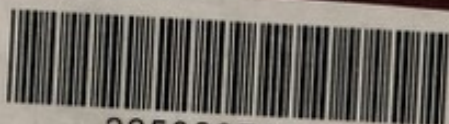

ANNUAL REPORT OF HOSPITAL BOARD

The Hospital Board have pleasure in presenting the 11th Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ending December 31st, 1932.

The number of patients treated during the year was 179, and, had it not been necessary to close the Hospital for six weeks for building operations to be carried out in connection with the extension, the number of cases admitted would have been greatly in excess of last year. Of the cases treated, 112 were surgical, 33 medical, 10 gynaecological, 101 out-patients, 108 X-ray, and 24 casualties, of which 20 were road accidents. Six deaths occurred, four of these cases being moribund on admission. Five patients occupied the Private Ward. Of the operations performed, 57 were carried out by the Honorary Consulting Surgeons. The total stay of patients in Hospital has been 1,829 days, making the average stay of each patient 10.22 days, the average cost for each patient per week being £4 15s. 3d.

As a matter of record, the total number of cases treated since the Hospital was first opened, up to the time of the extension, numbered 1,728 in-patients, 773 out-patients, 672 X-ray, 352 accidents, and the total stay of patients in Hospital was 17,261 days. There were 47 deaths.

The Board again desires to tender sincere thanks to the Honorary Consulting Surgeons and the Medical Staff for their valuable services to the Hospital. Only those closely associated with the work of the Hospital can fully appreciate the value of these services so willingly rendered.

With great pleasure the Board desire also to record their sincere appreciation and thanks to the Matron and the Nursing Staff for their untiring devotion to duty, and for their care and kindness to the patients under their charge, and it is in no small measure due to their efforts that the work of the Hospital has been so satisfactory.

The assistance of the members of the 16th Essex V.A.D., the 7th Essex Men's Detachment, and Miss E. M. Taylor, is greatly appreciated, and the Board desire to express thanks for the self-sacrificing work which has been done.

The unremitting services rendered by the Honorary Collectors in collecting the weekly contributions, which are such a great asset to the funds, are much appreciated, and the Board welcome the opportunity of paying tribute to their valuable service.

The Board records its indebtedness to all those who continue, year after year, to organise entertainments and events in support of the Hospital funds, and, whilst appreciating any assistance, however small, the Board would like to make mention of the following:—The Alexandra Rose Day Committee, The League of Mercy, The Stock Exchange Dramatic and Operatic Society for their grants, 'The Bakers' and Sweeps' Charity Match, Waltham and Cheshunt Hospital Carnival, The Waltham Hospital Football Cup, The Waltham Abbey Chamber of Commerce, The Salvation Army, Junior Imperial League, The British Legion, Garden Party (per Mrs. Brenton), 1st Waltham Abbey Rangers and Girl Guides, Garden Fete (per Mrs. Siddall), Mounted Gymkhana (per Miss Bestall), Baptist Church Lecture, Eastern Enfield Children's Carnival, Children's Cot Fund, Football Match, Metropolitan Police v. Larsen's, for special efforts on behalf of the Maintenance and Extension Funds. The Hospital Saturday Fund, The Hospital Saving Association, and Approved Societies are thanked for their contributions on account of Hospital services rendered to their members.

The Board desire to express their grateful thanks to the organisers of Alexandra Rose Day, Flag Day, and Pound Day, the results of which are a valuable asset to the funds, and to those who assist in these annual efforts by their personal service or gifts the Board are grateful.

The Board owe a debt of thanks to the Linen Guild for the provision of articles of linen, which is such an important part of the equipment of the Hospital. The increased accommodation at the Hospital will necessitate additional requirements of linen and garments, and offers of gifts or personal help will be gladly welcomed by Miss Lee, to whom the Board are indebted for her services as Honorary Organiser of the Guild.

The Clergy and Ministers are thanked for the visits made to the patients in Hospital, and also for the Harvest Festival Gifts and proceeds of congregational collections.

Many gifts in kind have been given to the Hospital, and have been acknowledged in the local Press with grateful thanks, and the Matron will always be pleased to receive such gifts at the Hospital. Other friends have helped in various ways, and are heartily thanked for their services.

The continued kindness of Mr. H. O. Larsen in providing fuel for the central heating is greatly appreciated, and the Board wish to tender their grateful thanks.

During the year a very successful Tudor Bazaar was held in the Town Hall. Lady Buxton very kindly consented to open the Bazaar, the proceeds of which amounted to £267, which sum was allocated to the Suspense Account of the Hospital. The wholehearted support given by the various local organisations was very gratifying and much appreciated, and the splendid result achieved was no doubt due to the united efforts of all. Special mention must be made of the great assistance given by Messrs. S. Puddephatt, Crabbe, Hull, Townsend, and Reeves, and other helpers, in preparing the scenery and stalls, and to the energetic Committee, of which Mrs. Courtney was Chairman and Mrs. Puddephatt and Miss D. Lockwood Joint Honorary Secretaries, to all of whom the Board desire to accord their great indebtedness.

It is much regretted that the Board have to record the death of Mr. P. McFarlane, who rendered such valuable assistance to the Hospital as Honorary Dental Surgeon.

The Board have received, with deep regret, the resignation of Sir T. Fowell Buxton, Bart., from the Board, owing to his leaving the district to reside at Cromer. The loss will be greatly felt, for, in his capacity as Chairman of the Board, which office he has held since the death of the late A. J. Edwards, Esq., he has rendered valuable assistance.

The thanks of the Board are accorded to Mr. J. Eve and Mr. J. W. Wigney for their valuable service in auditing the accounts for the year.

