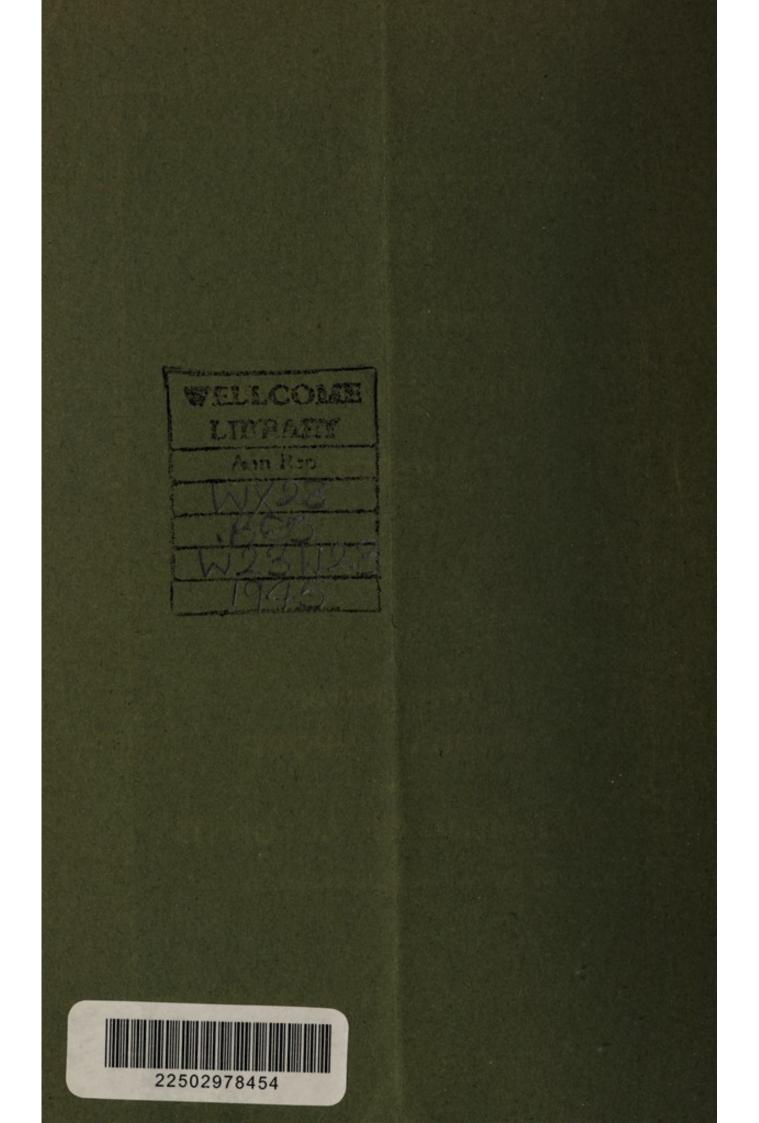

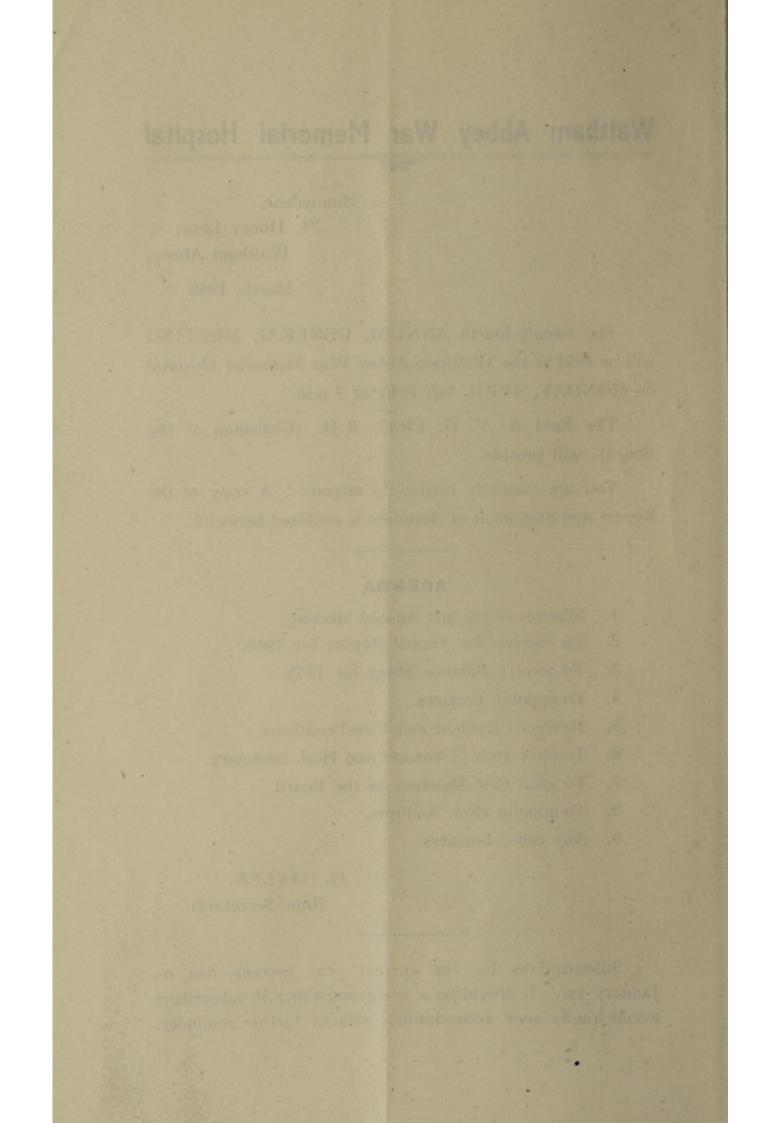

#### ANNUAL REPORT

It is with a sense of profound relief at the blessings that peace has brought to us all that the Hospital Board is able to submit its Twenty-fourth Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ending 31st December, 1945. In view of the continued shortage of paper it is, however, regretted that it is not possible to give fuller details of the work.

Since the cessation of hostilities the number of cases admitted for treatment has considerably increased. In-patients treated during the year were 296. Out-patients, 605, entailing 2,048 attendances. X-ray, 195. Of the in-patients treated (79 male, 85 female, and 132 children) 130 were surgical, 120 medical, and accidents 46. One hundred and twenty operations were performed by the Honorary Consulting Surgeons.

It is with deepest regret that the Board has to record the great loss the Hospital has sustained by the Passing of Sir T. Fowell Buxton, Bart., on October 28th, 1945. As a Trustee and Vice-president of the Hospital he always took an active and personal interest in the well-being of the Hospital since its inception, and his death will be a very sad loss to the community.

The continued assistance rendered by the Visiting Surgeons and the local Medical Staff has been invaluable, and grateful thanks are accorded to them.

The duties carried out by the Matron and Nursing Staff have been of inestimable value and are warmly appreciated. The many letters received from patients expressing appreciation for the attention, care, and devotion by the Nursing Staff is most gratifying.

The continued success of the Hospital Contributory Scheme is due to Mrs. Courtney, the organiser, and those voluntary workers who devote their time and efforts in collecting the contributions week by week.

It is desired to accord sincere thanks to all those who have supported the Hospital by their subscriptions, donations, box collections, and gifts in-kind from the Linen Guild and other friends.

The outstanding event of the year was the very successful Victory Thanksgiving Garden Fête held in aid of the Extension Fund in the grounds of Joyce House, by kind permission of Mr. and Mrs. G. Gray. The opening ceremony was carried out by Mrs. W. E. Tanner, the wife of the Honorary Consulting Surgeon to the Hospital. To the energetic and hard-working Committee, of which Mr. Gray was Chairman and Mrs. G. Trudgett Honorary Secretary, and the Waltham Abbey Club for their donation of £150, and other local organisations and friends who assisted to make the event so successful, heartfelt thanks are accorded for their efforts in raising the record amount of £1,297 3s. 10d.

