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

CHE FORRES PILLAR OR SWENO'S STONE, an early copy in carved oak, 54in. high. This stone stands near Forres, Morayshire, and is an object of local and other interest; it is said to represent the expulsion of the Danes from Scotland in the time of Malcolm II. - A Celtic bronze sword, found in the Thames, and a rapier blade from North Prodingham, XVIIth century.
 - 98 A rapier, with melon shape pommel, recurved quillons and fluted shell guard, inlaid with flowers, etc., in silver, the blade inscribed "Me siney es el nonem, Jesu," found at Folkton, English, circa 1600.
 - 99 A fencing rapier, with circular fluted shell guard, the pommel with similar decoration, the blade inscribed "Petter Vunder me fecit, Petter Vunder, Solingen," English, circa 1650, found near Knaresborough.
 - 100 A rapier with unusually long diamond section blade, inscribed Toledo, the swept hilt, with double ringed guard and recurved quillons, Italian, XVIth ventury, from West Huntington Hall.

A Scotch basket hilted broad sword, the double edged blade inscribed on both sides Andrea Farara, XVIIth century.

102 A sword with heavy basket hilt, the bars with quadrangular divisions, contra curving quillons which terminate in cross-worked knobs, massive semi-globular pommel, and diagonally worked, double edged fluted blade, 38½in. long, and another sword of similar class and period, the basket hilt with curving bars, the blade, 39in. long, circa 1610.

A double handed "Bastard" sword, with slightly 103 drooping quillons, terminating in spirally worked knobs, the guard and pommel also with spirals, boldly formed pas d'ane, the blade has a ricasso and channel marked with maker's name, Ivannym, circa 1540, 41in.

A double handed "Bastard" sword, with contra turning quillons, six sided pommel, and broad ricasso with maker's mark, below which the blade slightly expands and tapers downwards, circa 1540, the blade 43\fin. long.

two-handed sword, the blackened hilt with fluted pommel and moulded leather covered grip, the drooping quillons terminating in spiral scrolls with two side scrolls, and a port on either side containing a fleur-de-lis, the blade with leather curved ricasso, German, circa 1580.

Another, with double scroll quillons, the flamboyant blade stamped with an orb and cross, the reverse with the crossed flails of Munich, inscribed "Ochsenkopf," probably by Ulrich Diefstetter of Munich, 1559-1589, the blade 543in. long.

A small sword, with oviform pommel, the grip, pas d'âne and shells decorated with horsemen in combat, the long triangular blade of colichemarde pattern, etched and dated 1561.

A sword, with russetted hilt, the pommel formed as a lion's head, and with wire-covered grip, drooping quillons terminating in a lion's head, and fluted shell thumb guard, Swiss, circa 1590, the blade 33in. long.

A sword with hilt of bright steel, the pommel pear-shaped with seven flutes, grip of silver and iron wire, straight square quillons ending in spirally fluted knobs; the single ring guard pas d'âne, knuckle and thumb guards all of square section and fluted with knobs in the centres, the blade fluted and with squared ricasso, Italian, circa 1550.

An almost identical sword proceeding from the same atelier

is in the Wallace Collection, No. 287.

A rapier with pierced cup hilt and long ovate pommel, both quillons turned down and curved, the blade of diamond section, English, circa 1600. 36in. long.

A sword, with flat pear shape pommel, curved flat quillons and pierced shell guard, chased with the double-headed eagle, the outside of the hilt with flowers and scrolls, the blade stamped with armourer's mark, German, circa 1560, 365 in. long.

Another, nearly similar, the shell guard pierced with stars, the blade with ricasso and stamped with armourer's mark, German, circa 1630.

Two Cromwellian lobster tail helmets.

A small axe with single piercing, the wood haft carved with scrolls and mounted with ferrule, Austrian, circa 1570.

Another, the brass blade pierced and inscribed I.G.V. and A.H. M., the bone haft engraved with the Crucifixion, etc., 79 and dated 1579, Saxon.

A rapier with swept hilt and straight quillons, the guard and pommel encrusted with stars and spirals in silver, and above the ricasso a small shield with the Medici arms, the blade slightly fluted, 36in. long, Italian, circa 1580.

A rapier with ringed cup hilt, on each side six rings, and a shell with masks and perforations, the quillons turning up and down, the blade of diamond section, fluted and marked Sebastian Hernante, circa 1600.

118 A rapier with bright steel hilt, eight fluted pear-shaped pommel, counter curved quillons swelling slightly at the ends, knuckle guard, pas d'âne and double rings at each side rising from the pas d'ane connected to the knuckle guard by bars, the lower rings fitted with plates with trellised piercings, the blade of diamond section, 37in. long, doubly fluted and squared ricasso, stamped with name Adam Hollich, English, circa 1590.

