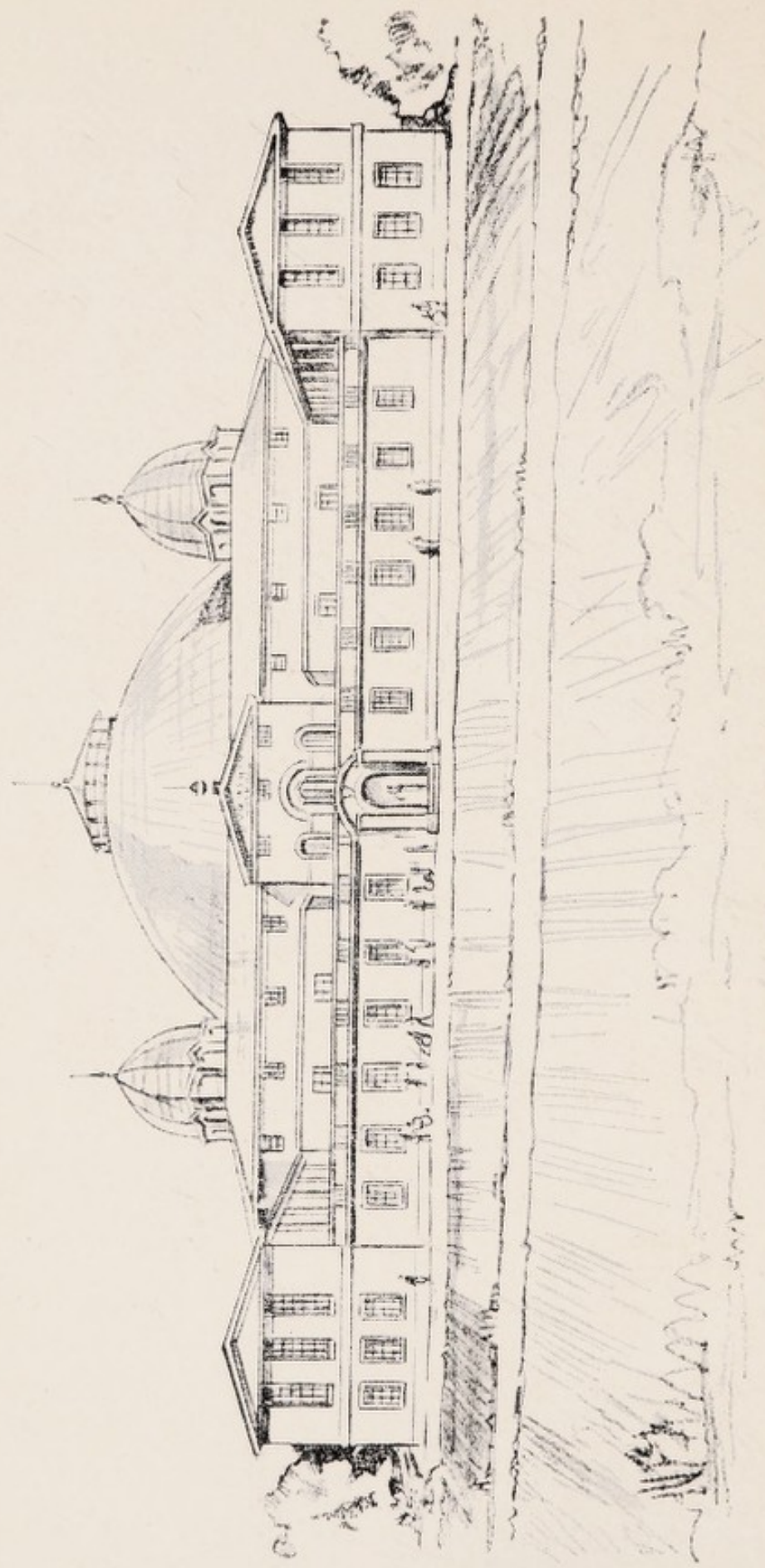

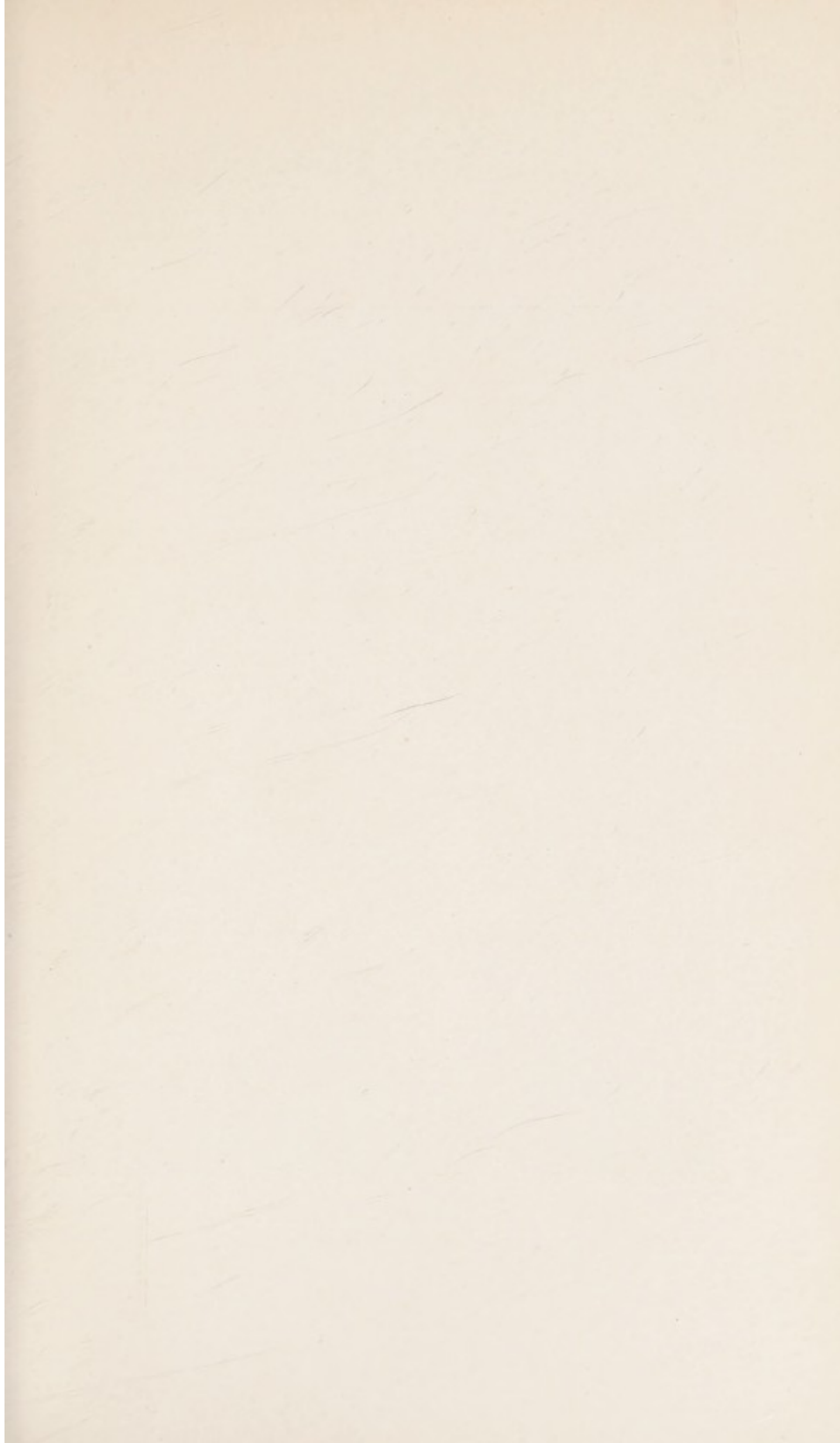

for the Year ended March 31st, 1939.

