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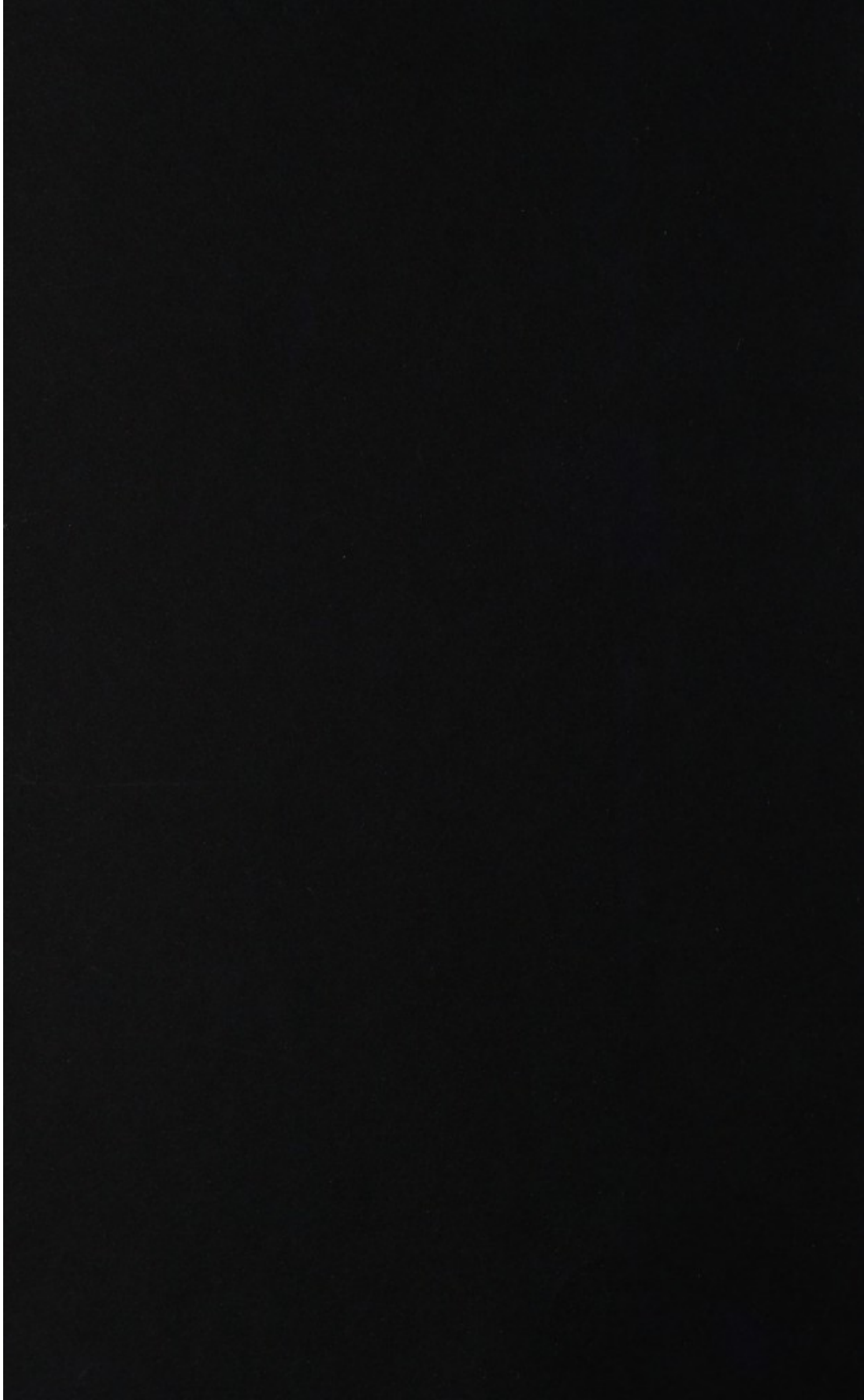

- 6 (339) *Kye-ba rDorje* (Sct. Hevajra) bronze, standing in his *yi-dam* form, holding his *sacti* in his arms, three-headed, ten-armed, enshrined in flames, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. high

- 6 (340) *Kye-ba rDorje*, another, identical with the foregoing, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. high

- (341) *P'yag-rdor* (Sct. Vajrapāni) gilt bronze, seated, two-armed, holding a double dorje and dorje bell, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, with temple seal

- (342) A pair of Nepalese copper Boxes, partly gilt, compressed circular, the designs hand-wrought repousse, on the covers an eighteen-armed form of Simhanada Mañjusri, surrounded by a chased border and six *Ranji* characters in relief, the sides pierced with designs of relief dragons in panels, 6 in. high, 13 in. diam. (2)
