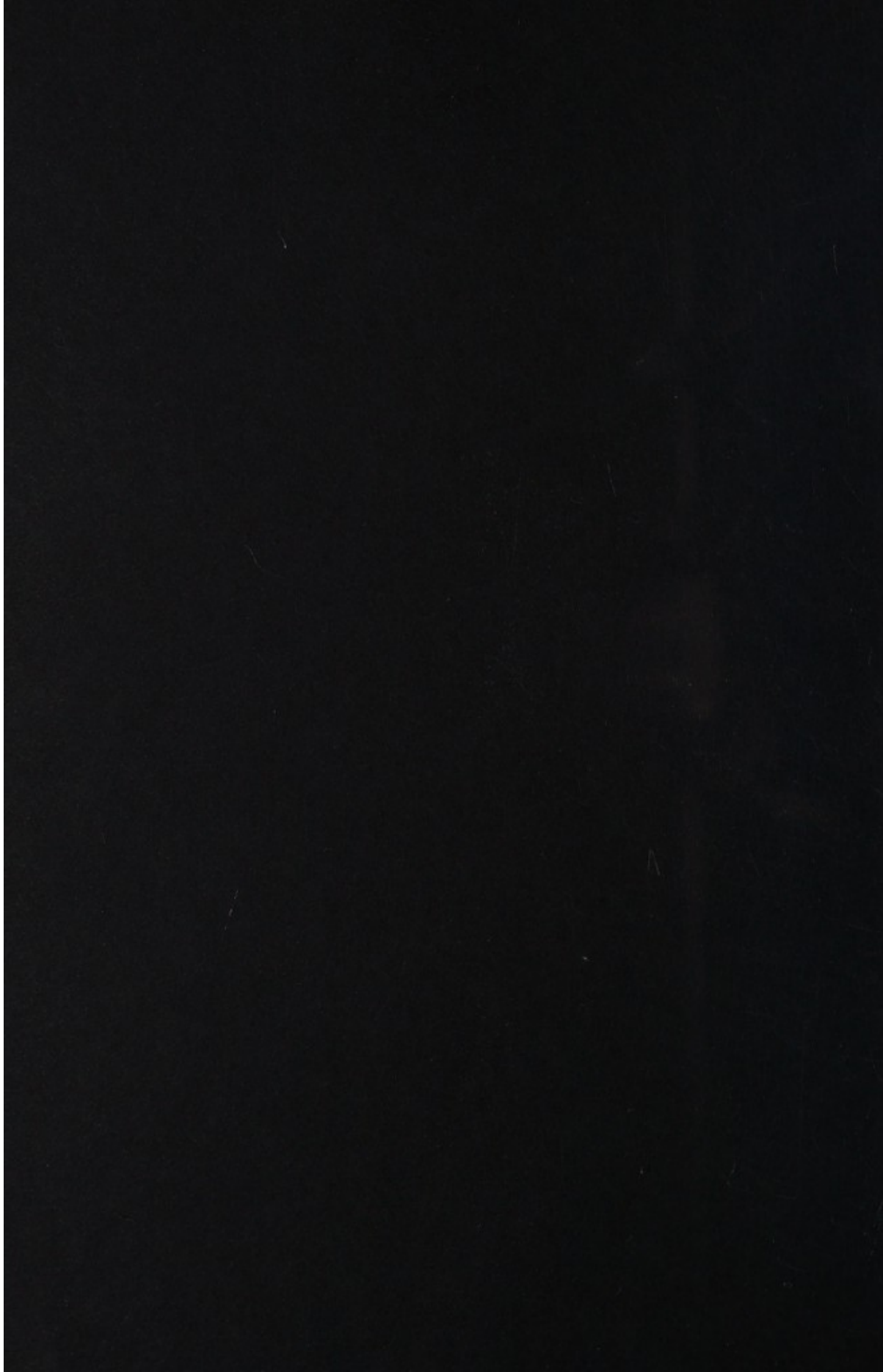

- 4 **NEAPOLEONIC RELICS.** A very interesting, rare, and unique collection of Relics and Souvenirs of the Battle of Waterloo (and Les Quatre Bras), 18th June, 1815, these relics and souvenirs were collected together and brought from the field, three weeks after the battle, by Messrs. Henry and Frederick Weymouth, who visited it on July 12th, 1815, mounted and enclosed in a wood and glass exhibition show case, measuring 39 by 27 by 4 inches.

Comprising :—Orderly Book of a French Soldier of the 2nd Regiment of Foot Artillery; leather portfolio of General Guye; certificate of a soldier who has been discharged; two French Tricoloured Cockades; metal knapsack ornament of the 3rd Battalion of the Guards (British); four brass French Eagles, or Shako plates; certificate of the Waterloo Prize Money belonging to Sergeant A. Rigsby; five metal Waterloo Military buttons; portion of document, with autograph signature of Duke of Wellington; belt-plate of a French soldier, etc., etc., together with the original passport (in a glass frame) issued to Messrs. Weymouth on their visit to Belgium.