In presenting the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st March, 1939, the Committee of Management extends to the many subscribers, supporters and friends sincere thanks for their continued interest in the work, so important to the Nation, upon which the Hospital is engaged.

Obituary.

It is with sincere and profound regret that the Committee places on record the death of Mr. Robert Whitehead, who as a member of the Committee of Management since 1908, and as Chairman for many years, took a deep and generous interest in the welfare of the Hospital.

The Hospital has also suffered a serious loss by the death of Dr. Frank Sawdon, who served as a member of the Honorary Medical Staff from 1913 to 1925, and subsequently as an Honorary Consulting Physician.

President.

Lady Turner, the wife of the President for the past year, Sir Samuel Turner, J.P., has graciously consented to accept the Presidency for the year 1939-40.

Management.

The Rev. Canon C. E. Scott-Moncrieff, D.D., R.D., on relinquishing his appointment as the Vicar of Buxton, resigned his seat on the Committee of Management. During the twenty-six years he served on the Committee, and for the same period held the office of Honorary Chaplain, the Rev. Canon Scott-Moncrieff rendered invaluable service to the Hospital and to the patients, in whose welfare he at all times took a deep interest.

His successor, The Rev. G. T. Carlisle, is an ex-officio member of the Committee of Management and has been appointed Honorary Chaplain.

The Committee regrets the resignation of Mrs. W. F. Mill, who during the nine years she served on the Committee of Management, rendered invaluable service at all times.

Mr. Edwin White has been appointed a member of the Committee.

Finance.

An excess of Expenditure over Income amounting to £1,508 8s. 5d. causes the Committee grave concern.

This deficit is less than the previous year (£1,908 8s. 3d.), and although expenditure has decreased by £1,130 18s. 3d. there has unfortunately been a decrease of £658 18s. 5d. in income.

The Committee makes an earnest appeal for additional Annual Income to counteract this deficit, and so avoid the restriction of the activities of the Hospital. Particularly is an appeal made to Subscribers to pay subscriptions under deed of covenant, thereby enabling the Hospital to benefit by the tax recovered without any additional cost to the Subscriber.

Particulars of this Scheme are given on the accompanying leaflet.

The Committee has during the year kept the Revenue Account under constant review and, although reluctant to restrict the privileges of subscribers, considered it to be uneconomic to provide treatment costing almost six pounds for each three weeks when in many cases only a subscriber's recommend, issued in return for a subscription of £1 1s. 0d., is provided.

It was therefore decided that all In-Patients admitted on Subscriber's Recommends should be required to contribute towards the cost of their board in accordance with their means, such contribution to be not less than 1s. per day. Out-Patients are similarly required to contribute not less than 2s. 6d. per week. Special arrangements will be made by the Committee to meet necessitous cases.

A slight amendment of the privileges of Subscribers was made by issuing one In-Patient or two Out-Patient Recommendations for each guinea subscribed up to a maximum of £5 5s. 0d., instead of one In-Patient or three Out-Patient Recommendations as formerly.

The particular attention of Subscribers is earnestly directed to the fact that the average cost of three weeks' treatment for each In-Patient now amounts to £5 16s. 0d., over five times as much as the minimum subscription.

As the Committee would be reluctant to contemplate any material reduction in the privileges accorded to Subscribers it is suggested that all Subscribers sending Patients for treatment will impress on them the necessity for the payment of the Board Fee, and, if possible, supplement their subscriptions by a special donation to counteract this deficiency.

The rates for Casual Subscribers were also amended to make them more commensurate with the cost of Maintenance, and are now as follows:—

Extension Fund.

Although the Appeal has suffered as a result of the unsettled International conditions which have been experienced, the Committee felt justified, in view of the amount received, promised, to the date of the publication of this report, or which can be properly applied, £23,479 10s. 3d. in instructing the Architect to proceed with complete plans, etc., and it is anticipated that the extensions, which are so urgently required, will be commenced in the very near future.

A further £11,520 9s. 9d. is required to complete the total appealed for, viz. £35,000, and all friends and supporters would render a great service by stressing the needs of the Hospital on every possible occasion.

Perhaps nobody appreciates the needs of the Hospital so much as those who have received benefit, and it is encouraging to report that, either by personal donations or efforts with which they have assisted, no less than £675 0s. 3d. has accrued from Patients.

Whilst special mention cannot be made here of all who have contributed to the Extension Appeal, it is felt that the following gifts exceeding £100 which have been received or promised since the inauguration of the Appeal must be recorded:—

Additions and Improvements.

In the last Annual Report attention was called to the necessity of renewing the X-Ray Installation, and perhaps the most important event during the year was the generosity of Lady Turner in

presenting the Hospital with new and up-to-date equipment for this department, upon which accurate diagnosis so largely depends.

After the accommodation was re-arranged and a 4-valve High Tension Unit with Rotating Anode Tube, Potter Bucky Table, and Upright Bucky Stand installed, the Department was officially opened by Lady Turner in January, 1939, at which ceremony Her Grace The Duchess of Devonshire presided.

Since the last Report it has been ascertained that the existing boiler equipment cannot adequately satisfy the demands which will be made upon it when the extensions are completed, and it will be necessary to build a new chimney, in addition to increasing the mechanical equipment, which will involve the Committee in an expenditure of some £1,500 more than was anticipated.

It has been decided that Deep Pools shall be included in the alterations to the Thermal Departments.

Emergency Organisation.

In the event of a National Emergency the Hospital will be called upon to play a very important part in the reception and treatment of civilian casualties from adjacent densely populated areas.

At the request of the Minister of Health a complete scheme of re-organisation has been prepared.

Flag Day.

The thanks of the Committee are due to the many friends of the Hospital, and in particular to Mrs. W. F. Mill, Mrs. Percival Williams and the ladies who assisted with the fruit and flower stall whose generous and willing assistance enabled last year's total to be exceeded, despite the fact that the result could not be augmented by the Clay Pigeon Shoot this year.

