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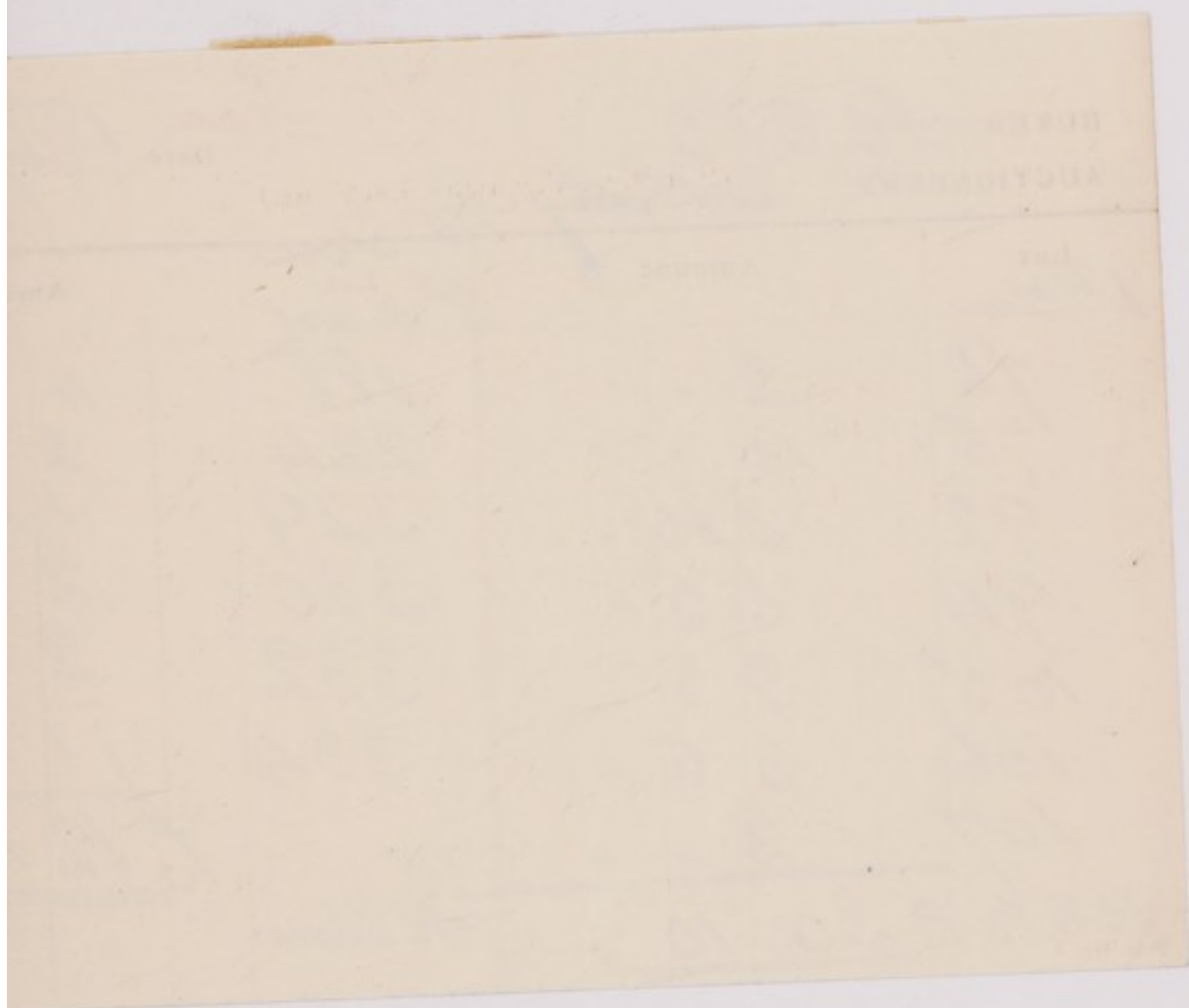

- 313 AN ARCHAIC THREE-QUARTER FIGURE IN SAND-STONE, found by the late Captain Adey, at Waiss, near Awaz, in Kurdistan, Persia, in 1901, where it was unearthed in the course of preparing foundations for a building, *extreme length 13 in., breadth of chest 4½ in.* The head has a prominent skull, 4 in. wide, a very low forehead and beak-like nose; the eyes are unproportionately big; the face is moustached and bearded, which suggests that the figure cannot be of Sumerian origin; part of the nose, beard and the whole of the left arm are missing, the stump of the other arm has been cemented to the trunk; the lower part of the figure below the hips is missing. From ten grooves or folds on the body (seven on the left and three on the right side of the hips) it seems that the figure was intended to represent a personage clothed in a tunic, but it would appear that at a later date, the chest and abdomen had been flattened in order to engrave upon the figure twelve lines of an inscription, illegible but presumably in Aramaic characters. The back is completely flattened, and a hole, one inch deep, bored upwards between the shoulders, suggests that the figure was at one time hung upon the wall.

