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## EDITIO PRINCEPS.

The complete set of the five volumes comprising the famous Aldine Greek Aristotle: the first complete edition of the works of Aristotle in Greek: "a truly stupendous work which well deserves the admiration it has met with." It is, moreover, the most important production of the Aldine press, and the work with which Aldus inaugurated his great series of the Greek classics. The printing of the first volume was completed at the end of 1495, but the final volume did not issue from the press until the summer of 1498.

All the five volumes of the present set are beautifully clean and retain generous margins. Vol. III is complete with the extra unnumbered leaf, which contains a page of text which by some mischance was left out when the pages were imposed.

It has a special interest for English collectors, because a part of the translation was made by an Englishman, Lineacre, and a letter of William Grocyn to Aldus is printed near the end, which gives a number of details concerning the study of Greek literature in England at the time. This letter has been eulogized by both Aldus and Erasmus, and is the only published work of Grocyn, a native of Bristol, who, at the time he wrote was Greek Professor at Exeter College, Oxford. One of the woodcuts (on H6a) is certainly by the artist of the *Poliphilo*, though it does not occur in that book. The cut on G2a is also very remarkable.

This extraordinary little book contains a number of chapters on Tobacco and the art of taking it. Copies of this book are excessively rare. According to Medina. *Imprenta en Mexico*, only four copies were known to him, one being the British Museum copy wanting a leaf. Whether the other copies are also defective, he does not state.

The book is so important that Medina devotes more than three of his large folio pages to it, and gives a list of all the chapter headings. The Copy described by Leclerc was defective, and he states that it is a book of the greatest rarity and is almost unknown.

Antonio describes the book, but doubts if it ever existed, HARRISSE, in his list of books printed in Mexico before 1600, describing one of the copies known to Medina, states that it is quarto, and that it consists of 255 pages, which is entirely wrong.

The work is divided into three books:

Book I. treats at length of the climate and the soil of Mexico, of its volcanoes and hot springs.

Book II. treats at length of the mines, plants, tobacco, cocoa, chocolate, etc.

Book III. is devoted to the Indians, to their clothes, and to those of the Spaniards born in Mexico.

The copies known to and described by Wagner in his "*Mexican Imprints*" and the "*Tribute to Wilberforce Eames*," and the only copies cited, are those in the National Library, Madrid, the British Museum. London (defective), the Huntington Library, and the defective copy in the New York Public Library.

It is of course not certain that the copy in the National Library, Madrid, or the Huntington Library copy are complete.

Andreas Vesalius, the great anatomist, was the son of an apothecary in the service of the Princess Margaret, governess of the Netherlands, and was born at Brussels in 1514. From boyhood he showed a strong bent to the study of anatomy, and with courage and determination he applied himself to it at Louvain and at Paris, running grave risks to obtain subjects. He accompanied for a short time the imperial army for the sake of increasing his knowledge; taught at the Universities of Pavia, Bologna, and Pisa with extraordinary success; acquired wider renown by the publication of his great work in 1542, and two years later was appointed first physician to the Emperor Charles V, whom he had thenceforth to accompany in all his movements. He held the same office under Philip II, and in consequence of the claims on his time, as royal physician, he did not prosecute his scientific studies. Suddenly, in the height of his honours and prosperity, he resolved on making the pilgrimage to Jerusalem, owing to the fact that he was found guilty of murder by the Inquisition for having opened a body for dissection, before death had really taken place, and that he was allowed to expiate the crime by a pilgrimage instead of death. On his return (1564) he was wrecked and perished of hunger and exhaustion in the Island of Zante.

This, his principal work ("*De Corporis Humani Fabrica*"), by its original views, important discoveries, and convincing evidence, constituted the sciences of human anatomy, and opened a new era in the progress of medical science. Its daring attacks on established doctrines and the venerated authority of Galen brought down on its author a storm of bitter reproach and opposition; but the storm soon allayed itself, and Vesalius was honoured by the next generation as the discoverer of a New World. This work was first published at Basel in 1542-3, which edition is exceedingly rare, and almost invariably incomplete, because it never was intended to be bound together, but rather was for use in separate sheets. The second edition appeared in 1555 at Basel, and this, the third edition, at Venice in 1568.

