



ANNUAL REPORT OF HOSPITAL BOARD.

The Hospital Board have much pleasure in presenting the 13th Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ending December 31st, 1934.

During the year 264 In-Patients were admitted, and 150 Out-Patients were treated; X-Ray cases, including Barium Meal examinations, numbered 140; there were 33 casualties, 18 of these being road accidents. Of the cases treated, 172 operations were performed, 106 of which were by the visiting Honorary Surgeons; and there were 59 medical cases.

One hundred and ten children were admitted to the Children's Ward, and 101 women and 53 men to the other wards. Private patients numbered The total stay of patients in the Hospital has been 3,772 days, the average

stay of each patient being 14.29 days.

The Board desire once again to record their high appreciation of the services rendered by the Honorary Consulting Surgeons and Medical Staff,

and thank them most heartily for their valuable assistance.

The Matron and her Nursing Staff have, throughout the year, shown unfailing care and attention to the patients, and have served the Hospital most efficiently. Valuable assistance has been rendered by members of the 16th Essex V.A.D. and St. John Ambulance 6th Nursing Division, together with the help of the 7th Essex Men's Detachment, all of whom are warmly thanked.

The Board have much pleasure in stating that Mr. L. R. Yealland has

kindly accepted the appointment as Honorary Physician to the Hospital.

The untiring efforts of the collectors of the weekly contributions have again been much appreciated, and the Board desire to express their gratitude

for the services rendered.

The substantial help received from the following sources is gratefully acknowledged:-The Bakers and Sweeps Charity Match, Waltham Abbey Chamber of Commerce, Waltham and District Hospital Carnival Committee, Waltham Hospital Cup Competition, Garden Fete (per Mrs. Brenton), Children's Ward Fund, Junior Imperial League, Pan Britannica Co., together with other help mentioned in the report.

Grants have been received from the Alexandra Rose Day Committee, The League of Mercy, and the Stock Exchange Dramatic and Operatic

Society, to all of whom thanks are tendered.

The Annual Pound Day again proved a valuable help to the Hospital with gifts in kind and money, and thanks are given to all those who helped to make it such a success.

The Flag Day collection, organised by Mrs. E. Smith, showed an increase over the previous year, and the helpers are thanked for their efforts.

The Linen Guild, which is organised by Miss Lee, continues to be a valuable asset to the Hospital in providing articles of linen.

A most successful Garden Fete, in aid of the Extension Fund, was held in the delightful grounds of Joyce House, kindly lent by Mr. and Mrs. G. Gray, to whom the Board desire to tender their grateful thanks. The Fete was opened by Mr. W. Ibbotson, one of the Honorary Visiting Surgeons to the Hospital, who was supported by members of the visiting and local medical staff, members of the Board, and a large number of friends and supporters of the Hospital. A representative Committee of willing helpers, with Mrs. A. Bond and Mrs. Walsham as Hon. Secretaries, and Mrs. Courtney as Chairman, were responsible for the successful organising of the Fete, which realised £200 2s. Grateful thanks are accorded to all those who assisted in any way to make the event such a success.

The Board take this opportunity of expressing grateful and sincere thanks to the numerous donors of gifts in kind, which have, from time to time, been acknowledged in the "Weekly Telegraph," the help from such

gifts being much appreciated.

The patients have greatly appreciated the visits made by the visiting

clergy and ministers of the respective denominations.

On Armistice Day a Memorial Service was held at the Hospital and was attended by a good number of people. The respective religious denominations were represented by the Rev. A. V. G. Cleall (Vicar of the Abbey Church), the Rev. T. Scottorn (Baptist), the Rev. P. Jackson

(Methodist), and the Salvation Army, who took part in the service. They were supported by members of the Board, members of the British Legion (under the command of Colonel Backhouse), and other bodies. Several wreaths were placed on the Memorial Tablet, including one by the British Legion, in memoryl of their fallen comrades. This is the first occasion that a Memorial Service has been held at the Hospital on Armistice Day, and it proved a great success and was much appreciated. As the Hospital is the townspeople's memorial, erected in memory of the men of the parish who made the supreme sacrifice, it seems only fitting that a service should be held at the Hospital on Armistice Day, and it is hoped in future to arrange for a service to be held each year.

The Board wish to express their indebtedness to the many voluntary workers for their services to the Hospital, and again thank Mr. J. Eve and

Mr. J. W. Wigney for kindly auditing the accounts.

It is with very sincere regret that the Board have to record the great loss of one of their warmest supporters, through the passing away of their Chairman, Mr. H. O. Larsen. Since the Hospital was first opened, Mr. Larsen took a very keen and practical interest in its welfare, and the generous support which he gave will be a considerable loss in the future, particularly in the provision of the fuel for the central heating, the cost of which the Board will now have to provde from the funds.

Lieut, Col. E. North Buxton was appointed to fill the vacancy on the Board caused by the death of the late Mr. H. O. Larsen, and Mr. H. J.

Bolton was appointed Chairman.

The retiring members of the Board are Mrs. Brenton, Mrs. Courtney.

