee appointed by His Majesty's Government to investigate the Nursing question.

- (d) £1,600 to meet the cost of a new shock-proof X-ray apparatus and additional accommodation required for the X-ray Department—one of the most important Departments of the Hospital.
- (e) £1,500 to provide Sun Balconies to the two Surgical Wards. These balconies will not only assist in the treatment of cases, but will make it possible to release accommodation in the old part of the Hospital for other essential purposes.
- (f) £1,400 to pay for (a) Converting Ryland Ward, an old small Ward with poor ventilation released by the provision of Sun Balconies, into a General Office. (b) Converting the present General Office into a fracture clinic for the modern and up-to-date treatment of fractures. (c) Providing an Almoner's Office and increasing the accommodation of the Pathological Department.

These very essential additions to the Hospital will ensure that its invaluable work will not be hampered by lack of equipment or accommodation for the patients or staff, and will also increase the Hospital's power to deal with an increased number of patients in the case of a National Emergency.

To start the Special Fund, the Right Hon. Anthony Eden, M.C., M.P., broadcast an Appeal from the Midland Regional Station on Sunday, the 13th November, 1938, which, by the close of the year, had resulted in a sum of £600 1s. 1d. being received.

The expenses in connection with the Appeal appear to be heavy (£93 18s. 1d.), but it must be borne in mind that this figure covers the cost of advertising and the printing of 25,000 letters, envelopes and forms, which were packed and delivered by Voluntary Helpers to every household in the area served by the Hospital. To these helpers, the Committee extend their grateful thanks. The average result of sixpence per letter is a little disappointing when one sees from the list of donations that two amounts of £50 were sent. It is hoped, therefore, that those who have not yet made use of the reply envelope and form will do so in due course.

The Committee wish to take this opportunity of expressing thanks to all those who have given or have organised events in response to the Appeal.

KENILWORTH CASTLE HISTORICAL PAGEANT.

The Committee wish to express to President E. Hicks and the Members of the Leamington and Warwick Rotary Club, 'their appreciation of the action they have taken in promoting the pageant, which will be held from the 8th to the 15th July, 1939, and trust that all friends of the Hospital will do what they can to help the Pageant Committee in its great task of producing the Pageant, so that the financial result will benefit the Appeal Fund and the Church of England Waifs and Strays Society.

PATIENTS.

The number of patients treated during the year was as follows:

It will be noticed from the above summary that the number of in-patients treated during the year, which includes 199 treated in the Private Patients' Department, is 142 more as compared with the previous year.

The number of new Out-Patients treated shows a slight increase of 179—the number of attendances is approximately the same as last year, showing that after initial treatment at the Hospital more patients are being subsequently treated by their own Doctors.

FINANCE.

The Ordinary Expenditure for 1938 (that is all Income except Legacies) exceeded the Ordinary Income by £1,399 4s. 7d., as compared with an excess of Ordinary Income over Ordinary Expenditure of £37 4s. for 1937. This reversed position is chiefly due to two items of non-recurring nature, namely the purchase of shock-proof diagnostic X-ray apparatus costing £1,150, and £380 revenue contribution towards the cost of a new water tower and water softener.

The deficit would have been very much more severe had the Contributory Scheme not been revised last year. The new benefits and rates of contribution came into effect on the 1st January, 1938, and have increased the Hospital's income by approximately £2,500, after paying for the extra benefits involved.

The Scheme still does not pay the full maintenance cost for its members, but the percentage it does pay has increased from 58% to 70% in two years.

As shown in last year's Balance Sheet the year 1938 commenced with a credit balance of £3,209 1s. 4d. This has been reduced, owing to the Maternity Block Building Fund becoming overdrawn, to £2,623 15s. 9d., and will be turned into a debit balance at the close of this year, when the expenses in connection with the extensions have been met. It will only be possible to meet these expenses by means of a loan from the bank.

The Committee wish to emphasize that it is imperative that the Hospital's services be maintained and developed. Research brings into being new and improved methods of treatment with the result that costs are bound to rise, also the fact that the Hospital has had to be enlarged to serve the increasing number of patients, means not only increased ward accommodation, but increased accommodation and equipment in all departments to meet the heavier demands made upon them. It is necessary, therefore, that whilst the ordinary income must be maintained, an endeavour should be made to build up a Reserve Fund for renewal of plant and machinery.

EXPENDITURE.

