Boniface Amerbach was born at Basle in 1495, and died at Basle in 1562. He was the eldest son of the printer, Jean Amerbach, and, with his brothers Bruno and Basil, collaborated with his father.

Boniface Amerbach was also professor at the University of Basle. He was the intimate friend and residuary legatee of Erasmus, while Froben and Episcopus were the executors of his will.

It is little known that, rich and generous, Amerbach increased (out of his private purse) certain donations from Erasmus, and even paid out, in the great *savant's* name, legacies to certain friends whom he had forgotten.

Erasmus' bust, placed on the clock tower of the Cathedral at Basle, mentions on its epitaph the names of the three friends.

It is extremely curious to find precisely the names of these three friends, Erasmus' printers, together in the book which we have.

This is the first Bible in which the printer has given the date and place of impression and his name; and it has always been regarded as an object of interest and value. It is much rarer than the Gutenberg Bible. The explanation of this is that Fust and Schoeffer's house was burned during the sacking of Mainz, three months after the Bible was completed, and many copies were destroyed.

According to a familiar story, many copies of this edition of the Bible were sold in Paris as manuscripts for 60 crowns apiece, and, from their number and extraordinary resemblance between them, they were supposed to have been executed by magic. Some colour is given to this story by the variations in the colophon, one form omitting all allusions to the art of printing, and another explicitly referring to the mechanical process. Moreover, it seems not improbable that Fust may have taken advantage of the ignorance of some people of the discovery of printing, for the small and elegant Gothic type with which this Bible is printed resembles very much the character used in writing.

The leaf offered for sale has very wide margins and is in excellent condition. The few single leaves which are offered for sale from time to time are generally taken from bindings and have consequently more or less suffered.

plished woman of her time, represents more admirably than Francis, the genius of the age. She studied Latin, Italian, Spanish, German, Hebrew, and, when forty, occupied herself with Greek. Her heart was ardent as well as her intellect; she was gay and mundane, and at the same time she was serious (with even a strain of mystical emotion) in her concern for religion. Although not in communion with Reformers, she sympathised with them, and extended a generous protection to those who incurred danger through their liberal opinions. Her poems, '*Marguerites de la Marguerite des Princesses*' (1547), show the mediæval influences forming a junction with those of the Renaissance. Some are religious, but side by side with her four dramatic Mysteries and her eloquent '*Triomphe de l'Agneau*' appears the '*Histoire des Satyres et Nymphes de Diane*,' imitated from the Italian Sannazaro."—Dowden.

"Adored by cultured ladies of Tudor England, the Queen of Navarre owed something of her English reputation to the infant zeal of Queen Elizabeth while she was princess. At the age of eleven the English princess translated a pious poem from Queen Margaret's pen. In his introduction to the work, the Comte A. de Laborde, Secretary of the Société Française, explains that it was "the house of Maggs Brothers of London who had the good fortune to discover one of the leaves, until then unknown, of the famous Book of Hours painted in the fifteenth century by Jean Foucquet for Maître Etienne Chevalier, of which the majority of pages, formerly purchased by the Duc d'Aumale, are the admiration of the visitors to the Condé Museum at Chantilly."

The leaf which has now been recovered represents Saint Michael conquering the devil, and is the subject of an extremely interesting essay by the well-known miniature expert, Comte Paul Durrieu. In this book he gives an outline of the history of fifteenth-century miniature painting in general and of the life and work of Foucquet in particular.

Jean Foucquet was a native of Tours and was "painter and illuminator" to Louis XI. His most celebrated work was the "Book of Hours," in which the miniatures constitute a series of pure *chefs d'œuvre*, to which we of to-day render the homage of our admiration. We believe that Etienne Chevalier's Livre d'Heures remained in his family until the death of his last descendant in the male line, Nicolas Chevalier, Baron de Crissé, who died in 1630. The erudite Gaignères, who died in 1715, recognised it as the original book. But a day came towards the dawn of the eighteenth century when the volume fell into the hands of a vandal. He divided up the book, detached each page which was ornamented with miniatures, and threw away the remainder of the book, which may have been destroyed, but whose existence is, at any rate, entirely unknown. In order to make these miniatures appear as independent paintings, the vandal carefully covered some of the words of the text which appeared on the same page as the miniature with ornamental borders cut from other miniatures of a much later period, the eighteenth century.

The author of this book then traces the manner in which the other leaves of the Livre d'Heures were slowly recovered from various countries in Europe. The book has been published by the *Société Française* for private circulation amongst the members.

The first section of this volume contains the laws of the Spanish Inquisition drafted from 1484 by Thomas de Torquemada and successive Inquisitors-General, compiled at the instance of Cardinal Alonso Manrique, Archbishop of Seville and Grand Inquisitor of Spain, and published by the seventeenth-century Jesuit Inquisitor-General, Don Juan Everardo Nidardo.

The second edition of this publication contains the text of an Inquisitorial decree given at Toledo in 1561 by Fernando de Valdes, Archbishop of Seville and contemporary Grand Inquisitor, setting forth the details of procedure to be followed by inquisitors during the trial of heretics. It comprises instructions as to the various occasions on which the prisoners might be tortured, the procedure on resuming the trial after torture, and the continuation of the process against the "name and fame" as well as the heirs of an imprisoned heretic, after his death.

The *Catholic Encyclopaedia* states that "much has been written of the inhuman cruelty of Torquemada." It is certain that no critic could have framed a graver indictment against him than the Inquisitor-General himself, through the medium of his laws, incorporated in this work.

Thomas de Torquemada, who was a nephew of the celebrated theologian, Cardinal Juan de Torquemada, was born at Valladolid in 1420, and died at Avila in 1498. As a Dominican at Segovia, he became the confessor and adviser of the Infanta Isabella of Castile, afterwards Queen Isabella the Catholic.

In 1482, the Catholic Sovereigns appointed Torquemada, Grand Inquisitor of Castile; subsequently extending his jurisdiction to Aragon. The organization of the Holy Office throughout Spain was then left in his hands, and in 1484 he convened an assembly of Spanish inquisitors, outlining twenty-eight articles for their guidance. The text of those articles is contained in the opening pages of this volume. Llorente, the famous Spanish social reformer of the nineteenth century, who had had free access to the archives of the Holy Office for many years as Secretary to the last Inquisition in Madrid, calculated that the number of Torquemada's victims totalled 8,800 who were burnt to death, and over 96,000 who were punished in other ways.
