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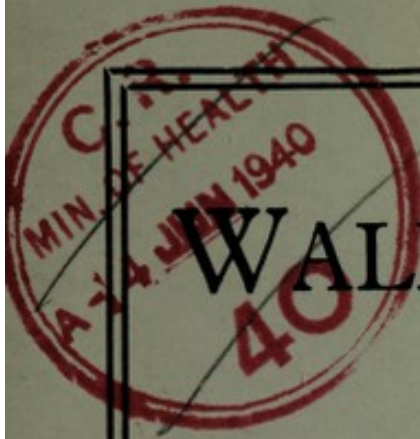
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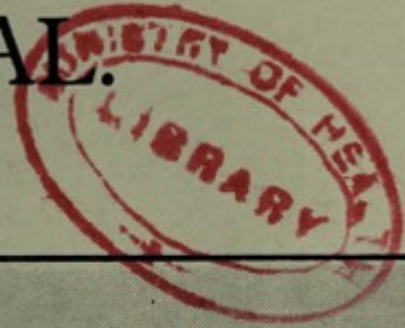

74th Annual Report, 1939.

The Committee have pleasure in submitting their Report for the year 1939, the 74th in the life of the Hospital.

In our Report for 1938 we referred to negotiations with those responsible for Air Raid Precautions in regard to the safeguarding of the Hospital. Immediately on the outbreak of war steps were taken to protect the Hospital by sandbagging, and special shelter facilities were provided for "walking" patients and for the staff. We are grateful for the voluntary help in this connection rendered by pupils from the local schools, medical students and other good friends.

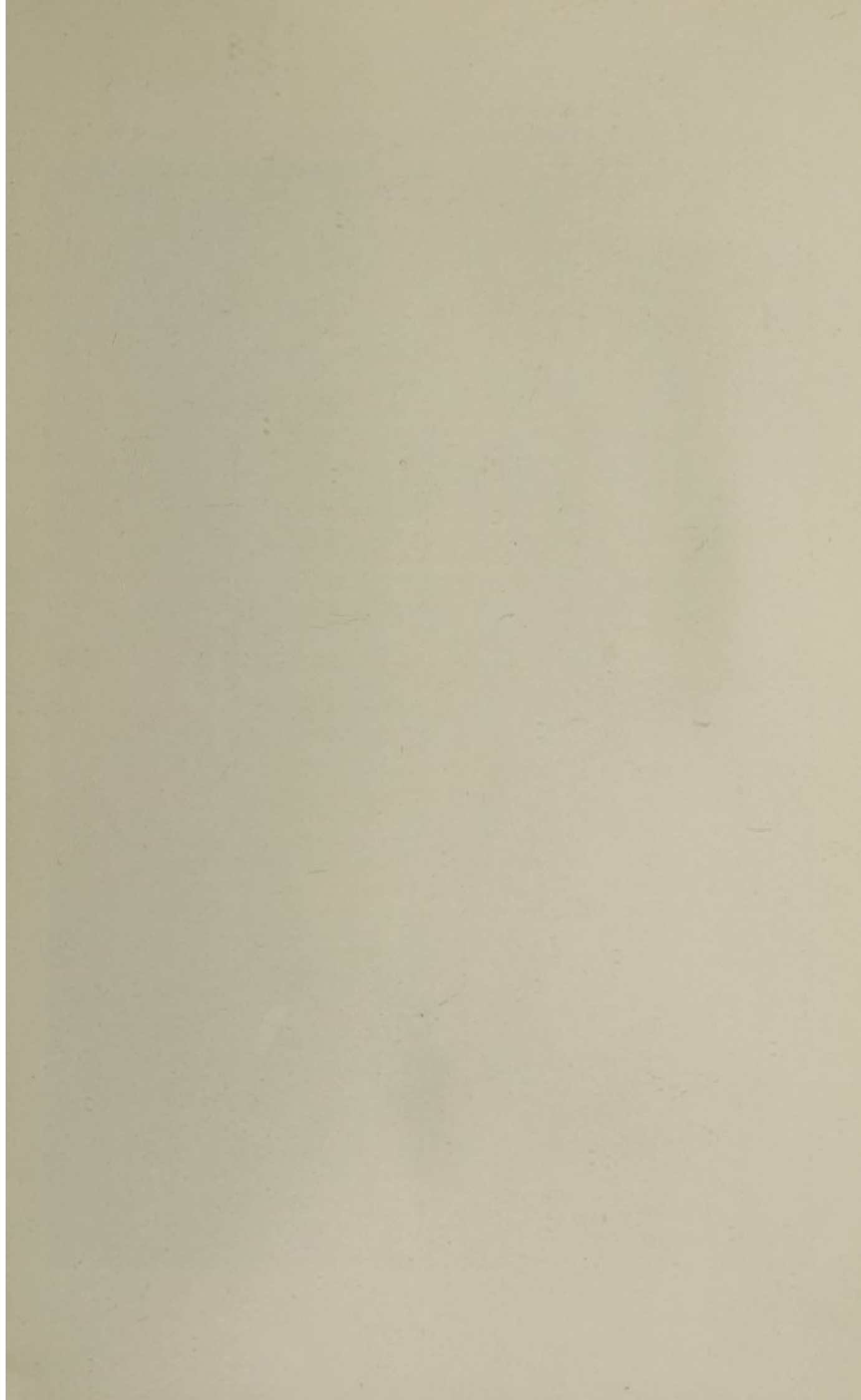
The Ministry of Health requisitioned a proportion of the bed accommodation and relinquished them at the end of October last. The Hospital is therefore once more free to carry on with civilian cases.