There is a net increase in expenditure as compared with 1937 of £2,164. To this must be added £1,000 expenditure in connection with the Contributors' Association during 1937, which is not shown in the Hospital's Income and Expenditure Account for 1938, as the Association's accounts are shown separately for the first time. The main increases are as follows:—

The increase under the first heading is due to the increase in the cost of milk. The second is chiefly due to £1,150 in respect of a shock-proof X-ray apparatus. The third item is principally due to the increased cost of coal. The fourth, under Salaries and Wages, is mainly due, as foreshadowed in last year's report, to the increases made in nursing salaries. The fifth, under Establishment, is due to the necessity of re-flooring the 1929 Extension of Victoria Ward, which was badly affected by dry rot.

INCOME.

During 1938, certain of the sources of ordinary income have been adversely affected by the Special Appeals, as follows:—

Invested Property.

Owing to the sale of investments mentioned earlier in this Report, the income under this heading has decreased by £110 as compared with the previous year. Part only of the decreased income occasioned by the sale of these shares is reflected in this year's account, and in a full year the decrease will amount to £275.

The Accounts show two very satisfactory Increases. The first from Entertainments and the second from the Contributors' Association.

Entertainments.

Receipts from Entertainments show an increase of £770:-

- 1. Leamington Fete, an increase of ... £250
- 2. Kenilworth Carnival, an increase of ... £365 principally due to the fact that during 1937 the sum of £265 was given to the Maternity Block Appeal Fund.
- Warwick Carnival, an increase of £155 against nil for 1937.


This is accounted for by the fact that the 1937 receipts of £50 was not received in time to include it in last year's account.

The importance of these Annual Events for the Hospital cannot be over emphasized, and the Committee is deeply grateful to all those who made the results possible.

Contributors' Association.

An examination of this account shows an increase in the gross receipts of £1,110. It must be remembered, however, that the 1937 published figures for the Leamington Section were inflated by the inclusion of eighteen months' income, and consequently the actual increase in the gross receipts for 1938 as compared with 1937 amounts to approximately £3,000.

Receipts on account of services to Patients shows an increase of £119, whilst Private Patients maintenance receipts are up by £87.

The following item of expenditure was passed in 1938, but will not occur until 1939:—

New Condense Main, Steam Trap and Hot Well.

In September last, it was reported that the steam lifting traps in the Calorifier Room were so worn after 17 years' service that they would have to be replaced; also the condense main of mild steel which had been in use for a similar period was patched in many places and required renewing. Further, the existing hot well tank, which had been re-welded on several occasions, was now too small to hold the amount of water received from the condensed steam. Estimates have been accepted for a new tank, condense main and steam trap, at a cost of £400.



THE VOLUNTARY HOSPITALS COMMISSION'S REPORT AND REGIONALISATION.

As stated in last year's Report a Provisional Central Council was formed by the British Hospitals Association to implement the first three and most important recommendations of the Voluntary Hospitals Commission, which are as follows:—

- 1. The division of the country into Hospital Regions.
- 2. The formation in each region of a Voluntary Hospitals Regional Council to correlate hospital work and needs in the region.
- 3. The formation of a Voluntary Hospitals Central Council to co-ordinate the work of the Regional Councils.

A meeting was held on the 12th April, 1938, at the Royal Hospital, Wolverhampton, at which it was recommended that the immense area of the West Midlands Region should be divided into smaller regions. In accordance with this recommendation, a meeting was held at the Coventry and Warwickshire Hospital, Coventry on the 23rd May, 1938, to discuss the question of the formation of a Warwickshire Voluntary Hospitals Council, with the result that such a Council has been formed, composed of representatives of the following Hospitals:—

The Coventry and Warwickshire Hospital.

The Warneford, Leamington and South Warwickshire General Hospital.

The Nuneaton General Hospital. The Stratford-on-Avon Hospital.

The Ellen Badger Hospital, Shipston-on-Stour.

The Council have met on several occasions when matters affecting all the Hospitals have been considered, and information exchanged.

FRACTURE CLINIC.

For some time past, as the Report of the Committee of the British Medical Association on Fractures indicates, there has been a growing feeling amongst those who have studied the after-history of the treatment of fractures, that these injuries do not receive the attention which they deserve, and that by more careful organisation, the results obtained could be very greatly improved, and much time and money saved. There can be no question that from the purely economic point of view the efficient treatment of fractures is of prime importance.

Public attention has been further drawn to this matter by the Interim Report of the Inter-Departmental Committee of the Ministry of Health appointed to consider the Rehabilitation of Persons Injured by Accidents. This report has been carefully considered by the Committee, and as soon as accommodation is available by the removal of the General Office Staff to new Offices, the old office will be converted into properly equipped accommodation for the treatment of fractures. The position is ideal, as it adjoins the X-ray Department. To equip this Clinic, a legacy of £200 has been received.

AIR RAID PRECAUTIONS.