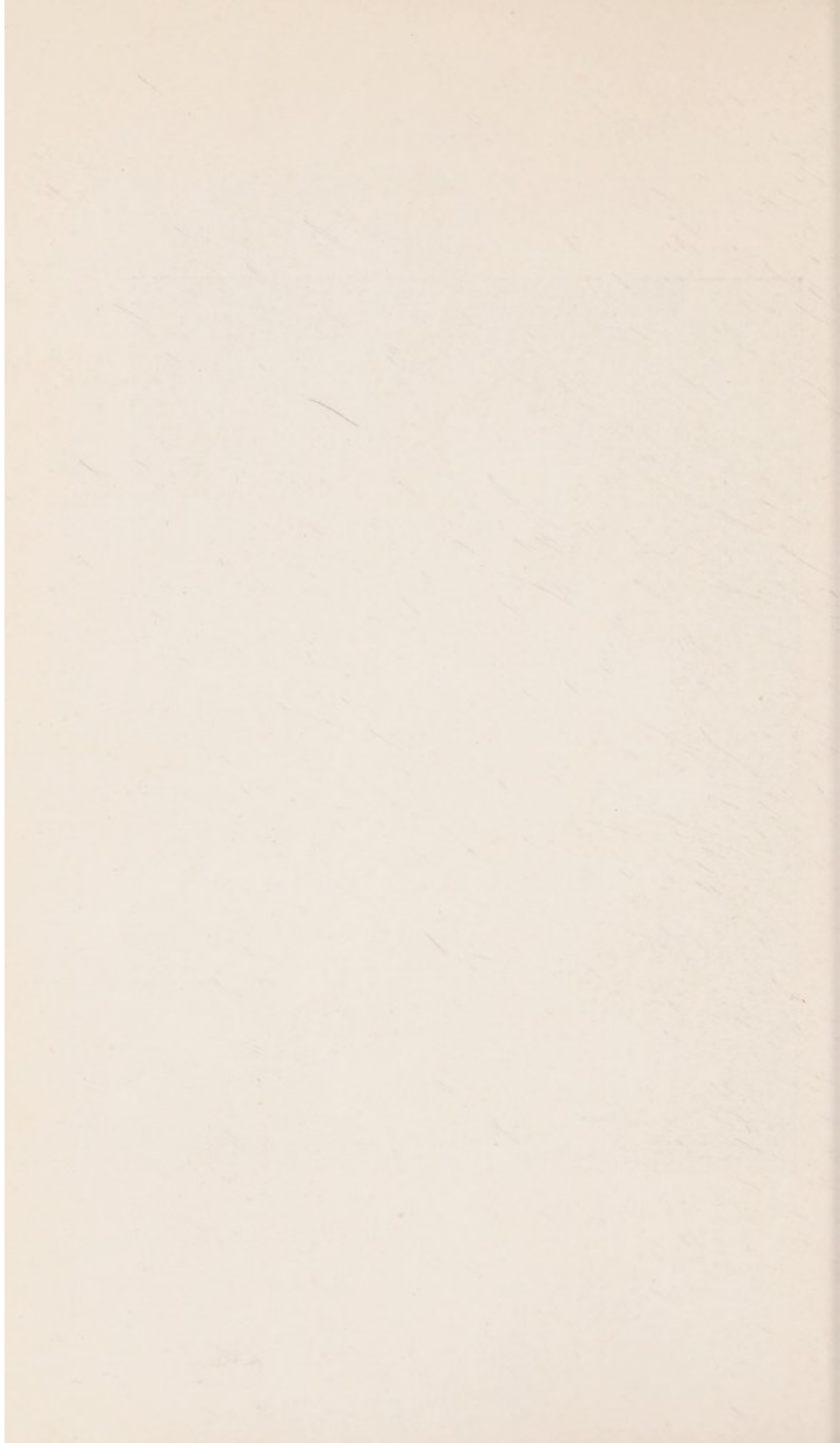

In addition there is a large Department equipped with the most modern apparatus for Orthopædic and Electrical Treatment of stiffened joints, injuries and deformities of many kinds. Physio Therapy has led to the establishment of Institutions for such forms of treatment throughout the country, but the Devonshire Royal Hospital offers facilities in this direction which are unrivalled, combining the use of Mineral Water treatments of proved value with other modern and beneficial methods. The Department includes a Gymnasium fitted for modern Orthopædic treatments; Radiant Heat, Infra-Red and Leucodescent Lamps; Electrical Apparatus for Faradism, Galvanism, Ionisation, Electro, and Vibratory Massage, Schnee Baths, Electric Cautery, Paraffin Wax, etc.; Ultra-violet, Mercury Vapour and Carbon Arc Lamps are also installed.

Department Report.**

The Orthopædic Clinic continues to be held by the Orthopædic Surgeon, Mr. H. O. Clarke, F.R.C.S.

Dr. M. Applebee has attended three times a week to give Pelvic Diathermy Treatments.

Report of the School.

There are at present 15 students in training. During the year six students gained the Conjoint Qualification in Massage and Medical Gymnastics. Eight students gained the qualification in Medical Electricity, and nine in Light and Electro-Therapy.

Lectures on Light and Electro-Therapy have again been given by Dr. H. M. Morris, D.M.R.E. Additional lectures have been given to the Conjoint Students by the Honorary Medical Staff.

Although previously only female students have been trained, it has now been decided that male students may be received.

Research.

An extremely important phase of the work of the Hospital is the increasing amount of original research which is carried out in the specially staffed and equipped laboratories. The estimated cost of this Research being £700 per annum.

The considerable cost of such work is fully justified by the benefits which accrue, not only to the patients in the Hospital, but as the various discoveries are made known by means of scientific publications, to all who are afflicted by rheumatism.

By this means the reputation of the Hospital has become international.

Careful and accurate study is necessary to accurately diagnose the many different types of rheumatic disorder, and the closest collaboration between the Pathological, Bacteriological, Bio-chemical and Radiographic Departments, is most essential.

