four-armed Vishnu, while above is the conventional representation of the origin of Vishnu, the Eggs and nostrils on the lotus leaf. Vishnu, his wives and Garuda are of copper bronze, the attendants, of brass.

COPY OF DECLARATION: -" I, John Dunstable Carew Puddicombe, do hereby declare that the striped waistcoat sent to you was the waistcoat worn by the Poet, Robert Burns, that it has been in my possession for the past fifty years, and that it descended to me in the following manner :-

It was purchased by S. W. R. Leigh, of Dartmouth, in 1796, as the writing on it shows. It was given by S. W. R. Leigh to his cousin, my grandfather, Mr. Thos. Leigh, and was given by him to his son, Commander Thos. Leigh, who commanded H.M. Ship 'Conqueror' at the Battle of Trafalgar (see O'Bryne's Naval Biography). Commander Leigh left it to his sister, Mrs. Elizabeth Carew Puddicombe (my mother), and my mother left it to me.

It was always regarded by my family with special respect and interest, and was carefully treasured; and although the infirmities of age prevent me remembering how it came into my long-departed relative's hands, no doubt as to its authenticity ever existed in my family.

N.B.-S. W. R. Leigh married the eldest daughter of Timothy Fetherstonhaugh, of Kirkoswald, Cumberland, and it is surmised that it was bought of some of Burns' friends in that district, the Leigh family having all been relic collectors.
