





ANNUAL REPORT.

The Committee is pleased to present to the Donors and Subscribers the 32nd Annual Report and Statement of Accounts.

The Committee having decided to abandon the Cottage Hospital System, have appointed a selected Medical Staff.

In future no patient in the general wards will have a doctor's bill to meet for any medical attention received whilst in the Hospital.

The Committee feel this is a great advance and one which will meet the adverse criticism often heard on this point whilst the Cottage Hospital system was in being.

Your attention is again called to the increase of work accomplished, and the Committee would emphasise the fact that many times during the year the Hospital has been running at its full capacity, particularly in the women's section. The contemplated extensions, when completed, will increase the accommodation in this department and are urgently needed.

601 patients have been admitted during the year, and of this number 252 were free. 433 major and minor operations have been performed, the results of which were highly satisfactory.

The ladies and gentlemen who composed the Rag Committee are again to be congratulated on their work. The sum of £284 7s 5d was handed over as a result of the Rag Day collections, and this amount together with other efforts organised by this Committee will bring the total in the region of £400.

The "Morecambe Guardian" co-operated with the Rag Committee in organising a Charity Matinee at the Theatre, and both Mr. Morphet and the "Guardian" are sincerely thanked.

The various Amateur Operatic Societies are again thanked for their valuable assistance.

The Linen Day organised by the Ladies' Committee and held at the Grand Hotel was again a success, as was the Pound Day, which was helped very materially by the teachers and scholars of all the schools in the area. For both these efforts the best thanks of the Committee are due and are sincerely given.

The Chief of Police and his staff, together with the Morecambe Tradesmen and the Morecambe Football Club are also thanked for the splendid result derived from the annual football match. The Committee particularly wishes to express to ex-Supt. Jackson its hearty appreciation of his able assistance and personal sympathy with the Hospital and accords to him the best of wishes in his retirement.

To the various Churches of the town and district who have again helped us we are sincerely grateful.

The Matron and her staff who have worked so splendidly are thanked by the Committee very wholeheartedly. The success of the Hospital is in no small measure due to their untiring efforts, and a large number of letters have been received from grateful patients conveying expressions of thanks for the way they have been nursed back to health.

Your Committee, in conclusion, thank all who have, in any way, whether large or small, helped to bring the year's work to such a successful issue.

The members of the Committee who retire in rotation and are eligible for re-election are: Mesdames Barwick, Parkinson and Ratcliffe, and Miss Nevison. Mrs. Evenden has retired from the Committee and another lady is required to fill the vacancy. Messrs. Evenden, Miller, Overend, Perigo, and Ratcliffe.

WORKPEOPLES' WEEKLY CONTRIBUTION.

The above scheme has shewn a marked improvement during the year and the committee in charge of the scheme are glad to report an increase in the amount received from the weekly contributions.

The income from this source shows that on the average nearly 1,100 members are contributing weekly. This is an increase of nearly 200, but it still leaves room for further improvement and the Committee appeal to all employers of even one or two assistants to help us in this matter.

The fact that no charges have been made for the operations on contributors is also a very substantial benefit received by members of the scheme, although no actual value can be given in figures.

The above figures show that the Committee have good grounds for making their appeal for further members and do so with the full knowledge that the benefits received are well worthy of the consideration of all who are insured under the National Health Insurance.

The scheme is controlled by an Executive Committee, composed of six members of the Hospital Committee and six from the contributors themselves. This Committee meets monthly, and the members are further represented by the Delegates Committee, which is composed of a delegate from each firm contributing. This Committee meets quarterly. Both these Committees are keen on the work of this scheme and are glad to be able to do something for the good of the Hospital.


