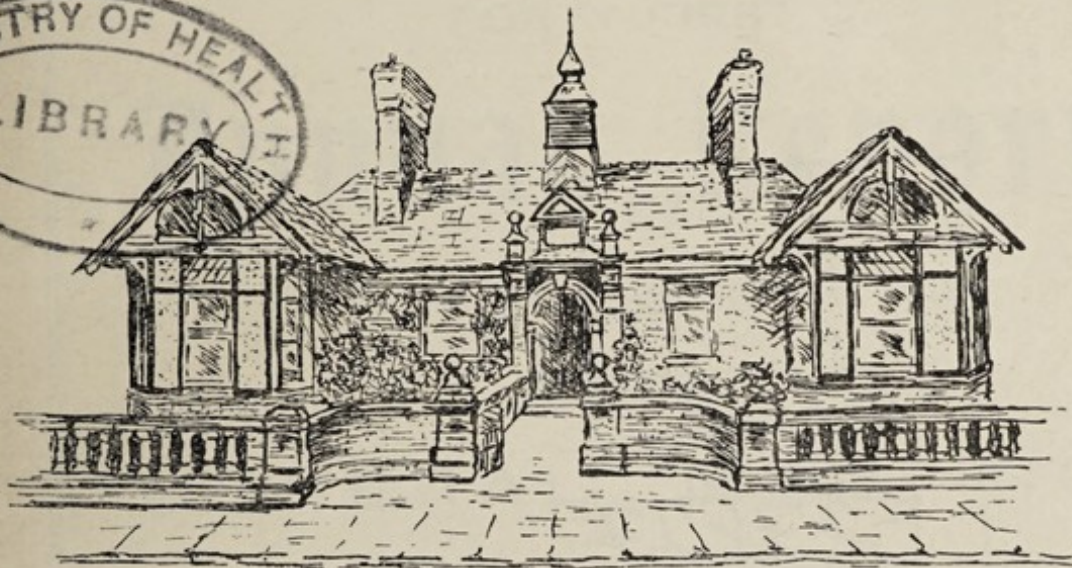

FORTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT.

The Committee beg to submit their Report for the year ended 30th September, 1928.

During the year the work of the Hospital has been well maintained ; 601 Patients have been treated, occupying 4718 days at an average cost of 9s. 0d. per day. 75 Major Operations were performed and 158 patients X-Rayed.

The Committee are much indebted to the Organisers of the Weekly Subscribers Fund for their continued support. The income from this source is well maintained. The Box Scheme in conjunction with this Fund has made further progress, the sum received during the year being £66 10s. 6d. an increase of £27 0s. 5d..

The Committee are pleased to report a welcome improvement in the finances of the Hospital. After meeting the balance of the expenditure upon the new X-Ray Apparatus referred to in the last Report viz: £38 1s. 8d, the loss on the years working amounts to £16 14s. 11d. There has been a slight reduction in the expenditure. The income, however, has increased considerably mainly due to Donations which have advanced from £383 1s. 10d. to £606 17s. 11d.

The Committee tender to all those Ladies and Gentlemen and Associations, who have in any way during the year assisted them, their grateful thanks. They would like specially to mention The Lady Harris and The Mayor of Faversham, the former for arranging a Bazaar Fund in her name and the latter for inaugurating the Cricket Competition.

Legacies amounting to £95 have been received.

The Members of the late Faversham Workmen's Club donated 492 £1 Shares of the Faversham Public Building Co., Ltd., valued at £250, which sum has been placed to the Endowment Fund.

The Committee have been fortunate in securing the services of Mr. D. G. Henley Luck, Chartered Masseur, as Honorary Masseur to the Hospital.

Miss A. E. Arnold who had faithfully served the Hospital as Nurse and afterwards as Matron for 15 years resigned in order to take up private nursing. The Committee wish her success in her new venture. In recognition of her services here Miss Arnold was presented with a Cheque subscribed by Friends and Patients of the Hospital. In her place the Committee have appointed Miss Jane H. Gibson, late of St. George's Hospital, London.

The retiring Members of the Committee are Messrs. Charles Holmes, and S. J. Chambers, Capt. C. E. Cheetham, Mesdames L. H. Finn, H. S. Neame and T. G. Gillett, all of whom are eligible for re-election.
