** Bugler William Sutton behaved with conspicuous gallantry throughout the siege of Delhi. On the 2nd August he particularly distinguished himself. The enemy made a formidable attack on our position; and Sutton, who was in the advanced trenches, saw one of the rebel buglers in the act of sounding. Fired, perhaps, with professional jealousy, Sutton rushed to the front, and killed the bugler before he could produce a note. The action, however, which specially earned him the Cross took place on the night before the assault. It was considered desirable to ascertain the state of the breach. The service was one of desperate peril, but Sutton volunteered to perform it, and providentially returned unwounded. He was elected by the privates of the regiment.