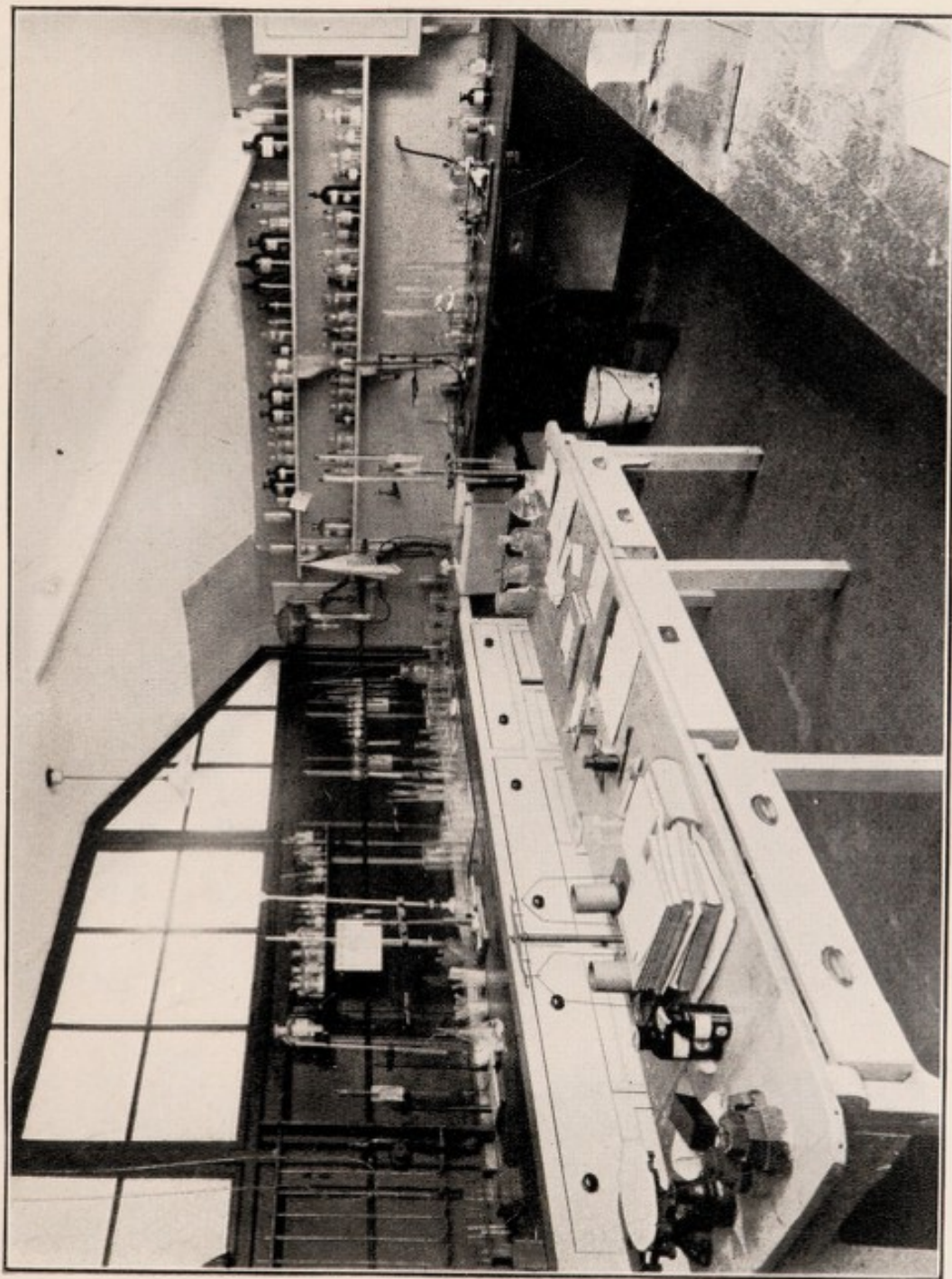

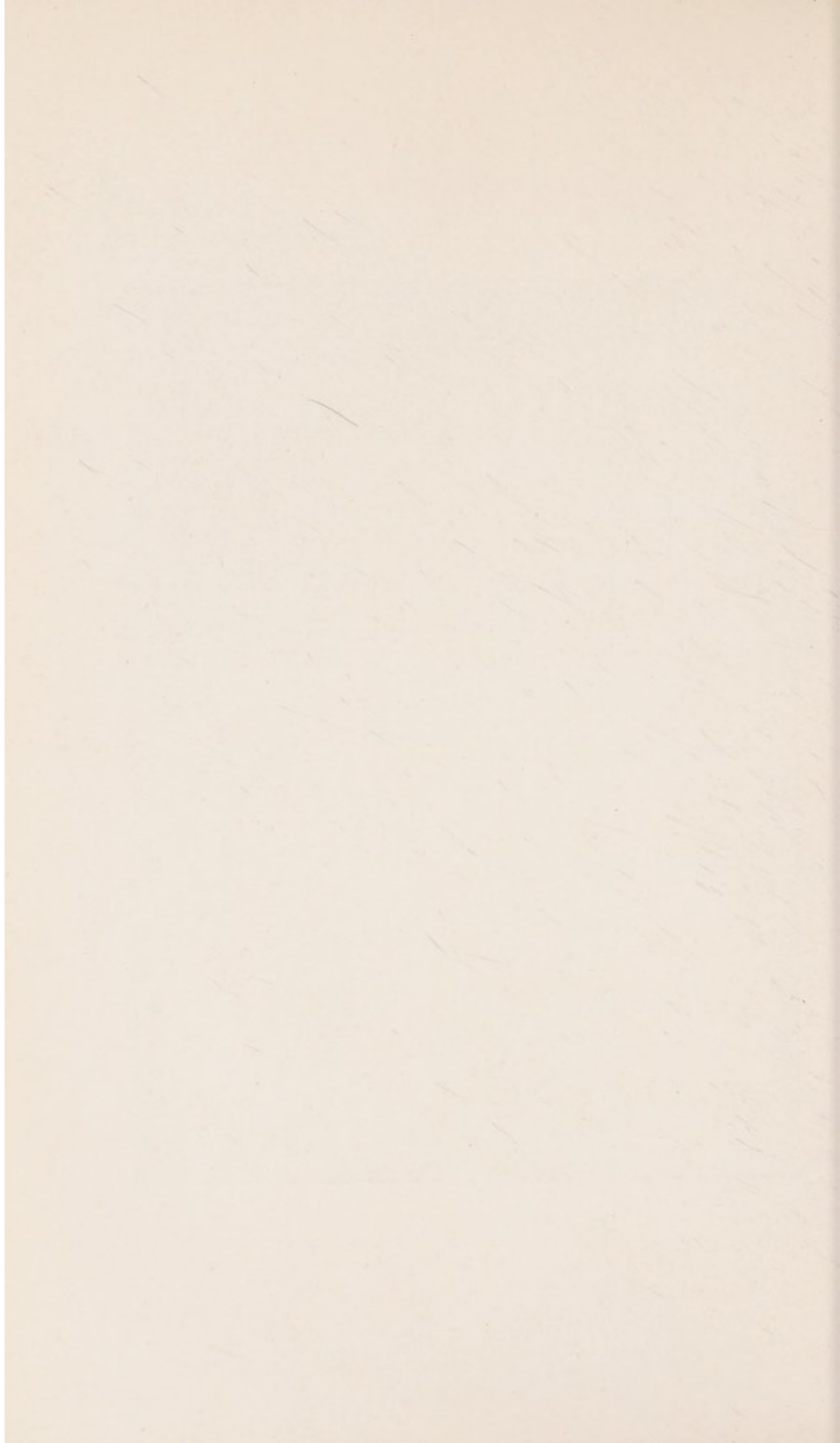

I beg to submit the Report on the work of the Biochemical Department for the year ending March 31st, 1939.

During the year, 3,561 examinations have been made in connection with the routine work of the Hospital and this total is made up as follows:—

This total, as in past years, does not include the numerous examinations made for the Buxton Clinic or those connected with research work; to cover these at least 1,500 should be added to the above total.

During the past year the question of urinary indole excretion, mentioned in the last report, has been further investigated, but staff changes and the pressure of other work have prevented its completion.

The effort to evolve a standardised technique for the determination of the Suspension Stability of blood has again been considered by an Empire Rheumatism Campaign Committee under the Chairmanship of Dr. C. W. Buckley, but without any definite success being achieved. The Spa Laboratory workers have, however, continued their efforts towards a standard process suitable for their particular purposes and have arrived at a unanimous conclusion which will be confirmed at a meeting which it is proposed to hold in Buxton shortly. It is very gratifying to be able to record that the process adopted is, with a very slight modification, the one that has been employed in your laboratories for the past 12 years.

The marked success of sulphonilamide therapy in various infective conditions has necessitated extensive investigations into the determination of this group of substances in blood and urine so that the dosage can be kept under effective control and suitable processes have now been evolved. In connection with this type of therapy the spectro-photometer loaned some years ago by the Halley-Stewart Trust has proved invaluable. This instrument has also been utilised in an investigation as to the accuracy of various methods used for the determination of hæmoglobin in blood.

In conclusion, I would again thank the Chairman and Members of the Medical Committee for their continued support and encouragement, and the General Superintendent and nursing staff for their assistance and co-operation during the year.

AUDITORS' REPORT.

To the Chairman and Committee of the Devonshire Royal Hospital, Buxton.

We have attended each month at the Hospital and have audited the books for the year ending 31st March, 1939.

We have seen that the income has been accounted for, and that the disbursements have been duly authorised and vouched.

We have seen Bankers' Certificates for balances in their hands, and have verified the Securities held on behalf of the Hospital.

The Stocks of Drugs, Provisions, &c., on hand have been properly certified.

The books continue to be well and efficiently kept.

EXTRACTS FROM THE GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS.

TITLE.

1. This Institution shall be known and distinguished by the name of The Devonshire Royal Hospital and Buxton Bath Charity.

PATRONS.

2. The Committee of Management shall select persons distinguished by their rank, contributions or services, to hold the honorary positions of Patron, President, and Vice-Presidents.

TRUSTEES AND PROPERTY.

3. The buildings and grounds of the Hospital and the Hot Baths and other real properties shall be vested in Trustees nominated from the Members of the Committee of Management and duly appointed pursuant to the provisions of the original deeds vesting the same in trustees for the Institution, and the properties shall be held by such trustees upon the trusts declared concerning the same.

4. All deeds and other documents of title relating to the Hospital properties shall be deposited with the Bank under the control of the Trustees.

