According to Fiske (*Discovery of America*, I. 301), Hanno penetrated as far as Sierra Leone, but the *Encyclopaedia Britannica* (XII. 922) states that he reached Cape Palmas, in Liberia (some distance further on). He gives a good description of what he saw, including "wild men and women covered with hair" called by the interpreters "Gorillas."

The importance of this book in geographical literature will be realised from the fact that it is the only description of any part of Africa south of the Sahara Desert prior to the Portuguese voyages of the fifteenth century.

The account of the Indian Ocean by Arrian (fl. c. 130 A.D.) is also interesting.

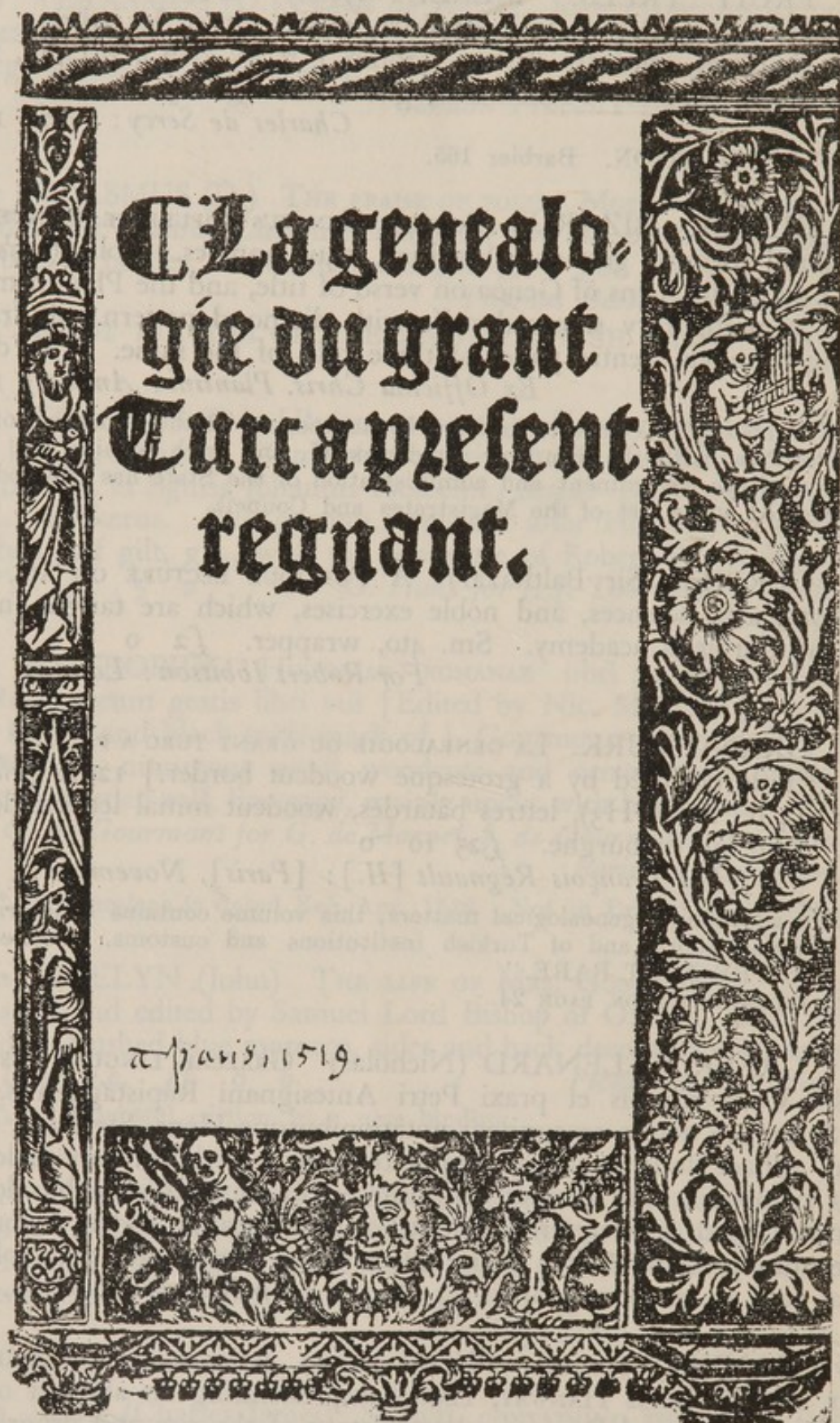