Magnificent copy of this extremely rare work; written at the instance of the Emperor Charles V, of whose exploits against the Moors the book gives a detailed account. The author was a Benedictine monk, who became Abbot of San Pedro de Arlanza in 1488. He was, in later years, re-elected to that post, which he held until his death in 1518.

He was very enterprising and exercised great influence at the Spanish court. He was chronicler to Ferdinand V and Isabella the Catholic; and it was the Emperor Charles V, (with whom he regularly corresponded) who urged him to write his books. Amongst his more voluminous works are his Chronicle of Fernan Gonzalez and of the Cid. Although later critics have deplored some of the inaccuracies contained in his works, they are all nevertheless extremely valuable and interesting on account of the authentic data which form the greater part of them, and which he obtained from the original sources in the monastic archives placed at his disposal.

Salva mentions this edition in his notes to No. 1288, but did not possess a copy. Paula's *Manual* (IV, p. 79) cites two copies of this rare edition. The second was published twenty-three years later, and a third, which included Guajardo's Proverbs, was published in Paris in 1614 and is the edition cited by Salva.

The author, whose real name was Pedro Faria, was one of several contemporaries who were influenced by the epoch-making *Celestina*.

In this curious little allegorical fantasy, in which each character personifies some virtue or vice, the author attempts to depict the illusion of the worldly life. The reactions of the allegorical persons upon one another show the primitive factor of life—Love—in its various aspects, while the world dreams on, awaiting the enlightenment which Death and Truth will bring.

Palau was the only bibliographer who saw or knew of a complete copy, and describes it as possessing three plates (which our copy contains) whereas Medina thought there were only two plates, and Sabin vaguely describes it as possessing "engravings." Being an Inquisitorial publication, printed for and by the Holy Office, no doubt the original edition was extremely limited; and apparently the few available copies are incomplete in one way or another.

The text contains a short history of the establishment of the Inquisition by the Catholic Sovereigns, of its patronage by St. Peter Martyr, and the papal edicts given in connection with the *Cofradia* or Brotherhood of St. Peter Martyr. The rules and constitutions of the *Cofradia* are then set forth.

There is an additional publication of two leaves entitled: *Orden que han de tener en la publicacion del Edicto General de la Fé, los Comissarios del Santo Oficio*, which gives the rules of procedure for the publication of an Edict of faith by the Commissaries of the Holy Office. This is one of the most pleasing books on the life and valiant exploits of *el Gran Capitan*, Gonzalo Fernandez de Cordoba, the celebrated Spanish hero of the Granada war and a score of fifteenth century campaigns, whose popular personality and military genius inspired many notable prose works in Spanish, and a Latin poem by Cantalicio. The original text of this particular "Life" was written in Italian by Pablo Jovio, Bishop of Mocera, and published in 1550.

James Lyell, who reproduces some of these woodcuts in his *Early Book Illustration in Spain*, says of this work: "The year 1520 was notable for two productions from this press of outstanding interest from the point of view of their illustrations. The first was *Aurea expositio hymnorum* of Nebrissensis, and the second, *Las quatorze decadas* of Livy . . . The very marked German influence on the book illustration of the Coci press is conspicuously evidenced in *Las Quatorze decadas*. A substantial and imposing folio volume of upwards of 500 leaves, it is one of the most finely printed books of the period. Throughout the book there are a large number of spirited half-page cuts.

No copy of this excessively rare first edition is in the British Museum, Church Catalogue or J. Carter Brown Library, nor is it mentioned by any of the bibliographers: Salva, Palau, Escudero, Medina, Brunet, Sabin, HARRISSE, or Leclerc. In fact, it appears to be quite unknown to bibliographers, many of whom have repeated Brunet's erroneous statement to the effect that the Toledo edition of 1546 is the first. HARRISSE cites this latter edition under No. 268.

This book contains a detailed biography of the Catholic sovereigns, and there are chapters on Columbus's discovery of the new hemisphere, the conquest of the Canary and other islands in the Atlantic, etc.

Lucio Marineo Siculo was an Italian humanist and historian, who was born in Sicily—hence his surname *Siculo*—in 1460, and died in Spain in 1533.