The question of Air Raid Precautions for Hospitals is a very difficult one owing to the immense window spaces. The recommendations of the Ministry of Health, issued in January, 1939, would, if carried out entirely, cost the Hospital several thousand pounds. The Government is prepared to contribute towards the more substantial precautions required at Hospitals, in so far as these precautions are in excess of any obligation which may be laid upon Hospitals by general legislation, and provided firstly that the hospitals are to form an integral part of the emergency hospital scheme, secondly, that they are in areas likely to be attacked, and thirdly, that the specific measures proposed have received the prior approval of the Ministry or the Department of Health. As Leamington Spa is considered to be a comparatively safe area, although it is close to Coventry and Birmingham—both undoubted objects of an enemy attack—the Warneford Hospital would not be entitled to a grant for Air Raid Precaution purposes, although it will, in the event of war, be a Base Hospital, and at the outbreak will have to take in immediately 50 acute cases from the Coventry and Warwickshire Hospital, and probably more if Coventry is attacked.

THE SEPTEMBER NATIONAL CRISIS.

Immediately information was received that war might break out precautions were at once taken, and if war had broken out on the Saturday, your Hospital would have been ready to take the 50 acute cases from the Coventry and Warwickshire Hospital and to take its part in dealing with any air raid casualties which might have occurred in its area.

An emergency meeting of the Medical Board was called, and surgical and medical teams to carry out the work arranged. The main Operating Theatre and the Casualty Theatre would have been protected by sandbags and adequate blacking out at night would have been completed.

Instructions as to the duties of the various departmental staffs were completed and issued, and extra stores of food and dressings obtained. This, it will be realized, created heavy responsibility and a tremendous amount of work for those in charge, which had to be completed in a very short space of time. At the moment, V.A.D.'s and Volunteers under the National Service Scheme are receiving nursing training at the Hospital.



COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

Obituary.

The Committee records with deep regret, the deaths of the following:—

The Right Honourable Lord Leigh, T.D., who was appointed a Vice-President of the Hospital in 1902, and was subsequently appointed Visitor in 1912, which office he held until the date of his death. Lord Leigh always took a keen interest in the welfare of the Hospital, and in spite of his many engagements, frequently found time to attend the meetings of the Committee of Management and the House Committee.

Mr. Henry Johnson of Offchurch who, although President of the Coventry and Warwickshire Hospital, took a keen interest in the welfare of the Warneford Hospital and was a most generous benefactor during his lifetime and, under his will, he has left the Hospital a legacy of £1,000.

Councillor J. Stiles, J.P. The Committee wish to place on record their deep appreciation of his invaluable services to the Hospital and their affection and respect for him. Mr. Stiles assisted the late Mr. Albert Cay in inaugurating the Hospital Weekly Contribution Fund in 1911, and was unanimously elected Chairman of the Fund in 1914; in the same year he was elected an Honorary Life Governor of the Hospital in recognition of his valuable work in connection with the Fund. Mr. Stiles also helped to inaugurate the Hospital Gymkhana, which for many years proved a good source of income, and he continued this work in assisting at the Leamington Hospital Fetes, of which he was Chairman in 1937 and 1938. Mr. Stiles was President of the Old Patients' Association since its inception in 1933, and was a member of the Committee of Management of the Hospital from 1916, and of the Finance Committee The Hospital has lost a great worker and friend. It is much to be regretted that he did not live to see his life's ambition realised, namely, the Contributory Scheme reach the £10,000 mark.

In January, 1939, the Hospital sustained a further great loss in the death of Dr. T. E. Cecil Cole.

Dr. T. E. Cecil Cole, M.A., M.D., M.R.C.P., was appointed Honorary Physician in 1906, and retired under the age limit in May, 1937, when he was appointed Honorary Consulting Physician to the Hospital in appreciation of his skilled services to the patients.

In addition to his work as a Physician, he was also Honorary Radiologist from 1907-22, a member of the House Committee from 1923 and a member of the Committee of Management since his appointment in 1906.

Dr. Cole was a great Physician and a great personality. He always took a lively interest in the administration and development of the Hospital, and his services will be much missed.

Resignation.

Mr. G. M. Nelson tendered his resignation owing to his engagements preventing him from attending the meetings regularly. His resignation was accepted with regret.

Elections.

Mr. J. Sabin, Mr. C. Randall and Mr. H. Hathaway have been elected members of the Committee.

Office of Visitor.