The Directors of Messrs. Murex Welding Processes, Ltd., and the Murex Sports Club are thanked for their substantial support.

Sincere thanks are expressed to Mr. E. W. Davies for a donation of  $\pounds 100$  12s., being proceeds of competition, and for  $\pounds 50$  received from the Royal Small Arms Institute.

A grant of £75 was made by the King Edward's Fund, and £10 from the League of Mercy, for which the Board is most grateful.

The allocation made to the Hospital from the Hospitals Day Collection was  $\pounds 70$  2s. 9d., and Alexandra Day  $\pounds 30$ . The local organisers and collectors are thanked for their services.

The retiring members of the Board are Mrs. Brenton, Mrs. Davies, Mr. W. Edmondson, and Mr. A. Knowler, who are eligible for re-election. The Board has pleasure in recommending the appointment of Lady Buxton, Mr. G. Gray, and Mr. G. Tuck as Vice-presidents. It is also considered desirable to appoint two additional Trustees, and the Board recommends that Mr. W. Edmondson and Mr. G. Gray be appointed.

The accounts for the year have been audited by Mr. E. J. Carter and Mr. J. W. Wigney, who are sincerely thanked for their honorary services.

The accounts for the year under review shew an excess of Expenditure over Income on the General Account, whilst the Building and Equipment Fund, due to substantial donations received, shews a balance, £2,500 of which has been invested in Government Securities until such times as the proposed extension plans can be proceeded with and the Ward, used as the First-aid Post, altered to provide for 10 additional beds.

It is desired to convey to all Hospital workers a message received from the Ministry of Health to all Voluntary Hospitals, on behalf of His Majesty's Government. This message of thanks makes special reference to the Hospital Services and the Staffs of Hospitals, including those who have rendered voluntary services, for the relief and comfort they brought to the many in suffering and distress, and for their unflinching endurance of hardship and danger during the war. Therein is acknowledged with humble gratitude the sacrifice of all those who on land or sea or in the air have given their lives that others may live, and heartfelt sympathy with their relatives in their sorrow is expressed.

In according this resolution of thanks from the Government the Hospital Board also acknowledges with gratitude the services of all who have worked for the well-being of our own Hospital, which was erected as a memorial to those who gave their lives in the Great War, 1914-1918.