He studied the classics in Palermo and Rome, and proceeded to Salamanca to teach Latin, rhetoric and poetry. After twelve years of this work, he was appointed by Ferdinand V to the post of historiographer and chaplain at the court, where he was responsible for the education of the children of noblemen. His lucid exposition of Latin was also of great service to the priests about the court. Marineo Siculo exercised a great influence upon the literary renaissance in Spain.

After the Queen's death, this *littérateur* accompanied Ferdinand on his voyage to Naples. He continued to act as chaplain and literary adviser at the Court until the reign of the Emperor Charles V, and obtained a canonicate at Palermo in 1524. Most of his books were published in Latin and some have remained in manuscript.

The first part of the book a "Regimen of sexual life" is an ample refutation of a treatise "*De epidemiali morte*," by the physician Ludovicus de Villa Rubea. The two physicians disputed about their views "*ad poenam ignis*" before the Archbishop of Toulouse, in April 1514. The second part, a literary monument of the persecution of the Jews in Spain, Portugal and France, strongly attacks the Jews and culminates in the demand to have them expelled from France, as well as the Neo-Christians, the so-called "*Sequaces judaeorum*" or "*Marrani*." Amongst others syphilis is made out to be a chastisement for having given admission to the Jews. The whole is composed in the form of a dialogue between *Fides* and one called *Eremita*. The peculiar woodcuts show a strong Spanish influence. The second full-page cut represents the *Arbor judaica* growing from the *Hortus Liliorum* (= France), the author is seated at the left side of it, whilst on the right side there is *Fides*, escaping. There are 29 large woodcut illustrations by Pieter Coeck, including one of the famous giant of Antwerp, who lived in remote times on the banks of the Scheldt, where the city now stands, and demanded of all traders who passed that way the toll of half their goods or as an alternative the sacrifice of one of their hands. There are two sets of woodcuts, differing in size, and obviously the work of two artists. The smaller cuts (46 by 36), in style contemporaneous with the book, are overcrowded, too full of detail, and with a lot of close cutting, which gives them an insipid and blurred effect. The larger cuts (65 by 49)—copied from a Lyons' edition of the *Postilla* of about 1482—are boldly designed and cut in firm outline, if somewhat rudely. The engraver with a few lines has often succeeded in conveying a great deal of action and expression. Although the translation of this history is regarded as the work of Lopez de Ayala, the translator's name does not appear anywhere; and as this edition was edited by Fray Pedro de la Vega, who dedicates the work to the Emperor Charles V, it is quite probable that Nicolas Antonio's statement to the effect that he was the translator, is correct. James Lyell, who reproduces some of these woodcuts in his "Early Book Illustration in Spain," says of this work: "The year 1520 was notable for two productions from this press of outstanding interest from the point of view of their illustrations. The first was *Aurea expositio hymnorum* of Nebrissensis, and the second, *Las quatorze decadas* of Livy. . . The very marked German influence on the book illustration of the Coci press is conspicuously evidenced in *Las quatorzedecadas*. A substantial and imposing folio volume of upwards of 500 leaves, it is one of the most finely printed books of the period. Throughout the book there are a large number of spirited half-page cuts. This edition of Livy is rarely found in perfect condition, the coloured title-page being generally missing."

The author Juan de Padilla was born in 1468, and died sometime after 1518. He was commonly called *El Cartuzano*, or the Carthusian, because he chose thus modestly to conceal his own name, and announce himself only as a monk of Santa Maria de las Cuevas in Seville. Before he entered into that severe monastery, he wrote a poem called *The Labyrinth of the Duke of Cádiz*, which was printed in 1493: but his chief works were composed afterwards.

"The one entitled '*The Twelve Triumphs of the Twelve Apostles*,' was completed on the 14th of February, 1518; a poem formidable for its length, since it fills a thousand stanzas of nine lines each. It is partly an allegory, but wholly religious in its character, and is composed with more care than anything else its author wrote. The action passes in the twelve signs of the Zodiac through which the poet is successively carried by Saint Paul, who shows him, in each of them first, the marvels of one of the twelve Apostles; next, an opening of one of the twelve mouths of the infernal regions; and lastly a glimpse of the corresponding division of Purgatory. Dante is evidently the model of the great monk. Indeed, he begins with a direct imitation of the opening of the '*Divina Commedia*,' from which, in other parts of the poem, phrases and lines are not unfrequently borrowed. The language, which has a decided air of yet elder times about it, is free and strong, and the versification, considering the period, is uncommonly rich and easy."—(Ticknor, *History of Spanish Literature*.)