- 314 AN INDO-HELLENIC FIGURE OF A BODISATTVA, in stone; he is standing, robed, with breast and right shoulder bare, his head is unshorn, and his locks fall on his shoulder, he is wearing sandals (*both hands are missing*), the face shows very strong Greek influence, and the figure probably dates from about 300 B.C. *fine and very rare*, 19½ in. high [Pl. IV]
- 315 A FRAGMENT OF A LINTEL: The Master is seen conversing with a mounted warrior; several figures in the background, with features reminiscent of Greek philosophers, *about* 300 B.C., 9½ in. high [Pl. IV]

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- 316 A GANDHARA STELE, *from one of the Buddhist ruins of the North-West Frontier of India*, a carving in horn-blende-schist, 4 ft. high, widest part 1 ft. 7 in., c. 2nd Cent. A.D. The shape is that of an ogee arched pediment, above a slightly tapering body, on a somewhat wider plinth, each part containing scenes in the life of Gautama. The pediment has five scenes divided by pillars and arches, the largest having a standing Buddha flanked by four disciples and on each side a pair of figures; above under a pointed arch Buddha seated under a Bodhi tree in the Dharma-chakra mudra with a woman on his left and a man on his right; above again under another arch Buddha in the meditative mudra. The body of the stele contains two scenes of equal size, the top being apparently Buddha preaching to the Nagas with Sakra on his left, the lower a similar scene with Vajrapani in attendance. On the plinth are two registers, the top one having a Buddha and four other seated figures (of gods?) under arched niches; the lower

two scenes: on the left the scene after the attainment of supreme knowledge when the four maharajas came offering their alms bowls of precious metals which he refused for an earthenware bowl; and on the right the Mahaparinirvana, under the two Sala trees of the wood at Kusinara; before the couch is Vajrapana fallen down, a seated monk and the tripod water cooler, Kasyapa stands at the master's feet and Ananda raises his arms in grief, while a central figure unidentified bows his head and tears his hair [Pl. V]

\* \* \* Owing to the stele having been broken and pieced together, many of the figures are extremely difficult of identification, so that there is abundant material for discussion and elucidation, but it may be said that this is one of the largest pieces of these reliefs which has come into the market, and not the least important.