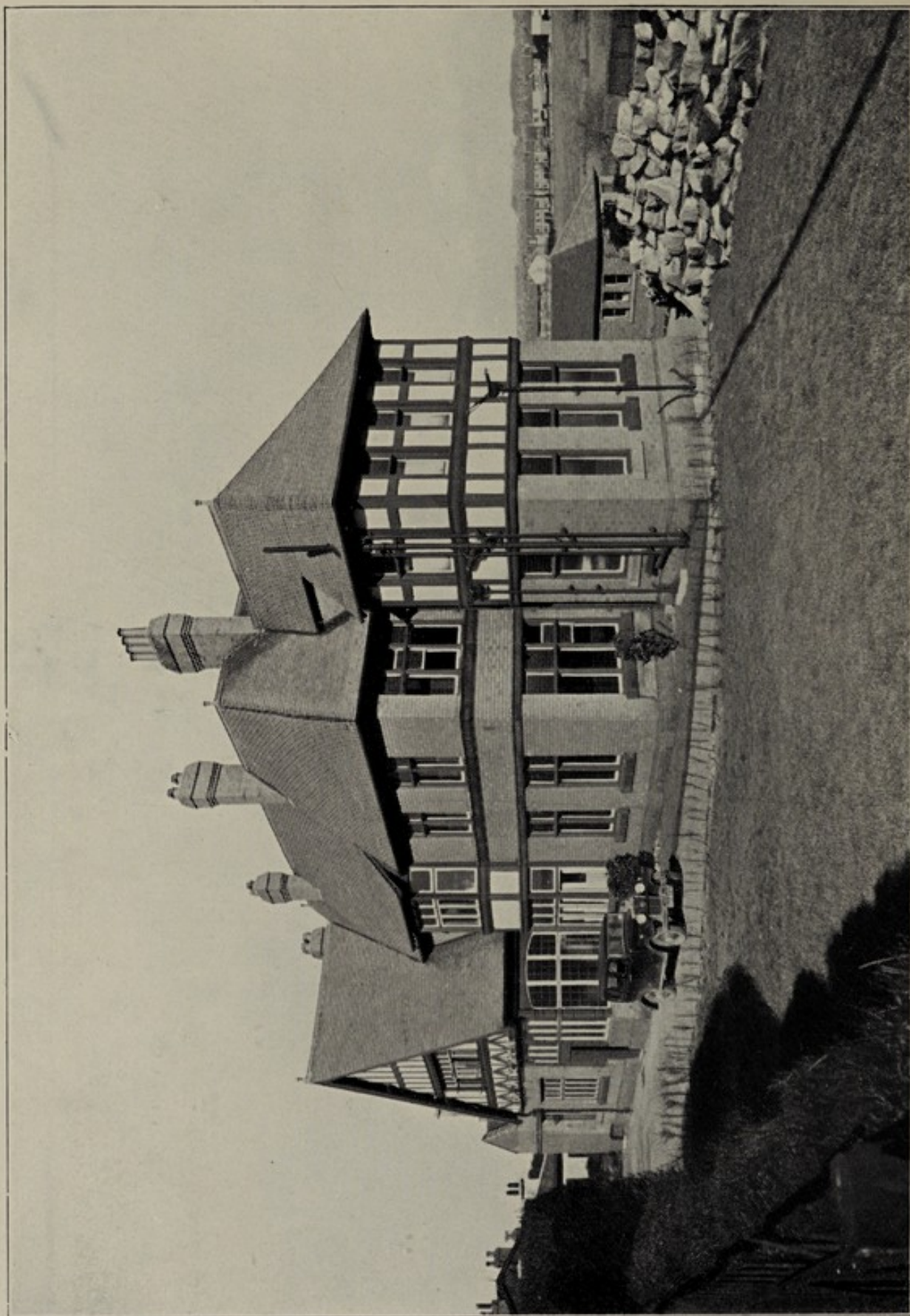
Provisional arrangements were made by the Regional Hospital Officer for a war-time staffing of the Hospital by Medical Officers to come into operation if and when necessary.

Your Committee continue to feel much concern at the consistent decline in the number of subscribers. It is evident that in present conditions increased expenditure in the maintenance of the Hospital will be inevitable, and we again appeal for more widely spread help.