This fine and much sought after edition is mentioned by Salva in his notes to *Palmerin de Oliva* (No. 1651), but he did not possess a copy. The woodcut on the first title-page represents Primaleon with Polendos and Duardos, facing the giant Gataru in the battlefield; while those on the second and third title-pages are the same design, representing a mounted knight, squire and page. The smaller woodcuts are quaint illustrations of the scenes in the story.

This is the second of another series of romances of chivalry, similar to the cycle of *Amadis de Gaul*, and relates to the exploits of Palmerin de Oliva. This cycle is known as the *Palmerines*, and is rich in episode, many of the adventures having occurred to the first hero amongst the palms and olive groves of Constantinople, from which he derives his name.

*Primaleon* relates the more complicated history of Palmerin de Oliva's sons, Primaleon and Polendos, with "Don Duardos," Prince Edward of England, whose name was given to a dramatized version of this romance, by Gil Vicente. The author of these two romances is unknown: some have attributed the work to a lady of Ciudad Rodrigo; others have cited Francisco Vasquez as the author. These romances were followed by *Palmerin en Inglaterra*, which is indebted to Cervantes for the perpetuation of its fame, being one of the works which Quixote was enjoined to preserve in his library. The three romances had a great European vogue in the sixteenth century.

This remarkable book consists of poems arranged to occupy certain pages that also contain a woodcut figure or figures, but without interruption of the text which occupies the spaces between the lines forming the figure as well as outside it. As these inner portions are in red ink, one can see that they can be isolated from their context and yet be read in a new sense. Thus, there is a figure of the Emperor Louis on Bb1 vo., one of Christ on al vo., others in the forms of Cherubs, crosses of various shapes, letters, Evangelistic symbols, a kneeling monk (Rabanus) &c. There are 28 of these pages, two others (a4, k1) being blank but for the headline (these probably the illegible portions of the original M.S.). It is to be noted that though these pages appear all to be set up with type, they are really, in the more complicated instances, entirely cut (with their figures) on the block in imitation of type. (This might be considered as a late instance of a German block-book: the same printer reproduced the early *Ars Memorandi*). The more simple ones are set in type, certain portions being enclosed by metal rules. Certain pages (e.g., b2 vo.) have had only those letters that immediately surround the figures cut with them, the rest of the page to save further useless labour being filled in with type, only distinguishable by a close examination. That on c4 vo. has the red figure with xylographic lettering printed in the midst of type. The red seems to have been printed first. Each of these pages of text is followed by a transcript in ordinary type for the sake of clearness and a *Declaratio* explaining the whole ingenious arrangement. Part II consists of remarks on each figure.

The other two cuts (160 x 126 mm.) are on Aa5 vo. and 6 vo., representing Pope Gregory IV. with Rabanus kneeling before him. In the first cut another monk presents Rabanus, he is probably Alcuin though he died before this Pope succeeded. In each case the Pope holds a book in "bag" binding.

All the initials are in red. Greek letters (e.g., h4) are apparently makeshifts. Rabanus (776-856) was abbot of Fulda and afterwards bishop of Mainz.

Although Colmeiro states that the author does not fail to advance some justification for the treatment of the negroes of Cape Verde, Padre Mercado's sentiments are humanitarian, and an outstanding feature of his work is his advocacy of the abolition of slavery. Salva comments upon the fact—very worthy of note in the author's own day—that many years before the English had brought about the abolition of the slave trade, a Spaniard had already pleaded the cause of the negro in bondage.

For when in the Year of our Lord 1491 our great King Ferdinand of Spain sent experienced navigators to the equatorial West to look for Islands, these seafarers on their return after nearly four months, said they had found many islands on the equator or near it, in proof of which they brought various exquisite kinds of birds, many very precious aromatic spices and gold; they also brought some men from that region with them. These men were not tall, but very well shaped, they laughed a great deal and were of a kind disposition, trustful and docile, of considerable intelligence, blue in colour and with square heads: they appeared most strange to the Spaniards.