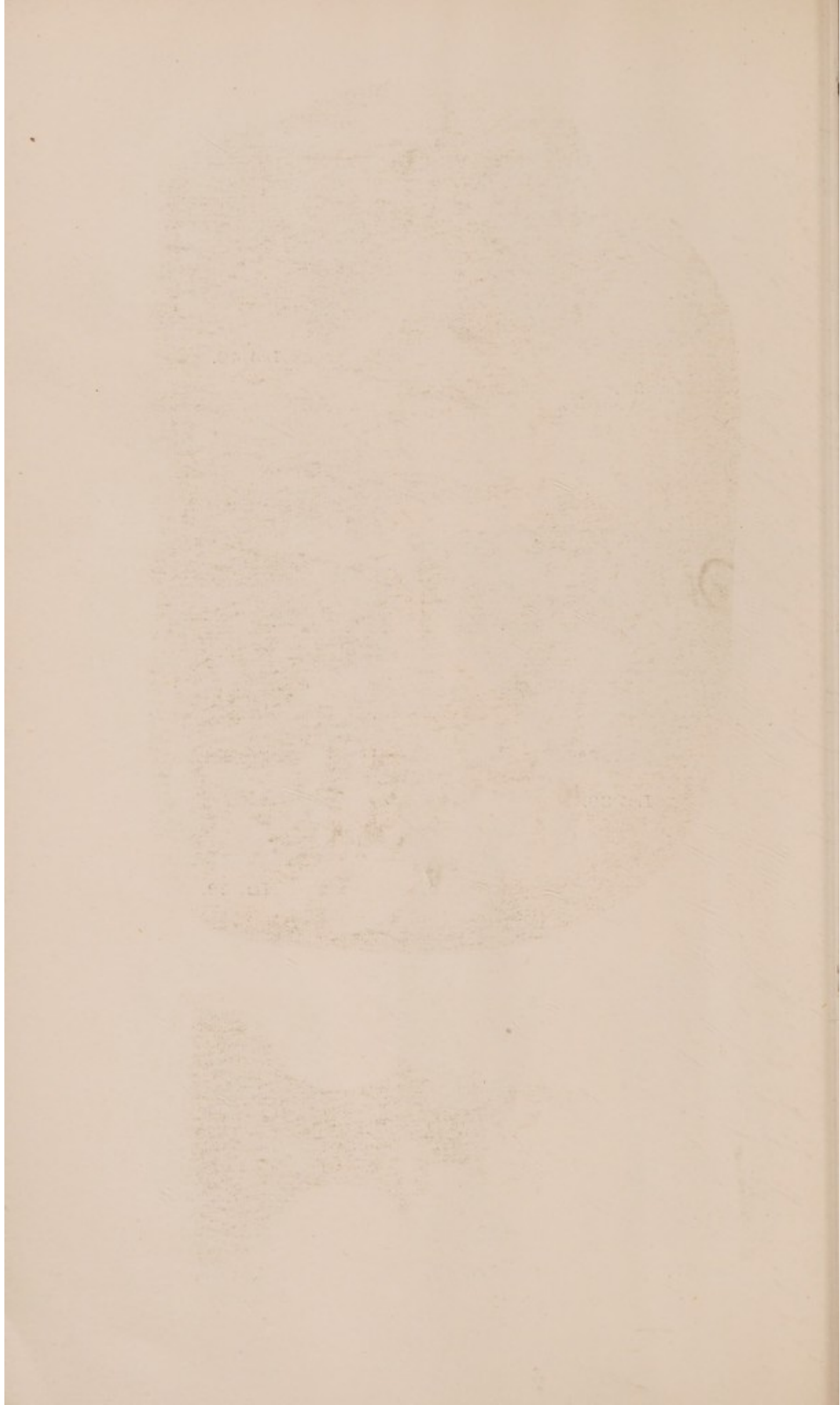