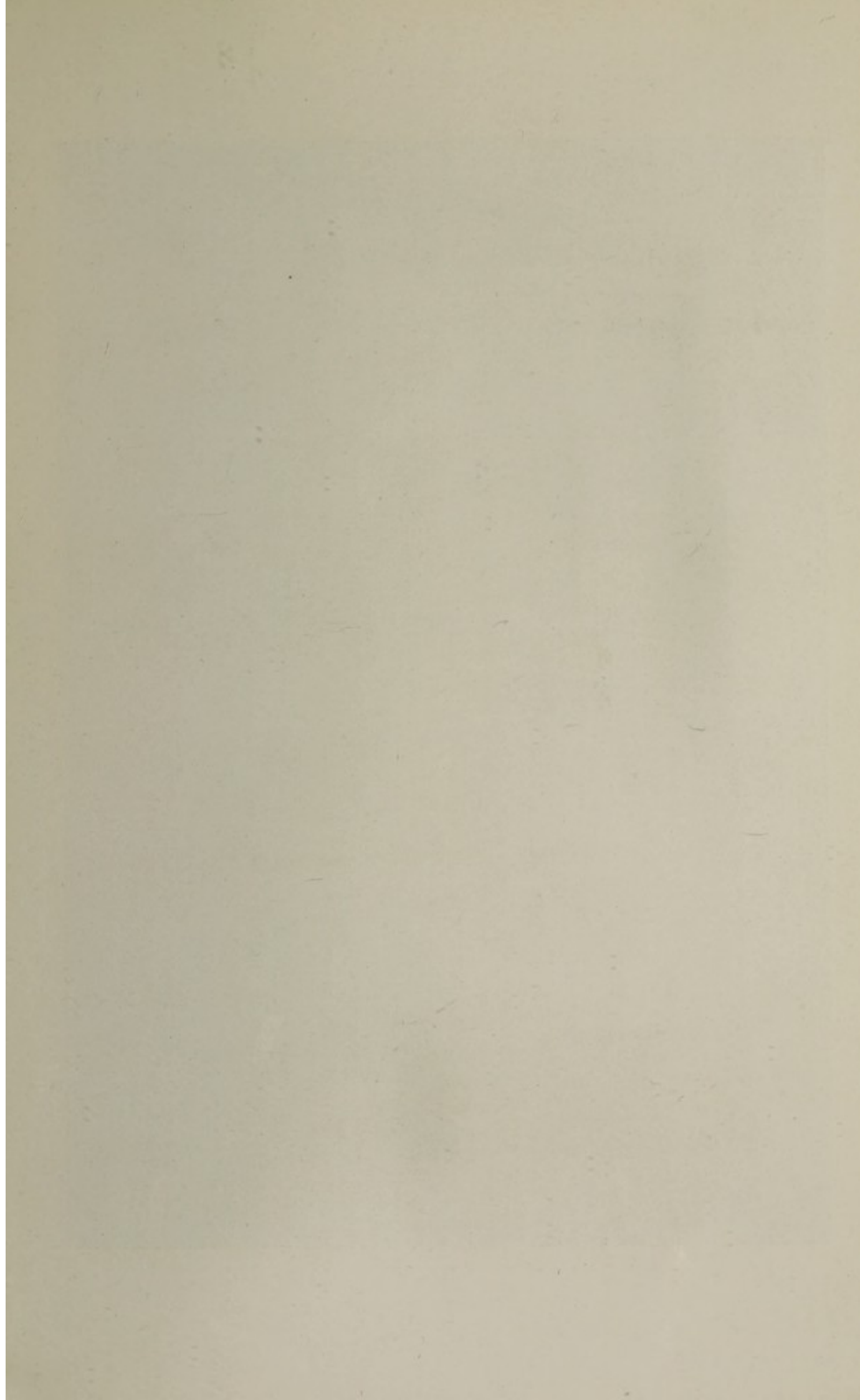

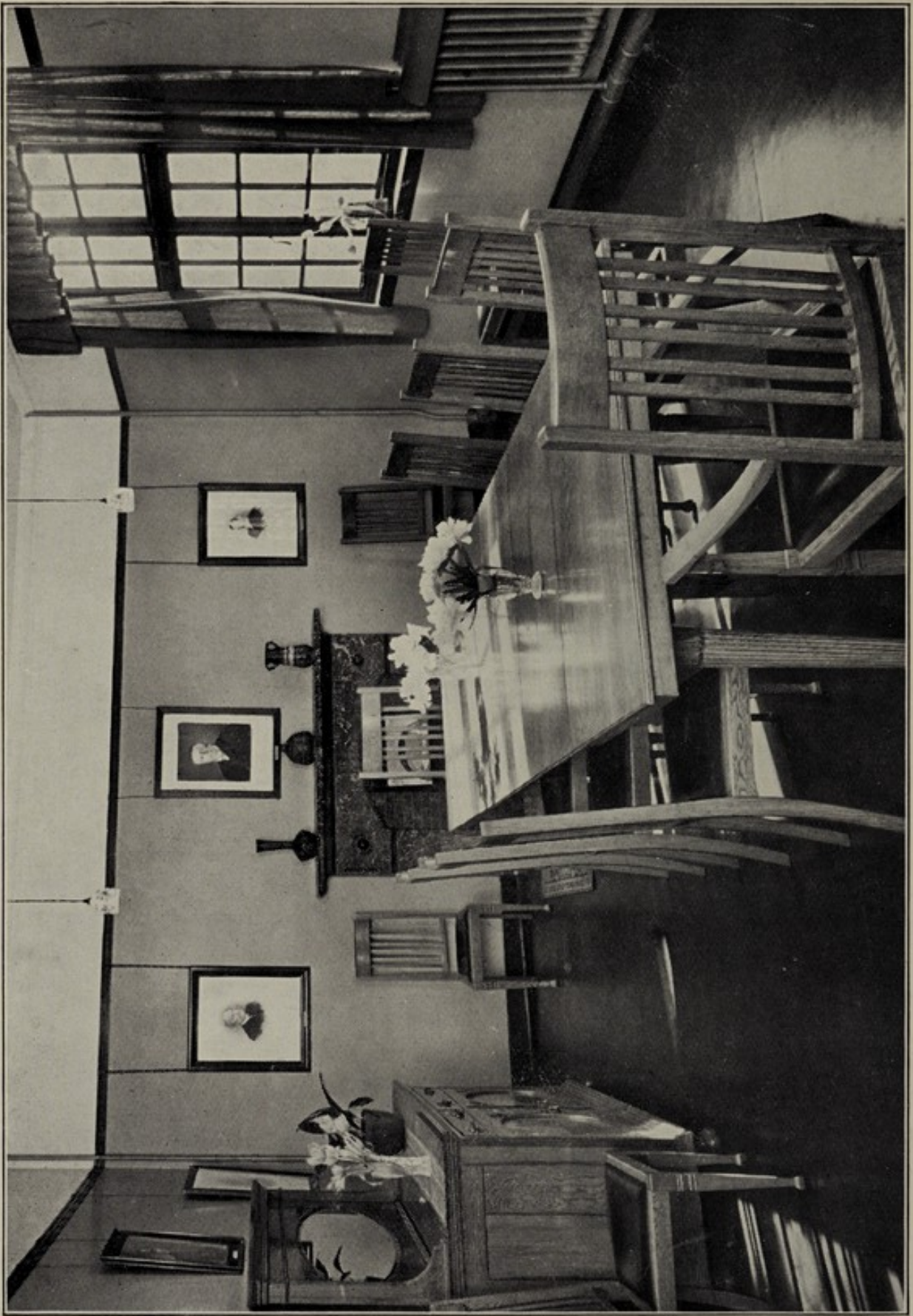

EXCERPTS FROM THE MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION
of the
WALLASEY COTTAGE HOSPITAL.

1. The name of the Company (hereinafter called the "Hospital") is "THE WALLASEY COTTAGE HOSPITAL."
3. (2) To provide, maintain and manage a hospital or hospitals for the reception and relief of the sick and disabled poor and for the treatment of patients suffering from injuries, diseases or ailments whether medical or surgical and any such other accommodation as may seem expedient for the treatment, care and relief of any such patients.
- (3) To carry on the work of a General Hospital or Clinic for the sick and injured.
- (4) To provide, maintain and manage Dispensaries, Infirmaries, Convalescent and Nursing Homes and Out-patients and other Departments in connection with any such hospital as aforesaid.
- (13) To obtain collect and receive money and funds by way of contributions, donations, subscriptions, legacies, grants or any other lawful method and to accept and receive gifts of property of any description (whether subject to any special trusts or not) for or towards the objects of the Hospital or any of them.

EXCERPTS FROM THE ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION
of the
WALLASEY COTTAGE HOSPITAL.

6. Any person who shall contribute not less than one guinea annually to the funds of the Hospital by way of subscription and any person eligible under Article 30 hereof, shall be eligible if willing to become an Annual Member. Any such person whether he shall become a member or not shall have the right to attend at all annual special and general meetings of the Hospital but shall not have the right to vote at such meetings unless he shall become an annual member or is a person nominated as an associated member under Article 30.
7. An Annual Member shall cease to be a member at the end of the year if the annual subscription payable by him for such year and also for the last preceding year shall both be in arrear.
8. Annual subscriptions shall be treated as becoming due in advance on the 1st January in each year.
11. Annual General Meetings shall be held in the month of February in each year at such place as aforesaid.
13. Seven clear days notice at least specifying the day, place and hour of any General Meeting and of the general nature of the business to be transacted shall be sent to every member entitled to receive the same, or given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in Wallasey and in one Liverpool daily newspaper, but the accidental omission or failure to give any such notice to or the non-receipt of any such notice by any of the members shall not invalidate the proceedings at any General Meeting.
21. Proper Minutes shall be kept of all proceedings.
22. The general management of the Hospital from year to year shall be entrusted to a Committee which shall consist of the executive officers mentioned in Article 29 and not more than 21 gentlemen to be composed of annual members whose subscriptions for the previous year shall have been paid. At every Annual General Meeting one-third of the said 21 gentlemen shall retire from office.
25. The Committee shall hold regular meetings at stated intervals at least quarterly and unless otherwise determined by the Hospital in General Meeting the quorum at a Meeting of the Committee shall be three.
27. The Committee may exercise all such powers and do all such acts and things as may be exercised or done by the Hospital and are not by Statute or by these Articles expressly directed or required to be exercised or done by the Hospital in General Meeting subject nevertheless to any statute and to any provisions of these Articles and to such regulations being not inconsistent with such provisions as may be prescribed by the Hospital in General Meeting.
29. (1) The Committee shall annually as soon as convenient after the Annual General Meeting appoint from amongst the members of the Hospital (subject only as hereinafter expressly provided).

