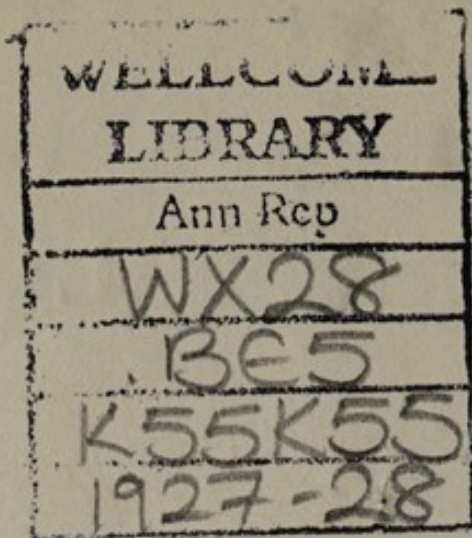

30th ANNUAL REPORT

June 1st, 1927, to May 31st, 1928.

It is with a sense of some satisfaction that the Committee present the 30th Annual Report for the year ending 31st May, 1928, and first wish to thank all who have so generously contributed to the Funds both for upkeep and building, and for many gifts in kind on Pound Day, and at other times throughout the year.

The year has been specially memorable in that the Committee had received such support to the Building Fund that it was decided to call for tenders for the erection of the New Hospital, with a good hope that it might be completed and opened clear of debt.

When the tenders were received it was found that the quotation given by a local firm, Messrs. Camp and Murch, of Salcombe, though not the lowest, was likely to prove the most satisfactory, and a contract was entered into in March, 1928, for the work to be put in hand at the beginning of April and completed by 31st March, 1929, at a cost of £9,582.

The progress of the work has been very satisfactory, and arrangements were made for the Foundation Stone to be formally laid by the Earl of Devon on June 14th.

The Current Account shows a credit balance of £77 16s. 5d. as against an opening credit balance of £89 18s. 11d.

Subscriptions amounted to £224 0s. 9d.; Patients' payments other than those received through Provident Funds were £233 19s. 8d. From the Kingsbridge Hospital Penny Fund £95 8s. 4d. was received on account of 24 patients and from other Provident Funds, £65 5s. 10d. for 17 patients.

During the year the Investments and Credit Balance of the Kingsbridge Invalid Trust Fund amounting to £2,444 14s. 4d. were transferred to the Trustees of the Hospital under an order of the Charity Commissioners. The Invalid Fund will remain as an addition to the Endowment Fund provided that the full amount required to pay for the New Hospital is obtained from other sources.

A legacy of £500 from the late Miss Jacson, £100 received during the year, which was, at the request of the Executors, credited to the Building Fund, and the former is held on deposit in the hope that it may be added to the Endowment Fund.

The record of work is as follows : Remaining in Hospital on 31st May, 1927, eight patients, and 95 were admitted during the past year. The total number of cases treated as In-Patients was 103 ; Out-Patients 48, and 68 operations were performed ; 74 patients were discharged as cured ; 16 were relieved, and seven died, including one baby shortly after birth. Patients remaining in Hospital, six. The high percentage of deaths is attributable to the fact that five of these cases were admitted with very little prospect of ultimate recovery.

In-Patients were received during the year from the following places and Parishes : Bantham 1, Blackawton 1, Churchstow 1, Devonport 1, Exeter 1, East Allington 3, East Charleton 2, East Portlemouth 1, East Prawle 2, Frogmore 1, Galmpton 1, Hope Cove 1, Kingsbridge 37, Lower Batson 1, Loddiswell 4, Malborough 5, Salcombe 24, Sherford 2, South Milton 1, South Pool 2, Torcross 1, Thurlestone 3, West Buckland 2, Woodleigh 1, Woolston 1, West Alvington 3.

The average stay of patients in Hospital was 23 days.

The number of beds available was nine and one cot, and the average daily occupation of beds was 6.48.

The average daily cost of each Patient was 9s. 1d., which includes all costs of provisions, domestic, surgery and establishment salaries, wages, board and administration.

One Pound Day was held when a large quantity of groceries and other useful articles were received in addition to £14 1s. 3d. in cash.

At the General Meeting held in September, 1927, Mr. C. H. Harris Pitts, Mr. R. Burnell Edwards and Dr. D. O. Twining were elected to serve on the Committee as representatives of the Subscribers for the current year.

