He was not, however, so mad as to prevent his penning Memoirs, that even to-day are consulted with profit, besides some Poems. According to this his lucid 'moments' must have been of a singularly protracted nature.

Brunet has no mention of the book, neither has Greswell in his *Annals of Parisian Typography*. Every page is redolent of the Press from which it issued nigh 400 years ago, and it is almost as fresh as on that day. The binding too, is a rare example, absent from most of the noted collections. Both panels measure 4½ in. by 3 in.: The Blessed Virgin is represented kneeling, half turned towards the Angelic Messenger, who bears a lily, around which is a scroll with the words *Ave Maria plena*, etc. Surrounding the whole in Gothic letter *Ecce ancilla domini fiat mihi secundum verbum tuum*. William Occam, or Occam, as he is sometimes called, was an English Franciscan, bailing from Surrey. The modern fabulist owes most of his 'origins' to such emanations of the mediæval mind as are to be found in these Moral Apologues, published under the title of *Dialogus Creaturarum Moralisatus*. The attraction is heightened, of course by the picture that heads each, and which endeavours to figure those concerned in a manner similar to Bewick's, but hardly so correct. The Sun and Moon hold first place, followed immediately by the Stars and the elements, as Wind and Water. Animals and Men of every conceivable order converse, until we come to Life and Death, the former represented by a falconer, the latter by a skeleton, very suggestive of those to be found in Du Chaillu's *Equatorial Africa*. The sun is most like a star-fish and the moon a healthy monk, but apart from these doubtful objects and some of the legendary animals, the conceptions err only in being too expansive. A few were copied in the English translation bearing the Paris imprint, about 1540, but even these few were inferior to those of the edition under notice.

A most extraordinary book, and *extremely rare*. The wealth of ingenuity is astonishing even to a *fin de siècle* mind, so trained to the wonders of mathematical instruments. The embellishments claim first attention, for here we have not only the objects but the whole circle of their surroundings, whether the experiment be in a study or in a field, and every person necessary is correctly represented in proper and very picturesque costume, with the very buttons of their dress each illuminated. In three instances carriages are necessary, and as a result we get a landscape, a very conscientious representation of a brougham of the period, several gentlemen engaged in the operation, and a postilion. This is only one out of many such cases of comprehensiveness, that aid in transforming a scientific method into a gallery of the working life that surrounded the contemporaries of Galileo, who, at this time, was still a young man. At the end is bound another similar treatise: **SOLI DEO GLORIA** is the pious heading of title, and it deals with Geometry and Perspective, AND HAS 14 WHOLE-PAGE **Water-colour Drawings** by way of illustration. Printed by the same printer a year later it adds yet more to the already resplendent View of the Manners and Customs of Scientists at the close of the Sixteenth Century.

A delightful example of the Parisian Press of the period and a dainty little morsel of literature singular as it was pleasing in those days: the author framed his message to the world in ten-syllable quatrains, classifying the subjects under such general headings as FEMMES, PRINCES, JUSTICE, FORTUNE. His advice is, as a rule, sound, and he has a pretty humour, that in the closing line often rivals the most supreme of epigrammatists. The book is undoubtedly rare, and, so far as we know, not a single copy has occurred for sale at auction in this country during the past ten years. There are also 32 lovely painted Initials (each one an exceedingly original design), not to mention scores of scrolled capitals.

The quaintly direct language of this venerable compendium of moral theology is alone sufficient to claim for it a close examination. Succinct expositions of the Commandments are followed by treatises on the capital sins and the works of mercy. And the terseness characteristic of the days when men called a spade a spade is refreshing to compare with the circumlocution of modern manuals of similar import. The following quotation from the essay on the first Commandment is a case of point: "And so glotons & lechous breken yis hest. And herfor sais Poule yt yse grete glotons makyn yir bely yir god. . . . Later on, treating of the use of images, the author's opinion is that they "dou bothe gude & harme. Goode to suche men to who yise ben bokis to luf God more yen yise schuldē ellis. Euel & harm yī dou to suche mē whom yī mouen yus to sett yir hope in help of yise ymages. . . . For lewde men sinne in pilgrimage (Chaucer was living at this time be it noted) ful oft. And clerkis sinne myche more ffor couetise of ofering. . . . ye bullis & absolutiōns marren many men. . . ." But quite apart from the text the volume is deeply interesting for its beautiful English calligraphy, of which the regularity is sustained throughout.

Scott Huxley of Canterbury (died March, 1898), who bequeathed them to his widow, from whom we purchased them.

Machlinia, or William of Mecheln, is believed to have brought his fount of type from Johannes Brito, the second printer of Bruges, and John Lettou is said to have come to this country on the invitation of Caxton; after producing two books, he joined his more successful confrere, and among their more noted productions was Lyttleton's *Tenures*, printed in 1481. These 'Statutes' were meant for incorporation in that work, but for some reason were issued separately. Like Caxton, they never made use of title-pages, and this particular book opens with an Alphabetical Table occupying the first 4 folios without signatures or numerals. The text follows on the recto of f. 5 (sig. A 1) and ends on reverse of f. 108 (sig. N 8) with 7 lines descriptive of Outlawry (*Vtlagarie*). A full page contains 40 lines, there are no numerals: signatures A—N in eights. The type is similar to that used for Lyttleton's *Tenures*, and in combination resembles most Caxton's No. 4*.