5. All investments now held in trust for the Institution and all moneys appropriated for investment whether permanent or temporary (unless otherwise provided in the instrument under which the same is acquired) shall be transferred to and invested in the name of Williams Deacon's Bank Limited as Custodian Trustee pursuant to the previous of Section 4 of the Public Trustee Act, 1906. The Committee of Management for the time being shall be the Managing Trustees for the purposes of the said section of the said Act.

6. All property belonging to the Institution is controlled by the Committee of Management. The Committee shall have full power in their absolute discretion to use or apply for the general purposes of the Institution all funds (including invested funds) held for general purposes, and may give such directions as they may think fit to the Custodian Trustee concerning any such funds, and the Custodian Trustees shall not be concerned to see for what purpose money is raised or to the application thereof.

7. A copy of a resolution passed at a meeting of the Committee of Management embodying directions to the Custodian Trustee and certified as a true copy by the Chairman of the Meeting shall be a sufficient mandate and authority to the Custodian Trustee.

8. The Meetings of the Committee of Management shall be deemed to be Meetings of the Managing Trustees, and shall be regulated by the rules hereinafter contained with regard to the Committee of Management so far as is applicable to their duties as trustees.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

9. CONSTITUTION.—The Committee of Management shall consist of 14 members nominated from the Life and Yearly Subscribers, The Vicar of Buxton, ex-officio, 5 of the Honorary Medical Officers, past or present, and 5 of the Governors of the Cotton Districts Convalescent Fund, to be appointed by the Governors of that Fund.

10. VACANCIES.—In the event of any member of the Committee of Management elected from the Life and Yearly Subscribers, or from the Honorary Medical Officers, being absent from six meetings continuously, unless his attendance has been prevented by illness or other sufficient reason accepted by the Committee of Management, he shall vacate his seat, but shall be eligible for re-election. In the event of any vacancy occurring in the Committee by the death, retirement, or non-attendance of any such member, it may be filled by the Committee of Management, notice having previously been given that a vacancy has occurred and that it is intended to nominate candidates. Names of candidates must be publicly announced at an Ordinary Meeting and the election shall take place at the next Ordinary Meeting. Vacancies occurring shall be filled within a period of twelve months.

11. POWERS.—The Committee of Management shall have full power to manage and conduct the Institution. Goods shall not be supplied or service rendered to the Hospital, for fee or reward, directly or indirectly, by any Trustee (except a Custodian Trustee), Member of Committee, official (honorary or paid) or servant, excepting the Honorary Treasurers (being Bankers). Anyone violating this Rule shall, ipso facto, cease to hold his or her appointment, and shall not be eligible for re-election for a period of twelve months.

12. VOTING.—Voting shall be by ballot whenever demanded by any member of the Committee of Management present at any Meeting. In all cases of an equality of votes, the Chairman of the Meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

13. MEETINGS AND QUORUM.—The Committee of Management shall meet on the second Friday of each month, or on such day and at such place and at such hour as they, or in an emergency the Chairman, may appoint, for the transaction of business; five forming a quorum.

14. ANNUAL COMMITTEE MEETING.—The Financial Year shall end on the 31st of March, and the Annual Meeting of the Committee of Management shall be held within the ensuing two months, when a President, Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Treasurer, and Auditors for the year ensuing shall be elected; and also the House Committee and other standing Committees; and their Annual Report, and the Treasurer's Accounts for the past year shall be considered and adopted.

15. ANNUAL MEETING.—An Annual Meeting of the Subscribers shall be held at such time and place as the Committee of Management may appoint when the Annual Report of the Committee of Management and the Treasurer's Accounts with the Auditors' Report for the past year shall be submitted.

16. **PRESIDENT.**—The President (or in his absence the Chairman) shall be ex-officio Chairman of the Annual Meeting of Subscribers, and shall continue in office until the Annual Meeting of the Committee of Management in the following year.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

17. **CONSTITUTION.**—The House Committee shall consist of the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman of the Committee of Management, and nine other members, three of whom shall retire each year, and shall not be eligible for re-appointment for a period of one year.

18. **VACANCIES.**—In the event of any member of the House Committee being absent from six successive meetings, unless his attendance has been prevented by illness or other sufficient reason accepted by the Committee, he shall vacate his seat, but may be re-appointed unless ineligible under Rule 17. Any vacancy occurring in the House Committee may be filled by the Committee of Management at any time without special notice.

19. **MEETINGS AND QUORUM.**—The House Committee shall meet at the Hospital once every month, or oftener if necessary, at such hour as they may appoint, three forming a quorum.

20. **DUTIES.**—They shall examine the books of admission and discharge, and all other books kept by the Officials bearing on the work of the Hospital.

21. They shall investigate any complaints of neglect or misconduct of anyone connected with the Hospital.

22. They shall keep a record of their Meetings in a Minute Book provided for the purpose, and shall report to the Committee of Management.

23. They shall examine and pass all accounts, and shall submit a statement thereof to the monthly Meeting of the Committee of Management.

24. They shall present at the monthly meeting all contracts for the supply of goods required for the use of the Hospital.

25. They shall replace and renew from time to time, as circumstances may require, all such internal fittings and furniture of the Hospital as may urgently require renewal; and make the contracts for these and all other ordinary domestic purposes.

FINANCE COMMITTEE.

26. **CONSTITUTION.**—The Finance Committee shall consist of the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman of the Committee of Management and three other members, one of whom shall retire each year and shall not be eligible for re-appointment for a period of one year.

27. **VACANCIES.**—In the event of any member of the Finance Committee being absent from six meetings continuously, unless his absence has been caused by illness or other sufficient reason accepted by the Committee, he shall vacate his seat, but may be re-appointed unless ineligible under Rule 26.

Any vacancy occurring in the Finance Committee may be filled by the Committee of Management at any time without special notice.

28. MEETINGS AND QUORUM.—The Finance Committee shall meet whenever it may be deemed necessary, at such hour as they may appoint, three forming a quorum.

29. DUTIES.—They shall, under the control of the Committee of Management, be responsible for the management of the finances of the Hospital.

30. From time to time or as occasion may arise they shall carefully review the investments of the Hospital and report to the Committee of Management any action they may deem advisable.

31. They shall exercise a close supervision over the financial affairs of the Hospital, report to the Committee of Management upon matters of financial policy generally, and prescribe methods of procuring funds for the Hospital.

32. All matters referred to them shall be carefully considered and the result of their findings reported to the Committee of Management.

BUILDING COMMITTEE.

33. CONSTITUTION.—The Building Committee shall consist of the Chairman and the Vice-Chairman of the Committee of Management and not less than three other members with power to co-opt for specific purposes.

34. They shall be responsible for the conservation of the building and care of equipment, and shall superintend all alterations or improvements which have been sanctioned by the Committee of Management. They shall also be responsible for the care and maintenance of the grounds, and shall report to the Committee of Management as occasion arises.

OTHER COMMITTEES.

35. Such other Committees as may from time to time be appointed shall be responsible for considering any matters referred to them and submitting to the Committee of Management any recommendations they may have to make.

HOUSE VISITORS.

36. Each month the Committee of Management shall appoint one of its members and three subscribers or supporters of the Hospital to act as House Visitors during the succeeding month.

37. Visitors are desired to visit the Hospital and all its Departments during their tour of duty, as frequently as possible at such times as may be convenient to them, when an official of the Hospital will be placed at their disposal.

38. House Visitors are desired to:—

- (a) Be present and inspect the serving of at least one of the Patients' meals each week.
- (b) Satisfy themselves that the Hospital is being maintained in cleanliness, efficiency and economy, with particular regard to the comfort and welfare of the Patients.