The Committee deeply regret the very severe loss that was sustained in the untimely and sudden death of Dr. William Tudor Webb on March 28th, 1928. The full measure of the valuable and unsparing work that he had rendered to the Hospital during many years will never be realized, and the sympathy of all is extended to his widow and family.

The Committee desire to record their appreciation of the service rendered by the Revd. R. S. Davies to the Hospital during the time he held the living of Churchstow with Kingsbridge, and to wish him all happiness in his new surroundings.

The Committee welcome the Revd. G. E. J. Porter as a Member of their body.

During the year the Motor Ambulance, the property of the Joint Council of the British Red Cross Society and and Staff, which for several years was managed by a Sub-Committee for the Hospital, was taken over by the Local Company of the St. John Ambulance Brigade.

Thanks are accorded to the Local Treasurer and Collectors for their assistance which is indispensable to the work of the Hospital, and the Committee desire to place on record that in spite of the generous response to appeals for the Building Fund the Annual Subscriptions have increased slightly.

The Committee trust that all Local Treasurers will kindly continue their valued aid.

The Committee record their appreciation of the services rendered by Dr. W. F. T. Adams, both as an Hon. Medical Officer and for inaugurating the Kingsbridge Hospital Penny Fund. A welcome is extended to Dr. W. R. Haslett both as Hon. Medical Officer and Member of the Committee, and to Dr. Murphy, of Modbury, and Dr. W. Hugh Roberts, of Kingsbridge as Hon. Medical Officers.

During the year the Committee have received with thanks the acceptance of invitation to Dr. H. G. Pinker, of The Crescent, Plymouth, to join the Honorary Consulting Staff of the Hospital.

The Committee again record their gratitude to the Hon. Medical Staff for the interest taken in the Hospital, and for their devoted care and attention to the patients, and express their appreciation to the Matron and Staff for the efficient working of the Hospital.

In conclusion the Committee desire to thank the Hon. Secretary, Hon. Treasurer and his assistant, Miss Smyth, for their invaluable work for the Hospital.

RULES.

1. That the Hospital be called the KINGSBRIDGE AND DISTRICT COTTAGE HOSPITAL.

2. That the HOSPITAL be for the benefit of such sick poor in Kingsbridge and the neighbourhood as can be better treated there than in their private homes.

3. Subscribers are entitled to a Letter of Recommendation for every 10s. 6d. they subscribe. Collectors of small sums and donors through entertainments and concerts are entitled to one Letter of Recommendation for every £1 so collected. Each letter is available from the date of payment of subscription for 12 months. It will admit one patient for four weeks only, a fresh letter to be obtained if the patient continues longer in hospital, and no one letter covers more than a single case.

4. Clergy and Ministers presenting offertories are entitled to a Recommendation for every 10s. 6d., available for 12 months from the payment of such subscriptions.

5. Sudden and urgent cases only admitted any time without a Letter, but this must be supplied as soon as possible. Admissions daily at 11 a.m.

6. Patients suffering from infectious and contagious diseases, advanced consumption, or any other hopeless chronic disease, or who are of unsound mind shall not be eligible for admission. But the Council shall have power to suspend the rule in very exceptional cases. The Matron has the authority to refuse any child under four years of age except in charge of its mother or some other suitable person who shall pay for his or her board.

7. The medical staff shall admit every suitable case in order of application.

8. Patients are expected to contribute towards their board and lodgings a sum per week to be fixed by the Committee, and payable in advance. Insured persons are required on admission to enter into an agreement with the Matron to pay a certain portion of their insurance money to the Hospital during the time they are in-patients.

9. Patients must come furnished with a change of linen and toilet requisites.

10. An undertaking to remove the patients from the Hospital when required to do so, and in the event of death to pay all funeral expenses, must be signed by a responsible person approved by the Managers; and the removal should, if possible, be after dusk.

11. Visiting days for friends of patients are Wednesdays and Saturdays from 2 to 4 o'clock; and for subscribers and their friends Thursday from 2 to 4 o'clock. No patient is to leave the premises without permission. No smoking is allowed inside the Hospital except by permission of the Matron.

12. When the beds are not fully occupied by the poor, a private paying patient may be admitted by the doctors, such patients to pay at least £3 3s. per week to the Hospital, besides the Doctors' Fees.