Four Honorary Executive Officers, namely :—

- (1) Chairman.
- (2) Vice-Chairman.
- (3) Treasurer.
- (4) Secretary.

who shall respectively remain in office until their successors have been appointed and who shall *ex-officio* be members of all Committees and Sub-Committees.

(2) Sub-Committees may be appointed for special purposes by the Committee. Persons who are not members of the Hospital but who have special technical qualifications may be appointed members of a Sub-Committee provided that not less than two-thirds of the members of any Sub-Committee shall at all times be members of the Hospital.

32. The Committee shall have power to appoint Honorary Medical Officers.

34. The Honorary Medical Staff shall keep a register in which shall be entered the names of patients treated at the Hospital. This register shall be produced at the Committee Meetings and before the Annual Meeting the Medical Officers shall send to the Honorary Secretary a report of the cases which have been under their care during the previous year.

41. The Annual Members shall have the privilege of recommending poor persons as patients; and although the hospital shall be open to all suitable cases, preference in admission shall be given to such recommendations should the number of patients in the wards, or circumstances generally, make a selection necessary.

43. No patients shall be admitted whose circumstances are such as to enable them to pay for their treatment, except upon payment of such weekly sum as may be fixed by the Committee and all patients shall be expected to contribute as they may be able, to the funds of the Hospital. Patients receiving compensation for accidents or any patients receiving money benefits under the National Insurance Acts, 1911, or any subsequent or amending Act, shall make such payments as the Committee may require.

All persons applying for treatment at this Hospital will be required to state whether they are insured persons or not.

Insured persons with small ailments will not be treated at this Hospital, but in cases of accidents which are not serious "First Aid" will be rendered and the Patient thereafter referred for further treatment to his Panel Doctor.

44. No patient shall remain in the Hospital for more than one month without the special permission of the Medical Officers and not more than three months without the permission of the Committee. No woman advanced in pregnancy shall be admitted (except in cases of severe accident or emergency) nor any person of notoriously bad character or suffering from venereal disease nor any person suspected to have an infectious or contagious disease, or lunatic affection, or delirium tremens, nor any cases of advanced phthisis nor any believed to be incurable, or in a dying state (except in cases of severe accident) nor children under 12 months old but this shall not prevent the Hospital receiving cases for which the Minister of Health may desire accommodation and treatment.

47. Assistance shall be afforded at the Hospital to persons suffering from minor casualties, in the department specially provided for Out-patients. A charge to cover the cost of surgical dressings shall be made in all cases where such out-patients are able to pay therefor.

53. The Committee shall cause true and proper accounts to be kept shewing in detail the receipts and expenditure of the Hospital and the whole of its property credits and liabilities.

VISITORS TO PATIENTS.

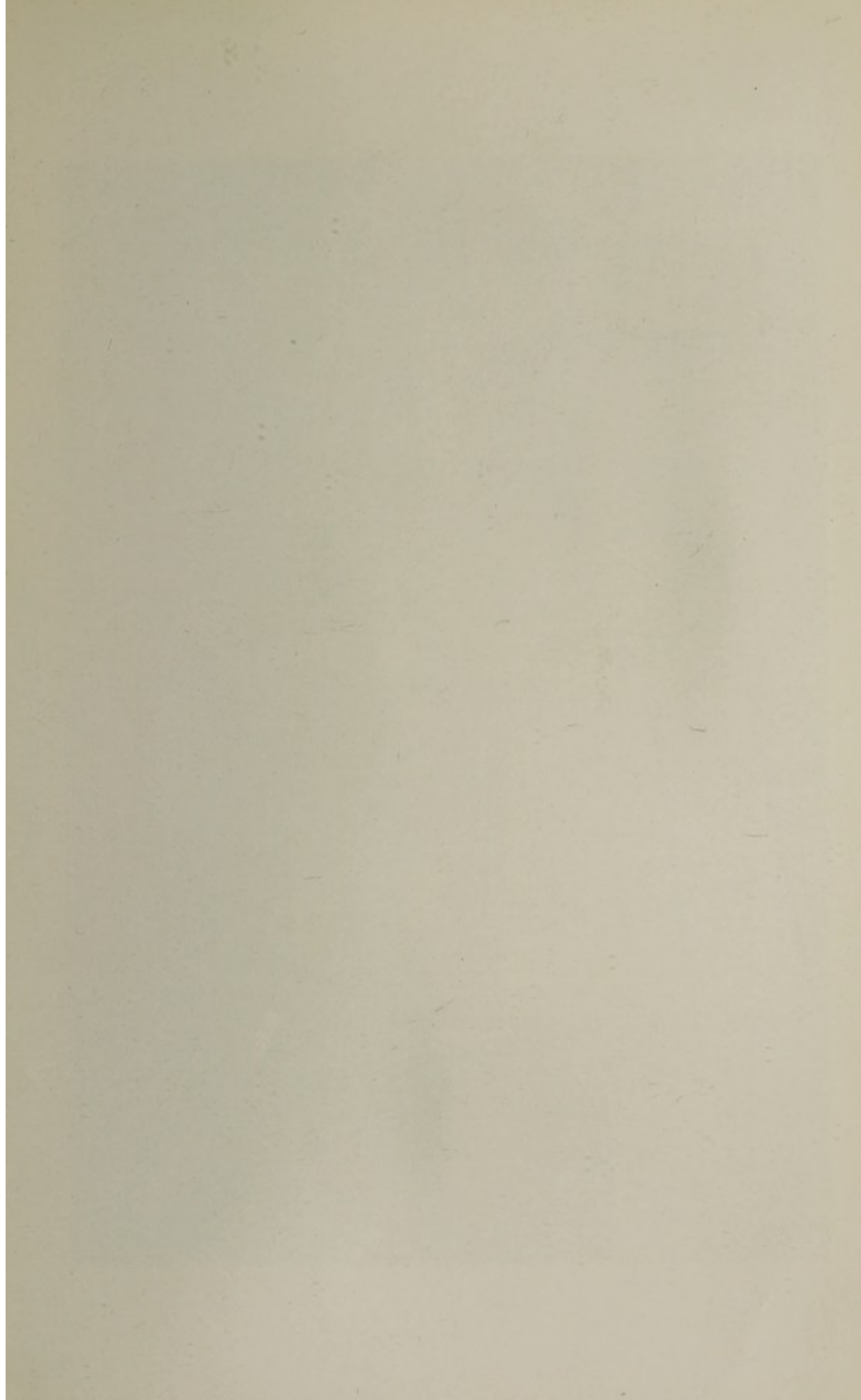
I. Friends of such patients as are in fit condition to receive visitors shall be allowed to visit them on Sundays and Wednesdays, in each week, between the hours of two and four in the afternoon, except that in cases where it is essential that any particular Ward should be kept quiet, the Matron is empowered to refuse admission to such Ward, and in no case shall more than two visitors to each patient be admitted at the same time.