- (c) Enter any observations or suggestions they may have to make in a book provided for that purpose, which shall be laid before the succeeding meeting of the House Committee.

MEDICAL BOARD.

39. The Honorary Consulting Physicians, the Honorary Physicians, the Honorary Assistant Physicians, and other Honorary Medical Officers shall constitute a Medical Board, and three members shall be a quorum. They shall meet on the first Friday of each month or on such other date as they may appoint, and shall carefully consider routine matters coming within their special province, such as all requisitions for instruments and drugs, the acceptance or refusal of applications from Patients who do not appear suitable, the retention or discharge of Patients who have been in the Hospital more than nine weeks, the efficiency of paid officers attached to the medical side of the Hospital. They shall submit a full report of their meetings to the Committee of Management.

PRIVILEGES OF SUBSCRIBERS.

40. (A) A Life Subscription of Twenty Guineas shall entitle a Subscriber to recommend one In and two Out-Patients annually. Forms of recommendation will be sent to Life Subscribers by the General Superintendent and Secretary on application.

- (B) Annual Subscribers shall be entitled to recommend one In-Patient or two Out-Patients for each Guinea Annually subscribed, but no such Subscriber shall send a Patient until he has been a Subscriber for at least three months, unless the difference between an Annual and a Casual Subscription be also paid; nor until his Subscription for the current year is paid; nor shall he be entitled to recommend more than five In-Patients under this Rule in any one year.

An increased Annual Subscription shall be treated as a new Subscription, and the Recommendation issued thereon cannot be used till three months after payment.

All Subscriptions shall be considered as due in advance on the 1st March in each year.

The Recommendations of Life and Annual Subscribers are available only during the year for which they are issued.

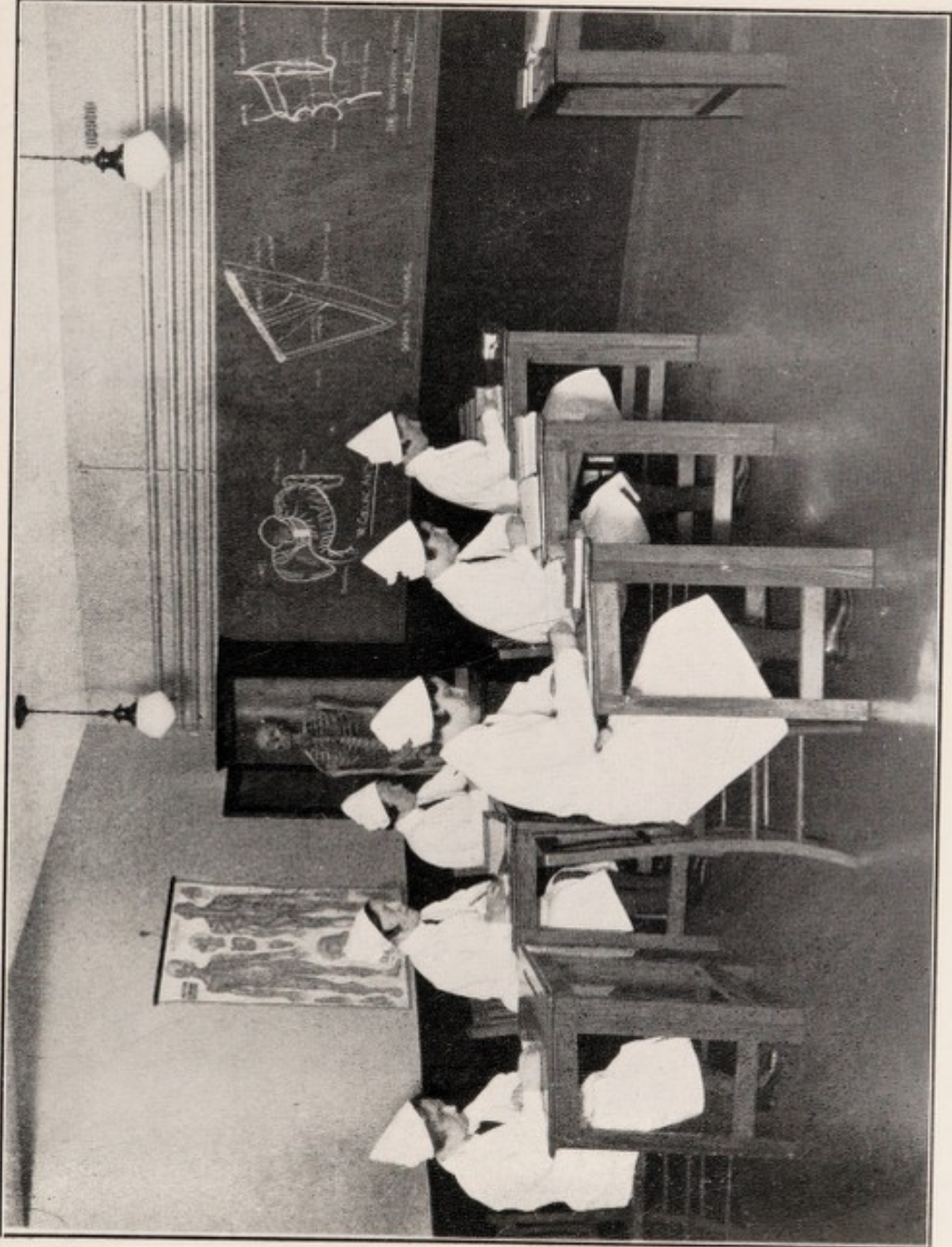
- (C) Patients who are members of a Contributory Scheme offering free Hospital treatment to its members, may not be admitted under an Annual Subscriber's Recommend unless the balance of the cost of maintenance, as shown in the Annual Report for the preceding year, is paid by the Scheme to which they contribute, or such proportion of the balance as may in special circumstances be approved by the Committee of Management.

- (D) Persons not being Annual or Life Subscribers may recommend Patients on payment of Casual Subscriptions as follows:—

