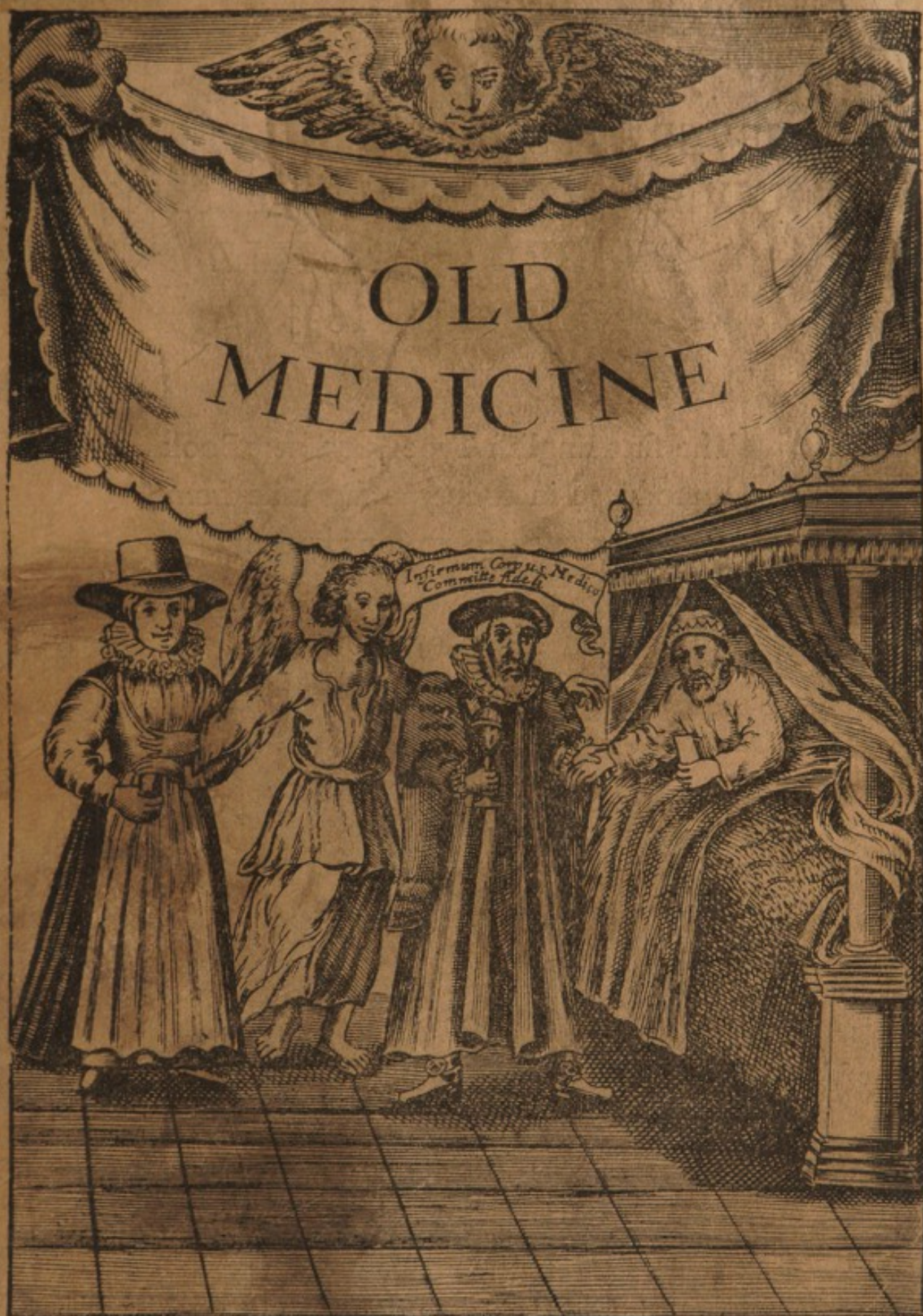

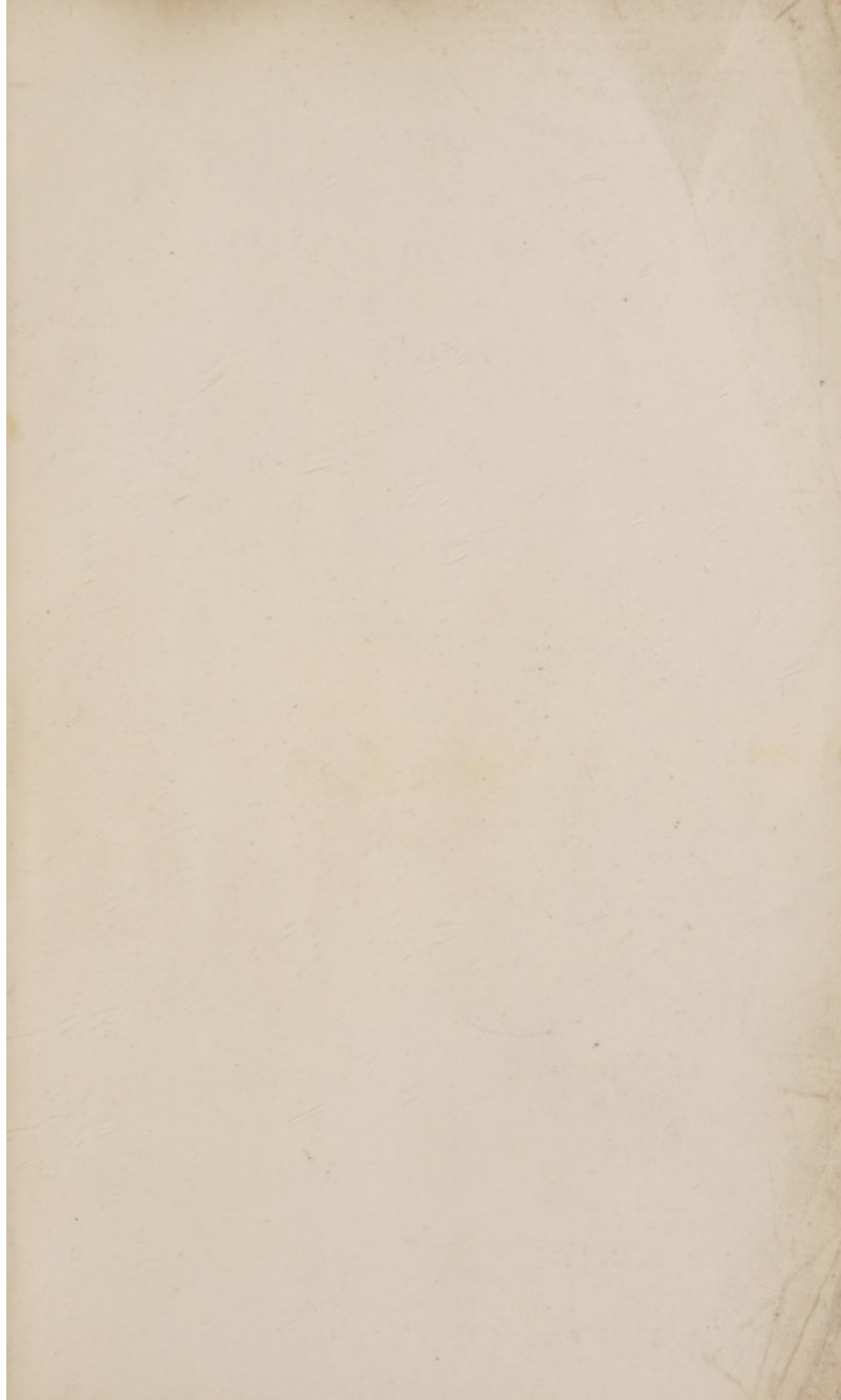

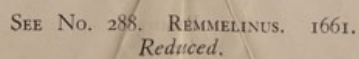

"This work is one of the most important in the history of embryology, and a matter of frequent dispute. Some writers have tended to make Harvey's merits overshadow the just claims of men like Malpighi and Von Baer of all pronouncements made, that of Huxley still seems the soundest and best. In his demonstration of the circulation Harvey was brought to a standstill at one period only, viz., the capillary anastomosis between arteries and