119 A rapier with "swept" hilt of blackened iron damascened with masks, acanthus scrolls, pomegranates and acorns, in silver, oviform pommel, knuckle guard, pas d'âne connected by a single ring, single guard on the outside, and triple guard on the inside, one single drooping quillon, the blade of hexagonal section, partly fluted, length with ricasso, 40\fin. circa 1580.

A bit of tinned iron elaborately pierced, a half canon with a whole port, players formed of brass chains and branches " à la connetable," German, circa 1600

Another, whole port with pears, and with elaborate players and branches "à la connetable," German, circa 1500.

A pair of stirrups of pierced and gilt copper, the arches widening towards the treads, the escutcheons before the suspension bars are formed as escallop shells, German, circa 1620.

A gilt spur, English, circa 1630.

124 A steel spur, English, circa 1700.

125 t A silver spur, English, circa 1780.

126 A powder horn of leather and steel, XVIIth century.

A sword with blackened iron hilt, trilobate pommel, the knuckle guard is joined to the large single ring by a counter guard, flat drooping quillons roped in the centre and expanding to the ends; the back edged blade 38in. long with long ricasso and flute, double stamped with

"Hog's back" mark, circa 1540.

A sword of the mortuary type but somewhat earlier with 128 blackened and gilt basket kilt chiselled with three medallions containing a crowned head of Charles I., the double edged blade with three flutings on each side and marked Andrea Ferara.

129 A bone powder horn, engraved with a hunting scene and

with steel mounts, early XVIth century.

A powder horn, with pierced and chased metal mounts. .

A flask of compressed horn, of pale green, with ivory base decorated with figures wearing late seventeenth century costumes, mottoes, etc., French, circa 1710.

A horn flask, with chased brass mounts, German, early 132

XVIIIth century.

A breast plate, engraved with military trophies, circa 1600.

A hunting sword, with inlaid grip, bird shape pommel, and 134 single curved quillon, partly gilt, the blade etched with hunting scenes, German, circa 1530.

A Processional or Ceremonial Weapon of an unusual character which may be described as a halbard or a military fork, but was obviously meant for official or court use. On one side is an axe blade pierced so as to exhibit the loop emblem of the Princes of Savoy, and on the other is a curved bill, a crowned eagle's head indicating the family connection with the Holy Roman Empire, and above these is a two-pronged fork, the whole surface with gold damascening and silver incrustation. A similar weapon slightly differing in details was in sale of Kennedy Collection, late XVIth century.

A small sword, the gilt metal hilt chased with figures and trophies and with wire grip, the triangular blade engraved

with scrolls, French, circa 1750.

A sword with cut steel hilt, XVIIIth century.

A gun, the wood stock inlaid with figures, masks, animals and foliage in engraved ivory, the steel barrel dated 1589, from Johanneum.

A Short Sword, of the Cinquedea type, the steel hilt has the customary drooping quillons and pierced shield-shaped pommel in the same medium, the grip composed of plaques of horn, secured by an annular rosette pierced with tracery; the blade 16in. long and 3in. wide at the hilt, grooved and inlaid with tracery.

A SHORT SWORD, of the Cinquedea type, the grip and 140 pommel inset with plaques of cornelian and lapis-lazuli, the quillons overlaid with silver filagree, having in their centres coats-of-arms, which, like those on the blade, are etched with the arms of Visconti. From The Raoul Richards Collection. From The Brett Collection.

A pair of old Saracen stirrups of wide spread design, inlaid with gold, and a single Oriental stirrup.

A blunderbus with brass barrel and bayonet, and one other. 4 2

A powder flask of deer horn, engraved with Leda and the Swan and other figures, a pair of XVIIth century spurs, and two plug bayonets.

Two Dervish swords and sheaths from Omdurman, and two Indian tulwars.

A wheel-lock gun, the carved stock inlaid with brass, mother-o'-pearl and coloured woods, late XVIIth century.

A wheel-lock rifle of XVIIth century date, though the contemporary barrel has been dated by a late owner 1771.

A HOLY WATER SPRINKLER made of iron, with wood handle, to hang at the saddle bow. Illustrated in Meyrick's "Arms and Armour," Fig. 3,

A Pair of Long Spurs with eight point rowells, terminating with grotesque heads, the heel plates chiselled with figures and sea horses.

A pryck Spur, XIIth century, another dug up in London, and a pair of spurs with fleur-de-lis rowells.

A highland flint lock pistol with ram's horn butt, raised 150 oval medallion on the stock, the lock marked "BISSELL," XVIIIth century.

A rapier with deep cup hilt with roped turnover, the blade 43in. long, is of diamond section and partially grooved, early XVIIth century.

152 A rapier with deep cup hilt, which is divided into alternate plain and pierced and chiselled panels, the blade, $40\frac{1}{2}in$. long, is marked with the letters zuoxpza, the pommel is of lobated pear form, and the straight quillons are spirally twisted.

