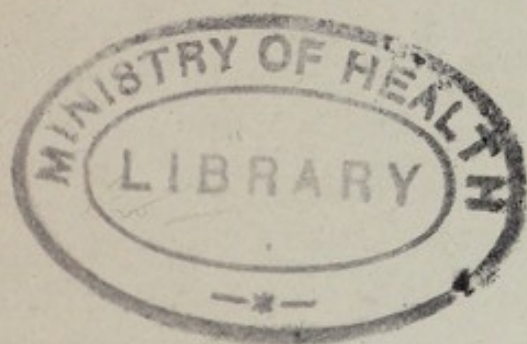

The Committee have pleasure in presenting to the Donors and Subscribers the 31st Annual Report and Statement of Accounts.

In last year's Report your Committee emphasised the amount of work which was being annually added to the task of administration at the Hospital. This is more than ever obvious this year and the Hospital has, during several periods, been run to its utmost capacity. All, therefore, who are interested in the work that is being so efficiently done, are earnestly urged to help in some practical way towards carrying out this worthy object.

During the year there have been 550 patients admitted and of these 332 were free. The operations performed numbered 378 and the results were highly satisfactory.

The Ladies of the Committee have again organised several successful efforts and the Linen Day At Home at the Grand Hotel resulted in a good collection of linen and donations amounting to over £12.

Annual Pound Day.—Organised by the Ladies' Committee this effort was again a distinct success, and the Teachers and Scholars of the Schools are sincerely thanked for their invaluable help.

The Chief of Police and his staff are thanked, together with the Morecambe tradesmen for the splendid amount raised at their annual football match and we must include in these thanks the Morecambe Football Club for lending their ground for the occasion.

The various Churches of the area and the Morecambe and Heysham Free Church Council have again materially helped in the raising of funds and are included in these thanks of the Hospital Committee.

The Staff and patients at the Hospital were indebted to good friends of the Leeds and Bradford Club Coaches for their gifts which provided an excellent fare for Christmas and the Committee extend their appreciation for this.

The Matron and her Staff are very sincerely thanked for so efficiently coping with the increase of work which they have had during the year and the satisfactory results are in no small measure due to the way in which they have so splendidly carried out their duties.

In conclusion, your Committee thank all who have, in any way, large or small, helped in the supplying the needs of the Hospital.

WORKPEOPLE'S WEEKLY CONTRIBUTIONS.

The Weekly Contributory Scheme which is now organised and supervised by a Committee, has again held its own, and in spite of the industrial unrest, there is a slight increase to report in the income to this fund.

This, to some extent, is satisfactory, but the Committee feel that until every employee in the town over 16 years of age has joined the scheme, our efforts on behalf of this fund must not cease.

The amount received from this source shows that on the average slightly over 900 members are contributing weekly to this scheme and this number ought to be materially augmented by the time we issue our next Report.

The cost of the operations is also a substantial benefit received by contributors, but the value cannot be given in actual figures.

From the foregoing it will readily be seen that the Hospital has been able to give to the contributors who have needed it, the attention and help that was necessary. The Committee, in making an appeal for further members, hope that these figures will prove that the scheme is really a friend when needed.

The scheme is controlled by an Executive Committee, composed of six members of the Hospital Committee and six from the contributors themselves. This Committee meets monthly and the members are further represented by the Delegates Committee, which is composed of a delegate from each firm contributing. This Committee meets quarterly. Both these Committees are keen on the work of this scheme and of the Hospital and are glad to be able to do something to help to supply the needs in such a worthy cause.

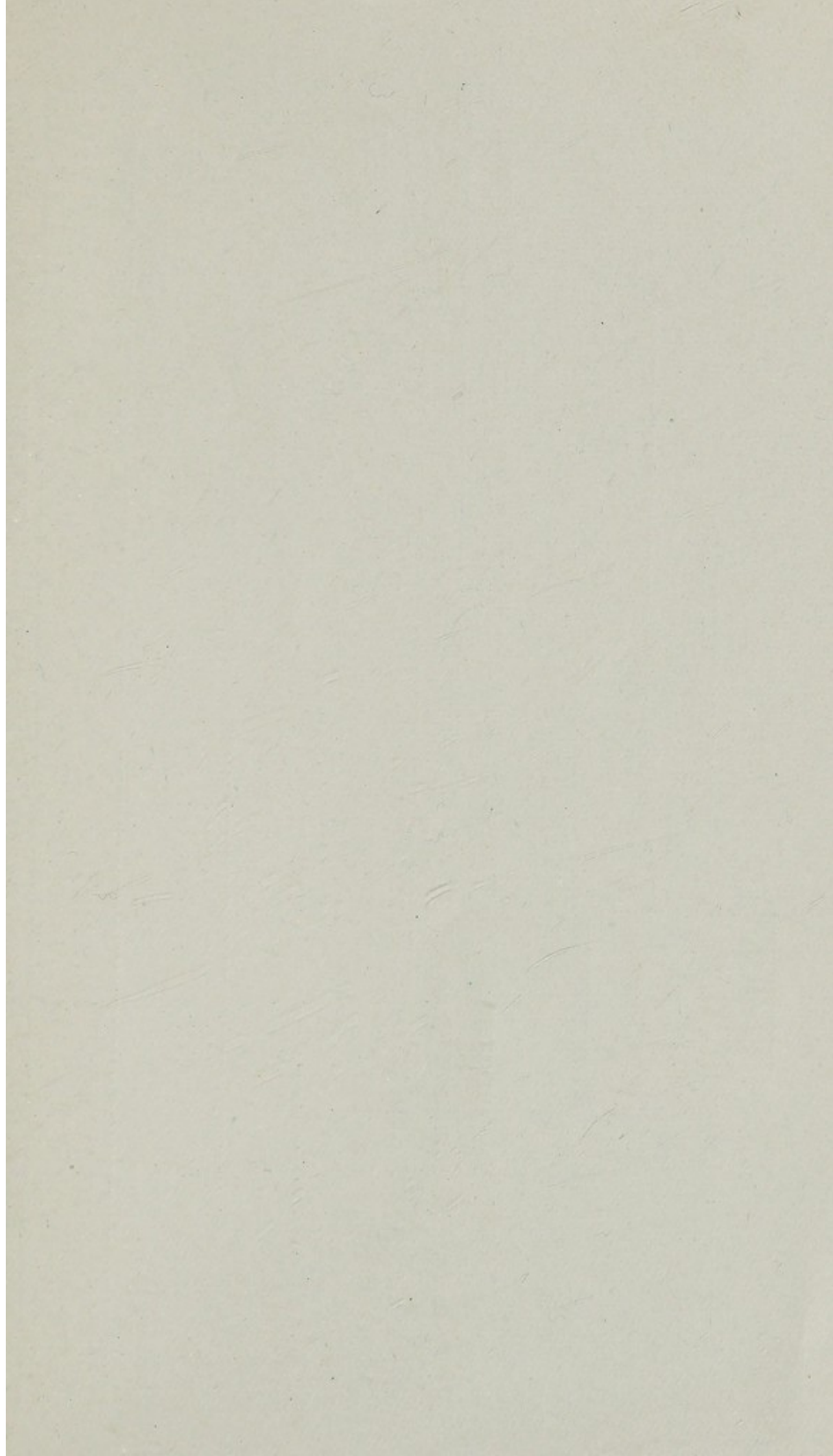

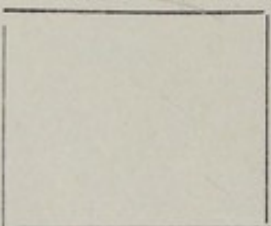