The retiring members of the Board are Sir T. Fowell Buxton, Bart. (who is not seeking re-election), A. Chapman, Esq., Mrs. G. Tuck, and Mrs. E. W. Davies, who are eligible for re-election.

The report cannot be concluded without reference to the extension which has been carried out during the past year. The Board have to report that the extension, plans for which were approved at the last Annual Meeting, with the recommendation to proceed, has now been completed, with the exception of the painting decorations. Before deciding to proceed with the extension, the Board very carefully considered the matter, and then decide to appeal for funds, and a Building Sub-Committee was appointed. The appeal met with a very satisfactory response, and when the Board were assured that a good portion of the sum required would be forthcoming, it was decided to commence building operations, and the tender of Mr. W. T. Duncan was accepted. The work was commenced in the second week in August, and finally completed on December 31st. During this period the Hospital was compelled to close down from the first week in October to the third week in November to allow structural alterations to be made.

The original accommodation provided for eight beds; this has now been increased to sixteen beds. The new Children's Ward has three beds and four cots, with bathroom attached. The Women's Ward has been increased to five beds, the Men's Ward has not been altered, and the Private Ward, with one bed, remains the same. A Ward Kitchen has been provided in the place of the Duty Room. In addition, a Casualty and Out-patients' department is provided, together with a new X-ray Room and Waiting Hall, which contains the Memorial Tablet of the names of the fallen in the Great War in whose memory the Hospital was erected. The staff quarters now comprise a sitting-room for the Matron, and a combined dining and sitting-room for the Nursing Staff, and each of the staff has a separate bedroom. The estimated cost of the work, when completed, including the interior and exterior painting of the whole of the old part of the building, and architects' fees, will be approximately £2,650, but this does not allow for the extra equipment and furniture. Towards this amount the Board have received £1,587 10s. 0d., which leaves £1,062 10s. 0d.

still to be raised. The Board have every confidence that, now the work has been completed, the balance outstanding will be forthcoming in the near future. The individual subscriptions received to date—of which a list will be published later—include sums of a few pence up to £200, and the Board most gratefully acknowledge the generous support given to the appeal, and also wish to thank those who have undertaken to canvass the district for funds. To those who have arranged and organised special efforts for the fund, sincere thanks are accorded.

The cost of furnishing and extra equipment is being met from the Suspense Account, and the Board greatly appreciate the gifts that have been received towards the furnishing, and others will be most acceptable.

In conclusion, the Hospital Board feel that all who read this report will realise how fully the work of the Hospital has justified its existence, and it will also be realised that the provision of additional beds will involve a proportionate increase in expenditure for maintenance and administration. The Board confidently hope that their efforts to increase the usefulness of the Hospital in the district will meet with general approval and such additional sympathy and support as will enable the work of our Memorial Hospital to be carried on in the future with the fullest measure of efficiency.

RULES.

MANAGEMENT.

The Waltham Abbey War Memorial Cottage Hospital shall be managed and controlled by a Hospital Board of 12 persons (6 men and 6 women), in addition to the President, Medical Officers, Hon. Treasurer, and Hon. Secretary. A Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall be appointed.

(2) The Hospital Board (5 of which shall form a quorum) shall appoint all Committees, including a House Committee and a Finance Committee (3 to form a quorum). The President, Chairman, and Vice-Chairman, Hon. Treasurer, and Hon. Secretary, shall be ex-officio members of all Committees.

(3) The Hospital Board shall meet every month to receive reports from the House and Finance Committees.

(4) There shall be an Annual Meeting of Subscribers in February, when the audited accounts of the Hospital shall be submitted. All officers and 4 members of the Board (2 men and 2 women) to retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election. The new officers and new members of the Board to be elected at the Annual Meeting of subscribers, but vacancies which occur during the year to be filled up by the Hospital Board.

(5) Annual subscriptions to become due on the 1st January in each year.

(6) Persons afflicted with Alcoholism, Mania, Epilepsy, Infectious, Contagious, or Incurable Disease, shall not be admitted, nor any woman in an advanced state of pregnancy.

(7) New rules or alterations to existing rules or nominations can be proposed at the Annual Meeting by giving written notice to the Hon. Secretary at least 14 days before the day of meeting.

PATIENTS' FEES.

Subscribers to pay a minimum fee of 1s. 6d. per day.

Non-Subscribers to pay a minimum fee of 4s. per day.

Children under 14 years of age pay half the above fees.

The X-ray fee to be at least 10s. 6d. Subscribers 5s. 6d.

Ex-service men will receive special consideration.

Patients in the Private Ward to pay a minimum fee of

£4 4s. per week for Subscribers; £5 5s. Non-Subscribers.

Out-Patients' fee for Subscribers, 6d. each dressing;

Non-Subscribers, 1s.

The House Committee shall have power to consider fees for necessitous cases.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

(1) The House Committee shall consist of 6 members elected from the Hospital Board (3 of which shall form a quorum) with the Medical Officer in charge for the month.

(2) The House Committee shall be responsible under the Hospital Board for the management of the Hospital, and shall perform such duties as the Hospital Board shall from time to time prescribe, and shall report all proceedings to the Board.

(3) The House Committee shall not incur any expenditure without the special authority of the Hospital Board, unless in case of emergency, when a sum not exceeding £5 may be spent.

(4) A case book shall be kept by the Matron, containing the name, age, occupation, nature of complaint, medical attendant, date of admission and discharge of patient.

(5) No food shall be introduced into the Hospital by visitors without the consent of the Matron or Sister in charge.

(6) Relatives and friends may visit children, and patients on the danger list, at the discretion of the Matron. Visiting days to be Wednesdays, 2 p.m. to 3.45 p.m., and Sundays, 2 p.m. to 3.45 p.m.

(7) Alterations may be made from time to time to these Rules by order of the Hospital Board.
