A grand collection made by Sir Walter and Sir C. M. Burrell, whose Portraits are included. The Views comprise a series engraved by Skelton after Mackenzie of the various Colleges of the Universities, and some of Westminster drawn and etched by J. T. Smith (1807-8); also a large view of Worthing, 1823. Among the Portraits are some beautiful MEZZOTINTS, including one engraved by C. TURNER after LAWRENCE of JOHN TAYLOR, Esq., another by D. LUCAS of RIDLEY COLBOURNE. The INDIA PROOFS (some before any letters) include 'COLLEGE JOHN,' engraved by J. Thomson (very fine); Miss Charlotte Wyndham, &c., &c. 'A Visit from Poor Relations,' MEZZOTINT (PROOF) engraved by S. W. Reynolds, and a few other subjects are added.

The above is a large and good copy from the Reynell collection, a hole in the last leaf only. The binding is a very fine signed example of stamped calf of curious design, each side having an ornamental border, enclosing four panels, female full-length figures in each, being representations of Faith and Hope, with cross and legible inscription; signature of binder I.P., and mark in each panel.

The Bishops and Cardinals of Henry VIIIth's reign come next in point of numbers, and then the Statesmen, Poets, Queens, &c., forming an almost complete Gallery of historical characters in any way connected with the history of this great Ecclesiastical Palace.

The words and music of the offices are those of the Franciscan order, to which the nuns of St. Clare belonged. Made for particular use at a period when the art of illuminating had quite declined, the book is not of the highest artistic value. But its historical interest is unquestionable. It was finished on Sep. 22, 1722, by Sœur Marie Therese de le Bury, who, on the reverse of the title page has inscribed the names of the community of which she herself was a member. There were 35 nuns in the convent on that day, AND THIS BOOK WAS LARGE ENOUGH FOR THEM ALL TO SING FROM AT THE SAME TIME. Judging from its excellence and perfectly clean condition, the book was held in high esteem by the good sisters. From time to time additions were made to it. The latest of these appears to have been the office appointed for the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which is dated 1774. It is certain, therefore, that this book was in constant use in the conventual choir for over 50 years, and probably it so continued for many years more until the fine printed choir books now to be seen in many Belgian religious houses came into general use. This copy of the Antiphonarium was probably made because the funds of the order (poverty was its strong point) did not permit the nuns to purchase a printed one.

To the commentary have been added frequent annotations by successive generations of students, filling here and there the wide and mellow margins left by the original scribe. The book thus embodies a practical history of mediæval caligraphy.

The initial is a highly realistic representation of God instructing Moses to threaten the King of Egypt. The patriarch holds in his hands a dragon, typical of the plagues. Another historiated initial has been replaced in workmanship of the same period. An abundance of delicately painted capitals pervade the pages from first to last.

391 **THIRTEEN LEAVES**, 18½in. by 13½in., from a Franciscan Antiphonary (XV. Century), including two initials (one 4½in. by 4in., the other two 4½in. by 3½in.), historiated in gold and colours, and a large number of others, very beautifully scrolled and painted, as well as words and music of anthems, etc., used on various festivals, £2 18s Sæc. The principal initial represents Christ conferring special jurisdiction upon St. Peter, who kneels at his feet. The central field of burnished gold contrasts finely with the ashen colour of the letter and its deep blue background. The other initial depicts the Annunciation, after the conventional manner.

The miniature which formerly illustrated the Epiphany has been cut out, but the one referred to above is a fine example of the illuminator's art. Many of these pages are more than commonly beautiful owing to the large number of brightly painted capitals, rubrications, &c., by which they are broken up.

The perusal of these mellow pages will reveal a wealth of artistic decoration. Besides the grand initial alluded to is a smaller one decorated with a six-winged seraph illustrating a passage in one of the responsories. The artist who was responsible for the book to which these leaves formerly belonged never failed to catch the ideas suggested by the text of the divine offices. The delicate tracery of his floriated work is beautiful beyond description.

A very interesting choir manual not only on account of the surpassingly beautiful execution of the gothic characters, but also on account of the remarks written on the fly-leaves by successive friars using the book. There are pages so aptly grouped and so tastefully adorned, that it were easy to wax enthusiastic in their contemplation. From the illuminator's point of view we may safely say (as do the writers of notices on novels) "there is not a dull page in the book," although it can boast nothing in the way of pictorial illumination, owing its entire merit to the excellence of textual execution. The music is written with admirable distinctness throughout, and includes the special music used by the Franciscan Order on its Founder's day.

From the æsthetic standpoint it possesses many claims to distinction, the great capitals being in many cases quite original. The book was once owned by the Monastery of St. Adrian (Geroldimontis), the store set on it by the community being instanced by the "Si quis sum abstulet, anathema sit" at the conclusion of the text.