veins, which, having no microscope, he could not see. In his investigation of the embryo the minute and patient work of years was driven to an *impasse* for the same reason, while the manuscripts containing his drawings and other results of experimental investigation of the embryo, were destroyed by the Parliamentary troopers, who invaded his chamber in Whitehall in 1642. He was one of the earliest to attempt to describe such minute structures as the formation of the crystal lens of the eye, the seeds of plants, etc. He disproved the theory of the fermentation of the blood, by observing that there were no bubbles in it even during the most severe fevers. He was the first to give a scientific description of the red corpuscles, which he noted varied in shape in different species. He was the earliest to observe accurately the structure of the teeth, and described the tubular formation of the dentine. He was one of the earlier to observe the passage of blood in the capillaries, and the spermatazoa in animal semen. He opposed the theory of "spontaneous generation." (Thomas 1417; *Biog. 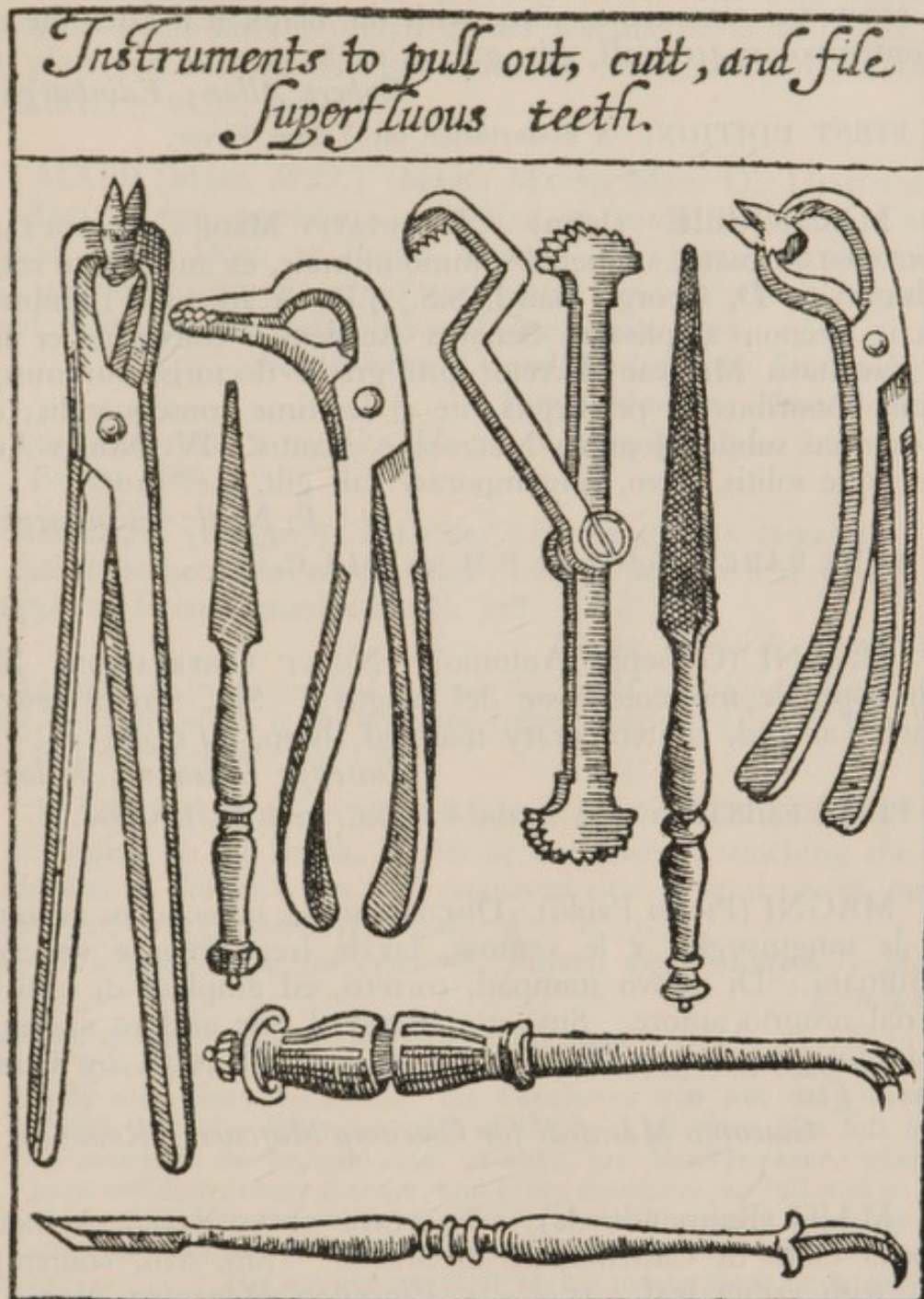