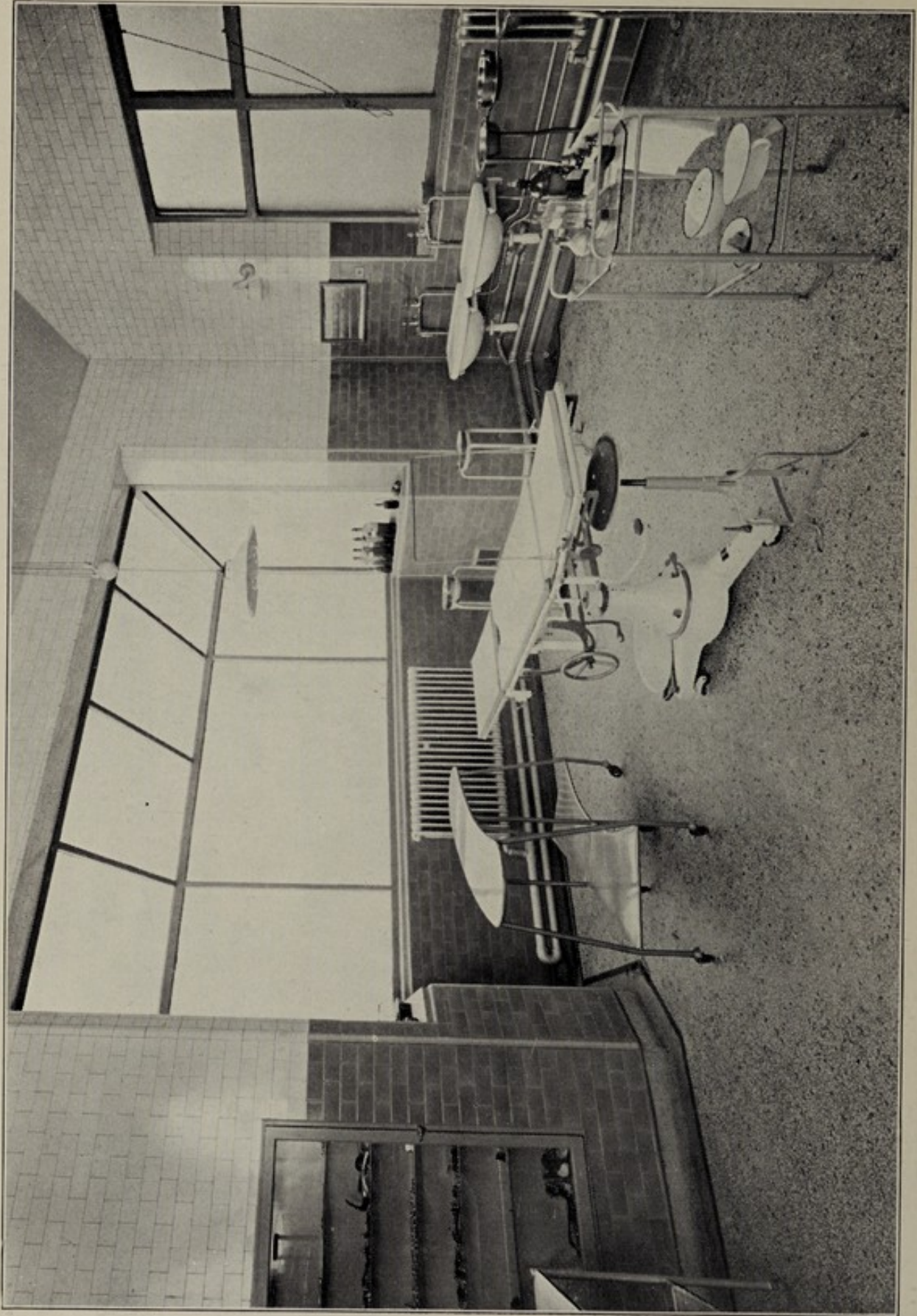
II. Visits to patients outside the hours above-mentioned can only be allowed in cases where special permission has been obtained from one of the Medical Officers and the Matron.