Mr. Bass, and Mr. Bolton, and all are eligible for re-election.

The Board wish to congratulate Brig. General Sir Richard B. Colvin, K.C.B. (the President of the Hospital), on the honour conferred upon him

by His Majesty the King.

The Board are greatly indebted to Miss Lee for her generous gift of £400, which, in due course, will be placed to the Endowment Fund, as This, with the present investments, will prove of material benefit in the future, and other gifts to this fund would be much appreciated.

The contributions made by the Hospital Saving Association and the Hospital Saturday Fund, for services rendered to their members, are gratefully

acknowledged.

The Board, however, desire again to call the attention of members of contributing societies, who receive treatment in the Hospital, to the heavy medical expenses which have to be met by the Hospital in connection with the visits of the Honorary Surgeons and Medical Staff to the Hospital for operations. Many members have shown their appreciation by making con-

tributions to the Hospital, which is much valued.

As will be seen by a reference to the Statement of Accounts, the income for the year amounted to £1,611 10s. 7d., an increase of £210 18s. 8d. over the previous year. The expenditure amounted to £1,696 6s. 7d., thus showing an excess of expenditure over income of £84 16s. 0d., which, with the deficit brought forward from last year, made a total deficit of £236 2s. 3d. The Board decided to reduce this amount by transferring £100 from the Suspense Account and £66 9s. from the Maintenance Account.

The Board, however, are pleased to be able to state that the deficit on the Extension Fund has been reduced from £613 2s. 1d. to £273 19s. 11d., and have every confidence that, once this debt is liquidated the expenses for maintenance will be met.

It is realised that the expenses grow heavier as the Hospital's responsibilities increase, and the only way to cope with additional outlay is by securing the support of further voluntary subscribers to contribute regularly. An earnest appeal is, therefore, made to those who do not yet subscribe, to assist in the endeavour to continue the beneficent work of the Institution. Such support will materially help to perpetuate a real tribute to the men of the district in whose memory the Hospital is erected, and, at the same time, assist in the relief of the sick and suffering.

RULES

MANAGEMENT.

The Waltham Abbey War Memorial Cottage Hospital shall be managed and controlled by a Hospital Board of 12 persons (6 men and 6 women), in addition to the President, Medical Officers, Hon. Treasurer, and Hon. Secretary. A Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall be appointed.

(2) The Hospital Board (5 of which shall form a quorum) shall appoint all Committees, including a House Committee and a Finance Committee (3 to form a quorum). The President, Chairman, and Vice-Chairman, Hon. Treasurer, and Hon. Secretary, shall be ex-officio members of all Committees

Committees.

(3) The Hospital Board shall meet every month to receive reports

from the House and Finance Committees.

(4) There shall be an Annual Meeting of Subscribers in February, when the audited accounts of the Hospital shall be submitted. All officers and 4 members of the Board (2 men and 2 women) to retire annually, but shall be eligible for re-election. The new officers and new members of the Board to be elected at the Annual Meeting of subscribers, but vacancies which occur during the year to be filled up by the Hospital Board.

(5) Annual subscriptions to become due on the 1st January in

each year.

Persons afflicted with Alcoholism, Mania, Epilepsy, Infectious, (6) Contagious, Tuberculous, or Incurable Disease, shall not be admitted, nor any woman in an advanced state of pregnancy.

(7) New rules or alterations to existing rules or nominations can be proposed at the Annual Meeting by giving written notice to the Hon. Secretary at least 14 days before the day of meeting.
PATIENTS' FEES.

Subscribers to pay a minimum fee of 1s. 6d. per day. Non-Subscribers to pay a minimum fee of 4s. per day. Children under 14 years of age pay half the above fees. The X-ray fee to be at least 10s. 6d. Subscribers 5s. 6d. Ex-service men will receive special consideration.

Patients in the Private Ward to pay a minimum fee of £4 4s. per week for Subscribers; £5 5s. Non-Subscribers. Out-Patients' fee for Subscribers, 6d. each dressing;

Non-Subscribers, 1s.

The House Committee shall have power to consider fees for necessitous cases.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

(1) The House Committee shall consist of 6 members elected from the Hospital Board (3 of which shall form a quorum) with the Medical

Officer in charge for the month.

(2) The House Committee shall be responsible under the Hospital Board for the management of the Hospital, and shall perform such duties as the Hospital Board shall from time to time prescribe, and shall report all proceedings to the Board.

(3) The House Committee shall not incur any expenditure without the special authority of the Hospital Board, unless in case of emergency,

when a sum not exceeding £5 may be spent.

(4) A case book shall be kept by the Matron, containing the name, age, occupation, nature of complaint, medical attendant, date of admission and discharge of patient.

(5) No food shall be introduced into the Hospital by visitors with-

out the consent of the Matron or Sister in charge.

(6) Relatives and friends may visit children, and patients on the danger list, at the discretion of the Matron. Visiting days to be Wednes days, 2 p.m. to 3.45 p.m., and Sundays, 2 p.m. to 3.45 p.m.

(7) Alterations may be made from time to time to these Rules by

order of the Hospital Board.