The A.D.B., XXVI., 149, gives the following account of Ulrich Pinder (also written Binder, Pinter and Pindar): He appears to have been born at the one time imperial city of Nördlingen, where he practiced as a doctor of medicine from 1484 to 1489; he was then appointed physician to the Elector Frederick of Saxony; and in 1493 he occupied a similar position to the City of Nuremberg, in which he continued till his death. He was one of the earliest medical writers to resort to the printing press. He set up in his own house the press which is named by Proctor "The printer for the Sodalitas Celtica," who may be identical with Friedrich Peypus. Proctor II, 11033, a, b, c: "Though there is no direct clue to this printer's name, it is a noteworthy fact that all his types but one were at a later date in the possession of Peypus."

The fact that the second tract has double signatures in itself proves that it is not the beginning of a book. Also, the *Tractatus simplicium medicinarum* is stated by the S.G.L.C. to contain 29 leaves, whereas this copy has two extra leaves at the end, headed *De dosibus medicinarum*; Graesse, V, 298, quotes the *Compendium breve* separately : "Av. 3 portr. en bois p. K12 recto*); he then ascertained the weight of his food and drink to be consumed in the twenty-four hours, and, taking into account other excreta, calculated the amount of "insensible perspiration." The designs, according to Vasari, were made by Jan Stephan van Kalcker, a Flemish pupil of Titian, who also is responsible for the magnificent portrait and the initials. The only place in which another engraving of the design is substituted for that which appears in the first edition is the title-page, which represents Vesalius lecturing to a large audience. Professor Roth regards this as the earliest picture of a lecture in anatomy. He considers the earlier ones in Bartholomaeus Anglicus (Lyons, 1482, and Wynkyn de Worde, 1495) and Ketham (Venice, 1493) as being rather readings from Galen, illustrated by a barber-surgeon. (M. H. Spielmann: *The Monography of Vesalius*, p. 134). With reference to these woodcuts and Vesalius's complaints as to "pirates" see Ambrose Firmin Didot: *Essai typographique et bibliographique sur l'histoire de la gravure sur bois*, col. 91-96. For facsimiles see Spielmann, *passim*, and Singer, plate 4. The most interesting feature of this edition is undoubtedly the denial of the "pores" of the septum at p. 746. Galen taught that some of the blood found its way from the right to the left ventricle through invisible pores, and this doctrine (which Dr. Singer terms "one of the main obstacles to the true explanation of the action of the heart") remained uncontradicted until the publication of this edition. There is no doubt that Vesalius was very dubious on the subject when he wrote the description of the heart for the first edition, but

he was not prepared just then to challenge what had been accepted for centuries. However, in 1555, fortified by twelve years' further research, and the powerful patronage of the Emperor Charles V, he made a pronouncement about which there can be no mistake. We give Dr. Singer's translation of the passage in both editions (pp. 27-28):

## FIRST EDITION. 1543.

"The septum of the ventricles is formed from the very densest substance of the heart. It abounds on both sides with pits imprinted on it, by reason of which it is provided with an uneven surface towards the ventricles of these pits none, so far as the senses can perceive, penetrate from the right to the left ventricle. We are thus forced to wonder at the art *industria* of the Creator by which the blood passes from right to left ventricle through pores which elude the sight."

## SECOND EDITION. 1555.

"Although some of these pits are conspicuous, yet none, so far as the senses can perceive, passes from the right to the left ventricle. . . . I have not come across even the most hidden channels by which the septum of the ventricles are pierced. Yet such channels are described by teachers of anatomy who have absolutely decided that blood is taken from the right to the left ventricle. I, however, am in great doubt as to the office of the heart in this part."

When we take into consideration that the Inquisition had come to regard an attack on Aristotle or Galen (witness the case of Galileo nearly a century later) as a matter for Church discipline, the passage in the second edition leaves no doubt as to Vesalius's opinion. The *Encyclopaedia Britannica*, Vol. I, p. 929, sums up Vesalius's general services to anatomy thus: "Besides the first good description of the sphenoid bone he shewed that the sternum consists of three portions and the sacrum of five or six, and described accurately the vestibule in the interior of the temporal bone. He not only verified the observation of Etienne on the valves of the hepatic veins, but described the *vena azygos*, and discovered the canal which passes in the foetus between the umbilical vein and the *vena cava*, since named the *ductus venosus*. He described the omentum, and its connection with the stomach, the spleen and the colon; gave the first correct view of the structure of the pylorus; remarked the small size of the caecal appendix in man; gave the first good account of the *media sternum* and pleura, and the fullest description of the anatomy of the brain yet advanced."

