ANCIENT WRITING AND ILLUMINATIONS.

The following series of faithful reproductions from the most ancient Manuscripts, dated from the 5th to the 11th Centuries, merit the special notice of Antiquaries. They were executed rather more than 50 years ago by G. V. Duhoyer; he was so skilful in this particular line, that he may be said to have elevated reproduction to the level of a fine art. His firmness of outline, the grace imparted to his curves, and the completeness with which he succeeded in catching the spirit of the original artists entitle him to the best esteem of those who reverence the work of the ancient scriptoria. The revisions are very numerous, sometimes slight, but very often the whole of a verse is completely altered, and again a line or two out of a verse will be left standing and the remaining lines altered altogether. It is curious to watch the evolution of thought as it endeavours to improve a line, and is at times frustrated by the confines of measure and rhyme ; the desperate feeling of some particular attempts is apparent in the impatient looking erasures of words written as improvements, but rejected as unfit either from an alliterative or a rhyming standpoint. All this tends to throw light on the laboured thought or easy fluency of the author, and from this particular example we should be inclined to favour the former as most probable. Mr. Wilson was nothing if not methodical in the arrangement of his collection, being a model to collectors in this respect, besides in many others. The catalogue he compiled would of course carry the preciseness of these methods to the point of an art. Sotheby's on Thursday last in the shape of the 'Roxburghe Revels,' ex-tracted from the Athenaum of January. 1834, mounted, and illustrated, among other things, with numerous portraits, autograph letters from Haslewood, R. Wilbraham, Hibbert, Lord Spencer, Dibdin, Heber, Boswell, Sir Walter Scott and others. The material upon which these 'Revels' were founded was purchased at Haslewood's death by Thorpe, the bookseller, the underbidder being Mr. Dilke. Thorpe at once 'wrote to Dibdin as follows : 'I bought it for 40. against the editor of the Athenaeum, who, if he got it, would have shown the Club up finely larded." Dibdin did not care to purchase stlence at so high a price, and the bookseller, having no sentiment in the matter, quickly disposed of 'Revels' to Mr Dilke for £50. That the Club got 'finely larded,' as Thorpe predicted, is a matter of history, for probably no literary club ever received such an exposure. The Roxburghe Club still exists, but an annual dinner and an occasional privately printed volume are the extent of its revels."—The Athenaeum, Jan. 14th, 1890.
