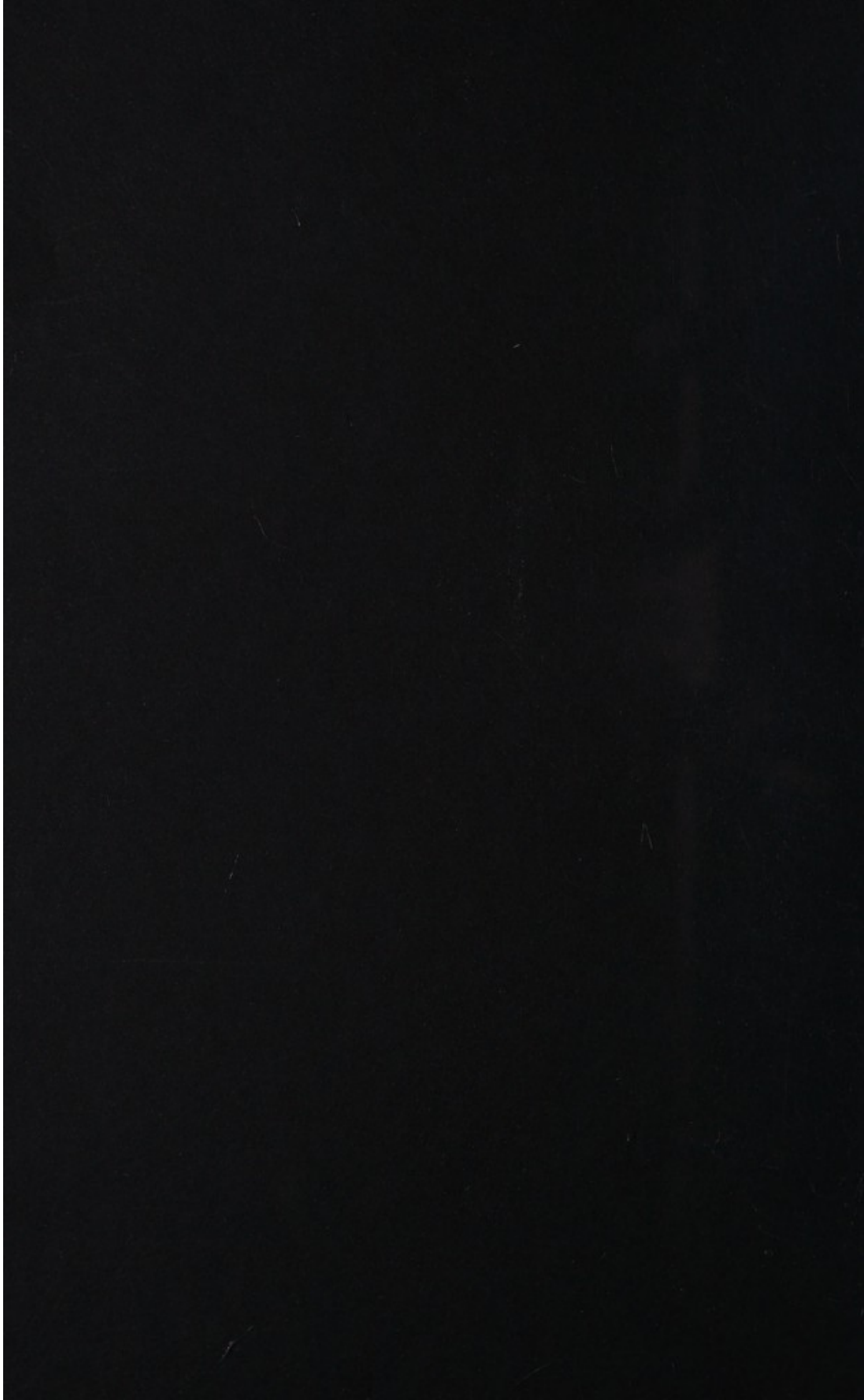

CONDITIONS OF SALE.

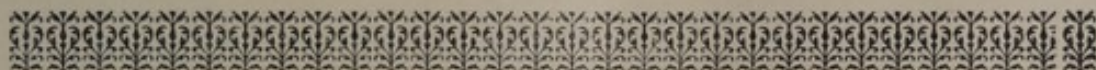

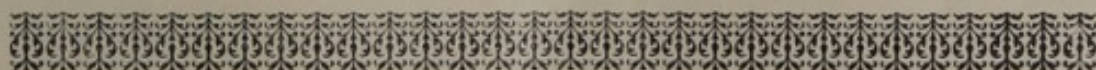