This office fell vacant on the death of the Right Hon. Lord Leigh, and it was unanimously resolved to ask the successor to the title to accept the Office of Visitor, which has been held by members of the Leigh Family for 78 years. The Committee are glad to be able to report that this connection will be continued, as the Right Hon. Lord Leigh has stated that he would be very happy to accept the Office of Visitor and his election will take place, in accordance with the rules of the Hospital, at the Annual Court of Governors to be held in March, 1939.

Honorary Medical Staff.

Obituary.

The Medical Board were deeply grieved at the sudden loss of their colleague, Dr. T. E. Cecil Cole, and desire to place on record their deep appreciation of his services.

Phychological Clinic.

The Neurological Clinic was renamed the Psychological Clinic, and Dr. S. A. Mackeith, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., D.P.M. (Eng.) was elected Honorary Consulting Physician in charge.

Hon. Ophthalmic Surgeon.

Mr. E. Lloyd Howell Jones, M.R.C.S. (Eng.), L.R.C.P. (Lond.) was unanimously re-elected Honorary Ophthalmic Surgeon for a further period of two years.

Honorary Registrar to the Pathological Department.

In order to improve the Hospital's Pathological services, it was decided to appoint an Honorary Registrar. Dr. G. Campbell, M.A., B.M., B.Ch., M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., was duly elected in accordance with the rules of the Hospital.

CHAPLAIN'S REPORT.

In writing my third report as Chaplain of the Warneford, Leamington and South Warwickshire General Hospital, I should like again to express my deep appreciation of the readiness of the Matron, the Doctors, and Nursing Staff, to assist me in every way in their power in my work as Chaplain.

After another year's work in the Hospital, I am happy to repeat what I said in my report a year ago, viz., "That in my many visits to patients both in the private block and in the general wards, I have never heard anything but expressions of gratitude and appreciation of the hospital and of everything connected with it; there was no single word of complaint from anyone."

This appreciation adds considerably to the pleasure of visiting in the Hospital and should, I feel, help to bring a very general support to our local Hospital and, at the same time, encourage all who are working there.

A Service with an address is held every Sunday in one of the Wards. There is a Celebration of the Holy Communion each month at 6 a.m., and at any time when desired by a patient.

The Hospital is visited regularly two afternoons in each week and many private visits are paid as need requires.

Life, at the Warneford is, I consider, a very happy one both for the patients and for the staff, because each helps to make it so for the other, and my work as a Chaplain is a very happy work too.



Twelve (12) cases have been helped. Eight (8) cases were sent to Convalescent Homes. One (1) case supplied with a Dental Set. One (1) case supplied with Railway fare. One (1) case supplied with a Surgical Belt. One (1) case supplied with Iron support and repairs to Surgical shoes. Railway and taxi fares were also paid by the Samaritan Committee.

REPORT OF THE ELEVENTH ANNUAL POUND DAY.

The Eleventh Annual Pound Day was held on Saturday, 22nd October, 1938. Leamington, Warwick, Kenilworth and fifty-five surrounding villages, and a number of Farmers, co-operated to make Pound Day as successful as in previous years.

LEAMINGTON had two Depots for receiving Gifts, 17 Schools collected and 32 shops had collecting boxes for Groceries.

Warwick had two Depots, 14 Shops assisted, and 13 Schools made collections.

Kenilworth had two Depots, 7 Schools collected and 16 shops had collecting boxes.

The transport of the goods to the Hospital was again carried out by voluntary helpers, to whom the Pound Day Committee wish to express their grateful thanks.

The total weight of gifts received from all sources was:—31,099½ lbs., of which 13,284½ lbs. were Groceries and 17,815 lbs. Vegetables and Fruit. This represents a total decrease of 54¾ lbs. Groceries were more by 498½ lbs. Vegetables showed a decrease of 563¼ lbs.

The total cash received was £43 8s. 6d., as compared with £43 19s. 3d. received last year.

The following weights were received from the three Towns and Villages:—

LEAMINGTON: 6,346½ lbs., of which 4,455¾ lbs. were Groceries and 1,890¾ lbs. vegetables—an increase of 250¼ lbs. and a decrease of 50¼ lbs. respectively on last year.

Warwick: 2,452 lbs., of which 2,119½ lbs. were Groceries and 332½ lbs. vegetables, an increase of 332½ lbs. and a decrease of 859¼ lbs. respectively on last year.

Kenilworth: 3,833 lbs., of which 1,608\frac{3}{4} lbs. were Groceries and 2,224\frac{1}{4} lbs. Vegetables—decreases of 136\frac{3}{4} lbs. and 330\frac{1}{4} lbs. respectively on last year.

VILLAGES: 14,067\(\frac{3}{4}\) lbs., of which 5,100\(\frac{1}{4}\) lbs. were Groceries and 8,967\(\frac{1}{2}\) lbs. Vegetables—an increase of 131\(\frac{1}{4}\) lbs. and 475\(\frac{1}{2}\) lbs. respectively on last year.