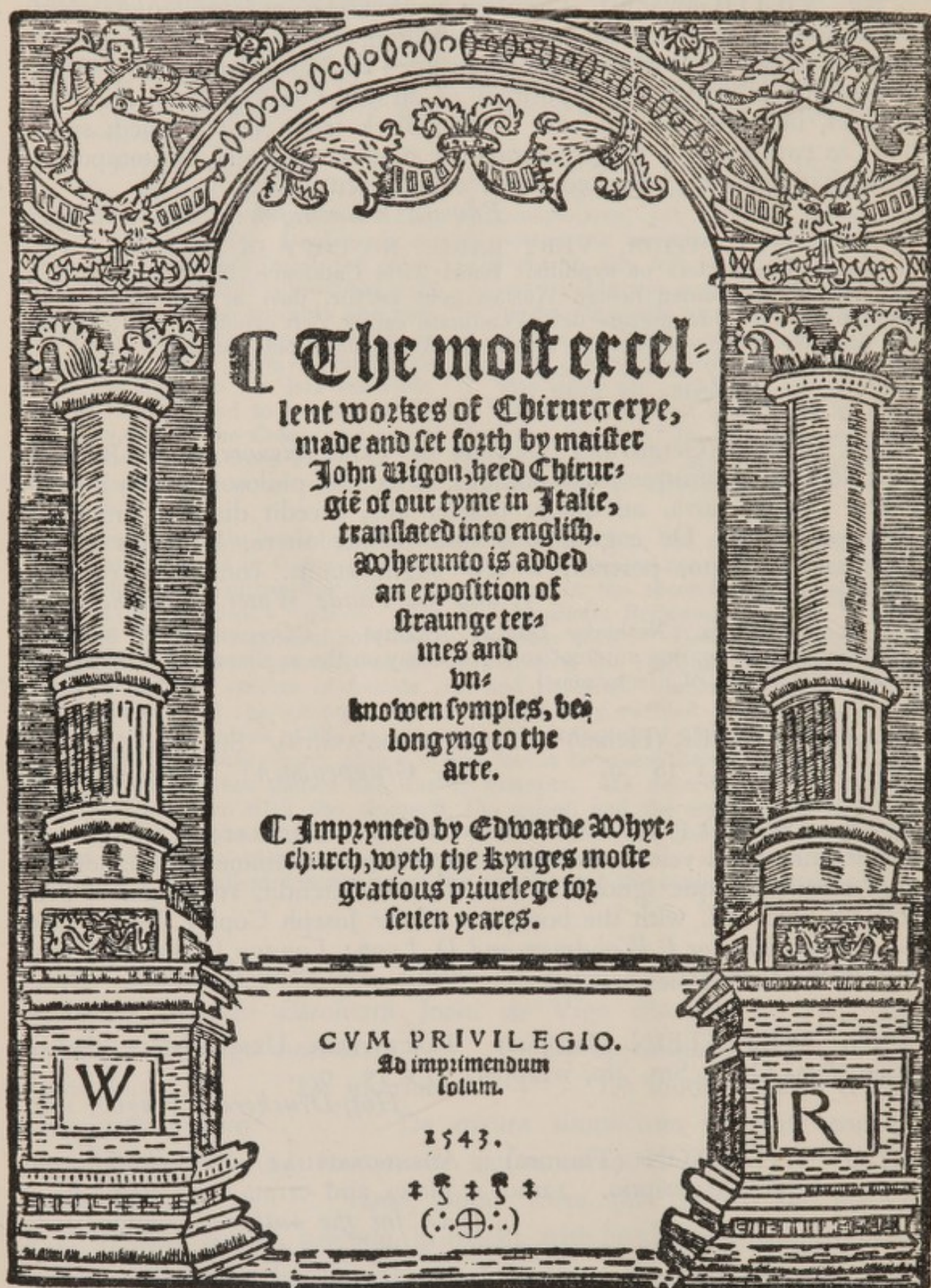
