



# Parnborough & Cove War Memorial Cottage Hospital

To the Residents of Farnborough, Cove and South Hawley.

THE Management Committee of the Farnborough and Cove War Memorial Cottage Hospital has great pleasure in presenting its Fourteenth Report.

The Hospital has again paid its way, in spite of the difficult conditions under which it was run owing to the building of the New Wing. The Committee considers this a most satisfactory result.

The New Wing comprises a Central Hall and Staircase, Operating Theatre, Anæsthetic and Sterilising Rooms, an X-Ray Room, Four Private Wards and one seven-bed Women's Ward. The building was begun in 1933, was completed and equipped by June, 1934, and was officially opened by Countess Haig of Bemersyde, on 7th July, 1934.

The necessity for this addition has been fully justified already by the continued demand upon both public and private beds. The Operating Theatre is now one of the best in the neighbourhood. The cost of this addition, including the equipment, amounted to £4117 9s. 9d.

The Royal Aircraft Establishment Benevolent

Fund has made the provision of an X-Ray apparatus its special care. This has been installed, is in constant use, and is proving a great benefit to the community.

A beautiful Mortuary Chapel has also been built. This was presented by Mrs. Clerk, a further proof of her interest in the Hospital and its work.

The Committee undertook the heavy expenses involved in the above additions with complete confidence in the goodwill and generosity of the residents of the district. Their confidence has not been misplaced.

Purses presented to Countess Haig at the opening ceremony provided £300 14s. 9d.

The Farnborough Chamber of Commerce, under the Presidency of Mrs. Kent, organised a brilliant Carnival early in September, which resulted in a cheque of £500. The Committee very much hopes that the Chamber of Commerce may consider a repetition of their wonderful effort.

Pound Days and Flag Day produced the sums of £39 18s. 9d. (cash and goods), and £45 4s. 4d. respectively, and grateful thanks are due to the organisers and helpers.

The enlargement of the Hospital has entailed additional work on the Matron, Medical Staff and Nurses. The Matron and her Staff fully maintained their high standard of efficiency, often under most difficult conditions. The Committee feels that your very grateful thanks are due to them all.

Miss Maxted has once more generously given her help as masseuse whenever necessary.

Many sincere appreciations of the kindly attention

shown to them continued to be received from patients.

This is a very gratifying feature.

The total number of patients admitted during the year was 231. The number of operations was 203 (major 80, minor 123). Maternity cases were 8.

The total number of days the beds were occupied was 3371. Patients were admitted under the West Surrey Hospitals League and payments from the League totalled £451 11s. 0d.

The Committee appreciate the good work and co-operation of the League and its collectors. The payments for patients admitted under their scheme has been of considerable help towards maintenance expenses.

Space will not permit individual mention of all subscribers, contributors and helpers. The gratitude of the Committee for their generous help is none the less sincere, and in conclusion the Committee confidently looks forward to a reduction of its heavy liabilities, and appeals for continued interest and support in carrying on the good work of the Hospital.