III. Friends of patients are not permitted to remain in the Wards during the visits of the Medical Officers.

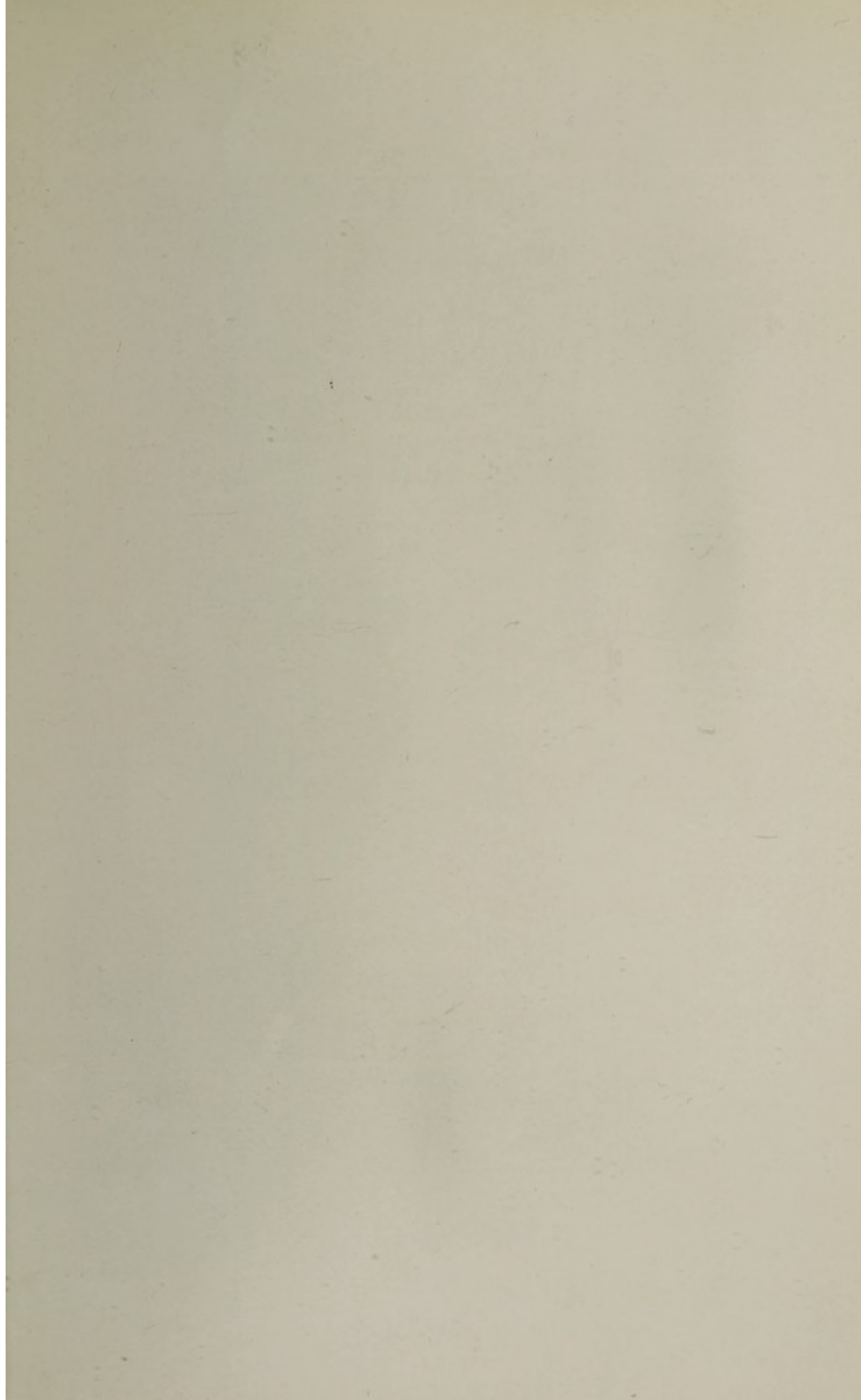

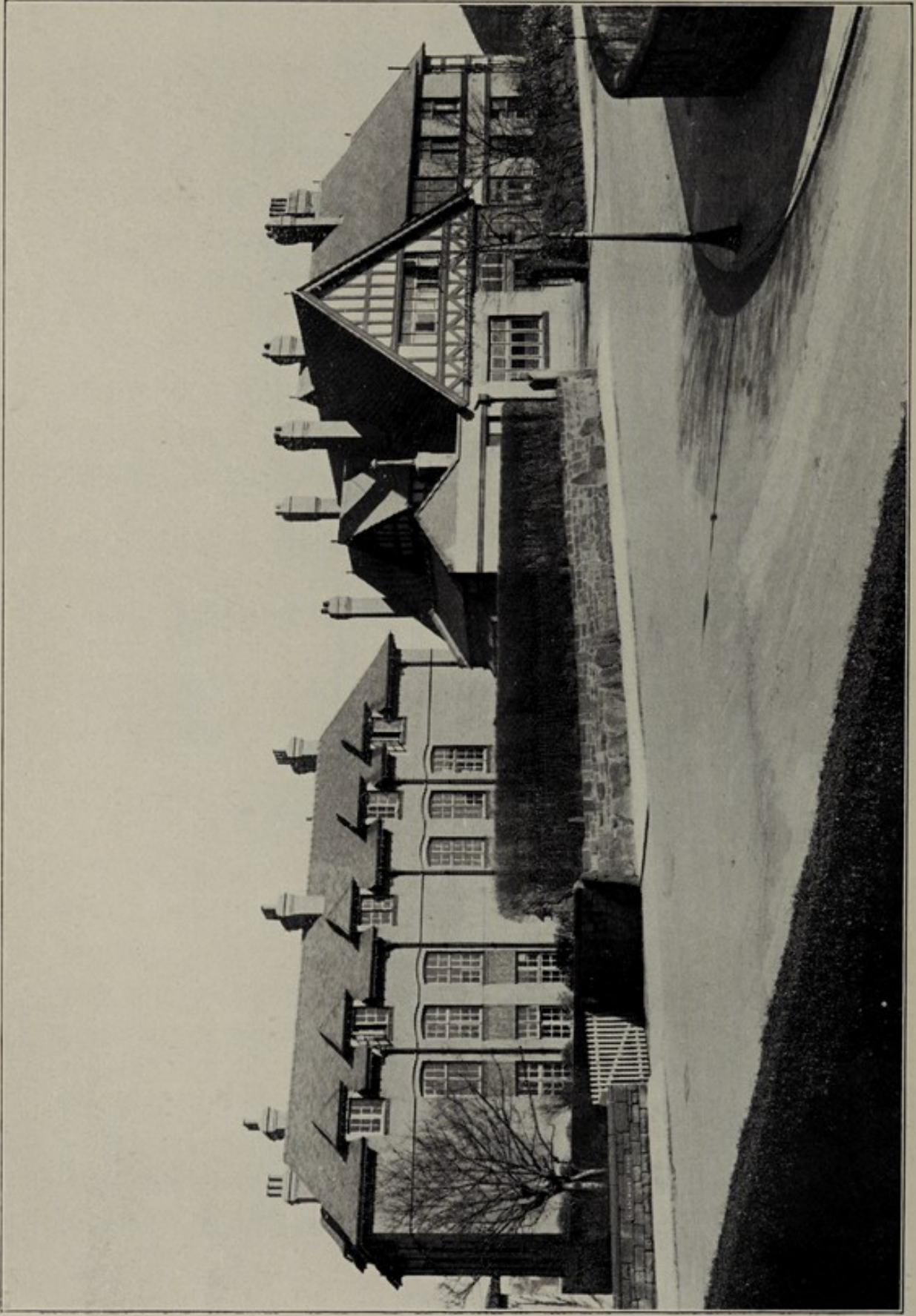

WALLASEY COTTAGE HOSPITAL.

SPEECH OF CHAIRMAN:
MR. ALBERT WHITESIDE.

The past Hospital Year was of a very mixed character owing to the outbreak of war, and it is in consequence difficult to make a comparison with the work done as against 1938 because from the first week in September 1939 practically half the accommodation in the Hospital was held at the disposal of the Government. This meant that only a limited number of civilian cases could be dealt with. All the necessary rearrangements to handle possible war casualties were promptly made, and it is gratifying to be able to report that the Hospital was quickly placed upon a war-time footing. Happily the contemplated influx of war-time casualty cases did not eventuate, and as time went on the tension slackened, and as from the end of October, when the Government release of beds was received, the Hospital soon resumed its ordinary services to the public. We did have a few patients from His Majesty's Forces, who were well cared for.

The Report refers to the steps taken by us to protect promptly the vital parts of the Hospital and to provide shelter against possible enemy Air Raid action for certain of the Hospital staff and patients, but I

would like to put on record our full appreciation of the amazing help and co-operation we received in carrying out these urgent protective measures at a period when the customary labour, transport and other facilities were not available. Transport for sand was a special difficulty, but we were splendidly helped by the Market Gardeners of Wallasey, who placed their motor lorries, etc., at our disposal and thus enabled us to utilise promptly and fully the cheerful services of the school girls and boys who worked at filling sandbags with an energy that was indicative of the British character to get on with the job when faced with danger. It was a time that we will never forget. The trench—120 ft. long by 7 ft. deep—CUT THROUGH ROCK BY MANUAL LABOUR ONLY, is an example of the zeal for work shown by our willing helpers. Let us hope that there may never arise an occasion to put the trench to use.