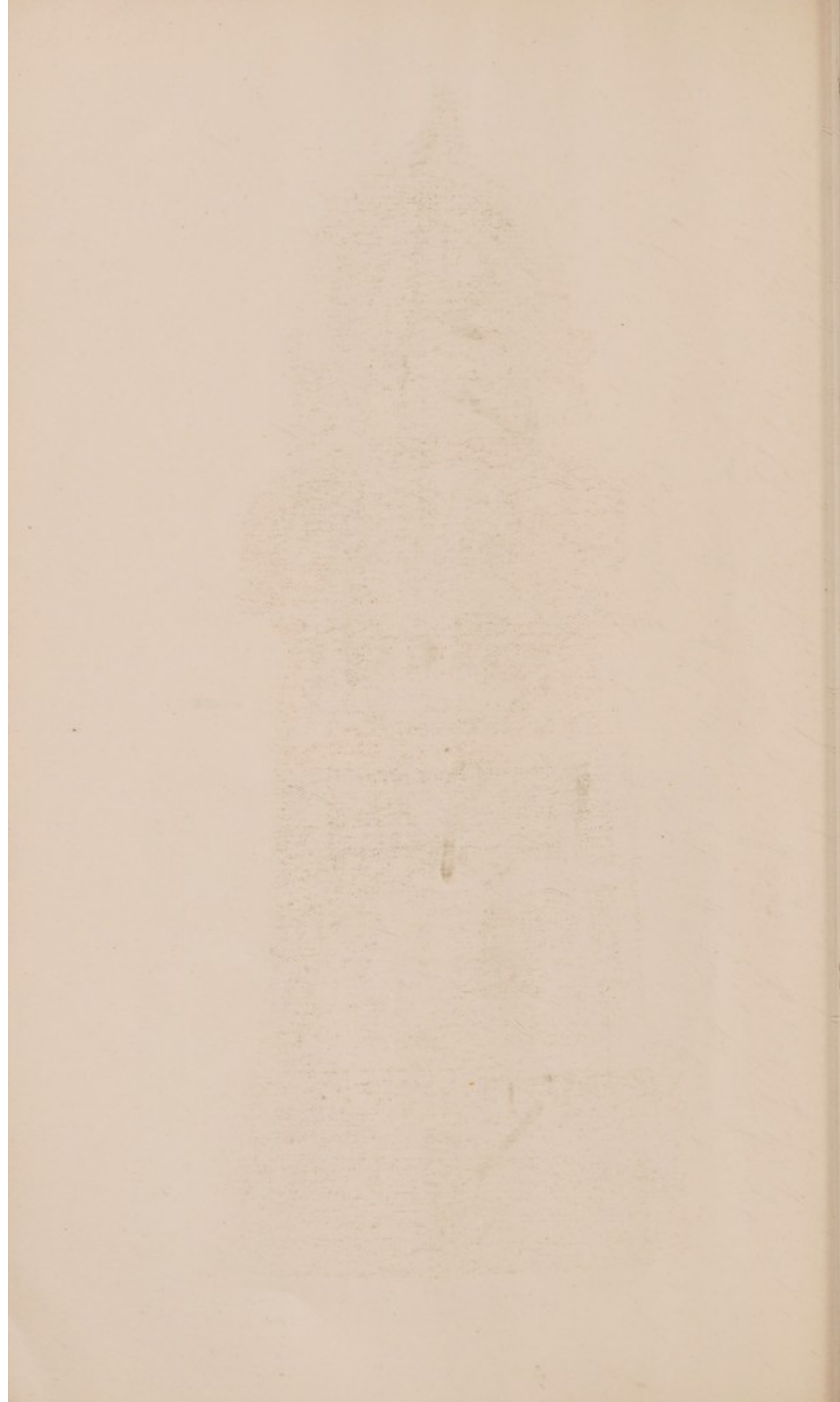

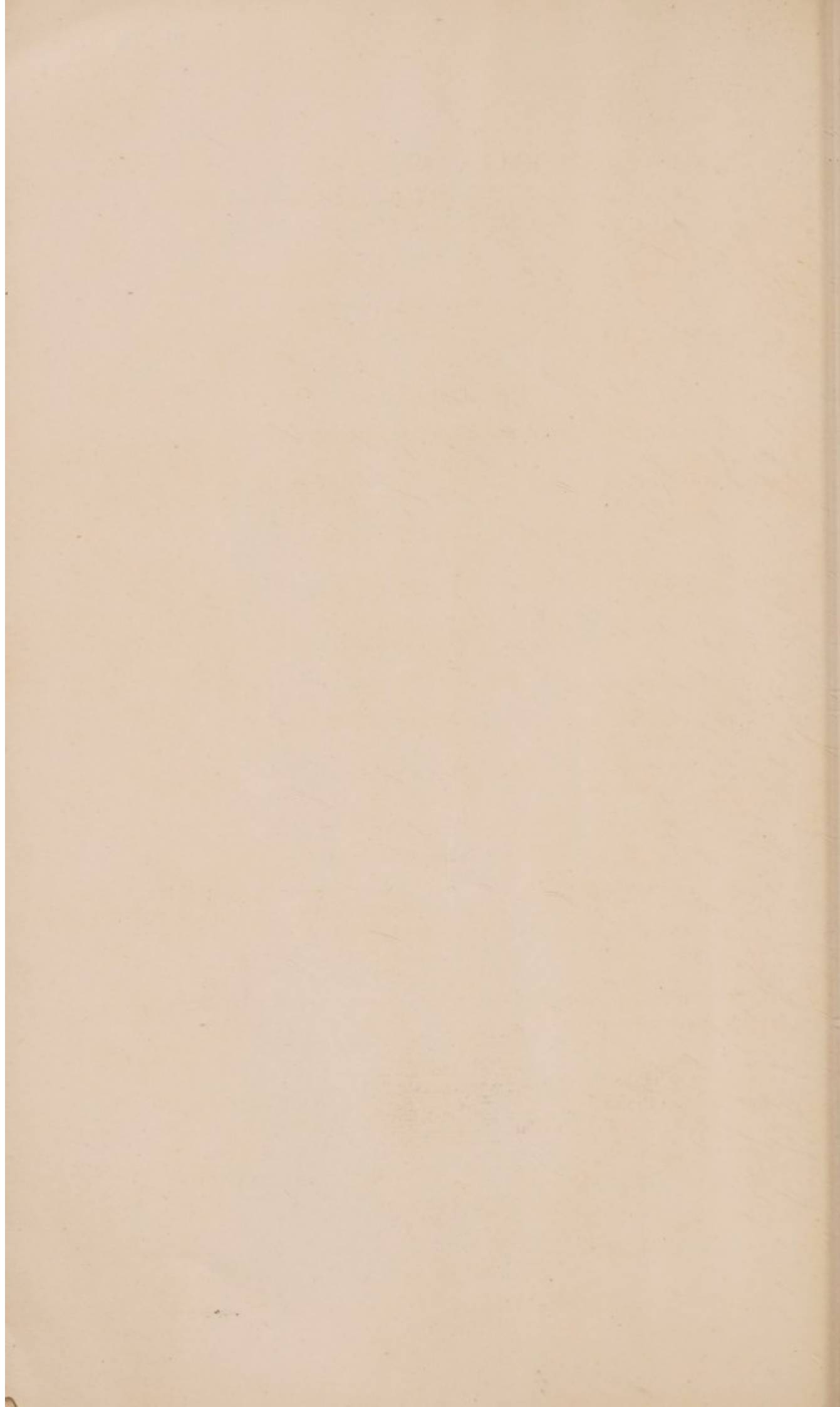