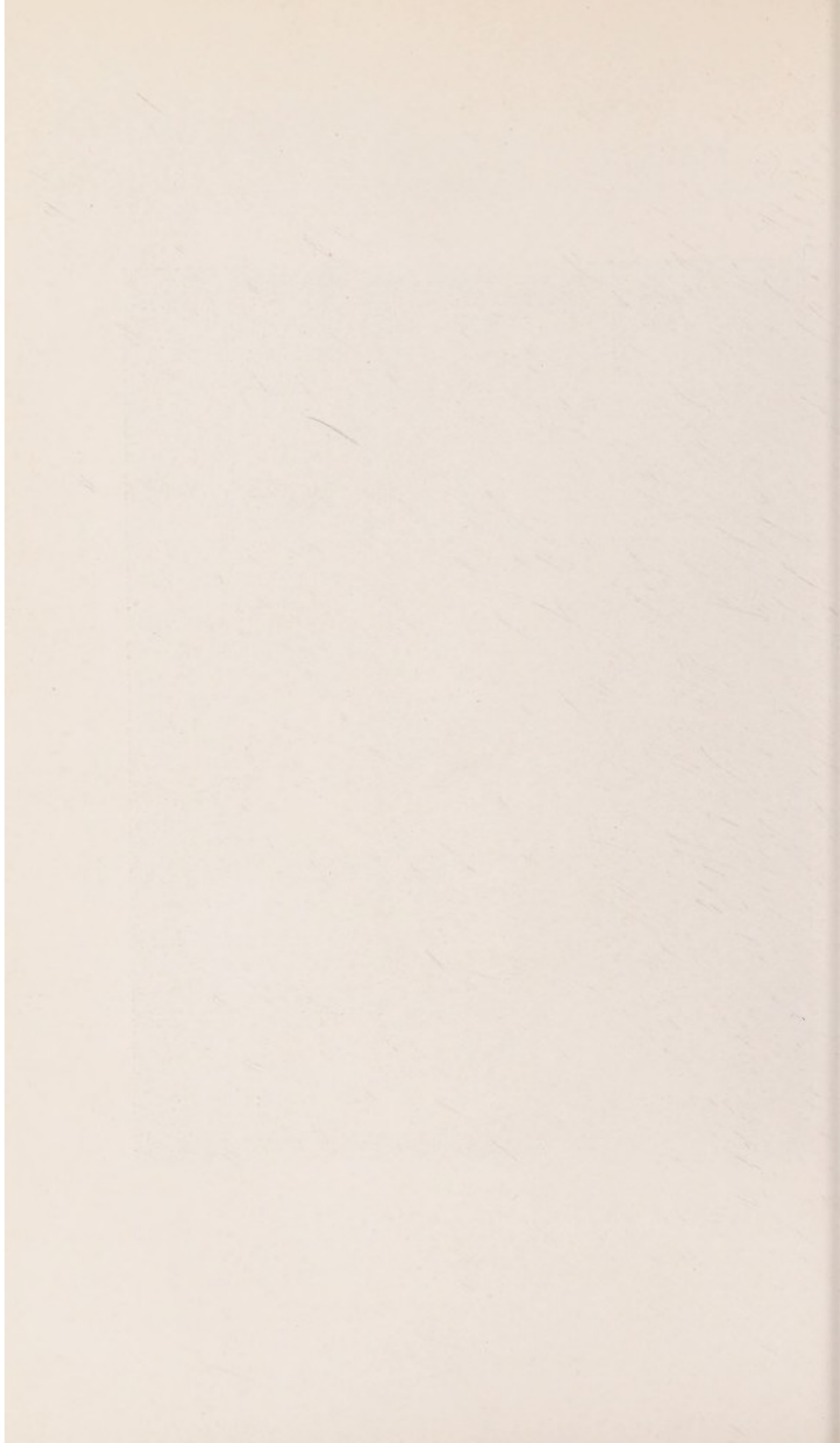

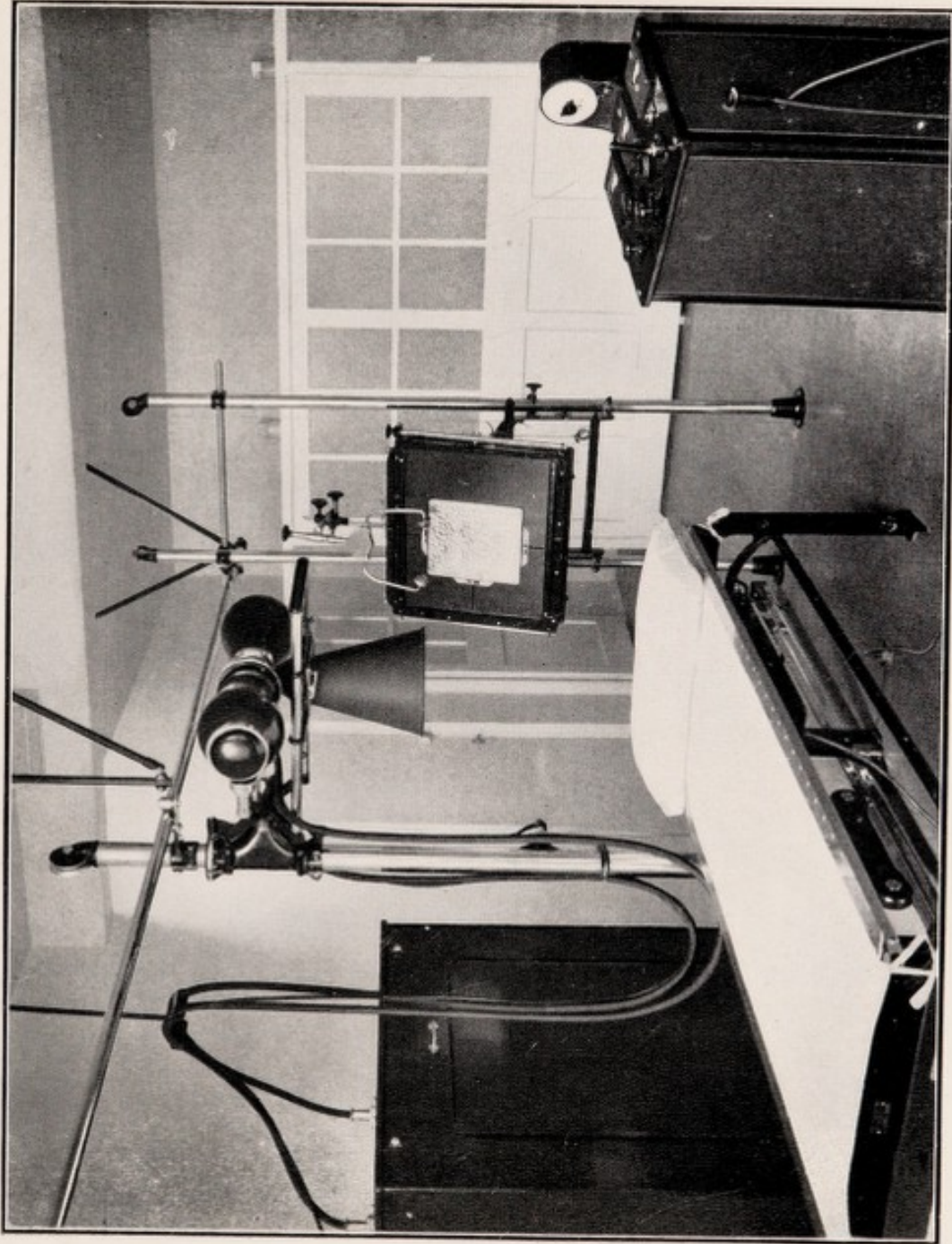

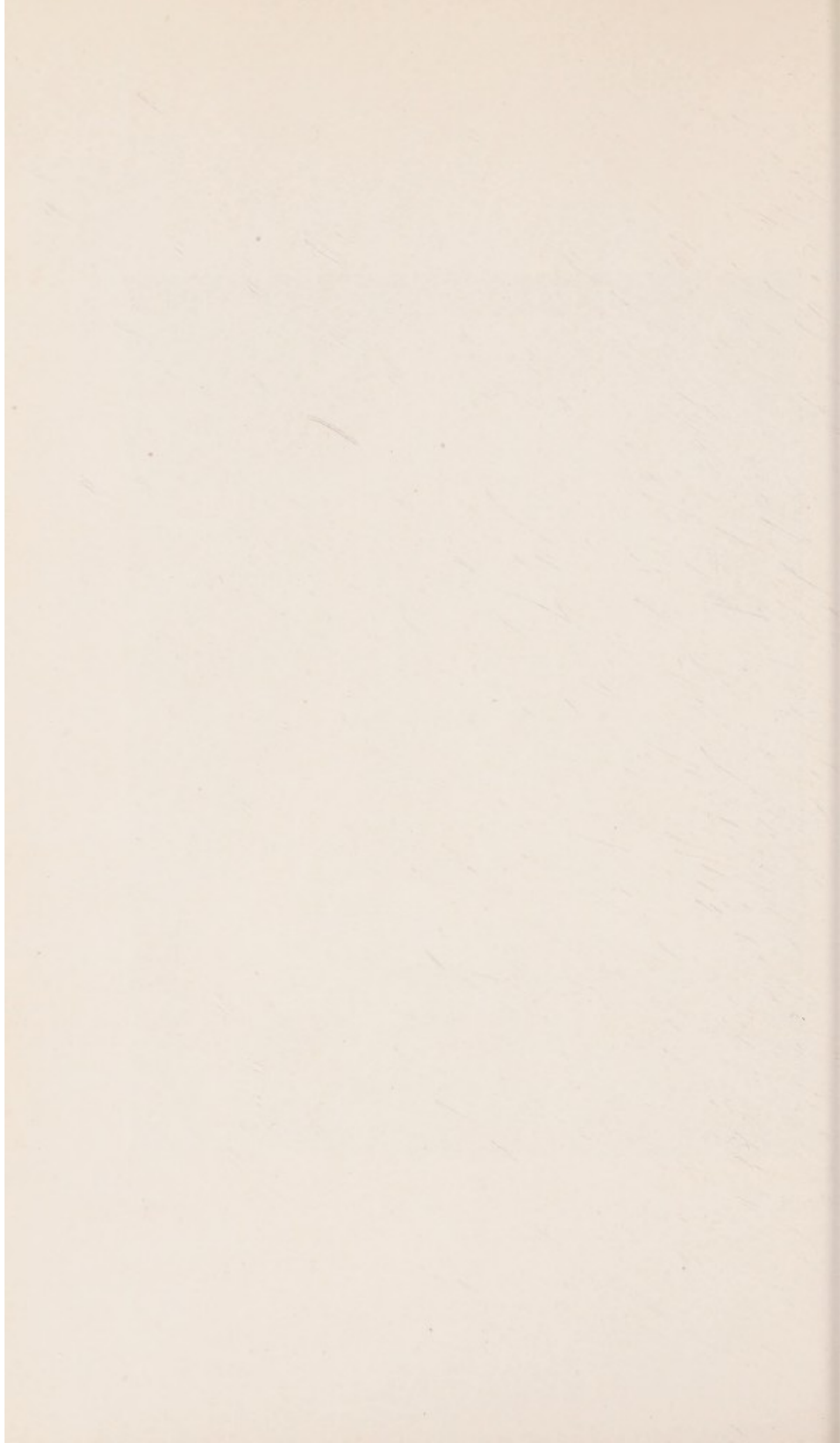


CLASS ROOM—MASSAGE SCHOOL.

- (E) Any Clergyman or Minister kindly preaching a Sermon or Sermons, on any one day in aid of the Funds of the Hospital, and contributing therefrom not less than £4 4s. shall be entitled to one In or eight Out-Patients' recommendations.
- (F) Proprietors of Hotels, Hydros, Boarding or Lodging-houses, who shall obtain from visitors donations amounting to £4 4s. or upwards during the year, shall be entitled to one In or four Out-Patients' recommendations.

NOTE.—Recommendations issued under Clauses (E) and (F) are limited to five In or 20 Out-Patients respectively.

- (G) Patients only are admissible whose diseases are capable of being benefitted by the Buxton Waters, viz. :—Rheumatism, Sub-acute and Chronic, Gout, Sciatica and Neuritis in all their forms, Fibrositis, Rheumatoid Arthritis and Osteo-Arthritis, Spondylitis, and crippling conditions arising from these diseases or from strains, fractures, or other causes. Cases of Tubercular origin will not be accepted nor shall Patients suffering from any Incurable Disorder or from Tuberculosis or advanced Heart Disease—Women more than six months advanced in Pregnancy—persons afflicted with Fits, Cutaneous Disease, Ulcers, Itch, or Insanity—or infested with Vermin—be admitted as In-Patients, or, if inadvertently admitted, shall not be allowed to remain.
- (H) Recommendations are available for treatment only, and may not be used to secure special examination or investigation.

AUDITORS.

70. The Auditors, not being members of the Committee of Management, shall examine all the books, vouchers, and accounts of the Institution monthly before being presented to the Committee of Management; and at the end of the financial year, in the like manner, they shall examine the Annual Statement of the Accounts. On being satisfied as to their correctness, the Auditors shall sign the Monthly Cash Statement and the Annual Statements.

BYE-LAWS.

73. The Committee of Management may from time to time make such Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to these Rules, for the conduct of the Institution, as they may think desirable.

ALTERATION OF RULES.

74. The power of making and repealing rules for the government of the Institution shall be vested in the Committee of Management for the time being.

75. These Rules may be wholly or partially rescinded, altered, or added to at a Special Meeting of the Committee of Management called for that purpose. Seven clear days' notice of any such proposed rescission, alteration or addition to be given to the members of the Committee prior to such meeting.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

PATIENTS.

1. An In-Patient will receive Board, Lodging, Medical Advice, Medicine, and Treatment for three weeks at the discretion of the Honorary Physician; should a further extension of time be advised by the Medical Officer, the Patient may remain, with a further Subscriber's Recommendation, or on the payment at the rate of £2 0s. 0d. per week.

