Rare Native Objects obtained on Captain Cook's Third Voyage.

- (44) 5 (1) Chief's cloak of woven flax, with wide borders woven in brown, black and natural coloured flax, in geometrical patterns. No European materials have been used in the making of this cloak, but are usually present in later cloaks, NEW ZEALAND
- (46) 4 (2) Very large wooden fish-hook with human bone barb, probably a shark hook, NEW ZEALAND
- 4 (3) **Extremely rare chief's flute, carved in the usual Maori style with grotesque face, etc. New Zealand**
- (3/10) 8 (4) Ceremonial stone headed adze, the blade inserted in the finely carved wood handle, and secured with an elaborate binding of very finely braided cord, COOK ISLANDS
- (6/5) 6 (5) Chief's adze in original wooden handle, the blade of fine quality jade, NEW CALEDONIA
- 6 Two highly polished hardwood clubs, one carved to represent a bird's head, NEW CALEDONIA

- (3/15/1) 4 (7) Fine decorated flute of polished bamboo, and a chief's necklet of porpoise teeth, HAWAIIAN ISLANDS

- (6p) 12 (9) **Bone Dagger, the handle bound with human hair and fibre, and said to be the original dagger with which Captain Cook was killed. Hawaiian Islands**
- (48) 4 (10) Very rare chief's fighting weapon of stone in remains of net-work sling, HAWAIIAN ISLANDS
- (2/17/6) 6 (11) Ancient heavy wooden mallet or pounder, HAWAIIAN ISLANDS
- 12 Large wooden axe-shape weapon, and a rare canoe bailer, NEW ZEALAND

- (2/17/6) 5 (13) Large stone-bladed double-headed axe, WEST AUSTRALIA
- (4/5/1) 7 (14) Axe with jade blade, in wooden haft, MARQUESAS ISLANDS
- (5/7/1) 7 (15) Very fine old shale pipe, the carvings depicting totemic animals, mythical beasts, chiefs, etc., HAIDA TRIBE of QUEEN CHARLOTTE'S ISLAND
- (3/10/1) 6 (16) An unusual type of war club, the handle ornamented with hair and beads; medicine man's bag of magic objects, and a large horn spoon, NORTH AMERICA
- 5 (17) Rare adze, the handle carved with two mountain goats and bear; and a ditto large fish-hook, carved with a human head, BRITISH COLUMBIA
- 7 (18) **Exceedingly rare club of stone with wooden handle, used in the old days for killing slaves. North West Coast of America**
- 19 Ancient greenstone TIKI, with history, NEW ZEALAND

- (50/1) 5 (20) Axe with stone blade, and an European gun stock carved in Maori patterns, and used as a club in the NEW ZEALAND WAR
- (14/10) 16 (21) **Chief's ceremonial paddle, the blade carved in high relief with grotesque figures and lizards. Carried by a chief when directing operations from a war canoe. An exceptional specimen of old Maori carving. New Zealand**
- 22 An ancient wooden canoe bailer, carved with a conventional human face, and with phallus handle, found in a cave at HAWKE'S BAY, NEW ZEALAND
- (3/5) 7 (23) Very rare rasp, of fish skin, the wooden handle carved to represent two complete human figures, NEW ZEALAND
- (2/10) 7 (24) Fine example of a pipe-tomahawk as traded to the Indians by the Hudson Bay Company, the shaft inlaid with lead and silver; and a stone-headed club of the PUEBLO INDIANS of NEW MEXICO
- 25 Very rare hide quiver containing arrows, a separate compartment of the quiver contains the bow, which is made of horn, wood and sinew, CREE INDIANS, NORTH AMERICA
- (50/1) 26 Box, beautifully ornamented with designs in coloured quill, CREE INDIANS; and a chief's whip of the NICHE TRIBE CANADIAN INDIANS
- (60/1) 4 (27) Rare complete mourning dress of black seeds, and shaped pieces of shell, MACUSI INDIANS, BRITISH GUIANA; and a chief's necklet of human teeth, showing the effect on the teeth by the continued practice of chewing the "betel" nut
- (2/11/6) 5 (28) Instrument with ball head surrounded with chains, and having a long iron spike. They were used by the "DANCING DERVISHES of CAIRO" during religious ceremonies when the spike was thrust into various parts of the body. Examples are now rare, their use being forbidden in 1880