The Farmers responded generously to the appeal by giving direct to the Hospital 4,400 lbs. of vegetables, chiefly potatoes. Many Farmers sent their Gifts to the nearest Depot and these have been included in the Village returns.





Photo taken and presented to the Hospital by Walden Hammond, Leamington Spa. THE MAIN KITCHEN (Before being Re-modelled)

Included in the weight of all goods received, were Eggs, Poultry and Fruit.

The Schools sent the following weights—Groceries and Vegetables:—

Leamington: $3,750\frac{1}{2}$ lbs.—an increase of $534\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. Warwick: 1,694 lbs.—a decrease of $167\frac{1}{4}$ lbs. Kenilworth: $1,172\frac{1}{2}$ lbs.—a decrease of $104\frac{1}{2}$ lbs.

The Depots produced the following weights—Groceries and Vegetables:—

Leamington: $1,625\frac{1}{4}$ lbs.—a decrease of $52\frac{1}{4}$ lbs.

Warwick: 261 lbs.—an increase of 1013 lbs.

Kenilworth: 2,3243 lbs.—a decrease of 4051 lbs.

Shops collected the following weights-Groceries only:-

Leamington: $970\frac{3}{4}$ lbs.—a decrease of $282\frac{1}{4}$ lbs. Warwick: 497 lbs.—an increase of 132 lbs. Kenilworth: $335\frac{3}{4}$ lbs.—an increase of $42\frac{3}{4}$ lbs.

In concluding this Report, the Pound Day Committee wish to record their deep appreciation of the help so willingly given by everyone connected with the Day, and their grateful thanks to the great-hearted Public for their splendid support.

ADMISSION OF IN-PATIENTS.

1. Accidents and urgent cases are admitted at any time.

2. Annual Subscribers and Life Governors may recommend In-Patients and Out-Patients by a personal note to the House Governor and Secretary. Patients so recommended must conform with the regulations governing the admission of In- and Out-Patients.

3. Contributors under the Contributors Association, whose contributions are not in arrears more than eight weeks, and who have contributed for at least six months, shall be exempt from any payment for In-Patient or Out-Patient charges on producing a Contributor's Letter of Recommendation duly signed by the person responsible for receiving his or her contributions. Should a Contributor desire to enter the Paying Patients' Block, a remission of £1 15s. Od. per week on the maintenance charge only will be allowed.

4. Non-contributors will be admitted according to Medical urgency, and are required to pay up to the full cost of maintenance according to their means while in Hospital, unless otherwise decided

by the Exemption Committee.

5. Any Patient who is not a Contributor to the Contributors Association admitted in case of accident or sudden emergency, who is able to provide and pay for the requisite medical or surgical aid shall be accountable to the Hospital for the expenses incurred, and the Committee have the right of making such a charge as may fully reimburse the Hospital for all expenses. The Medical Officer in attendance shall be allowed to make his own charge and to demand the same from the party or parties liable at Law.

6. Patients shall be discharged as soon as cured, or whenever the Medical Officer shall consider that a longer stay in the Hospital is

unnecessary.

7. No Patient shall be admitted as an In-Patient, if Out-Patient treatment is likely to be equally successful.

OUT-PATIENTS.

Out-Patients, other than Contributors, shall be charged in accordance with the Out-Patient charges laid down by the Committee of Management, and shall, if necessary, be assisted with advice, medicine, and mineral water and bathing treatment, but shall be in no other respects chargeable to the Hospital.

VISITS TO IN-PATIENTS.

In-Patients may be visited by their relatives and friends on Sundays between 2 and 4 p.m., and Tuesdays between 6-30 and 7 p.m., also Thursdays between 2-30 p.m. and 3-30 p.m., but at no other time unless by special permission. Only four visitors are allowed—not more than two at a time—on any Visiting Day. Visitors are not admitted to the Children's Ward, and no children under 14 years of age are allowed to visit anyone in the Hospital, except by special permission. Cards for visitors are provided by the Hospital.



A FEW INTERESTING DETAILS:

34 gallons of Milk are consumed daily.

50 loaves of bread are consumed daily.

7 tons of coal in winter and $5\frac{1}{2}$ in summer are burnt in the boilers daily to provide (night and day) steam for sterilizing and cooking, hot water for sterilizing, washing and heating.

The Hospital has its own Laundry where 7,000 pieces are washed and ironed every week.

The Hospital is well and economically run compared with other Hospitals of the same size, as is shown by the comparative statistics published in the Hospitals' Year Book.