2. An Out-Patient will receive medical advice, medicines, and treatment for three weeks at the discretion of the Honorary Physician; should a further extension of time be advised a Patient may remain with a further Subscriber's Recommendation, or on payment at the rate of 14s. 0d. per week. The Medical Officers will attend these Patients at the Hospital only at the appointed days and hours.

3. Any Patient who has been in the Hospital for a period of nine weeks shall be reported to the Medical Board for consideration as to the desirability of further treatment.

4. Any Patient who shall be re-admitted into the Hospital shall again be placed under the care of his or her former Physician, except under exceptional circumstances.

5. All applicants for admission, either as In or Out-Patients, will be required to produce a recommendation, signed by a Subscriber, and to contribute not less than 1s. per day as an In-Patient, or 2s. 6d. per week as an Out-Patient, towards the cost of their maintenance. The Committee reserve the right to determine whether an applicant is eligible for the Charity and may make special arrangements to meet necessitous cases.

6. The Honorary Medical Officers are authorised to refuse admittance to, or discharge, any Patients they consider not capable of being benefitted by the Buxton Waters.

7. Every In-Patient will be required to bring a proper change of clean body linen, and will have to pay for his, or her, own washing out of the Hospital; and to deposit one shilling upon receiving the key of the clothes box appropriated to his or her use; this deposit will be returned to the Patient upon giving up the key. All Patients must be provided with money for their travelling expenses when leaving the Hospital, as the Committee of Management are in no way responsible for such provision.

8. All Patients will be required to observe strictly the Rules laid down for their guidance; any infringement of the rules will render the Patient liable to immediate dismissal, and to be declared ineligible for re-admission.

9. Application for the admission of In-Patients, accompanied by the Subscriber's Recommendation and the usual medical certificate to be made to the General Superintendent and Secretary, who will intimate, by return of post, the earliest date upon which the Patient can be received. Patients are not on any account to come to the Hospital until they receive notice that there is room for them, as no allowance of any kind will be given to those who cannot be taken in.

10. In-Patients are admitted into the Hospital on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., and during their residence in the Hospital are under the immediate medical supervision of the Resident Medical Officers.

11. Visitors to the Hospital are particularly requested not to interfere between the Patients and the Hospital authorities.

12. No Patient can be admitted without producing a Subscriber's Recommendation, and a Medical Certificate specifying the nature of the disease, and certifying that the Patient has not been exposed to the influence of Infectious or Contagious Disease during the six weeks previous to his or her admission.
