

## Fifteenth Century English Medical Manuscript,

By Sir JOHN MANDEVILLE.

Mandeville (Sir John, d. 1372, also called John of Bordeaux, etc.) A Noble Tretys made by a Gode Phisician, John of Burdeux, for Medycyne ageyne the Pestilence Evill, together with other tracts, as follows: Ff. 1a-13b: On Digestive and Laxative Medicines, in Latin. (Text begins: Omne enim corpus humanum . . .); Ff. 14a-19b: On the Practice of Urines, in English. (Text begins: It is understonde whoso will loke an Urine . . .); Ff. 19b-20a: Expositiones Urinarum. (Text begins: Color rubeus est quasi flamma . . .); Ff. 20a-22a: Various Prescriptions in Latin; Ff. 22a-31b: A Treatise on the Preservation of Health, in Latin. (Text begins: Aristotiles autem scribens alexandro magno . . .); Ff. 31b-33a: De Mirabilibus Aque Ardentis Rectificate. (Text begins: Ab origine mund' universa . . .); Ff. 33a-43a: A Treatise on the Plague by Sir John Mandeville, in Latin. (Text begins: Ego, Johannes de Burgundia . . .); Ff. 43a-49a: A Treatise on the Plague, in English, by Mandeville.—This is a different work from the preceding. It is the one quoted at the beginning of this description. (Text begins: Here begynneth a noble tretys . . ; Some MSS. give only the first three chapters of this work, this gives all four.); Ff. 49b-54b: A Letter, in Latin, containing Medical and other Advice respecting the Plague. (Text begins: Dilectissime frater, ut intellexi, . . .); Ff. 54b-55b: On the Conditions of the Seven Planets, in English. (Text begins: Sol. whoso is borne when he reyneth . . .); Ff. 56b-63b: Aetrological Tracts and Tables in Latin; Ff. 63b-64a: Miscellaneous notes in another hand.

Manuscript on paper, 64 leaves, written in a running hand, with a few diagrams, including one illustrating the influence of the Signs of the Zodiac on bleeding. 12mo. (140 by 97 mm.), old vellum, preserved in case.

[Written in England about 1450]

A Medical Manuscript of great interest and importance.

The Medical Treatise, the title of which is reproduced at the beginning of this description, is by the famous Sir John Mandeville, the Author of the fabulous Book of Travels, which bears his name. The identification of Mandeville with the medieval medical writer variously known as John of Burgundy, John of Bordeaux, or John the Bearded, is accepted by all competent scholars. The greater part of the evidence on which this identification rests is provided by the testimony of Mandeville's friend and executor, Jean d'Outremeuse. According to D'Outremeuse's story both John of Burgundy and Sir John Mandeville are assumed names. The author of this tract was really an English peer, the Earl of Montfort, who, having killed one of his contemporaries, was forced to leave the country. After extended travels he settled down at Liège in 1343, and practised as a physician under an assumed name.

Sir John Mandeville (to use the best known of his appellations), was like Chaucer's physician, an astrologer as well as a doctor.

"He was well grounded in Astronomye, He kept his pacient wondurly well In houres by his magik naturel."

In Mandeville's opinion no one was fit to practise medicine who had not a complete knowledge of astrology. "I 40 yere and more have oftyn tymes proved in practise that a medecyn given contrary to ye constilacion, although it were both wele compowynd or medled, and ordinatly wroghte after the scheme of phisik, yet it wroght nowther after the purpose of the wareher nor the profit of the pacient."

Mandeville's writings on medical topics were held in high esteem during the Middle Ages, especially in England. With the exception of the "Governayle of Helthe" (which is sometimes attributed to him), none of them were printed before the nineteenth century.

## Mystic Manuscript: Fifteenth Century.

RAYMUNDUS LULLUS. Ars Generalis, Nova Logica, Brevis Pictura Tabule Generalis, Disputatio quinque Sapientum, and other subsidiary treatises.

Manuscript on 310 leaves of paper, written mainly by Stephanus Lannkchammer, cleric of the Diocese of Passau, at Branau (On the Inn, Bavaria) in 1454 and signed by him in full, on fol. 62. Many curious diagrams in various coloured inks.

A very remarkable and well preserved manuscript of the principal philosophic works of the great CATALAN MYSTIC PHILOSOPHER RAMON LULL. There can be no doubt that this codex is copied from very good and authentic originals, since each treatise ends with the full subscription of the author with the date of composition, proving that the MSS, from which Langkamer used was genuine. The first subscription, that to Ars Generalis, reads in full: "Incepta fuit hec sciencia in mari in portu Tuniciji (Tunis) in medio Septembris Anno Incarnacionis Millesimo ducentesimo nonagesimo tercio (1293) et fuit finita in eodem anno in Octobri Apiphanie in Civitate Neapolis ad honorem domini dei nostri et beate virginis Marie.

Scripta sunt hec per Stephanum Lannkchammer de Patavia, clericum eiusdem doicesis, Anno MCCCCLIIII. in die danctissimi principis apostolorum beati Petri ad Vinvula, in opido Pranaw, duce Ludwico regnate per Bauoarium.'

Similarly the date of composition of the "Nova Logica" is given as "in Janua, May 1303"; the "Practica scientibus nostram generalem artem" also "Janua 1303."

The manuscript is very well and legibly written and is valuable for establishing the text of these famous books.