Turning from the warlike preparations, I want to refer to a more peaceful service to the Hospital and that is the need for more help on the financial side. Our accounts show a serious falling off in donations and collections. Commendable though it is to save money in war-time in order to help our Country, it is vitally and equally important to save life and restore impaired health, and that is the mission of our Hospital and of

all Hospitals to-day ; so we hope the public will not get the impression that Hospitals can run by themselves ! This is not so. We want the goodwill and continued support of the public so that our work may not be hindered. Actually the need for financial aid is more pressing in war-time, as there is every likelihood of the resources of the Hospital being utilised to the utmost extent.

The Ladies Collecting Committee are deserving of our fullest praise for their good work in spite of present-day difficulties, and they will welcome cordially all those who are willing to co-operate with them in collecting additional revenue for the Hospital. THIS WORK IS REAL NATIONAL SERVICE TO THE SICK AND SUFFERING, and I hope that many public-spirited ladies and gentlemen of Wallasey will respond to this call. Come and have a look at the Hospital and learn of the good work that is being done here, and then you will be persuaded to join the ranks of those good citizens and citizenesses who are already helping us.

I should also like to thank the party of kind workers presided over by Mrs. A. Reid Moir, who meet at The Grange, Wallasey, to prepare garments and other useful things required in a hospital, particularly in war-time.

They have sent us a most useful supply and we greatly appreciate their good work.

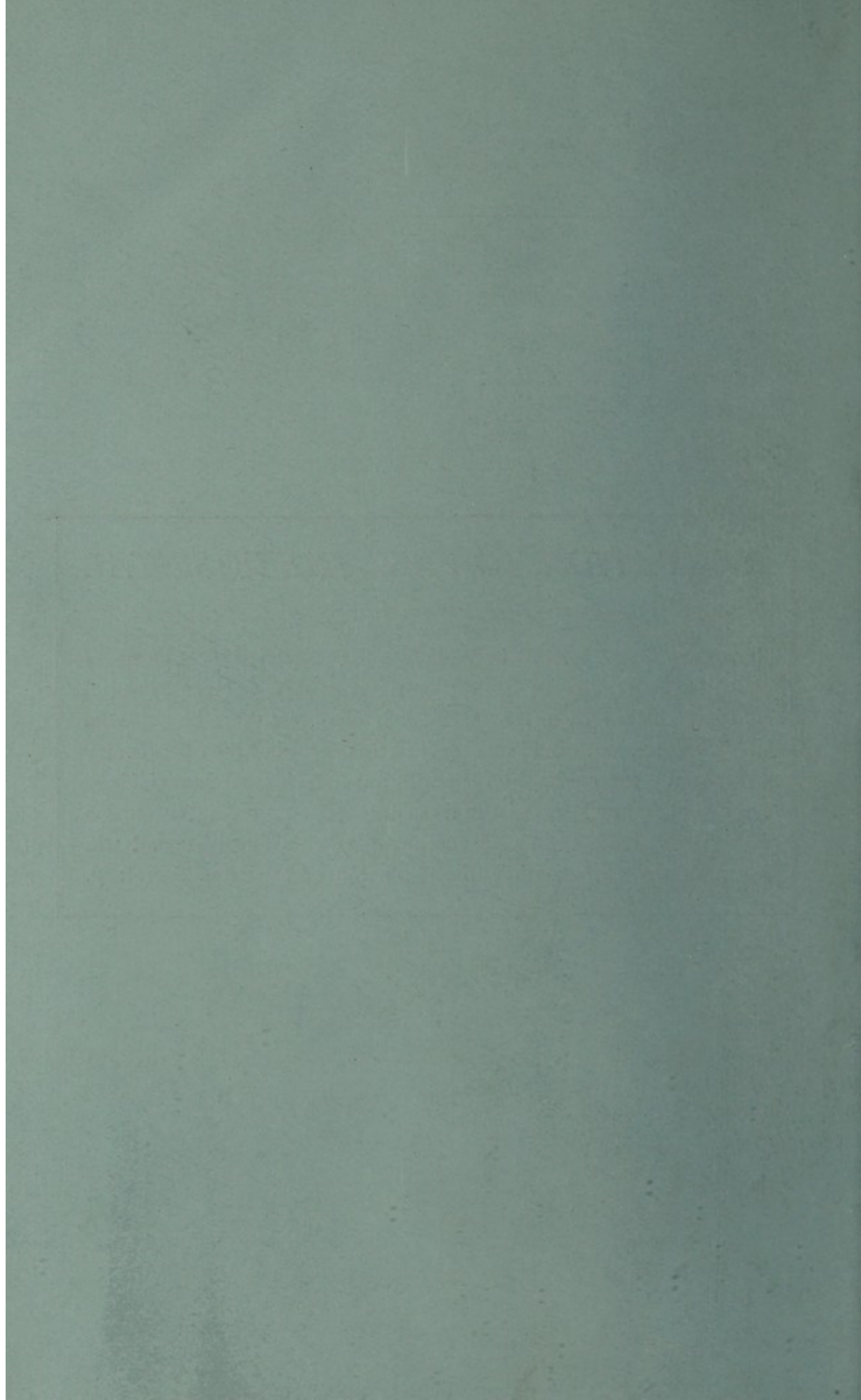
Our Matron was very fortunate in being able to take her holiday in South Africa and get back before the outbreak of war, and we were glad to see her return greatly refreshed by the change. The nursing side of the work in the Hospital was very ably carried on in her absence by Sister Nixon and the nursing staff, and the Committee appreciate their efforts.