153 A swept hilt rapier with long straight quillons, armourer's mark on the ricasso, the blade 40½ in. long, of diamond section, late XVIth century.

154 Two swept hilt rapiers with straight quillons, the blade of one marked "Gonzolo Simon."

155 A pair of pistols, the butts decorated with figures and trophies, by Griffin, Bond Street, and another pair with carved butts.

A Thibetan saddle with front and rear plates of silver, inlaid with turquoise and other stones, and with fittings of gilt bronze and a bridle to correspond.

157 A Persian cuirass of four plates Char Aina, and two old Turkish breastplates.

A pair of heavy Thibetan stirrups, the openwork plated with silver, and a Persian dagger, the hilt adapted from an old European powder flask, the sheath covered with XVIIth century embroidery.

A Persian helmet and three defensive plates finely engraved with hunting scenes and inscriptions.

A pair of brass stirrups with openwork on sides, and twohorsebits, XVIIth century.

An Indian powder flask of ebony inlaid with ivory, a brass powder horn and a Persian set of utensils for opium.

163 An old Persian blunderbuss, known as Cher Bache, the back and barrel chiselled with animals and flowers, and a Chinese sword with shark skin scabbard.

An "eared" yataghan, with highly embossed silver sheath, the blade inscribed in gold in Arabic characters: "I depend on the Creator, the servant of Solomon, Haj Nooh Reya Sahab," and the date, A.H. 1227, and another yataghan.

165 Two Indian thrusting daggers (koutars), with finely channelled blades and chiselled hilts inlaid with gold.

166 A Persian dagger, with massive ivory handle carved with the King Takht Djemchid Darius seated on throne, with courtiers, attendants bringing wine, etc.

Two Persian daggers, with ivory handles and embossed = silver sheaths.

A powder horn made from the antler of a deer, decorated with a boar hunt in carved ivory, Austrian, circa 1740, and another ivory powder flask.

169 A LATE FORM OF "TUCK" OR FOINING SWORD, with largely proportioned hilt, probably an Italian production of the

third quarter of the 16th Century.

The hilt of this beautiful sword has been described by the Baron de Cosson as "the finest silver incrusted example known to him." The pommel is oviform, the quillons of great length, with a slight diagonal bend, completed with two counter-rings and a large pas d'ane. Like the swords of the same nature in the Musee d'Artillerie, Nos. J.95 and J.377, and the sword No. 675 in the Wallace Collection, the grip is not the original, it being far too short to serve the purpose for which the sword was intended. The incrustations of silver that constitute the hilt enrichment are formed as Amorini, foliage, tendrils, etc., accurately inlaid in that school of design often found on English-made hilts of a somewhat later date, but which enrichment, in the greater majority of cases, can be traced to an Italian origin. The blade—37 in. long and 1 in. wide at the hilt—is of flattened diamond-shaped section. It presents the peculiarity of having its ricasso incrusted with silver, en suite with the hilt.

170 A "Town" Sword or Rapier, doubtless Italian, about 1590. The pommel oviform with long straight quillons, knuckle guard, three bars and small shield, it is a familiar type, but as such is an extremely fine example, having rich incrustations of silver in the form of cherubs' heads, etc., inlaid on a field, once gilt. The blade, 39\frac{3}{4}in. long, exclusive of the ricasso, is of flattened octagonal section, doubly grooved, also pierced with apertures. It is inscribed: De Alonzo Perez en Toledo (?). As bladesmith's mark a crowned B is stamped on the ricasso, also the letters T.O.

- AN OLD ENGLISH OAK LIVERY CUPBOARD, enclosed by three panelled doors in the upper part, and two panelled doors below, and with fluted and carved borders and baluster supports at the sides, carved with initials E.W. and date 1678, 93in. high, 71in. wide.

- 193 A Georgian mahogany secretaire, the fall-down front enclosing pigeon-holes, etc., a drawer over and six small drawers under, 45in. wide.
- 194 A set of four Venetian chairs, the high backs and seats covered with crimson silk damask, on carved and gilt baluster legs and shaped stretchers.
- 195 A Queen Anne mirror in gilt frame, surmounted by a scroll cartouche, the border with a shell and other ornaments, 47in. by 21in.
- 196 A set of four and two elbow Chippendale mahogany chairs, the square shape backs with pierced centres and carved foliage ornament, on square legs.
- 197 A William and Mary chair with high back, walnut shaped elbows, carved stretcher and baluster legs.

- 198A A Chippendale mahogany tall boy chest of eight drawers and writing slide, the corners fluted and carved with fretwork ornament, 46in. wide.

- 199 A Hepplewhite mahogany sideboard with serpentine front, with drawer, cellarettes and slides at the sides, on square tapered legs, 74in. wide.
- 200 A pair of Georgian knife boxes and covers, of square tapered shape, 21in. high.