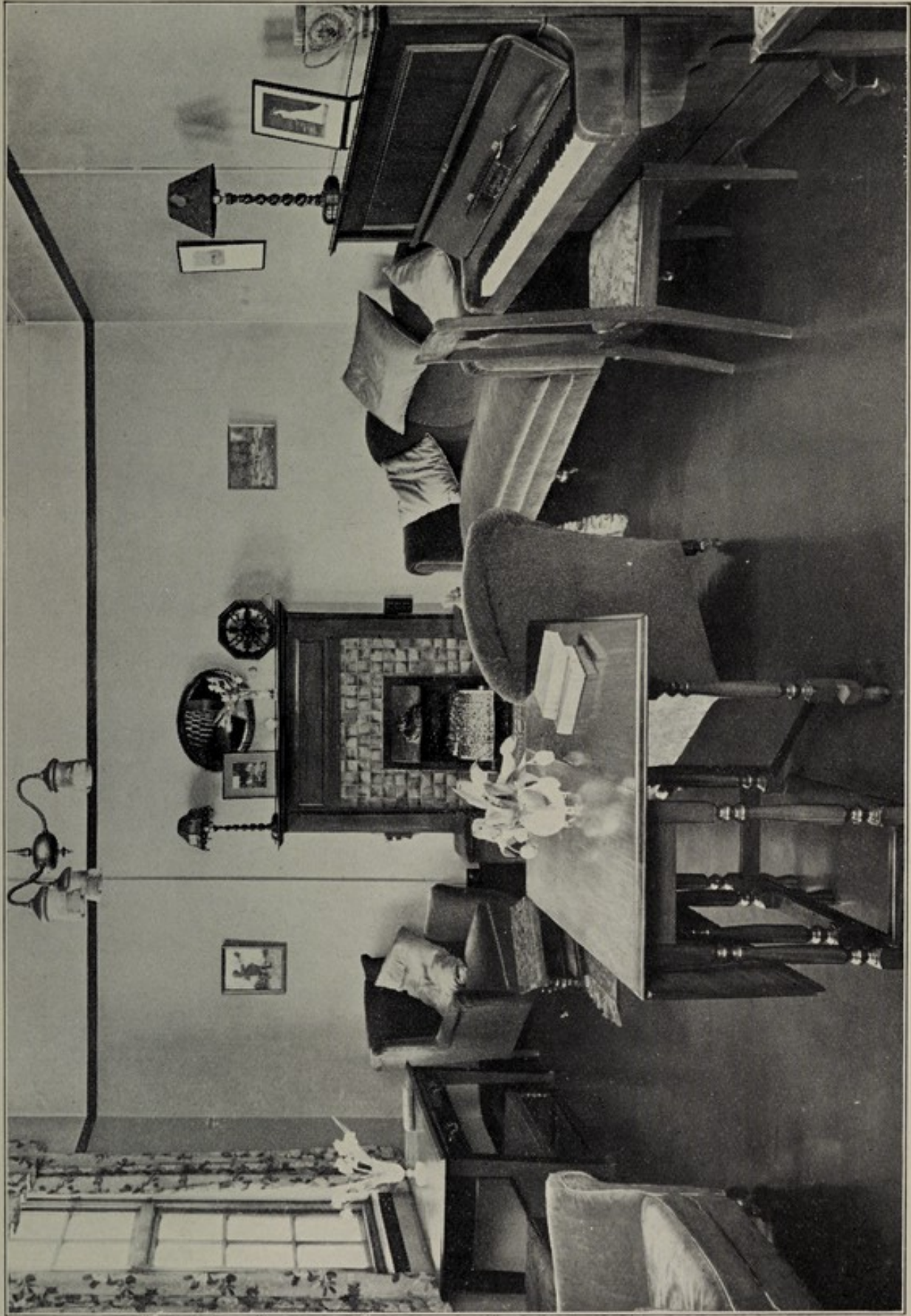

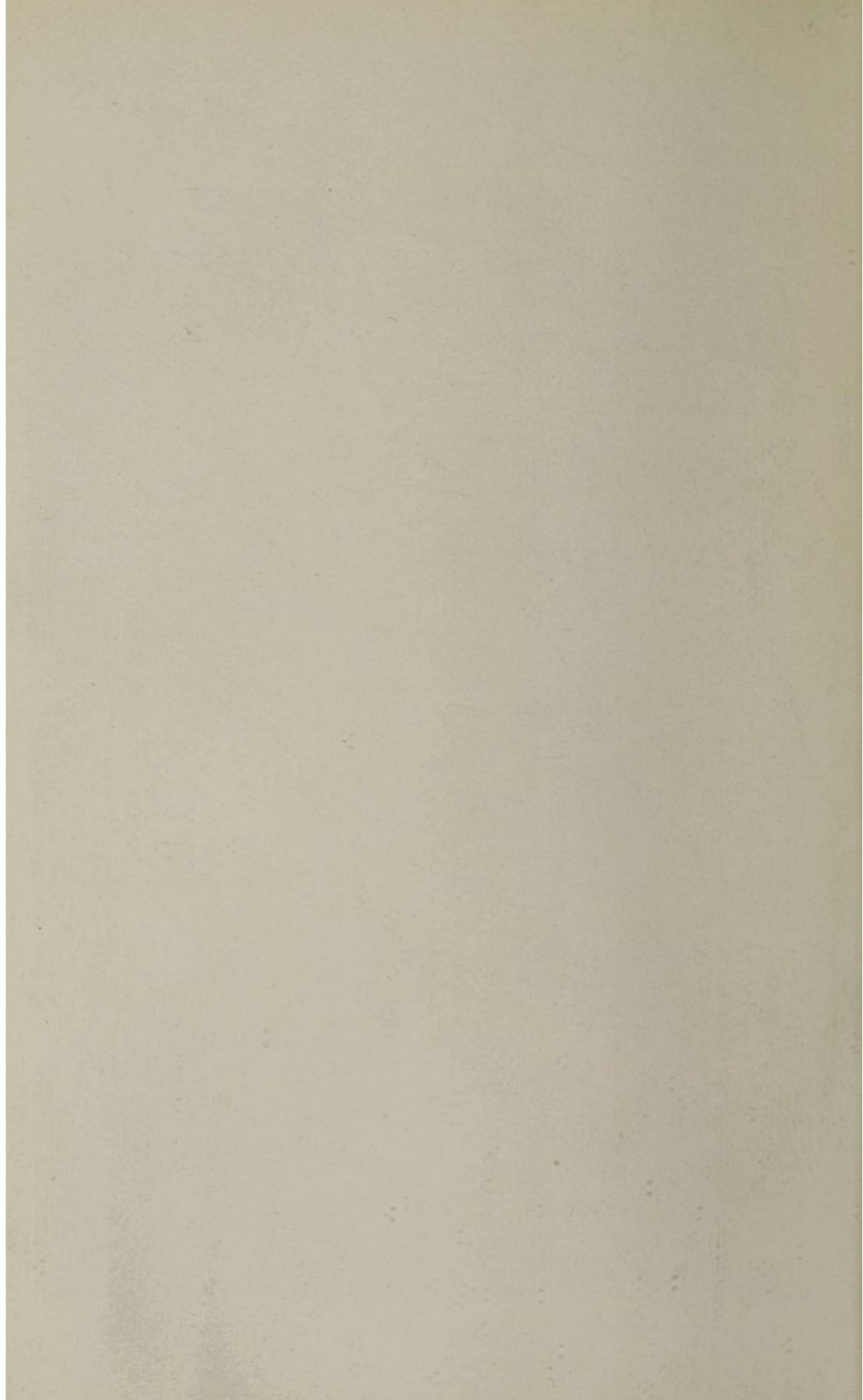
INVITATION TO VIEW THE HOSPITAL
